INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 25 of 1955.

Registered, 8th September, 1955.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 8th day of August, 1955, between the West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants, and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called the "Union"), of the one part, and the Trustees of the Public Library, Museum, and Art Gallery of Western Australia (hereinafter called the "employer") of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Cleaners and Caretakers (Public Library, Museum and Art Gallery) Agreement and replaces Agreement No. 8 of 1939.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the classes of workers mentioned herein who are employed by the Trustees of the Public Library, Museum and Art Gallery of Western Australia.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year from the date hereof.

5.—Definitions.

"Casual worker" is one for whom less than one (1) weeks continuous service is provided.

"Cleaner attendant" shall mean a male adult worker employed cleaning the offices and rooms of the employer and performing the duties of an attendant in either the Public Library, Museum, or Art Gallery.

"Head attendant and caretaker" shall mean a male adult worker in whose duties are included the responsibility for the supervision of cleaning, and who is engaged as caretaker of the premises.

6.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) weeks notice on either side, except in the case of a casual worker, when one (1) days notice shall suffice.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker is required to present himself for duty except such absence is due to illness and comes within the provision of clause 14 (Sick Leave) or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Agreement.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such cases wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.

7.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep a time book or time sheets, properly posted each week, showing the times worked by each employee and the wages paid to each employee covered by this Agreement. Such time book or time sheets, with all entries therein, shall on demand be produced at any reasonable time during the day by the employer for inspection by the Secretary of the Union or by a duly authorised official of the Union.

8.—Preference to Unionists.

In the employment of persons under this Agreement, no discrimination shall be exercised against the members of the West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants, and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers, Perth. Provided that, where a worker other than a member of the Union is engaged, such worker shall within 14 days of engagement make application for membership of the Union, and if accepted shall complete such application, and whilst working in the industry shall continue such membership.

9.—Hours of Labour.

The hours of attendants in the Public Library shall be forty (40) hours per week, which shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. on week days and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

The hours of attendants in the Museum and Art Gallery shall be forty (40) hours per week, which shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

10.—Overtime and Sunday Time.

(a) All time worked outside the usual rostered working hours shall be treated as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half with a minimum payment for two and one half hours at that rate.

(c) This clause shall not apply to the head attendant and caretaker.

11.—Posting of Agreement.

A copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a suitable place in Library, Museum and Art Gallery, where it shall be accessible to each and every employee. The secretary-treasurer of the Union may post notices relating to Union business in the place where a copy of the Agreement is posted.

12.—Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were on ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave, or to be taken at some other mutually acceptable date.

(c) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(d) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday.

Where the worker is on duty or available on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(e) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

(e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.

(ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

15.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All workers covered by this Agreement shall be granted long service leave on the basis of three (3) months leave on full pay for each seven-year period of continuous service.

(b) Subject to subclause (a) of this clause, the conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full-time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

16.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages to workers employed under this Agreement shall be:—

(a) Basic wage—£12 6s. 6d. per week.

(b) Margins—

Head attendant and caretaker—£217 per annum (plus free quarters, light, fuel and water).

Cleaner-attendant (Library)—£1 16s. per week.

Cleaner-attendant (Museum and Art Gallery)—£1 10s. per week.

(c) In addition to the rate of wage prescribed herein for his class of work, a casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) of such wage.

17.—Higher Duties.

Any worker who is employed for four (4) or more hours on any day on work carrying a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, shall be paid such higher minimum rate for the whole of the day. If he is employed for more than one (1) and less than four (4) hours on work carrying a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid the higher minimum rate for the time so employed.

18.—Materials.

All workers under this Agreement shall be provided with the necessary tools and materials free of charge.

19.—No Reduction.

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement is being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

4.—Apprentices.

(a) The provisions of the schedule marked "Apprenticeship Regulations" in Award No. 3 of 1940 are hereby embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to an employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to the first two or fraction of two journeymen, and thereafter one apprentice to two journeymen employed by him in that branch. For the purpose of this clause, "branch" shall be deemed to be the "iron bedstead making" industry.

(c) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years to "Iron Bedstead Making."

5.—Junior Workers.

The work of junior workers shall be confined to labouring work, except that—

- (a) junior workers under the age of 17 years may be employed operating link mesh machines, assembling link mesh, assembling plates and fabrics, weaving springs, cutting wire and making clips, branding and stamping;
- (b) junior workers of 17 years of age and over may, in addition to the work prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause, be employed on assembling and removing work from casting frames, operating drilling machines, general chipping work and hand painting of gates and similar articles.

6.—Overtime.

Pay for overtime shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter until the usual time for starting on the next ordinary working day: Provided that all work performed on a Saturday afternoon, Sunday, or holiday as prescribed, shall be paid for at double time rates.

7.—Provision of Appliances.

All tools and appliances shall be provided by the employer, provided that this shall not apply to the following tools required by chill fitters:—

- 1 6in. square.
- 1 12in. straight-edge.
- 1 2ft. steel rule.
- 1 pair 6in. odd legs.
