WHEREAS by section 17, subsection (1) of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation vest in the Minister the moneys, securities for moneys, or goods collected by a war fund or held for any charitable purpose by or on behalf of any person, society, body or association, on being satisfied that a majority of at least three-fourths in number of the persons who are trustees or who have control of the moneys or securities for moneys or goods have

consented thereto; and whereas a majority of at least three-fourths of the Kulin Hospital Scheme Committee has so consented: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby vest in the Chief Secretary, the Minister of the Crown to whom for the time being the administration of the Act is committed, all moneys and securities for moneys held by any person for the Kulin Hospital Scheme.

Road Districts Act, 1919-1951.

Alteration of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Dandaragan, Moora and Gingin Road Districts by—

- (a) transferring that portion of the Dandaragan Road District described in Schedule "A" hereto to the Moora Road District to form portion of the North Ward thereof;
- (b) transferring that portion of the Dandaragan Road District described in Schedule "B" hereto to the Moora Road District to form portion of the West Ward thereof;
- (c) transferring that portion of the Moora Road District described in Schedule "C" hereto to the Dandaragan Road District;
- (d) transferring that portion of the Gingin Road District described in Schedule "D" hereto to the Dandaragan Road District.

Schedule "A."

Transfer of Territory from the Dandaragan Road District to the Moora District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Western boundary of Melbourne Location 2001 (reserve 16839) and a Northern boundary of the Dandaragan Road District and extending Easterly, Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that road district to the Easternmost boundary of location 3391; thence Northerly, Westerly, again Northerly and again Westerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 3347; thence Northerly to and along that boundary to the Southern boundary of location 3463; thence Westerly, Northerly and North-Easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 3599; thence Northerly to and along the Western boundaries of locations 3599, 3597, 2030 and 3169 (portion of reserve 18256) to the South-Eastern corner of location 3109 (portion of reserve 18256); thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 3109 and 1948 to the latter's South-Western corner, and thence Northerly along the Western boundaries of locations 1984 and 2001 aforesaid to the starting point. (Public Plans 63/80 and 90/80.)

Schedule "B."

Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Northern boundary of Melbourne Location 3617 and an Eastern boundary of the Dandaragan Road District and extending Southerly along that district boundary to the Northern boundary of location 3627; thence Westerly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 3626; thence Northerly to and along that boundary to the Southern boundary of location 3122; thence Westerly, Northerly and Easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 3617 aforesaid, and thence Northerly and Easterly to and along the Western and Northern boundaries of that location to the starting point. Transfer of Territory from the Moora Road District to the Dandaragan Road District.

All that portion of Melbourne Location 3391 situate South and East of the common road district boundary. (Public Plan 63/80.)

Schedule "D."

Transfer of Territory from the Gingin Road District to the Dandaragan Road District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and the Northern boundary of the Gingin Road District and extending Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of that road district to the right bank of the Moore River; thence generally Westerly downwards along that bank to the Western boundary of reserve 425; thence Northerly along that boundary to the North-Western corner of that reserve; thence West along the Northernmost boundary of Swan Location 1375 and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally North-Westerly along that low water mark to the starting point. (Public Plans 30/80, 31/80, 58/80 and 59/80.)

Mines Regulation Act, 1946-1954.
