BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.
Bush Fires Board,
Perth, 11th October, 1956.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Hon. Minister for Lands, acting under the powers conferred by section 17, subsection (3) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, has approved of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited burning times made under section 17, subsection (1) of the said Act so far as such declarations extend to any land used for railway purposes in the road districts and municipalities mentioned and for the periods stated in the Schedule hereunder. Any burning undertaken on railway land under the provisions of this suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

No burning shall be undertaken on days when the fire hazard forecast issued by the Perth Weather Bureau is "severe" or "dangerous."

At least three men shall be constantly in attendance at every fire until it has been completely extinguished, including all smouldering logs, timber, disused sleepers and other inflammable material.

Each man shall be provided with a heavy fire rake and each three men with at least one knapsack spray with sufficient water for its operation.

Any burning carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall comply with section 18 and all other relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954.

4.—Hours of Work.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work, worked from Monday to Friday inclusive.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside the usual working hours shall be paid at the rate of time and a half from Monday to Friday.

(b) All time worked on Saturday between the normal starting time and noon shall be paid at time and a half and double time thereafter.

(c) All time worked on Sundays and Public holidays (as defined in Clause 7) shall be paid at double time.

(d) In the computation of overtime each day will stand by itself.

(e) The employer may require any worker to work overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.

(f) An organisation, party to this Agreement, and/or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with (e) above.

6.—Meal Allowance.

Any worker who is obliged to partake of a meal when on duty outside the metropolitan area shall be paid a meal allowance of 3s. 6d. Provided that any worker who is in receipt of a travelling allowance shall not be entitled to any meal allowance under this clause.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 15 of 1956.

(Registered 10th September, 1956.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 28th day of August, 1956, between the W.A. Fire Brigades Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") of

7.—Holidays.

(a) A period of two (2) consecutive week's leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Board after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer. Provided that no annual leave shall accrue to any worker until he has served three (3) complete months.

(b) For employment for portion of the year beyond three (3) months, the worker shall only be entitled to such holidays as are proportionate to his length of service.

(c) A worker who is dismissed for peculation or theft shall not be entitled to annual leave or payment therefor.

(d) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days leave due to them. Provided that nothing herein shall deprive the employer of his right to retain such workers at work during the close-down period as may be essential.

(e) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(f) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(g) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

8.—Travelling and Duty outside the Metropolitan Area.

(i) When an employee is required to work outside the metropolitan area he shall be paid 4s. per item for breakfast, lunch, dinner and bed. Provided that such allowance shall not be paid if full board and lodging is provided and shall only be proportionate where part board and lodging is provided.

(ii) Travelling on other than duty hours shall be paid at ordinary rates with a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one day.

9.—Country Duty.

The employer shall give forty-eight hours notice of country duties.

10.—Uniforms.

All uniforms as determined by the Board shall be supplied to the employee.

11.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act, 1912-1944.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for more than one day.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct, or where the worker does not notify his station of his sickness within four hours of commencing time.

12.—Accident Pay.

Full pay shall be paid for accidents while on duty.

13.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly.

14.—Membership of Union.

Every man employed as a permanent serviceman must when assuming duty apply for membership in the applicant Union, and if elected remain a member of the Union whilst in the service of the Board.

15.—Term of Agreement.

Term of Agreement shall be one year from the date hereof.
