To Alan Gregory Smith, Esq., Stipendiary Magistrate of Perth:

I, THE Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you Alan Gregory Smith to be a Royal Commission to investigate and report, in relation to the Marketing of Potatoes, Onions and Eggs upon the following:

- (a) The methods and present facilities of marketing, and whether, in the public interest, the Board system of marketing should be continued.
- (b) The distribution from the producer to the consumer, with particular reference to handling, storage, and losses due to deterioration during marketing.
- (c) The analysis of the wholesale and retail prices setting out the remuneration of all persons, agents, firms, or marketing authorities in the marketing and distribution from the producer to the consumer, and whether all these handling costs are justified.
- (d) The influence of seasonal production upon quality and the retail price.
- The basis used in granting and refusing licenses to grow potatoes or onions.
- (f) To recommend any proposals for-
 - (i) more efficient methods of market-
 - ensuring an adequate supply of products of good quality to consumers;

(iii) ensuring reasonable margins for distribution and sale between producers and retailers, and a fair price to the consumer.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Apppendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission and the Chairman thereof under the Act.

And I hereby request you as soon as reasonably may be to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section forty-nine of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1954, that the Governor by Commission, either general or special, may assign to any practitioner of the Supreme Court of at least seven years' standing or to a Stipendiary or Resident Magistrate the duty of trying and determining within any place or district specially fixed

for that purpose by such Commission any causes or matters, or any questions or issue of fact or of law or partly of fact and partly of law in any cause or matter, depending in the Supreme Court, or the exercise of any civil or criminal jurisdiction capable of being exercised by a Judge, and that the civil and criminal jurisdiction capable of being exercised by a Judge which under the said section the Governor may by Commission, either general or special, assign to the persons hereinbefore men-tioned may include each and every jurisdiction, civil or criminal, and original or appellate which by any custom, law or prerogative, or any statute enacted or otherwise howsoever a Judge of the Supreme Court can exercise, but so that no appellate jurisdiction shall be assigned unless the Commission is granted to a Judge or a practitioner of the Court of at least seven years' standing; and whereas our trusty and well beloved Sir John Patrick Dwyer, Chief Justice of Western Australia is, in consequence of sickness, temporarily unable to perform the duties of his office and therefore, pursuant to section 10 of the said Act, all the duties and powers of the Chief Justice, during such inability, devolve upon our trusty and well beloved Albert Asher Wolff, the senior Judge; and whereas Altert Asher Wolff, the senior Judge; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to assign to a Commissioner the duty of trying and determining at Perth within the State at or within which the same may be tried or determined all causes or matters or any questions or issues of facts or of law or partly of fact and partly of law in any cause or matter depending in the said Supreme Court or the exercise of any civil or criminal jurisdiction campble of height expected by a Judge until diction capable of being exercised by a Judge until the Commission granted to such Commissioner is revoked: Now know ye therefore that I the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said section 49 do by this Commission assign to you Gregory James Boylson of Perth, a practitioner of the Supreme Court of Western Australia of at least seven years' standing the duty of trying and determining at Perth within the State at or within which the same may be tried or determined all causes or matters or any questions or issues of fact or of law or partly of fact and partly of law, in any cause or matter depending in the said Supreme Court, and the exercise by you of any civil or criminal jurisdiction capable of being exercised by a Judge of the said Court until this Commission is revoked by me and so that you the said Gregory James Boylson shall by virtue of this Commission have the same powers and may carry out the same duties and perform the same functions to all intents and purposes as a Judge may carry out and perform during such time as this Commission shall remain in force and unrevoked and so that the civil and criminal jurisdiction assigned to you and capable of being exercised by you under and by virtue of this Commission shall include appellate as well as original jurisdiction.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted) that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare any Crown lands be Reserves for Natives under the

Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, and abolish any reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1953, the Governor declared an area being portion of Swan Location 01 being lots 115 and 116 on L.T.O. Plan 4504 to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Reserve: Now, therefore I, the said Gov-ernor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1953, as aforesaid.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 5 of 1955. (Registered 14th April, 1955.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 4th day of April, 1955, between the Swan Brewery Company Limited; the Emu Brewery Limited; and the West Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited; and Union Maltings Proprietary Limited, all of Perth and Fremantle (hereinafter in these presents called "the employers") of the one part, and the Breweries and Bottle Yards Employees Industrial Union of Workers, of Western Australia, of Perth being an industrial union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 (hereinafter in these presents called "the Union") of the other part; whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out herein shall, in all cases, be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed and complied with according to the true intent and meaning thereof by the parties hereto and it is also hereby mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that this Agreement shall apply to the whole of the employees embraced in the Schedule herein contained.

1.—Interpretation.

For the purpose of this Agreement-

- (a) "Casual hand" shall mean any person who is not employed continually for more than 40 ordinary working hours 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
- (b) "Cylinder man" whenever used in this Agreement, shall mean a worker who is generally employed at a majority of the undermentioned occupations, namely, filling, preparing, carbonating and racking beer from a chilling cylinder, but shall not mean any employee who is casually employed in any one of the last mentioned processes.
- (c) "Bottle-washer" shall mean any person employed washing bottles by hand or machinery.
- (d) "Fireman" shall mean a person employed in a stokehold attending a steam boiler or gas-producing plant.
- (e) "Nightcellarmen and nightmaltsters" shall apply only to cellarmen and maltsters who are employed on night duties.
- (f) "Leading hands" are employees who are in charge of and responsible for the work of others.

2.-Wages Schedule.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities undermentioned is as follows:—

(a) Basic Wage.—Within a radius of 15 miles from the G.P.O., Perth—£12 6s. 6d.

Workers in cold rooms or cellars with a temperature of less than 45 deg. Fah. shall be paid 5s. per week in addition to the minimum rate.

Maltsters working on permanent night duties at the Swan Malt House shall be paid an allowance of sixteen shillings (16s.) per week in addition to the ordinary rate of pay.

Boiler cleaning which shall include scraping, cleaning and painting cylinders. For all time which they may be employed at this class of work, workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification.

Ammonia coils—For all time which they may be employer chipping, cleaning, scraping, or painting ammonia coils workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classifications, and whilst so engaged shall be supplied free with goggles, pullovers and respirators and allowed reasonable time before the end of each shift to cleanse themselves.

Coal handling—Workers employed on breaking, crushing, and handling coal in bunkers or bins shall, for all time whilst so engaged be entitled to be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classifications.

Boots—The employers agree to supply boots to those workers employed at bottle washing on the tanks at the tubs at the filters, at the cask-washing shed, and at the bottlers, to be worn during working hours, same to be supplied free of cost by the employers.

Oilers and aprons—The employers agree to provide oilskin coats and leather aprons for carters, to be used whilst the employer's work is being done only. In the case of the employers the Swan Brewery Company Limited, the Emu Brewery Limited and West Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited the abovementioned minimum rate of wages shall be deemed to have been payable by such employers in respect of all time worked on and after the 15th day of December, 1954 and in the case of the employer Union Maltings Proprietary Limited such minimum rate of wages shall be deemed to have been payable by it in respect of all time worked on and after the 13th day of December, 1954.

3.—Hours.

Forty hours shall constitute an ordinary week's work for all workers. Such hours shall (except as to shift workers) be worked on the following basis:—

(a) All workers other than those mentioned in subclauses (b) and (c) hereunder—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, to be worked within a spread of hours of 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. with one hour for lunch.

- (b) Firemen—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 5.0 a.m. on any day. The employer may require any fireman to start work at any time after 5.0 a.m.
- (c) Nightcellarmen and nightmaltsters—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 4.30 p.m. nor after 2.0 a.m. on any ordinary working day.

4.—Shift Work.

- (a) Workers may be employed-
 - (i) on "regular shift work" that is in regular rotation from week to week on two or three shifts spread over 16 or 24 hours respectively, day shift to be worked from 7.30 a.m. to not later than 3.30 p.m., afternoon shift from 3.30 p.m. to not later than 11.30 p.m. and night shift from 11.30 p.m. to not later than 7.30 a.m.;
 - (ii) on "casual shift work" that is on one weekly shift only worked in any department, casual, day, afternoon, and night shifts to start and finish at the times respectively referred to in the preceding paragraph.
- (b) In the case of both regular and casual shift work the first shift of the week will begin on Sunday at 11.30 p.m. and the last shift of the week shall finish at 11.30 p.m. on Friday. Duty rosters shall be posted on Friday in each week and shall show the starting and finishing times of each worker during each week. Particulars relating to starting and finishing times shall be rigidly adhered to.
- (c) The provisions contained in the previous subclauses of this clause may be varied by mutual agreement between any employer and the Union.
- (d) All workers employed on regular shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 5 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay for any week during which they work afternoon shift and an allowance equal to 10 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay for any week during which they work night shift.
- (e) All workers employed on casual shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of their ordinary weekly wage for any week during which they work afternoon shift and $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of their ordinary weekly wage for any week during which they work night shift.
- (f) A crib time of 30 minutes shall be allowed to the permanent nightmaltsters employed at the Swan Malt House and to all workers whether on regular or casual shift. Crib time shall be included in the working time.
- (g) The additional allowances mentioned in subclauses (d) and (e) hereof shall be taken into consideration in calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond eight hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this Agreement.

5.—Overtime.

(a) The following overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half:—

All time up to four hours worked:

- (i) Over eight hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.
- (ii) Outside the starting and finishing times mentioned in clause 3 (a) and before the starting time of 5.0 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. mentioned in clauses 3 (b) and (c) respectively.
- (iii) In the case of shift workers outside rostered starting and finishing times.
- (iv) On Saturday.
- (b) All overtime in excess of four hours worked during the periods referred to in subclause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) Subject to any alteration by mutual arrangement all workers on day work engaged in or about a brewery or bottling works shall, if required to work more than one hour's overtime after the usual

finishing time, be entitled to knock off for one hour after the usual finishing time for refreshments in which event and if notice of overtime has not been given at least 24 hours previously tea money shall be paid at the rate of four shillings (4s.) provided that where food is provided by the employer tea money shall be reduced to the rate of three shillings (3s.).

6.—Lunch Intervals.

The lunch intervals of 60 minutes shall be taken between 12 o'clock noon and 1.0 p.m. or between 1.0 p.m. and 2.0 p.m.

7.-Smoke-o.

Ten minutes shall be allowed at 10 o'clock a.m. and again at 3 o'clock p.m. This concession however, does not apply to men working on shifts.

8.—Casual Hands.

Casual hands shall be paid by the hour at the rate of ordinary pay plus two shillings (2s.) per day.

9.—Record.

Each employer shall keep a record of the name of each worker except stablemen, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, and wages paid to each worker, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any other person appointed by the Union during working hours. Each worker shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

10.-Sundays.

All work performed by workers in any department on Sunday and Easter Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All workers required to work on Sundays shall be allowed one Sunday off per fortnight: Provided that the employer may, in an emergency, require such workers to work on consecutive Sundays

11.—Holidays.

All work performed by workers in any department on the undermentioned holidays shall be paid for on an hourly basis at a rate equal to one and one half (1½) times the ordinary rate of pay per hour with a minimum of four (4) hours' pay and in addition such workers shall be paid one (1) day's pay for the holiday. All holiday shifts shall rotate. One ordinary day's pay shall be paid for the undermentioned holidays to workers who do not work that day.

The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Annual Pienic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Show Day, and Sovereign's Birthday. In case any of the above holidays falls on a Saturday or a Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

12.—Annual Leave.

Each employee on completion of 12 months' service shall be granted three (3) weeks annual leave, two (2) weeks on double pay and one (1) week on single pay, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the workers and the employers. The annual leave shall be in addition to the holidays mentioned in clause 11 hereof.

On termination of service of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than three months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of two and one-twelfth (2 1/12th) days' pay for each completed month of service. On termination of service of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than one month, but less than three months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of one and one quarter (14) days' pay for each completed month of service.

13.—Annual Bonus.

The employer shall pay such employee receiving wages under this Award, a week's pay by way of bonus in the last week in December in each year.

Any employee leaving the employer's service for reasons other than misconduct, dishonesty, or neglect of duty before the payment of such bonus in any year shall, when leaving be paid a pro rata payment in lieu thereof; any employee who shall not have been in the employ of the employer for a year in the first week in December shall receive a part of his week's pay bearing the same proportion to a week's pay as the period of his service bears to a year.

14.—Long Service Leave.

- (a) All workers who from time to time shall complete 25 years of continuous service with an employer shall be given long service leave. Such long service leave shall be taken at the conclusion of 25 years of continuous service and shall comprise 13 weeks' leave of absence for recreational purposes.
- (b) Should a worker who has completed 15 years of continuous service be retired compulsorily on medical grounds on the advice of a medical officer appointed by the employer or by reason of being over the employer's retiring age or die before completing 25 years' continuous service, there shall be paid by the employer to such worker or to his dependants as the case may require a sum of money bearing the same relation to 13 weeks' pay at his rate as his service with the employer bears to 25 years. "Dependant" shall mean the widow and/or children under the age of 16 years, or any child in fact dependent on any worker and, in the case of a single worker, shall mean such dependant (if any) as such single worker may in writing notify to the employer during his lifetime, accompanied by proper proof of actual dependency.
- (c) Continuous service shall include any interval spent on service with Her Majesty's Armed Forces during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged, and shall also include any interval spent during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged with any National Service into which a worker is compulsorily drafted for defence purposes.
- (d) Unless otherwise agreed in individual cases, long service leave shall be taken at such period as shall be mutually agreed upon within two years of it becoming due. In default of agreement it shall be taken at such time within such period of two years as the employer shall determine.
- (e) Except in the cases of a worker who, at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave, is of an age exceeding 60 all long service leave shall be taken by way of actual holiday and not by way of payment in lieu thereof on retirement. A worker who at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave is beyond 60 years of age shall have the option of taking actual holiday under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised by a notice in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for long service leave.
- (f) Workers on long service leave shall, while on such leave, continue to be paid at the actual rate (exclusive of overtime or other allowance) enjoyed by them at the commencement of such leave. Except in special circumstances payment shall be at the same times as during normal employment but may be made by cheque by mutual arrangement.
- (g) It shall be a condition of every worker's taking long service leave that he (or she)— $\,$
 - (i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
 - (ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of the leave; and
 - (iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with long service leave pay.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance, or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) above (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a medical

officer appointed by the employer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

- (h) The employer shall have the right in cases of emergency to recall any worker from long service leave, in which case the unexpired leave shall be made up on some mutually convenient date.
- (i) In order to avoid confusion and embarrassment workers whilst on long service leave shall not, without the prior permission of the officer in charge of the particular establishment, visit any of the premises of the employer except for the purpose of collecting pay or transacting genuine business with the employer's officers. Social visits shall not be indulged in. "Establishment" means any brewery, cooperage, or workshop, but does not include hotels or annual picnics or sports or usual weekly competitive sporting activities.
- (j) The benefits of long service leave shall be in addition to all benefits at present or hereafter to be enjoyed by workers.
- (k) In the event of any governmental or similar long service leave scheme being introduced for industry as a whole, the parties concerned shall meet to consider alterations necessary in order to adjust the scheme to such new conditions.
- (1) Notwithstanding anything in this clause contained no worker nor his legal personal representative shall be entitled to any of the benefits by this clause conferred in any of the following circumstances:—
 - (i) When, in the opinion of the directors of an employer a worker has committed fraud upon the employer or any defalcation in relation to the employer or breach of trust or similar act prejudicially affecting or likely to so affect business or interests of the employer and is dismissed.
 - (ii) If the worker shall become a bankrupt or insolvent debtor within the meaning of any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Western Australia or shall assign alienate or charge his benefits hereunder or any part thereof or attempt to do so or if through his own act or default or by operation or process of law the same shall become vested in or payable to some other person, firm or company.

15.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the board of reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the board, and pending the board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.
- (d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, shall be deemed to apply to any board of reference appointed hereunder.

16.-Engagement.

The engagement between employer and worker, except casual hands, shall be weekly, and may be terminated by a week's notice from either party, except in the case of the worker absenting himself without leave, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of other misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped, through fire or tempest, when such engagement may be terminated immediately.

17.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker who is unable through sickness or accident to attend his duties, shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty.
- (b) A worker shall be entitled to sick pay in respect of any period of absence on account of sickness after the 1st day of January, 1948, on the

basis of one half day's pay for each completed month served with the employer between the said 1st day of January, 1948, and the date of the commencement of such absence provided that in calculating the amount due to a worker in respect of any particular period of absence through sickness there shall be deducted therefrom any sum or sums previously paid to him hereunder.

- (c) The term "sickness" shall not include any case where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof of his sickness satisfactory to the employer. This proof shall be in the form of a medical certificate if the absence is for three days or more. The employer shall have the right at any time to have the worker examined by a doctor on behalf of the employer.
- (e) Except as aforesaid, a worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost through sickness or accident.

18.—Contractors.

All work of any employee in the capacity as mentioned in this Agreement in or about a brewery or bottling works or in connection with the business of brewing or bottling beer shall be carried out departmentally by bona fide brewery employees engaged and paid direct by the brewery proprietors and not by agents or contractors. This clause shall not apply to contractors erecting, repairing or making alterations to buildings or machinery or making alterations to buildings or machinery or to carriers being engaged for the delivery of goods other than beer as has been the practice or custom prior to this date. But when contractors are employed delivering beer the brewery company shall undertake to see that whilst so employed on such work the contractors pay to both the drivers and offsiders the same wages and work under the same conditions as is provided in this Agreement.

19 .-- Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

20.—Term.

This Agreement shall be for a term of twelve (12) months from the 15th day of December, 1954.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Between Foremen (Government) Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Works, Hon. Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, Minister in charge of State Engineering Works and Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, Respondents.

THE Conciliation Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

Award. 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Government Engineering and Allied Trades Foremen and Sub-foremen's Award" and replaces Award No. 46 of 1950, as amended.

3.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply throughout the State of Western Australia to all workers employed as tradesmen foremen and sub-formen enumerated in clause 4—Wages—hereof, by the Minister for Public Works, Minister for Water Supply, the Minister in Charge of State Engineering Works and the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and to any other tradesmen foremen who may from time to time be included in the wages clause.

4.--Wages.

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(a) Basic Wage:			
(i) Within a radius of fifteen (15) miles of the G.P.O., Perth	12	6	6
(ii) Outside a fifteen (15) mile radius of the G.P.O., Perth, but within the South-West Land

(iii) Outside the South-West Land	19	Q.	4

- (b) Foremen shall be paid margins in accordance with the classification herein prescribed:-
 - (i) Class 1—Foremen:

Fitting shop, State Engineering Works. Moulding shop, State Engineering Works. State Blacksmith shop, Engineering Works.

State Carpentry shop. Engineering Works.

Patternmaker, State Engineering Works. Meter shop, State Engineering Works. Machine shop, State Engineering Works. Boiler shop, State Engineering Works. Tractor shop, East Perth Workshops. Electrical workshop and/or installation, East Perth Workshops.

Electrician, Metropolitan Water Supply. Fitter, Fremantle Harbour Trust. Maintenance, Fremantle Harbour Trust. Marginal range per annum: £549-£570-£591. Advancement from the minimum to the maximum shall be by yearly increments.

(ii) Class 2-Foremen:

Plumbing shop, State Engineering

Mechanic, East Perth Workshops. Machine shop, East Perth Workshops. Bodybuilding shop, East Perth Workshops.

Fitting shop, East Perth Workshops. Fitter, Albany Workshops, P.W.D.

Welder, Construction, Metropolitan Water Supply. Electrical Fitter, Fremantle Harbour Trust.

Marginal range per annum: £473-£487-£522.

The employer shall classify each officer within the marginal range herein prescribed and may re-classify any officer, including the foremen specified in subclause (c), within the above range or promote such officer or officers to Class 1, at any time when in the opinion of the employer concerned, the experience of such officer and the nature of his duties or responsibilities warrant such re-classification.

(c) Sub-foremen including foremen specified hereunder:-

> First year £381. Second year £417. Carpenter, Hydraulic Engineers. Motor Mechanic—Metropolitan Water Supply. Carpenter—Fremantle Harbour Works.

(d) Any person appointed to the position of foreman or sub-foreman and not covered by any of the above classifications shall be classified by agreement between the parties, or failing such agreement, leave is hereby granted for either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration.

5.—Definitions.

"Sub-foreman" shall mean a tradesman appointed by the management who is required to assist the foreman to a greater degree in the control of men and operation of the workshops beyond that required of a leading hand to the extent that it requires practically the whole of his time in this direction. Whilst occupying the position of sub-foreman he will be considered as being trained for a position of foreman, and when required must be capable of taking over the duties and responsibilities during any absence of the foreman.

6.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours exclusive of time occupied for meals shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) days per week, Monday to Friday inclusive, subject to the provisions of clause 7 (a) hereunder.

7.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours shall be classed as overtime and paid for as follows:-

- (i) (a) Time and a half for the first four (4) hours after the usual stopping time and double time thereafter. Provided that all work (other than shift work) after 10 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive shall be paid at double time up to the usual starting time.
- (b) Where work other than shift work is done on Saturdays, the workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, but if work is performed in any period from 5 p.m. on Saturdays, the worker shall be paid double time for all time worked after that hour.
- (ii) All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates.

Provided that overtime shall not be construed as meaning the additional time up to a maximum of two (2) hours in each week usually and necessarily worked by foremen as part of their ordinary duties prior to and after the usual starting and finishing times.

8.-Meal Money.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid an allowance of three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof.

9.—District Allowance.

District allowance shall be paid for as provided for in the Award covering engineering trade employees of the State Government.

10.—Camp Allowance.

Foremen and sub-foremen shall be paid the camp allowance applying to the main body of wages men with whom they are working.

11.—Country Work.

- (a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares including sleeper, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all meals and board and lodging.
- (b) A worker travelling to work away from or returning to his usual place of employment shall be paid for the actual travelling time in his ordinary working hours, and in addition thereto, his actual travelling time outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one (1) day.
- (c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.
- (d) In respect to a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth in a passenger train, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.: Provided that this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time when paid for below eight (8) hours in any one (1) day.
- (e) Fares shall be first class including sleeper when necessary except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid.

12.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund to the Minister the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service up to the date of the termination of his services.
- (d) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in centinuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.
- (g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them: Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Minister of his right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.
- (h) Workers regularly working for the Government North of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the Department. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two (2) years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

13.—Public Holidays.

- (a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (ii) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.
- (iii) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (iv) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (v) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

14.—Sick Leave.

- An employee on production of an adequate medical certificate shall be granted sick leave on the following basis:—
- (a) One-sixth of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (b) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed two (2) weeks wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but any portion unused in any calendar year shall be

allowed to accumulate up to the period of one (1) week and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

- (c) The privileges accrued by way of accumulation of sick leave prior to this amendment, or 15 working days, whichever is the greater, shall be credited to the worker concerned.
- (d) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (e) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause except under special circumstances as may be approved by the employer.
- (f) Sick leave shall not be granted in respect of any absence due to an employee's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- (g) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

15.—Long Service Leave.

- (a) An employee who has completed 10 years' continuous service shall be entitled to three calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six calendar months on half pay.
- (b) For each subsequent period of seven years' continuous service an employee shall be entitled to an additional three calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six calendar months on half pay.
- (c) The provisions of subclause (a) and (b) shall apply as from the date of the issue of this Award: Provided that previous continuous service up to that date since the date an employee's last period of long service leave became due shall only be counted in full where the conditions prescribed in relation to that previous service provided for three months' long service leave on full pay on the basis of seven years' continuous service. Where such previous service would only have entitled an employee to three months' long service leave on full pay on the basis of ten years' continuous service, then the first 18 months of such previous service shall not be counted.
- (d) Continuous service shall not include the period during which an employee is on long service leave, or any period exceeding two weeks an employee is absent on leave without pay or any service an employee may have had before reaching the age of eighteen years.
- (e) An employee, who resigns or is dismissed, shall not be entitled to long service leave or payment for long service leave other than that leave that had actually accrued to him prior to the date on which he resigned or the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.
- (f) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an employee is on long service leave will be treated as part of the long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.
- (g) A lump sum payment for long service leave accrued in accordance with this clause and for pro rata long service leave shall be made in the following cases:—
 - (i) To an employee who retires at or over the age of sixty years or who is retired on the grounds of ill-health, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the employee has completed not less than twelve months' continuous service.
 - (ii) To an employee who is retired for any other cause, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the employee had completed not less than three years' continuous service before the date of his retirement.
 - (iii) To the widow of an employee or to such other person as may be approved by the Minister in the event of the death of an employee, provided that no payment shall

be made for pro rata long service leave unless the employee had completed not less than twelve months' continuous service prior to the date of his death.

(h) The calculation of the amount due for long service leave accrued and for pro rata long service leave shall be made at the rate of salary of an employee at the date of retirement, resignation or death whichever applies, and no such payment shall exceed the equivalent of 12 months' salary.

16.—No Reduction.

Any employee who has been, prior to the date of this Award, in receipt of a higher rate of pay than that specified herein, shall not suffer any reduction in such amount solely by reason of the Award.

17.—Contract of Service.

The engagement of a foreman or sub-foreman shall be terminated by one month's notice on either side, such notice to expire on the usual pay day, excepting that an employee guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

18.—Acting in a Higher Capacity.

When a sub-foreman is acting in a higher capacity for one consecutive week or more, he shall be paid the minimum rate of pay of that position in which he is acting.

19.—Board of Reference.

- 1. For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—
 - (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
 - (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- 2. An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912–1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

20.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof and may be amended in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.

21.—Leave to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend clause 4—Wages—at any time during the currency of this Award.

(ii) Add new subclause (e):-

- (e) When an apprentice absents himself from the service of the employer with the intention of terminating his apprenticeship, then the employer's liability to pay any further remuneration shall cease immediately, and the apprentice shall forfeit to the employer a sum equivalent to six (6) months' wages at the rate then applicable.
- 4. These amendments shall operate as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.
