### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 6420/09.—That reserve No. 12375 (Nulagine Lot 106) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Water Supplies in trust for the purpose of Water.

Corr. No. 1235/53.—That reserve No. 23787 (Newdegate Lot 32) should vest in and be held by the Lake Grace Road Board in trust for the purpose of Road Board Depot.

Corr. No. 1415/55.—That reserve No. 24492 (Yelbeni Lot 30) should vest in and be held by the Kununoppin-Trayning Road Board in trust for the pose of Children's Playground.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Health Act, 1911-1955.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 732/56.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 161 of the Health Act, 1911-1955, that the provisions of Division 3 of Part V. of that Act shall operate and have effect in the health districts of local authorities as specified in that section and in the health district of any other local authority, within the meaning of that Act, in which the Governor may from time to time declare by Order in Council that those provisions shall operate and have effect; and whereas the Carnarvon Health District is a health district of a local authority, within the meaning of the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the power in him vested, doth hereby declare that the provisions of Division 3 of Part V. of the Health Act, 1911 (as amended), shall operate and have effect in the Carnarvon Health District.
