PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1954, is as follows:—

- (2) No licensee shall in the Goldfields district— $\,$
 - (a) have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of liquor; or
 - (b) sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises.

at any time before nine o'clock in the morning or after eleven o'clock at night upon any day in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license.

Provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, by proclamation extend or reduce the hours in any licensing district or part of a district within the Goldfields district, and this subsection shall have effect as so modified, but any such proclamation may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, by varied or revoked by a subsequent proclamation:

And whereas by a proclamation dated the 7th day of May, 1952, the hours were extended in specified districts within the Goldfields district and by a proclamation dated the 20th day of February, 1953, were further extended in respect of those publicans' general licenses within the Kalgoorlie licensing district specified therein: And whereas the Licensing Court on the 15th day of July, 1955, made a recommendation to the Governor in respect of those hours: Now, therefore I, the Governor

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Licensing Court do hereby proclaim as follows:—

- (1) Paragraph (1) (b) of the proclamation dated the 20th day of Feburary, 1953, is hereby varied by substituting for the figures word and letters, "3 p.m. and 6 p.m. the figures word and letters, "3.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m."
- (2) The Second Schedule of the proclamation dated the 7th day of May, 1952, is hereby varied by deleting the word, "Kalgoorlie" therefrom.
- (3) The holder of a license mentioned in the Schedule to this proclamation in respect of premises in the Kalgoorlie Licensing District, a district within the Goldfields district, shall not—

have or keep the licensed premises open for the sale of liquor; or sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon the licensed premises;

upon-

- (a) Anzac Day, the twenty-fifth day of April;
 Good Friday; or Christmas Day;
 whether those respective days fall on a Sunday or any other day of the week at any time;
- (b) Sunday, except during two periods, one of which shall be between 10.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and the other of which shall be between 3.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

and then only during either period in accordance with the provisions of section 122 (2) (c) (iii) of the Act:

(c) any day of the week, other than a day mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs (a) and (b) except between 9 a.m. and 11 p.m.

(4) This proclamation does not prejudice the operation in the Kalgoorlie Licensing District of the provisions of the Licensing Act-

> relating to the holders of licenses other than those mentioned in the Schedule to this proclamation; or contained in section 44, and in subsections (3) and (4) of section 121 and in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 122 of that Act.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 17 (3), subsection (1) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the municipalities and road districts during the periods as set out in Schedule No. 1 hereunder, and to approve of the boundaries of the areas described in Schedules Nos. 1 to 15 (inclusive) hereunder.

Schedule No. 3. Cranbrook Road District.

Schedule No. 5. Upper Chapman Road District.

The dividing line between Zones 1 and 1C in the Upper Chapman Road District shall be a line commencing at a point on the present Upper Chapman Road District boundary situate in prolongation Northerly of the Western boundary of Victoria Location 4073 and extending generally South-Easterly to and along the Western and part of the Southern boundary of that location, the Western and Southern boundaries of location 7042, part of the Western and Southern boundaries of location

7024, the Northern and Eastern boundaries of location 5959, part of the Eastern boundary of location 6246, the Northern boundaries of location 3608 and 3609 and onwards to the Eastern side of road No. 8068; thence Southerly along that side, through Whelarra Townsite, and onwards along the Western boundary of location 3618 and again onwards to the North-Western corner of location 6285; thence along the Northern and part of the Eastern boundary of that location, the Northern boundary of location 4041, the Northern, North-Eastern, and part of the Eastern boundary of location 7932 to the Southern side of road No. 7101; thence generally Easterly along that side to the North-Western corner of location 7083; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of that location and onwards to the Northern boundary of location 8256; thence Westerly, generally Southerly, and generally North-Easterly along part of the North, North-Western, Western, Southern and South-Eastern boundaries of that location, the Western and Southern boundaries of location 3346 and onwards to the Eastern side of road No. 8084; thence Southerly along that side and the Western boundaries of locations 6789 and 6788, part of the Southern boundary of the latter location, the Western boundaries of location 6791 and 4460 and onwards to the right bank of the Greenough River, a point on the Upper Chapman Road District boundary. (Public Plans 160/80, 160D/40, 160C/40 and 157B/40.)

Schedule No. 6. West Arthur Road District.

Schedule No. 7. Wandering Road District.

The dividing line between Zones 1A and 2 in the Wandering Road District shall be bounded by lines starting from the centre of the Hotham River situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of Avon Location 2063 and extending Northerly to and along said boundary to its North-Western corner; thence Easterly along its Northern boundary and onwards to the centre of road No. 770; thence generally North-North-Easterly along said centre to the centre of road No. 149; thence generally North-Westerly along said centre to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Western boundary of location 27032; thence Northerly to and along the Western boundary of reserve No. 910 to its North-Western corner; thence Easterly along boundaries of said reserve and location 15501 to the Western boundary of location 17852; thence Northerly, Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of said location to a point in prolongation South-Westerly of the centre of road No. 4386; thence generally East-North-Easterly to and along the said centre to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 23712; thence Northerly and Easterly to and along boundaries of said location to the Western boundary

of location 17826; thence generally Northerly and Westerly along boundaries of locations 17826, 5609 and 17825 to the latter's South-Western corner; thence generally Northerly and Easterly along boundaries of locations 17825, 17824 and 5607 to a Northern boundary of the Wandering Road District aforesaid.

Schedule No. 8. Williams Road District.

The dividing line between zones 1A and 2 in the Williams Road District shall be a line starting from a point on an existing Northern boundary of the road district, the said point being on the Southern boundary of Williams Location 1355 situate in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern side of road No. 3972 and extending generally South-Easterly to and along the Eastern sides of roads No. 3972, 58, 2995 and 2874 to join the Southern boundary of the road district at the North-Western corner of Wellington Location 3463.

(Public Plans 451B/40 and 450/80.)

All that portion of the Gingin Road District lying East of a line commencing at the North-West corner of Swan Location 1375 on the Northern boundary of the road district and extending Southerly and South-Easterly along the Western boundary of location 1375; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 558; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 558; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 558; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 890; thence South-Westerly and South-Easterly along boundaries of M. lot 1428; thence Easterly along the Southern boundary of the lot to its South-East corner; thence Southerly to and along the Western boundary of location 3229 and to and along the Eastern boundary of location 2497 to its South-East corner; thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of the said location 2497 to the North-Eastern corner of location 2557, thence Southerly, Easterly, Northerly, again Easterly and again Southerly along boundaries of location 2557 and 2498 to the South-East corner of location 2498; thence Southerly to the North-Western corner of location 2445; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 2445 and onwards to the South-East corner of location 3077, thence generally South-Westerly to the North-Western corner of location 1373, thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 1373 and onwards to the

left bank of the Gingin Brook; thence Westerly along the said left bank to the North-Western corner of location 615; thence Southerly and Easterly along boundaries of location 615 to the North-Western corner of location 1026; thence Southerly along the Western boundaries of locations 1026, 2421 and 3220; thence Easterly along the Southern boundary of location 3220 and 2857 to the North-West corner of 2852; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 2852; thence Westerly and Southerly along part of the Northern and Western boundaries of location 1448 to the North-East corner of location 1591; thence Westerly and Southerly along the Northern and part of the Western boundaries of location 1591, to the North-East corner of location 1656; thence Westerly, South-Easterly and Easterly along the Northern, the South-Western and part of the Southern boundaries of location 1656; thence South-Easterly along the South-Western boundary of location 2957 to its South-West corner; thence in a straight line from that point to the junction between the Western boundary of the stock route and the Southern boundary of the Gingin Road District.

A dividing line in the Plantagenet Road District starting at the North-Eastern corner of Plantag-enet Location 372, a point on the Eastern boun-dary of the road district and extending Westerly along the Northern boundary of that location to the Western side of Chester Pass Road (road No. 991) thence generally Northerly along that side of road 991 to the South-East corner of location 4577, thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of location 4577 to the South-East corner of location 4763, thence Northerly along the Eastern boundary of location 4763, thence Westerly along the Northern boundaries of locations 4763 and 5618 to the North-West corner of location 5618, thence generally North-West to the South-East corner of location 4583, thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 4583 and 4026, thence Northwards along the Western boundaries of location 4026 and 1150 to the South-East corner of location 1066, thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 1066 and 4935, thence Northerly along the Western boundary of location 4935 to the South-East corner of location 5626, thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of location 5626, thence generally South-Westerly to the North-East corner of location 3334, thence Westerly along the Northern boundary of location 3334 and 5898 to the Eastern boundary of location 4088, thence Southerly, Westerly and Northerly along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of location 4088 and the Southern and Western boundaries of location 1048 to the South-East corner of location 3335, thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of location 3335 to its South-West corner, thence generally Westerly to the South-East corner of location 5195, thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of location 5195 and the Northern boundary of 3751, thence Southerly along the Western boundary of location 3751 to the North-East corner of location 3752, thence Westerly along the Northern boundary of location 3752, thence Northerly along the Eastern boundary of location 18, thence Westerly along the Northern boundary of location 18 to its North-West corner; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of that location to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of location 364; thence Westerly and Northerly to and along boundaries of location 264 and 1102 and anywards to the Southern location 364 and 1103 and onwards to the Southern boundary of location 17; thence generally Westerly and Southerly along boundaries of location 17, 3141 and B6 to the North-Eastern corner of location 139; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of that location to the Northern side of road No. 686; thence generally Westerly along that side and the Northern side of road No. 1256 to the Eastern side of road No. 8376; thence generally Northerly along that side to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northern side of a road on the Northern boundary of location 1050; thence Westerly to and along that side of the road to a

surveyed road on the Westernmost boundary of location 2816; thence North-Westerly along the Eastern side of that road to road No. 2366; thence generally Northerly along the Eastern side of road No. 2366 and the Eastern side of road No. 3318 to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 793; and thence Westerly to and along the Southern boundaries of location 793. 750, 748, 1085 and 743 and terminating at the South-Western corner of the said location 743 at a point on a Northern boundary of the Road District.

Schedule No. 12. Zone 4A.

Portion of Augusta-Margaret River, Nannup and Manjimup Road Districts bounded by lines commencing from a point on the seashore at Point mencing from a point on the seashore at Point Frederick in Flinders Bay and extending generally Northwards along the Eastern shores of the Blackwood River Estuary and Hardy Inlet and continuing generally Northerly and Easterly along the left bank of the Blackwood River, thence generally East-North-Easterly along the said bank to the left bank of Nannup Brook; thence generally Easterly along the said bank to the Nannup Brook. Electric Bread Toasters.

Electric bread toaster means any appliance which is intended primarily for toasting bread or similar foods.

C101-1950 Ap.

Prescribed Class of Electrical Appliance.

Electric Grillers.

Electric griller means a heating appliance the nominal rating of which does not exceed 15 amperes, which is intended or may be used for heating or grilling food, or for heating cooking utensils standing on the appliance, but does not include any such appliance which incorporates a cooking compartment fitted with a heating unit or units provided solely for heating the cooking compartment. C102—1952 Ap.

Published. Specification.

Electric Radiators.

Electric radiator means an appliance incorporating an electric heating unit which when in operation heats the atmosphere in its immediate vicinity by radiation and/or convection, but does not include any appliance solely or principally suitable for cooking, or for special application of heat to definite materials or substances, or any appliance in which the heating element is completely enclosed by a medium such as to prevent all exposed parts reaching a temperature greater than one hundred and twenty degrees centigrade.

C103-1952 Ap.

Electric Portable Immersion Heaters.

Electric portable immersion heater means a portable electrical appliance designed for connection by means of a flexible cord and intended for heating liquid in which it may be immersed, but does not include electric jugs or other vessels to which heating elements are permanently fixed or heating elements intended for permanent fixing in such vessels.

C104-1948 Ap.

Electric Kettles or Electric Saucepans.

Electric kettle or electric saucepan means a portable vessel in which is incorporated an electric heating element intended for heating liquids, and includes coffee percolators, teapots and gluepots, but does not include electric urns or urn type percolators of a capacity of one gallon or more, or equipment designed and/or manufactured specifically for sterilising purposes.

C105-1954 Ap.

Electric Jugs.

Electric jug means a jug or similar vessel having a body of non-metallic material and in which is incorporated a bare electric heating element, sheathed resistor type electric heating element, or electrodes.

C106-1952 Ap.

Electric Trons.

Electric iron means a smoothing and/or pressing hand iron which is heated by means of an electric heating unit forming part of the appliance, and which is suitable for laundry, domestic, tailor's pressing or similar use.

C107-1952 Ap

Apparatus Connectors.

Apparatus connector means the combination of an inlet plug and an inlet socket, the inlet plug being that portion which contains the spring contacts and is arranged for attachment to a flexible cord, and the inlet socket being that portion which contains the pins and is mounted on or forms an integral part of an electrical appliance.

C109-1948 Ap

Earth Leakage Circuit Breakers.

Earth leakage circuit breakers means a switch intended to open a low or medium pressure circuit automatically when a predetermined difference of potential is applied between a terminal of the switch which is intended for connection to the metal casings, frames and/or conduits of an electrical installation and a second terminal of the switch which is intended for connection to the general mass of the earth, but does not include earth leakage relays.

C110-1951 Ap.

Miniature Over-current Circuit Breakers.

Miniature over-current circuit breaker means an enclosed airbreak switch, the nominal rating of which does not exceed fifty amperes, intended for opening a low or medium pressure circuit automatically under predetermined conditions of over-current and having as its main function the prevention of continued overloading of wiring.

C111-1951 Ap.

Plugs and Plug Sockets.

Plug means a device having pins and intended by its insertion in a plug socket to make a detachable connection between the contacts of such plug-socket and the conductors of a flexible cord or cable.

C112-1951 Ap.

Prescribed Class of Electrical Appliance.

Plug-socket means a device for fixing at a point at which the fixed wiring of an electrical installation terminates and having contacts intended for making a detachable connection with the pins of a plug.

Published. Specification.

Wall Switches.

Wall switch means a switch, whether single-pole, double-pole, two-way, or intermediate, which is designed for surface, flush, or semi-flush mounting on some part of a building, structure, or switchboard and by means of which a circuit can be opened and closed under no-load or normal-load conditions by the direct manual operation of a dolly (lever), a turn-button, or press-button, but does not include:—

Ceiling pull switches.

Switches for attachment to or insertion in flexible cords.

Switches specially designed for and incorporated in appliances.

Momentary-on and momentary-off press-button switches.

Automatic or electrically operated switches.

Door contact switches, and

Switches of a type normally used other than as wall switches and acknowledged by the Commission to be outside the ordinary trade designation of wall switch.

C113-1952 Ap.

Electric Soldering Irons.

Electric soldering iron means a portable tool, part of which is a soldering bit heated by means of an electric heating unit contained within the tool.

C114-1952 Ap.

Flexible Cords.

Flexible cord means an insulated cable, the conductors, insulation and covering of which are such as to allow of flexibility, and in which no conductor exceeds .007 sq. in. cross section.

C116—1950 Ap. C147—1950 Ap.

Normal Bayonet Lampholders.

Normal bayonet lampholder means a device by means of which an electric lamp having a normal bayonet cap* may be connected in an electric circuit.

*A normal bayonet cap (International size B22) is a bayonet cap comprising a cylindrical outer wall, which carries two pins for engaging in slots in the lampholder, and having a diameter of about $\frac{7}{8}$ in. and carrying two contacts insulated from each other and the outer wall.

C117—1950 Ap.

Electric Handlamps.

Electric handlamp means a fitting intended for attachment to a flexible cord to hold and to permit of the holding of a portable electric lamp and intended for use on direct or alternating current circuits at low or extra low pressures, but does not include—

- (a) portable standards, portable brackets and similar fittings of a decorative nature, although they be movable and not fixed; or
- (b) any handlamp which-
 - (i) is intended for operation at a pressure not exceeding twenty-five volts, and

 - (iv) is fitted with a guard of such size that it will not accommodate any 60 watt 240 yolt lamp.

Normal bayonet lampholder adaptor means a connecting device capable of being inserted in a lampholder of the normal bayonet (B22) type, and either suitable for connection to a flexible cord, or fitted with a lampholder or lampholders and being with or without a switch or switches.

Cord Extension Sockets.

Cord extension socket means a device arranged for attachment to a flexible cord and having contacts whereby a detachable connection may be made with the pins of a plug, but does not include such devices which are enclosed or are intended for use solely where they will be enclosed within an appliance in such a way that they are not exposed to personal contact. C120-1954 Ap.

Plug Socket Adaptors.

Plug socket adaptor means a single or multiple connecting device (other than a plug) for insertion in a plug socket.

C122-1954 Ap.

Electric Razors—(Electric Dry Shavers).

Electric razor means a device incorporating an electric motor or vibrator mechanism actuating cutters intended for removal of beard or similar purposes and includes any special apparatus connector, any flexible cord, any resistance and/or transformer supplied with an electric razor to enable its connection to supply mains, but does not include any razor which can be operated only by a battery having a terminal pressure not exceeding 25 volts.

C125-1952 Ap.

Cord-line Switches.

Cord-line switch means a device intended for insertion in a flexible cord and containing a switch capable of making and breaking the connection of one or more conductors of the flexible cord, but not including switches intended for the series-parallel control of heating elements.

C127-1954 Ap.

Portable Lamp Standards and Brackets.

Portable lamp standard or bracket means an electric light fitting which may be placed on a horizontal surface or attached by spring clamps or other suitable means to vertical or inclined surfaces, and which are not intended to be fixed in position, such fittings being intended for connection by flexible cords, but not including—

- (a) any portable lamp standard or bracket fitted with a fluorescent or other gaseous discharge lamp; or
- (b) any electric handlamp.

C128-1948 Ap.

Portable Electric Ranges.

Portable electric range means an electric cooking appliance the nominal rating of which does not exceed 10 amperes comprising a cooking compartment fitted with at least one element provided solely for heating the compartment, and with or without one or more heating units which are intended or may be used to heat a cooking vessel or vessels standing thereon.

C146-1952 Ap.

Non-flexible Electric Bed Warmers.

Non-flexible electric bed warmer means an appliance which is designed to be heated by means of an electric heating element enclosed in a rigid container, and which is intended or may be used to heat a bed in which it is placed.

C148-1950 Ap.

Flexible Electric Heating Pad.

Flexible electric heating pad means an appliance in the form of a pad which is heated by means of an electric heating element contained within a flexible enclosure or envelope, the surface heating area of which does not exceed six square feet; such surface area being the projected area (projected on a horizontal plane on which the pad is laid out flat) of that portion of a pad in which the heating element is built; but it does not include any marginal hems or flaps surrounding the portion into which the heating element is built.

Portable Electric Vacuum Cleaners.

Portable electric vacuum cleaner means a portable appliance designed for operation at low voltage incorporating an electric motor which, by causing movement of air, is intended to remove dust and associated foreign matter by suction, with or without the assistance of driven brushes, beaters or the like, but does not include any such appliance having a maximum loading exceeding 500 watts.

C153-1951 Ap.

Prescribed Class of Electrical Appliance. Decorative Lighting Outfits.

Decorative lighting outfit means a set of miniature type lampholders (with or without lamps) together with conductors, such lampholders and conductors being either unassembled or assembled for connection to an outlet in an electrical installation.

C152-1950 Ap.

Extra-low Voltage Transformers.

Extra-low voltage transformer means a fixed or portable transformer rated at not more than 1 K.V.A. for connection on the primary side to a low voltage supply and having a maximum secondary voltage of less than 50 volts and intended for energising lighting and bell circuits, electric toys, portable electric tools, and similar apparatus designed for operation at extra-low voltage but does not include—

- (i) transformers for use in electronic equipment including radio and television apparatus, battery chargers and the like;
- transformers associated with instruments and laboratory apparatus;
- (iii) transformers for use in mines;
- (iv) railway signalling transformers;
- (v) transformers which are incorporated in appliances in such a way that all parts of the secondary circuit are insulated for 250 volts or are inaccessible to personal contact;
- (vi) transformers of a type which normally is used otherwise than for energising bell and lighting circuits, electric toys, portable electric tools, and similar apparatus designed for operation at extra-low voltage and which the Commission acknowledges in writing to be outside the definition of an extra-low voltage transformer as herein defined.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 29 of 1955.

Between the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commismissioners, Applicants, and Merchant Service Guild of Australasia, Western Australian Section Union of Workers, Fremantle, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties

have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

Schedule.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Fremantle Harbour Trust (Pilots) Award, 1955, and replaces Award No. 53 of 1948 as amended by No. 233 of 1950

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all pilots in the service of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and shall operate within or in the vicinity of the boundaries of the Fremantle Harbour as described in the Schedule to the Fremantle Harbour Trust

4.—Definitions.

"Trust" shall mean the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

"Pilot" means any pilot employed by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

5.—Rates of Pay.

- (a) Basic wage—£12 6s. 6d. per week, representing £642 19s. 1d. per annum.
 - (b) The margins over the basic wage shall be:— First six months service—£1,070 14s. 9d. Thereafter—£1,205 14s. 9d.
- (c) In computing service, the period served by pilots with the Trust prior to the date of this Award shall be taken into account.
- (d) Salaries shall be payable weekly up to and including the date of payment.
- (e) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this clause at any time during the currency of this Award.

6.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) (i) Forty-five (45) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in consecutive hours on any five (5) days of the week at the discretion of the Trust.
- (ii) Pilots shall be advised of their rostered hours two (2) weeks in advance. Such rostered hours shall be regarded as approximate only and shall be subject to change where necessitated by later shipping movement advices.

- (iii) Each pilot shall, a week in turn, be rostered as "Pilot Special Duty." The daily overtime provisions in clause 8 (a) and the consecutive hour provision of subclause (a) (i) of this clause shall not apply to such pilot, whose rostered hours may be varied by the Trust in any manner deemed necessary to meet the pilotage requirements.
- (iv) The Trust may substitue any other pilot during the absence or non-availability of the "Pilot Special Duty."
- (b) For the purpose of this clause, a day shall be from midnight to midnight.
- (c) The Harbour Master or other officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose, may book off or exempt a pilot from duty for any period during any of his rostered hours on the five working days of the week, and during the period so booked off a pilot shall not be required for service unless in case of urgent necessity or of emergency.

7.—Days Off.

- (a) Pilots shall be rostered to have two (2) days off each week, such days off to be consecutive where possible. For the purpose of this clause, a week shall mean Saturday to the Friday of the following week.
- (b) The Trust shall roster one of the said days one month beforehand, and of the other, twenty-four hours notice shall be given: Provided that if through unforeseen circumstances, or necessity, a pilot is recalled to duty on either of his rostered days off, he shall be paid overtime for the period of recall in accordance with the provisions of clause 8 (b) of this Award.

8.—Overtime.

- (a) Overtime shall mean and include all time of duty in excess of eleven (11) hours per day or forty-five (45) hours per week on the five (5) working days of the week, Saturday to the following Friday, inclusive, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half per hour.
- (b) A pilot who is recalled to duty on a rostered day off shall be paid overtime for the period of recall at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, with a minimum payment as for three (3) hours.

9.—Meal Payments.

A pilot who, because of actual pilotage duties, is involved in purchasing a meal away from his residence, shall be reimbursed by the Trust for reasonable out of pocket expenses so incurred.

10.—Residential Area.

Pilots shall reside within a radius of six (6) miles of the Pilot Station.

11.—Telephone.

A telephone shall be installed in the residence of each pilot and the rental and a reasonable amount for calls shall be paid by the Trust.

12.—Annual Leave.

- (a) After each year of his service, a pilot shall be entitled to annual leave for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days. This leave shall be taken in accordance with a programme to be prepared in January of each year.
 - (b) (1) If, after giving a pilot notice of the date upon which his leave will commence, the Trust, within two weeks of such date of commencement, directs the deferment of the leave,
 - (2) where a pilot has actually commenced his annual leave and is recalled to duty before his leave has expired,

the Trust shall reimburse the pilot all moneys reasonably incurred and forfeited by him in respect of such leave.

13.—Long Service Leave.

A pilot who has served the Trust for a period of seven years shall be entitled to three months long service leave.

Leave to which pilots are entitled under the provisions of this clause may be allowed to accumulate for such period and under such conditions as may be approved by the Trust, but not otherwise.

14.—Sickness and Accident.

- (a) (i) A pilot who is incapacitated through sickness or injury other than that arising in the course of his employment may, upon production of a medical certificate as to his incapacity, be granted sick leave, with pay, for such period and upon such conditions as may be determined by the Trust.
- (ii) Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the pilot, or where a medical certificate is not produced when requested by the Trust, the pilot shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty: Provided that any period of absence without pay may at the discretion of the Trust be deemed to be leave without pay.
- (b) A pilot who in the course of his employment and while on duty or acting under the instructions of the Trust, receives an injury or contracts any sickness which incapacitates him from duty, may be granted his usual remuneration for such period as may be determined by the Trust and, in addition, reasonable medical, surgical, hospital, or other expenses incurred thereby may be paid by the Trust: Provided that, in the event of the pilot electing to proceed with a claim at common law or under the Employers' Liability Act, any payments made by the Trust under this subclause shall be deducted from the amount of any judgment so given against the Trust.

15.—Engagement and Dismissal.

- (a) The contract of service may be determined by three months notice on either side: Provided that a pilot may be instantly dismissed or suspended for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.
- (b) A pilot shall serve for a term of six months on probation before his appointment as such is confirmed, and during such period shall be deemed to be on a weekly engagement.
- (c) Each pilot shall submit himself to such annual medical examination as to physical fitness and vision as the Trust may require. The cost of such examination shall be paid by the Trust.

16.—Record of Duty.

Each pilot shall enter daily in a book or books, to be provided by the Trust, a record of all pilotage services performed by him, and such other information as the Trust may require.

The record shall also contain the following information:—

- (a) Time of duty on each day and the total hours of duty for each week.
- (b) Time booked off pursuant to clause 6 (c).
- (c) The actual time engaged in piloting duty, including therein all travelling time other than that occupied in going to and from residence and wharf or office.
- (d) All waiting time on vessels, waiting pratique and/or delayed departures.
- (e) Weekly summaries of the information in (a), (b) (c) and (d).

17.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the 1st day of March, 1955.

Part I-Application.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers engaged in vocations mentioned herein and employed in or in connection with the production of iron ore in Yampi Sound.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year from the date hereof, and its provisions shall become applicable on the first pay period commencing after the said date.

Part II-General Provisions.

Clauses under this heading are to be operative throughout the industry except where otherwise specifically provided herein.

5.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers, on Mondays to Fridays inclusive not more than eight (8) hours, and on Saturdays not more than four (4) hours.

- (b) When more than one shift is worked on the surface, forty (40) hours shall constitute a weeks work on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, not more than eight (8) hours, inclusive of crib time, and on Saturdays not more than four (4) hours, exclusive of crib time.
- (c) Provided, however, that in the case of continuous and/or shift work this provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty (80) per fort-night to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each, including crib time: Provided further, that by agreement between an employer and the Union, the hours of work may be worked under a roster which shall provide for an average of forty (40) hours per week, spread over a period of three (3) weeks.
- (d) The actual times for starting and finishing work shall be as agreed upon between the employer and the workers, but, in the event of these parties being unable to agree, shall be as fixed by a Board of Reference constituted under clause 15 of this Award.
 - (e) Nothing herein shall apply to cooks.
- (f) Nothing contained in this clause or in clause 4 hereof shall apply to watchmen whose hours of duty shall not, without payment of overtime, exceed (80) per fortnight. Such hours shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer. Overtime and all work performed on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, or Christmas Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half time and a half.
- (g) In all cases in reckoning the time of duty of workers covered by Division (ii) of Part III, of this Award, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam in starting up or closing down engines or in banking fires shall be included.
- (h) Crib time for shift workers shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes and shall be taken at the employer's convenience at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work.
- (i) One (1) break of ten (10) minutes shall be allowed during the morning of each shift to all workers during working hours: Provided that such break shall not prevent the continuous operation of the power station, electric shovels, quarry transport, crushing plant and shiploading or other plant that should operate continuously throughout the day or shift.

6.—Overtime.

- (a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Except as hereinafter provided, all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday and Labour Day, shall be paid at double time, except when employed effecting repairs to or renewals of plant or machinery in order to enable work to be safely resumed or for maintaining the continuity of electric light, power and water supply (not including the installation of new machinery or plant) in which case the rate shall be time and a half.

With respect to workers covered by Division (ii) of Part III of this Award, all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

- (c) When computing overtime the district allowances shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.
- (d) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

- (e) A worker who is called upon to start work before his usual starting time when he has worked overtime in the preceding shift shall be paid double time up to his usual starting time.
- (f) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid overtime rates until he gets his meal time.
- (g) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the premises he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (h) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time that he holds himself in readiness.
- (i) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required on the job.
- (j) Nothing contained in subclauses (a), (b), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h) and (i) hereof shall apply to cooks.
- (k) All time worked by cooks outside the daily spread of twelve (12) hours or in excess of forty (40) hours in any one week shall be deemed overtime and paid for at the rate of time and one-third: Provided that overtime in excess of seven (7) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

7.—Holidays.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of three (3) consecutive weeks leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months continuous service with such employer.
- (b) Seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one (1) week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof. Where a worker with twelve (12) months continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of three (3) consecutive weeks annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof increased by one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
- (c) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (d) If after one (1) months continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-quarter (\frac{1}{4}) of a weeks pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service, or in the case of a worker referred to in subclause (b) hereof, such payment shall be one-third (\frac{1}{3}) of a weeks pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each such months he is so engaged.
- (e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

- (f) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (d) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

8.—Travelling.

- (a) The employer shall provide transport from Perth or any port North thereof in Western Australia to the place of employment, the fare to be deducted from the subsequent earnings of the worker in such a manner as is agreed upon in writing by the parties: Provided that, if the worker completes six (6) months continuous service with the employer, the fare shall be refunded to the worker by the employer: Provided further that if the worker completes two (2) years continuous service with the employer, the fare to Perth or the original port of embarkation in Western Australia shall be paid by the employer or pro rata after twelve (12) months of service.
- (b) Board and lodging at Derby shall be provided by the employer whilst the worker is waiting for the first available and suitable transport to his place of employment.
- (c) One (1) days wages at ordinary rates shall be allowed whilst travelling to the place of employment, irrespective of the place of commencement of the worker's journey, the length thereof, or the means of transport.

9.—District Allowance.

In addition to the wages prescribed in clauses 28, 29, 32, 34, 37, 40, 43 and 48 of this Award, an allowance of one pound (£1) per week shall be paid to all adult workers. Provided that no district allowance shall be payable during the period of annual holidays prescribed in clause 7 hereof if the worker leaves the Award area.

10.—Board and Lodging.

If required, workers shall be provided with suitable board and lodging. Such lodging shall include the provision of a stretcher, mattress and pillow.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct the sum of twenty-eight shillings (28s.) per week from the wages of each worker for the board and lodging so provided.

11.—Payment of Wages. Wages shall be paid fortnightly.

12.—Accidents and Transportation.

In cases of accident the employer shall make the necessary provision for the transport of the injured worker to the nearest hospital town and, when necessary, some person shall accompany the injured worker, such attendant to be transported free and to be paid for all lost time and reasonable expenses incurred.

13.—Water Supply.

The employer shall provide potable water for workers, in quantities not less than three (3) gallons per day per man.

14.—Union Representative.

(a) The duly appointed representatives of the Unions on the works shall be recognised by the employer.

(b) In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer.

15.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any or them;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.—Contract of Service.

- (a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 18, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Award.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for wilful misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

18.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

19.—Time and Wages Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker governed by this Award, the nature of his work and hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record of each worker governed by this Award shall be open for inspection to a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours at the employer's office or other convenient place and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

20.—Posting of Award and Union Notices.

The employer shall keep a copy of this Award in a convenient place in the workshop, and he shall also provide a notice board for the posting of Union notices. All notices to be submitted to the employer for approval before being posted.

Piecework.

There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rates fixed by this Award:—

- (a) Where the engagement is for a period of time, such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof, without the written consent of the worker.
- (b) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work, the amount of work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than five per cent. (5%).
- (c) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.
- (d) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages and allowances fixed by this Award for the work done.
- (e) The price of any article to be supplied by the employer to the worker shall be specified prior to the contract being entered into, and shall not be increased during the period of the contract.
- (f) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Award, or by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.
- (g) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wages remuneration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period they have been employed at the rate fixed by this Award or by the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors.

A printed copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the change room on the works.

22.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Union.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

23.—Preference.

- (a) Preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Award shall be given to financial members of the Unions who are parties to this Award or to persons who give to the employer an undertaking in writing to make application to join such Union within one (1) month of accepting employment: Provided that—
 - (i) there are members of the relevant Union or intending members applying as aforesaid, equally qualified with other workers offering their services to perform the particular work required to be done and ready and willing to undertake the same; and
 - (ii) the rules of each Union shall permit any worker of good character with the requisite qualifications (if any) coming within the scope of this Award to become a member of the Union upon payment of the subscription and/or entrance fee prescribed by the registered rules.
- (b) Where a worker, not having been a member of the relevant Union at the time of his engagement, applies for membership of the Union within one (1) month after his engagement, it shall be deemed that no question of preference has arisen unless and until his application is rejected for good cause.
- (c) If during the continuance of this Award anything in the nature of a strike occurs in the industry hereby regulated, or, if there is any restriction in output by the workers or any section thereof acting in concert, the benefit of this clause shall thereupon cease and determine insofar as the particular Union or Unions involved is or are concerned. For further assurance and without modification of or prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this subclause, the employer may at any time apply to the Court, upon giving seven (7) days notice to the Union for a declaration hereunder and the consequential cancellation of this clause, and the Court, upon cause being shown, shall make a declaration and order accordingly appropriate to the circumstances of the particular case.
- (d) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to junior workers or apprentices.

24.—Junior Workers.

(a) Unapprenticed male junior workers (under 21 years of age) may be employed in any of the vocations mentioned in this Award, in the proportion of one (1) to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) adult workers.

Junior workers shall receive wages and proportionate district allowance in accordance with the following scale:—

- (b) The term "junior worker" shall not apply to a worker under 21 years of age who has completed his term of apprenticeship.
- (c) In the event of any dispute between the Union concerned and the employer as to the appropriateness of the employment of a junior worker, the matter may be referred to a Board of Reference.

25.—Higher Duties.

(a) Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified

- at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.
- (b) A worker's regular rate of pay shall not be reduced whilst he is temporarily employed at work classified with a lower minimum, owing to shortage of material occasioned by the employer's default, or for any other cause within the control of the employer.

26.—Shift Work.

- (a) Men working shifts not subject to weekly rotation shall be paid for each shift other than a day shift at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (b) All other shift workers—five per cent. (5%) in addition to the relevant rate prescribed in this Award.
- (c) With respect to workers under this Award working more than one (1) shift, any worker whose ordinary rotation shift falls on a Sunday or on any of the abovementioned holidays may be employed at ordinary time. Any shift worker required to work more than six (6) shifts consecutively shall be paid for the seventh shift at double time.

27.—Special Rates and Provisions.

(Applying only to workers covered by Divisions (iii) and (v) of Part III.)

- (a) Height money: Workers engaged in the erection of steel frame buildings, bridges, and gasometers at a height of fifty (50) feet or more above the nearest horizontal plane shall be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per day extra.
- (b) (i) Goggles, glasses and gloves, or other efficient substitute therefor, shall be available for the personal use of any worker engaged in welding.
- (ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt thereof and on leaving employment shall return the same to the employer.
- (iii) During the time the same are on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.
- (iv) No worker shall lend another worker the goggles, glasses or gloves or substitutes issued to such first mentioned worker, and if the same are lent, both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.
- (v) Before goggles, glasses or gloves or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the employer to another worker, they shall be effectively sterilised.
- (c) A tradesman (not employed as a first-class welder) who in addition to his employment as such is also required to do welding shall be entitled to receive one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged. A worker entitled to payment under this paragraph shall not be entitled to claim extra pay for welding under the higher duties clause of this Award.
- (d) Work on Ships: One penny half-penny (1½d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when engaged in working under lower platforms of engine rooms, in bilges, or any confined spaces around ship's boilers, between ship's sides and boilers, through manhole doors and between bulkheads and back-end or single-end boilers.
- (e) Marine Work: Work in double-bottom tanks and bilges and on board ships in any confined spaces where it is necessary for the worker to work in a stooping, sitting or otherwise cramped position, shall be paid for at the rate of one penny halfpenny $(1\frac{1}{2}d.)$ per hour extra.
- (f) Diesel Engine Ships: For work below the floor plates in diesel engine ships, threepence (3d.) per hour extra, but if in the opinion of the employer the work is exceptionally dirty, sixpence (6d.) per hour extra.
- (g) Apprentices shall be deemed to be included in the provisions of paragraphs (a), (b), (d), (e), (f) and (h) of this clause.
- (h) Dirt Money: One penny half-penny $(1\frac{1}{2}d.)$ per hour shall be paid to workers when engaged on work of a specially dirty nature, where clothes are necessarily unduly soiled or injured or boots are injured by the nature of the work done.

Without limiting the definition of "dirty places," the following may be taken as examples:—Chimney flues other than new, inside fireboxes and smokeboxes other than new, inside boilers other than new (where elevator is not provided).

(i) Extra payment in respect of dirt money or on ships or marine work or on diesel engine ships shall not be cumulative.

30.—Dirty Work.

Workers engaged inside in cleaning the inside of engine crank cases shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per hour extra whilst employed at such work.

Division (iii)—Boilermakers.

31.—Definitions.

Welding Section-

"First-class welder" means a worker using electric arc or acetylene, petrol or coal gas blow pipe on any work other than—(a) filling castings, or (b) cutting scrap metal; or (c) welding with the aid of jigs, or (d) operations specifically mentioned as being the work of a second, third, or fourth-class welder in the definitions of those terms hereunder.

Margin

"Second-class welder" means a worker who—
(a) uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in filling castings, or (b) welds with the aid of a jig, or (c) operates automatic welding machines for the setting up of which he is not responsible.

"Third-class welder" means a worker who uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in tacking preparatory to the completion of work by any other worker.

"Fourth-class welder" means a worker using an electric spot or butt-welding machine, or cutting scrap with oxy-acetylene blow pipe, petrol or coal gas blow pipe.

Boilermaking Section-

"Boilermaking" means the fabrication, erection, and/or repairing of steel or iron boilers or other vessels subject to greater pressure than the weight of their contents, but does not include drilling by stationary machines.

"Tradesman" means an adult worker who is required to develop work from scaled drawings or prints, or to make templates, or to apply general trade experience without the guidance of a foreman or other tradesman, and includes riveting by hand or machine, caulking, chipping and working rivet busters.

Steel Construction Section-

"Tradesman" means an adult worker who is required to develop work from scaled drawings or prints, or to make templates or to apply general trade experience without the guidance of a foreman or other tradesman and includes riveting by hand or machine, caulking, chipping and working rivet busters.

"First-class machinist" means an adult worker engaged solely in working one or more of the following machines—bending rollers, gag straight liners, guillotines, shearing machines, hydraulic presses of over two hundred (200) tons pressure, portable drillers, portable reamers and tappers.

"Second-class machinist" means an adult worker engaged solely in operating one or more of the following machines—mangling, nipping and notching, roll straightening, punching, cropping, hydraulic presses of two hundred (200) tons pressure or under, stationary drillers, stationary reamers and tappers, cold saw, friction saw, plate-edge planers and other machines.

32.—Wages.

33.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to-

- (a) Workers employed to do in or about a building any work of a permanent nature in lead, or any of those metals which have superseded lead, particularly including the following classes of work:
 - Work in sheet lead, galvanised iron, or other sheet metal generally used by plumbers.
 - (ii) Pipe work in lead, sheet metal, wrought iron, cast iron, copper or brass.
 - (iii) Work connected with the installation of gas, water (including appliances for heating same), steam or air for heating purposes.
 - (iv) Sanitary and general plumbing.
 - (v) Fitting and fixing corrugated asbestos sheets, asbestos gutters, down pipes, ridging, rain heads and flashings.
- (b) Workers employed in ship or chemical plumbing.

34.—Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rate of wage payable to the workers employed in the vocation set out hereunder:—

35.-Wet Work.

While working in any place where water is continually dripping so that the worker's clothing becomes wet with soakage, or where there is water underfoot so that the worker's feet become wet, the worker shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the prescribed rate. This clause shall not apply to natural surface made wet by rain

36.-Well Work.

A worker required to enter a well thirty (30) feet or more in depth for the purpose in the first place of examining a pump, pipe or any other work connected therewith, shall receive an amount of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for such examination, and one shilling (1s.) per hour extra thereafter for fixing, renewing or repairing such work.

38.—Definitions.

In this Award, subject to the context:-

"Tradesman" means a worker, not being an apprentice, who in the course of his employment works from drawings or prints, or makes precision measurements or applies general trade experience, and includes a first-class machinist.

"Toolmaker" means a tradesman making and/or

"Toolmaker" means a tradesman making and/or repairing any precision tool, gauge, die or mould to be affixed to any machine, who designs or lays out his work and is responsible for its proper completion.

"First-class machinist" means a tradesman who is partly or wholly engaged in setting up and operating the following machines:—Lathe, boring machine, milling machine, planing machine, shaping machine, slotting machine and grinding machine.

"Second-class machinist" means an adult not engaged as a tradesman and who is not required to work from drawings or prints required to be scaled and/or measured from drawings or prints, or to make precision measurements, but who is engaged in operating or in the setting up and operating of machines enumerated in the definition of "first-class machinist" or who is engaged operating a key-seating machine, or a second-class brass finisher or as a pipe fitter on low pressure work.

"Third-class machinist" means a machinist, not being a process worker, who operates any machine set up by a tradesman, or any machine the setting up of which does not require the knowledge or skill of a second-class machinist.

"Motor mechanic" means a worker engaged in making, repairing, altering, assembling (except assembling for the first time in Australia) and/or testing the metal parts (including electric) of the engines and/or chassis on motor cars or other motor vehicles, except motor cycles.

"Motor cycle mechanic" means a worker engaged in making, repairing, altering, assembling (except assembling for the first time in Australia) and/or testing the metal parts (including electric) of the engines and/or frames and/or chassis of motor cycles and side-cars.

"First-class welder" means a worker using electric arc or acetylene, petrol, or coal gas blowpipe on any work other than (a) filling castings; or (b) cutting scrap metal; or (c) welding with the aid of jigs; or (d) operations specifically mentioned as being the work of a second, third, or fourth-class welder in the definition of those terms hereunder.

"Second-class welder" means a worker who (a) uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in filling castings; or (b) welds with the aid of a jig; or (c) operates automatic welding machines for the setting up of which he is not responsible.

"Third-class welder" means a worker who uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in tacking preparatory to the completion of work by any other worker.

"Fourth-class welder" means a worker using an electric spot or butt-welding machine or cutting scrap with oxy-acetylene blowpipe, petrol or coal gas blowpipe.

"Automotive electrical fitter" means a worker engaged in the manufacture and repair of the starting, lighting and ignition equipment of motor vehicles (including motor cycles).

"Electrical fitter" means a worker employed in making, repairing, altering, assembling, testing, winding or wiring electrical machines, instruments, meters or other apparatus other than wires leading thereto.

"Electrical installer," subject to the exceptions specified in this definition, means a worker engaged in the installation of electric lighting, electric meters, bells, telephones or motors and apparatus used in connection therewith, and includes a worker engaged in the running, repairing and testing of wires used for lighting, heating or power purposes.

The term does not include a worker who fixes a motor on a concrete bed or who erects metal frames for the support of apparatus used in connection with the generation or distribution of electricity.

"Battery fitter" means a worker engaged in overhauling and repairing storage batteries, but the term does not include a battery attendant.

"Battery attendant" means a worker who carries out testing, topping up, cleaning, charging and discharging, removing and replacing storage batteries.

"Electrical linesman and/or wireman" means a worker engaged (with or without labourers assisting) in erecting poles for electrical wires or erecting wires or cables on poles or over buildings, or tying it or them to insulators, cr joining or insulating it or them, or doing any work on electrical poles off the ground, but no linesman shall be allowed to work off the ground on live wires without the assistance of a labourer.

"Heat treater" means a tradesman who is required to apply general trade experience as a heat treater, and who carries out the operation of heat treatment to produce in the materials treated such requirements as hardness, toughness, ductability, resistance to abrasion, elasticity, tensile strength, machinability and resistance to creep, and who works to limits in size, and straightness in tool work.

"Pipe fitter" means any worker employed on pipe work but does not include a worker solely engaged in assembling, joining and fixing pipes. All work on live steam pipes shall be a tradesman's work.

Division (vi)—Painters.

39.—Definitions.

"Painter" means a worker who is engaged in any manner whatsoever in connection with (a) the painting of buildings of any nature, fences, petrol or oil containers of over fifty (50) gallons capacity, bridges (whether constructed of iron or wood or partly of iron and partly of wood); or (b) paperhanging, decorating, glazing, marbling, gilding, putty-glazing, kalsomining, distempering, colour washing (but not lime washing, except where the lime wash is mixed with colour), staining, varnishing, plastic relief, stripping off of old papers, removing of old paint or varnish; and (c) the preparation of all work connected with any of the above branches of the trade and of all materials required for any of the above branches of the trade; but the term shall not include one worker who is employed for the purpose of mixing plastic material with its necessary vehicle and cleaning up floors and wood work after the application of plastic relief and such worker shall be classed as a builder's labourer.

"Lime washing" means the application to surfaces by means of a spray or brush of lime which has been slacked down with water or binder.

"Glazier" means a worker who (a) fits and fixes leadlights into prepared positions; or (b) cuts glass or any of its kindred products and fits and fixes it, either with putty or beads, either nailed or screwed into any place, including shop fronts, prepared for its reception by a tradesman, such as in window sashes, frames, doors of either wood or iron; and/or (c) cuts glass prepared with designs and sandblasts same.

- (a) Boat Type or Swinging Scaffold—Workers, when working on a boat type or swinging scaffold, shall be paid at the rate of one shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per day extra. In this subclause the term "swinging scaffold" means any scaffold suspended from overhead gear and not supported from the ground, and which by reason of the operations carried out on it or by reason of wind force or vibration is likely to swing or sway.
 - (b) Spray Painting-
 - (i) Lead paint shall not be applied by a spray to the interior of any building.
 - (ii) All workers applying paint by spray shall be provided with overalls and respirators by the employer.
- (c) Lead Paint Surfaces Not to be Dry Rubbed, etc.—No surface painted with lead paint shall be rubbed down or scraped by a dry process.

The employer shall provide the following tools when they are required on the job:—Dogs and cramps of all description, bars of all description, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, trammels, hand and thumb screws, soldering irons and spanners from three-quarters (3/4) of an inch upwards.

45. Tool Lock-up.

A secure and weatherproof place shall be provided by the employer, where the carpenters' tools may be locked up apart from the employer's plant or material.
