LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1950.

Rules of The Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1950, the Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned; and whereas it is desirable to amend the rules of the Board as published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 45) of the 5th August, 1949: Now, therefore, the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby, at a meeting held on the 15th day of July, 1955, make and publish the following amendments to the said rules, to take effect one month after publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Soap Manufacturing Award" and shall replace Award No. 8 of 1937 as amended.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked, except in the case of shift workers, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, with a meal break not exceeding sixty (60) minutes each day.

(c) Where shift work is worked, the forty (40) hours shall be worked at times to suit the convenience of the employer.

6.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and any work performed on Saturday before 12 noon, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done after 12 noon on Saturday or on Sunday or any of the holidays prescribed in clause 7 (a) hereof shall be paid for at double time rates.  
(c) Notwithstanding anything contained here-  
in:—

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

7.—Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 6 (b), be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If, after one (1) months' continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted by the employer at Christmas time.

(g) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

9.—Meal Money.

Where a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after his usual knock off time for more than one (1) hour he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof: Provided that this clause shall not apply to workers

living in the same locality as their place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

10.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

11.—Change and Mess Room.

A suitable change and mess room shall be provided for in all establishments.

12.—First Aid Equipment.

Adequate first-aid equipment shall be provided in all establishments.

13.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers when one hour's notice shall suffice all workers shall be engaged and paid by the week and one weeks notice shall be given on either side.

14.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

(f) Casual hands:—"Casual hand" shall mean a worker who is employed for a period of less than one (1) week.

Casual hands shall be paid as under:—

Adults: Threepence (3d.) per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

Juniors: One penny halfpenny (1½d.) per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

(g) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and seven and a half per cent. (7½%) for night shift.

16.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

17.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the name of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which each such worker has been employed. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

18.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 20.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers upon being engaged shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate or verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

## 21.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by regulations.

There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

## 22.—Provision of Boots.

Men will be provided with rubber boots when (actually) working in a caustic soda plant.
