IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of sunk nets, being nets the ground or lead line of which is moved along the bottom and the cork line of which is submerged during the process of hauling, in the whole of the waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers and all their affluents and tributaries, for a period of five years from date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, excepting during the months of May, June, July, August and September in each year in that portion of the waters of the Swan River defined in the Locality Schedule hereto.

## Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Swan River known as Melville Water, together with all its affluents and tributaries except the waters of the Canning River and its affluents and tributaries flowing between straight lines drawn from Point Lewis to Point Belches and from Point Resolution to Point Walter, respectively.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets other than hand scoop nets for a period of five years as from date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

## Schedule.

1. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from the Perth Causeway upwards to the Railway Bridge at Guildford.

2. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from the Middle Swan Bridge connecting the Middle Swan Road upwards to its source.

3. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from a line drawn from the South-Western extremity of Point Resolution to the South-Western extremity of the Point Walter jetty (situated at Point Walter), downwards to a line drawn from the Western extremity of the South Mole to the Western extremity of the North Mole at Fremantle.

4. The waters of the Canning River and of its affluents and tributaries upwards to its source, from a line drawn from a point on the right bank and situate 8 chains North-Westerly from Salter Point, and extending 242 deg. 21 min. 22 chains 3 6/10th links across the said river, the extremities of such line being marked on the ground with steel rails.

5. All that area of Western Australian waters from the Southerly extremity of Mudurup Rocks (South of Cottesloe Jetty) and extending in a Northerly direction to the South-Western extremity of North Street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter of a mile from the foreshore.

6. All that area of Western Australian waters from the South-Western extremity of North Street, Cottesloe, and extending in a Northerly direction to a point one-half mile South of the drain at Swanbourne with a width of a quarter of a mile from the foreshore.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 (2) of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare an open season in respect to Grey Kangaroos (*Macropus Ocydromus*), from the 15th July to 30th November, 1955, in all those portions of the State which lie within the boundaries of the Road Districts specified in the Schedule hereto (excepting Flora and Fauna reserves and National Parks): Provided that every person taking grey kangaroos for gain or reward, or selling their skins, shall hold a license in accordance with the Regulations made under the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or

Traffic Act, 1919-1954.

Shark Bay Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 2319/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1954, namely, that the Shark Bay Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

(1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads.

(2) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs and directions, and for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian.

(3) Clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof.

(4) Clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.
