WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, the Governor may by Proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class "A" any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said section; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the reserve described in the Schedule hereto should be classified as of Class "A": Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation classify as of Class "A" the reserve described hereunder.

Reserve No. 12098, containing about 88 acres, for the purpose of "Protection of Flora." (Plan 378B/40, F1.)

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1954, it is provided *inter alia* that the Governor may by proclamation prohibit either absolutely or, except in accordance with regulations,

the bringing into the State of Western Australia, either generally or from any specified State, country or place, of any specified kind of plant, fruit or other thing which would, in his opinion, be likely to introduce any disease into the State of Western Australia; and whereas I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator am of the opinion that the bringing of bananas into this State from any other State or territory of the Commonwealth of Australia would be likely to introduce into this State the disease caused by the family of pests known as Trypetidae: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the bringing by any person into this State from any other State or territory of the Commonwealth of Australia of the fruit known as banana except in accordance with the Banana Importation Fruit Fly (General) Regulations, 1956.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 6/39.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1953, a Water Board may, with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water; now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1953, of the Busselton Water Board borrowing the sum of three thousand, five hundred pounds (£3,500) for a period of 15 years, repayable by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments with interest at the rate of five pounds, ten shillings (£5 10s.) per centum per annum for the works approved by Order in Council dated the 14th day of November, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of November, 1956, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the 1st day of July, 1958.

Bruce Rock Road Board.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1297/52.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1955, namely, that the Bruce Rock Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

- (1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads, and the use of footpaths.
- (2) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads, or footpaths or traffic signs, lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions.

(3) Clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof.

(4) Clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

### W.A. COAL INDUSTRY TRIBUNAL.

Applications No. 91, 92, 93, 94.

In the matter of the Mining Act Amendment Act No. 84 of 1948, Part XIII, Division I, and in the matter of an Industrial dispute wherein the Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd. and others, applicants, and the Coal Miners' Industrial Union of Workers of W.A., Collie, the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, Australian Society of Engineers, Collie River District Branch, The Deputies Union of Workers, Collie, and the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Industrial Union of Workers, Collie Branch, respondents, are parties, and in the matter of an application by the Employers to amend Awards No. 4 of 1953, No. 1 of 1953, No. 19 of 1954, and 61 of 1954, regarding Holiday clauses. (Applications No. 91, 92, 93, and 94, of 1955 of W.A.C.I.T.)

The Tribunal hereby awards, orders and prescribes that the undermentioned Awards of the W.A. Coal Industry Tribunal, as amended, be further amended in the manner following:—

Miners' Award—No. 4 of 1953.

1. Delete subclause 6 (f) (i) and insert in lieu thereof:—

(f) (i) For all time worked on any day (including Sundays and holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof) during ordinary working hours on afternoon or night shift 10 per cent. shall be added to the day shift rates. All time worked on any day (including Sundays and the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof) outside the ordinary working hours on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid for at the rate of 10 per cent. of the day shift rate in addition to the penalty rates prescribed herein.

2. Delete subclause 9 (a) (iii) and insert in lieu thereof:—

9 (a) (iii) The rate for all work performed on the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof for employees not engaged upon contract shall be time and one quarter in addition to a sum equal to the amount of the payment prescribed in subclause (c) of clause 6. Any employee engaged upon contract and employed on the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof shall be paid, in addition to his contract earnings for that day, a further sum equal in amount to one and one quarter times the daily sum to which he is entitled under the Award in respect of each day of annual leave.

3. Delete subclause 9 (b) (ii) and insert in lieu thereof:—

9 (b) (ii) For all time worked on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof, double time.

4. Delete subclauses 9 (c) (iii) and (iv) and insert in lieu thereof:—

9 (c) (iii) For all time worked on the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof, when a mine is worked for the production of coal, double time.

9 (c) (iv) For all time worked on the holidays prescribed in clause 13 (a) hereof, when a mine is not worked for the production of coal, time and one half.

5. Delete Clause 13 and insert in lieu thereof:—

#### 13.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely Australia Day (January), Anzac Day and Labour Day, together with all other days, except Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday and Foundation Day, gazetted from time to time as public holidays which are observed generally by the public in Western Australia—provided that any employee who without good and sufficient reason fails to work on the working day immediately preceding a holiday or the first working day following such a holiday, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(i) Each worker shall be entitled to twenty-two and a half days' annual leave on full pay, provided that the worker has worked the full number of shifts which his mine has worked for the production of coal and which he would have normally worked during the preceding 12 months, and should he have worked less than the said number of shifts when the said annual leave is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall receive or be paid for a proportionate amount of annual leave: provided further that, where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this subclause. Annual leave for each year shall be granted and taken between 1st December and 30th June next ensuing. For pumpers and grooms who usually work seven days per week annual leave entitlement shall be calculated on the basis of twenty-two and a half days per annum, plus .25 of a day for each completed month of service in the year in that classification.

(ii) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall, for service prior to 2nd day of December, 1956, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Award applicable before the 20th day of September, 1956, and for service subsequent to the 2nd day of December, 1956, in accordance with the provisions of this subclause.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, the leave prescribed in subclause (b) hereof shall be taken—

(a) in a period of three weeks commencing not later than the Monday preceding Christmas Day, and

(b) in a period commencing Good Friday.

(d) The rate of pay for such annual leave shall be:—

- (1) In the case of those workers who take their leave before or during the recognised annual Christmas closedown of the mines, the rate payable on the last working day of the period taken for the calculation of their holiday entitlement.
- (2) In the case of those workers who take their leave at a time other than the Christmas closedown, the rate payable on the last working day preceding such leave, provided that in respect to the Easter Leave, payment shall be made on the usual pay day.

(e) A contract miner shall be entitled to be paid when on annual leave or holidays a rate equal to loaderman's rate. A contract wheeler or contract mine timber cutter shall be entitled to be paid when on annual leave or holidays a rate equal to wheeler-packer's rate.

(f) (i) Shifts lost on account of compensatable accidents sustained during the course of employment (not exceeding one month at a time) shall be regarded, for the purpose of calculation of the extent of annual leave, as shifts of actual attendance during those days for which the mine has worked for the production of coal.

(ii) Shifts lost by an employee through absence on paid sick leave and long service leave, or shifts lost by a union official bona fide absent from his employment either to attend proceedings before any Industrial Tribunal or Commission in which the parties to this Award are interested parties or with the permission of the management to attend to union business, shall be regarded for the purpose of this clause as shifts worked.

(g) Any employee not required to work on a holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof who changes his employment from one employer to another after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday, shall, subject to provisions of subclause (a) hereof, receive payment for such holiday from the employer by whom he is employed on the first working day following the holiday and the said employer shall have the right to recover from the employer by whom the employee was employed on the working day immediately preceding the holiday 80 per centum of the amount of the payment made to the employee.

(h) An employee not required to work on a holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof who through the operation of Mine Workers' Pensions Legislation is required to vacate his employment after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday shall be entitled to payment for such holiday unless without good and sufficient reason he fails to work on the working day immediately preceding the holiday.

(i) In addition to the annual leave and holidays prescribed in this clause workers shall be permitted to take four (4) days per annum without pay for the purpose of holding aggregate meetings, not more than one day to be taken in each calendar quarter; provided that the meetings are held in accordance with Union rules and provided also that at least twenty-four (24) hours notice is given to all employers of the intention to hold any such meeting.

(j) Any employee who changes his employer in the course of the year, but who does not leave the coal mining industry, shall be required to take the aggregate number of days annual leave that he has qualified for with all employers in the preceding 12 months.

(k) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (b) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer; and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(1) Workers engaged on essential work during the period or periods referred to in subclause (c) hereof, shall be allowed equivalent time off with a maximum of twenty-two and one half (22½) days at such time as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker. Provided that the employer is under no obligation to provide work on the days known as Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday and Easter Monday and if no work is provided the worker may claim payment for that day with a reduction in his annual leave entitlement. Provided also that any employee who works on Christmas Day, New Year's Day or Good Friday shall be paid at the rate of time and one quarter.

#### ENGINE DRIVERS' AWARD—No. 61 of 1954.

1. Delete subclause 5 (c) and insert in lieu thereof:—

5 (c) For all time worked on any day (including Sundays and the holidays prescribed in Clause 10 (a) hereof) during ordinary working hours on afternoon or night shift 10 per cent. shall be added to the day shift rates. All time worked on any day (including Sundays and the holidays prescribed in Clause 10 (a) hereof) outside the ordinary working hours on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid for at the rate of 10 per cent. of the day shift rate in addition to the penalty rates prescribed herein.

2. In Clause 7: Overtime—after the word "holiday" in line two, insert the words "prescribed in Clause 10 (a) hereof."

3. Delete Clause 9 and insert in lieu thereof:—  
9.—Crib Time for Firemen.

On day shift (Sundays, Pay Saturdays and Holidays prescribed in Clause 10 (a) hereof excepted) the companies shall provide relief for firemen during crib time; the limit of such crib time shall be in conformity with the approved custom of the Collie Coalfields District. The period specified for such crib time shall be immediately after the other workers at the mine's specified crib time. The firemen relieved shall be responsible for the proper firing of the boilers.

4. Delete Clause 10 and insert in lieu thereof:  
10.—Sundays and Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, Australia Day (January), Anzac Day and Labour Day, together with all other days, except Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday and Foundation Day, gazetted from time to time as public holidays which are observed generally by the public in Western Australia—provided that any employee who without good and sufficient reason fails to work on the working day immediately preceding a holiday or the first working day following such a holiday, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(b) All work performed on Sundays or holidays as prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time: Provided that where the work of any grade of employee is so continuous over the whole week as to necessitate their being rostered for work regularly on Sundays, the rate for such work shall be time and a half.

(c) Any employee not required to work on a holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof who changes his employment from one employer to another after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday, shall, subject to provisions of subclause (a) hereof, receive payment for such holiday from the employer by whom he is employed on the first working day following the holiday and the said employer shall have the right to recover from the employer by whom the employee was employed on the

working day immediately preceding the holiday 80 per centum of the amount of the payment made to the employee.

(d) An employee not required to work on a holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof who through the operation of Mine Workers' Pensions Legislation is required to vacate his employment after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday shall be entitled to payment for such holiday unless without good and sufficient reason he fails to work on the working day immediately preceding the holiday.

5. Delete Clause 11 and insert in lieu thereof:  
11.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Each worker shall be entitled to 22½ days' annual leave on full pay at his rate of wages per shift payable at the time he takes such leave, provided that the worker has worked the full number of shifts which his mine has worked for the production of coal and which he would have normally worked during the preceding 12 months, and should he have worked less than the said number of shifts when the said annual leave is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall receive or be paid for a proportionate amount of annual leave; provided further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this subclause. Annual holidays for each year shall be granted and taken between 1st December and 30th June next ensuing.

(ii) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall, for service prior to 2nd day of December, 1956, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the award applicable before the 20th day of September, 1956, and for service subsequent to the 2nd day of December, 1956, in accordance with the provisions of this subclause.

(b) Except as hereinafter provided, the leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be taken—

(a) in a period of three weeks commencing not later than Monday preceding Christmas Day, and

(b) in a period commencing Good Friday.

(c) (i) Shifts lost on account of compensatable accidents sustained during the course of employment (not exceeding one month at a time) shall be regarded, for the purpose of calculation of the extent of annual leave, as shifts of actual attendance during those days for which the mine has worked for the production of coal.

(ii) Shifts lost by an employee through absence on paid sick leave and long service leave, or shifts lost by a union official bona fide absent from his employment either to attend proceedings before any Industrial Tribunal or Commission in which the parties to this Award are interested parties or with the permission of the management to attend to union business, shall be regarded for the purpose of this clause as shifts worked.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (a) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer; and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(e) Workers engaged on essential work during the period or periods referred to in subclause (b) hereof, shall be allowed equivalent time off with a maximum of twenty-two and a half (22½) days at such time as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker. Provided that the employer is under no obligation to provide work on the days known as Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New

Year's Day, Good Friday and Easter Monday and if no work is provided the worker may claim payment for that day with a reduction in his annual leave entitlement. Provided also that any employee who works on Christmas Day, New Year's Day or Good Friday shall be paid at the rate of time and one quarter.

(b) (i) Each worker shall be entitled to twenty-two and a half days' annual leave on full pay at his rate of wages per shift payable at the time he takes such leave; provided that the worker has worked the full number of shifts which his mine has worked for the production of coal and which he would have normally worked during the preceding 12 months, and should he have worked less than the said number of shifts when the said annual leave is taken, or at the termination of the employment, he shall receive or be paid for a proportionate amount of annual leave: provided further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this subclause. Annual holidays for each year shall be granted and taken between 1st December and 30th June next ensuing.

(ii) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall, for service prior to 2nd day of December, 1956, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Award applicable before the 20th day of September, 1956, and for service subsequent to the 2nd day of December, 1956, in accordance with the provisions of this subclause.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, the leave prescribed in subclause (b) hereof shall be taken—

(a) in a period of three weeks commencing not later than the Monday preceding Christmas Day and

(b) in a period commencing Good Friday.

(d) (i) Shifts lost on account of compensatable accidents sustained during the course of employment (not exceeding one month at a time) shall be regarded, for the purpose of calculation of the extent of annual leave, as shifts of actual attendance during those days for which the mine was worked for the production of coal.

(f) An employee not required to work on a holiday prescribed in subclause (a) hereof who through the operation of Mine Workers' Pensions Legislation is required to vacate his employment after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday shall be entitled to payment for such holiday unless without a good and sufficient reason he fails to work on the working day immediately preceding the holiday.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (b) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer; and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) Workers engaged on essential work during the period or periods referred to in subclause (c) hereof, shall be allowed equivalent time off with a maximum of twenty-two and a half (22½) days at such time as may be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker. Provided that the employer is under no obligation to provide work on the days known as Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday and Easter Monday and if no work is provided the worker may claim payment for that day with a reduction in his annual leave entitlement. Provided also that any employee who works on Christmas Day, New Year's Day or Good Friday shall be paid at the rate of time and one quarter.
