No. 48 of 1955.

Between West Australian Branch, Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Hon. Minister for Agriculture; Anchorage Butchers Limited; and Thomas Borthwick and Sons (Australasia) Limited, Respondents.

THE Conciliation Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon him by Section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in pursuance of a remission made to him by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties.

Award

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as "The 'Meat Ex-port' and 'Local Consumption (Thomas Borth-wick and Sons, Albany)' Award" and replaces Awards Nod. 14 of 1940, and 23 of 1943, as amended.

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

4.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.-Scope.

- This Award shall apply to-
 - Workers employed in the killing, dressing and/or preparing of sheep or lambs and killing and dressing oxen, calves or pigs for export.
 - (ii) Workers employed in boning departments attached to and operated at Export Works, notwithstanding that the boned meat may not be exported.
 - (iii) Workers employed in production of byproducts, notwithstanding that such byproducts may not be exported.
- (iv) Workers employed at the works of Thomas Borthwick and Sons, Albany, who are em-ployed as slaughtermen killing and dressing oxen, sheep, calves, lambs or pigs for the purpose of local consumption.

6.—Hours.

The week's work shall consist of forty (40) hours to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive

7.—Starting and finishing Times.

(a) Except where otherwise provided, the ordinary starting time shall not be earlier than 7.30 a.m. and the ordinary finishing time not later than 5 p.m. These times may be altered by mutual agreement between the Union and the employer or in default of agreement by a Board of Reference

(b) No worker shall be penalised for being a few minutes late, provided he submits a satisfactory explanation to the employer and is prepared to make up the lost time.

(c) Penners up, drovers and stockmen: The starting and finishing times in this branch of the industry shall be as mutually agreed between the employer and the worker concerned.

(d) The ordinary hours of work appropriate to the day shall be worked as a continuous shift.

8.-Meal Times.

(a) Any time allowed under this Award for a meal shall not exceed one (1) hour. Suitable times for any meal or crib time shall be mutually arranged between the employer and the Union, and, if no agreement is arrived at, the Board of Reference hereinafter constituted shall decide.

(b) No worker shall work or be required to work for a longer period than four (4) hours without a suitable interval for the midday meal and not longer than five (5) hours in other cases.

(c) Meal times for workers engaged in loading for trains or boats shall be elastic, as may be mutually arranged, when necessary, in order to facilitate the loading and despatch of trains and boats.

(d) Subject to subclause (c) meal time if worked shall be paid for at double time on prevailing rates, and this will continue until such time as the worker has been allowed to take his meal.

9.—Smoke-ohs.

(a) Workers under this Award shall be allowed a smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes before noon and a further smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes in the afternoon.

(b) Workers in the cold storage section, if and when employed outside the prescribed starting and finishing times, shall also be allowed a smoke-oh of fifteen (15) minutes immediately on completion of each two (2) hours of such service.

10.—Overtime.

(i) Day Workers:

- (a) Overtime shall be paid for as follows:-For all time worked within one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours before the worker's usual starting time, time and one half for the time worked within such one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hour period.
- (b) For all time worked after the worker's usual ceasing time to midnight, time and one half for the first four (4) hours and thereafter double time.
- (c) For all time worked in the period com-mencing from midnight or commencing before one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours of the worker's usual starting time, double time up to the worker's usual starting time.
- (ii) Shift Workers:

All time worked by shift workers in excess of the hours rostered in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(iii) General:

(a) For all work performed on Saturdays, time and one half for the first four (4) hours, thereafter double time with a minimum payment for two (2) hours.

- (b) All work performed on Sundays and the holidays prescribed in Clause 11 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time with a minimum payment for two (2)hours.
- (c) When a worker without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual finishing time for more than one (1) hour or after 6 p.m. whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.
- (d) A worker who is required to work over-time through the night shall be allowed a period of not less than one and a half (1¹/₂) hours off work as a breakfast break before being required to continue with his next day's ordinary work next day's ordinary work.
- (e) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement. (ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the require-ments of this subclause.

11.--Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 10 hereof be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Union Picnic Day.

(b) Any worker absenting himself from work on the working day preceding or on the working day following a holiday without reasonable excuse or without the consent of the employer shall not be entitled to payment for the holiday.

(c) The secretary of the Union shall give to the employer one (1) calendar month's written notice of the date upon which it is intended to celebrate butcher's picnic day; falling such notice the employer shall be entitled to assume that the fixed date for such celebration is the third Monday in February, and to make his business arrangements accordingly.

(d) This clause shall not apply to piece workers nor to casual hands.

12.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the employer may deduct from any moneys due to such worker or the said worker shall refund to the employer the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service up to the date of the termination of his services.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(d) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(f) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(g) This clause shall not apply to piece workers nor to casual hands.

13.-Casual Workers.

"Casual Worker" shall mean any person, other than a piece worker, who is employed for less than three (3) consecutive days (provided that Satur-day, Sunday and any holiday, unless worked, is not included in the reckoning of consecutive days) and such a worker shall be paid twenty per cent. (20%) in addition to the ordinary rates.

14.—Contract of Service.

(a) For the first four (4) weeks of employment, the contract of service of all workers, except, casuals, piece workers, junior workers, penners-up, drovers and stockmen, shall be by the day and shall be terminable by one (1) day's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture of a day's pay.

(b) Except as provided elsewhere in this clause, the contract of service of all workers, except casuais and piece workers, shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture of one (1) week's pay.

(c) (i) A piece worker during the first twelve (12) weeks of his employment shall be informed at or before the end of each day whether or not he will be required for work on the following day. If he is informed that he will be required for work and he attends on that day willing to work and he is not given employment, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to if he had worked the day he was ready and willing to work.

(ii) The contract of service of a piece worker employed for more than twelve (12) weeks shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side or by the pay-ment or forfeiture of one (1) week's pay.

(d) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

15.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

16.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than two (2) hours of one (1) day on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day. If employed for two (2) hours or less, he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked

17.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record containing the following particulars:-

- (a) the name of the worker;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day:
- (d) the wages and overtime paid;
- (e) a tally of the number of beasts killed solo per day:

- (f) a tally of the number of beasts killed per day team engaged in chain slaughtering.
 - Such book shall be open to inspection at the office of the employer by the secretary of the union or other officer appointed by the Union, in writing, on any day during working hours.

18.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Sick Leave (other than Piece Workers).

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year in respect to each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) or more days.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

 - (ii) Where a worker who has completed his piece work for the day is offered work and he refuses such work, he shall be paid a proportion of the amount prescribed in subclause (b) (i) hereof based on the number of hours actually worked each day.

21.—Junior Workers.

(a) Junior workers may be employed on all classes of work covered by this Award; provided that if employed as slaughtermen or in Group "A" or "B" of the chain system, they shall be entitled to be paid in accordance with the adult rates for that class of work; provided further that no junior under the age of eighteen (18) years shall be employed in the chain system.

(b) No junior shall be required to lift weights in excess of the following:----

22.-Work of Employees.

(a) Sheep and Lambs-Chain System:-

Group "A."—Comprising the men engaged in catching, sticking and shackling.

Group "B."—Comprising the men engaged in skinning hind legs and removing hind trotters, placing long hooks and removing shackles, skinning forelegs, removing tongues and sweetbreads, cheeking, tying weasands, punching, clearing briskets, splitting skins, removing front trotters, fianking out and thumbing up, clearing tail and rectum gut, punching off skins, scalping and removing heads, gutting, removing paunch and pluck and trimming neck and splitting down briskets.

(b) Beef Slaughterman.—The work, when working with a slaughterman's labourer, shall include sticking, removing feet and hide, removing caul fat, sawing or chopping down, trimming neck, hanging up and washing and finishing off in a workmanlike manner.

(c) Killing and Dressing of Pigs.—Shall include stunning, shackling and hoisting up to bleeding rail, sticking, handling into and in scalding tank, handling out of scalding tank, scraping, shaving and thoroughly cleaning, opening up and removing insides, and chopping or sawing down, washing and hanging off, and singeing if required.

(d) The foregoing operations shall be performed as determined from time to time by the employer and to his satisfaction.

(b) Extra Rates:

- (i) Tubercular and/or gangrenous cattle, i.e., where one quarter or more of a beast is condemned on account of tuberculosis and/or gangrene—double rates.
- (ii) Bulls and genuine stags, 300 lb. or overdouble rates. "Genuine stag" means a fully grown animal that exhibits characteristics of a bull including a definite neck crest.
- (iii) Tubercular, injured or septic calves (foreman to decide whether injury or infection is sufficient to justify additional rates) double rates.

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- (iv) In all cases of extra rates, the foreman to decide whether the etra rate is justified.
- (v) The extra rates prescribed in this Award shall not be cumulative. Where more than one of the conditions entitling a worker to extra rates exist on the same work the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the conditions so existing.
- (c) Tallies:
 - (i) The day's work on Monday to Friday inclusive shall consist of killing and dressing----

Cattle:

For 2 slaughterman and 1 labourer-21 bullocks.

For 1 slaughterman and 1 labourer-10 bullocks.

For 1 slaughterman-7 bullocks.

Calves:

2 calves shall equal 1 bullock.

Pigs:

For 1 slaughterman-

- (i) up to 80 lbs. weight-26.
- (ii) up to 200 lbs. weight-18.

(iii) 200 lbs. and over-9.

Provided that the pen is not more than 18 feet from the scalding pens and provided also that the employer shall provide all necessary assist-ance to handle and lift the pigs.

(ii) Any slaughterman shall, if required by the employer, kill and dress more than one class of stock, in which case his day's work shall be proportioned to the tally laid down for each class.

(d) General:

- (i) All work done by slaughtermen on beef, tally in subclause (c) of this Clause shall be paid for at rate and a half.
- (ii) In the event of any class of stock, bullocks, calves or pigs not being in the pens, or scalding water provided for men employed on pigs by 8.30 a.m. tallies shall be de-creased in proportion to the length of time the worker is kept waiting.
- (iii) Provided a slaughterman's labourer has cleaned up, and provided also that the day's tally has been done, he shall cease work with the slaughterman, but if called upon to work after the slaughterman has done his full tally, except for the purpose of cleaning up, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half
- (iv) In the event of any slaughterman or slaughtermen on whom a slaughterman's labourer is in attendance not doing his or their full tally, the labourer may, on the completion of the work, be employed at ordinary rates at other work on the floor for the time equivalent to the uncompleted proportion of the tally.
- (v) Adult labourers shall be employed where necessary.
- (vi) Junior and adult labourers labouring on slaughtermen shall not go beyond the outside overnight holding pen for stock.
- (vii) No slaughterman shall clean up or wash down.
- (viii) No carcase lumping shall be done by any slaughterman or by any person who has done his day's tally. Lumpers, when not engaged on lumping, may be engaged on any other work, but shall not suffer any deduction of pay.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:-

- (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpre-tations of the provisions of this Award or any of them.
- (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of Regulation 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

27.—Preference to Unionists.

(a) Preference of employment as between members of the West Australian Branch Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and other workers shall be given to aforesaid members: Provided that-

- There are members of the said union equally qualified with other workers offer-(i) There ing their services to perform the particular work required to be done and ready and willing to undertake same;
- (ii) The rules of the Union shall permit any worker of good character coming within the scope of this Award to become a member of the Union, upon payment of a reasonable subscription and/or entrance fee. If any question should arise as to the reasonableness of such entrance and/or subscription it shall be referred to the Registrar for decision: and-
- (iii) In any case where a new worker not having been a member of the said Union at the time of his engagement applies for membership of the said Union within seven (7) days after his engagement, it shall be deemed that no question of preference has arisen, unless and until his application is rejected for good cause.

(b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this Clause shall not apply if there is any restriction of output by the workers acting in concert, or if any system of clocking work or otherwise regulating the time for the performance of work is in operation.

(c) This clause shall be deemed to be rescinded on the conviction of the said Union or any of its members of an offence under Part IX of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.

(d) The provisions of this Clause shall not operate in the case of junior workers under the age of eighteen (18) years.

28.—General Conditions.

(a) The employer shall provide suitable dressing rooms and dining rooms for all workers.

(b) Sufficient power driven grindstones, and hot and cold showers to be provided; also full provision for hanging and drying clothes.

(c) The whole of the work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the employers.

(d) (i) Each employer shall keep a first-aid equipment containing the following:-

3 Sterilized dressings for fingers.

- 3 Sterilized dressings (assorted sizes, one for hand, one for feet and one large size).
- Tube or pot ung vitamine ata (V.P. 48).

6 Assorted roller bandages.

2 ozs. Iodine.

2 ozs. Sal Volatile. 1 Triangular bandage.

1 Reel adhesive tape, 2 inches.

Eye drops and brush.

2 Enamel or kidney dishes, 8 inches.

Medicine glass.

A.P.C. tablets (24).

(ii) Where possible one person employed in the industry shall be a qualified man to tend to any injuries.

(e) Junior workers may be employed in the cold storage branch of the industry; provided that a junior worker shall not be permitted to work in a chamber with a temperature below thirty-two (32) degrees. "Chamber" shall mean any room artificially cooled.

(f) Workers when overheated through working outside, shall be allowed to cool down before entering the chamber.

(g) Ammonia helmet shall be kept adjacent to chambers.

(h) All workers shall be paid weekly and in the time of the employer not later than Friday in each week; provided that payment may be made during the smoke-ohs.

(i) Waterproof cape and cap shall be provided for workers engaged in defrosting.

(j) No worker shall be called upon to work in a chamber with wet floors or dripping pipes, or where a leak of ammonia exists excepting for the purpose of affecting repairs, in which case rubber boots or ammonia helmet shall be provided for such workers.

(k) Each chamber shall be provided with an alarm connected with the engine room.

(1) No worker shall be called upon to work in a chamber unless he be paid at least the minimum rate provided for such class of work.

(m) Canvas aprons shall be supplied to cold storage workers when they are engaged handling unwrapped meat.

(n) The temperature in the "Boning Room" shall not be lower than forty-five (45) degrees above zero.

(o) The employer shall provide locker accommodation in the dressing rooms where clothes and worker, or in lieu thereof provide some system where clothes and belongings may be stored and kept by each such worker, this provision need not apply in respect to casuals.

29.—Shift Work.

Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions the existing practice in respect to shift work shall continue, provided that shift workers shall be paid a penalty rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to their normal daily wage.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 43 of 1956.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and A. T. Brine & Sons Pty Ltd., Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court.

Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:---

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note---Wherever the word "Award" accurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.--Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Quarry Workers' (Donnybrook Freestone) Award."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

4.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to the classifications mentioned herein who are employed in the freestone quarrying industry within a seven (7) mile radius of the Post Office at Donnybrook.

5.—Hours.

Day Workers.

Forty (40) hours, exclusive of meal times shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) shifts of eight (8) consecutive hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.

6.—Overtime.

Day Workers.

(a) All time worked beyond the hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work done on Sundays and/or holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) When a worker is recalled after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(d) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one and a half hours, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof: Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker who can conveniently return home for a meal.

(e) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(f) In the computation of overtime, each day shall stand alone.

(g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:-

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way whether directly or in-directly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the voruing of the subscription of the subscription. the requirements of this subclause.

7.-Wet Places.

Any worker working on wet ground so that his feet become wet shall be paid at the rate of one shilling and four pence (1s. 4d.) per day extra. Provided that this clause shall not apply when the employer provides the worker with rubber boots.

8.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one day or shift or less, he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

9.-Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service of all workers other than casual workers shall be by the day and shall be terminable by one (1) day's notice on either side given on any day, and if the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(b) Wages shall be paid weekly unless otherwise mutually agreed.

10.-Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work from any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

11.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Nothwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) As from the date of this Award, sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has not been allowed in any year to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues

(h) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to payment under this clause

12.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall be allowed as holidays without deduc-tion of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such lcave cn full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The Provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage may be employed at such lesser wage as may be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Union.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate

15.-Board of Reference.

(a) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purposes of the Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.-Record.

The wages book (or wages sheets) of the employer shall be open for inspection by the Secretary, or an accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the Company during working hours, upon reasonable notice being given of the desire to inspect same

17.—Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour and at the change of shift, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one week.

18.—Inclement Weather.

Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 10 (Breakdowns) each worker (other than a casual worker) shall be paid an allowance at ordinary rates for time lost through inclement weather, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) That such allowance shall not exceed the equivalent of eight (8) hours' pay in any one week;

(b) that weather shall not be regarded as inclement for the purposes of this clause unless the employer, or his representative on the job, and the employee, or a representative of the employee, agree that it shall be so regarded. Failing such agreement, weather shall not be regarded as inclement and work shall continue;

(c) that any intermission of work owing to inclement weather, regarded as such aforesaid, shall immediately cease and work shall be immediately resumed on the employer or his representative calling for a resumption of work;

(d) that an employee shall not be entitled to payment as provided for in this clause unless he remains on the job until a decision to cease work for the day has been made by agreement between the employer or his representative and the employee or his representative;

(e) that the intermission of work by employees who would be exposed to or working in inclement weather, so regarded in accordance with this clause, shall not be a ground for intermission of work in places where employees are not so exposed to or are not called upon to work in such inclement weather.

19.—Leading Hand.

Any worker placed in charge of three or more other workers shall be paid at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per day extra whilst so employed.

Clause 8.-Camp Allowance.

Delete the whole of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

Clause 8.-Camp Allowance.

(a) Employees who are required to camp at the site of the work either by direction of the employer, or because no reasonable transport facilities are available to enable them to proceed to and from their homes each day, shall be paid a camping allowance of £1 15s. for every complete week they are available for work. Such weekly allowance is to cover any fares incurred at the week-end by men travelling away from camp to their homes and return, but an employee who is absent from duty without the employer's approval on the working day immediately prior to or succeeding a week-end shall be paid as provided in the following sentence.

If required to be in camp for less than a complete week, they shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per day including any Saturday or Sunday, if in camp and available for work on the working days immediately preceding and succeeding each Saturday and Sunday. Provided that in the case of employees beyond the 26th parallel camped 20 miles or more from the nearest town the camp allowance shall be £3 10s. per week, and if required to be in camp less than a completed week the allowance of five shillings (5s.) herein contained shall be increased to ten shillings (10s.).

(b) Provided, however, where the employer at his own cost, provides the employee with a proper mess room and cooks the employee's food free of charge, the allowance provided in subclause (a) of this clause shall be reduced to 17s. 6d. per week or 2s. 6d. per day, as the case may be, except in the case of employees beyond the 26th parallel, who are in camps 20 miles or more from the nearest town, where the amounts shall be £1 15s. per week and five shillings (5s.) per day.

(c) When satisfactory accommodation, other than tents or huts, is made available by the employer, the allowance mentioned in subclause (a) may be reduced in the case of any worker, however short his occupation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer; the amount of such reduction to be agreed upon by a representative of the respondent concerned and the Union, and in the event of a dispute or difference, to be referred to a Board of Reference for determination. Provided that where satisfactory accommodation other than the provision of tents or huts, is made available in the case of married men by the employer, the allowance mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall not be payable however short his occupation of such accommodation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer. Such accommodation shall not be deemed satisfactory for the purpose of this subclause unless it is sufficient to reasonably provide for the accommodation of the worker, his wife and any of such worker's dependants who shall be nominated by him. Any dispute as to the accommodation provided under this subclause may be referred to the Board of Reference.

Three chucks and blades shall equal two quarters of beef.

Five butts shall equal two quarters of beef. Seven briskets with shin attached shall equal

two quarters of beef. Three butts and rumps shall equal two quarters

of beef. Five briskets and shins with portion of clod attached shall equal two quarters of beef.
