WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Juries Act, 1957-1959, *inter alia*, that when it appears to the Governor that the duties of any office, or class of offices, in the paid and active service of the Crown in right of the State or of any agency or instrumentality of the Crown in right of the State, are such that interruption of the discharge of those duties would result in serious inconvenience to the public or any section of the public, the Governor may, by Proclamation, exempt any person while occupying that office, or while occupying any class of those offices, from liability to serve as jurors; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, that the interruption of the discharge of the duties of the class of offices specified hereunder would result in serious inconvenience to the public or some section of the public: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in me vested, do hereby exempt the persons for the time being occupying the classes of offices specified hereunder from liability to serve as jurors, that is to say—

- (a) Inspectors of Mines;
- (b) officers of the Field Division of the Native Welfare Department.

Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 884/19.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Water Boards Act, 1904, that for every Water Area constituted under that Act, there shall be a Water Board constituted by the Governor by Order in Council; and whereas it is enacted by section 3 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, that the Governor may revoke any Order in Council made before, or after, the commencement of the said lastmentioned Act, for the constitution of a Water Board under the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, aforesaid, and dissolve the Water Board constituted pursuant to any Order so revoked; and whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of July, 1919, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of July, 1919, the Governor's Deputy, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 6 of the Water Boards Act, constituted the Wyndham Road Board a Water Board to administer the Water Boards Act, 1904, in the Wyndham Water Area as constituted under that Act; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient that the Water Board constituted pursuant to the said Order in Council should be dissolved: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by section 3 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, doth hereby as from and after the 1st day of July, 1960, revoke the said Order in Council and dissolve the said Wyndham Road Board as the Water Board constituted for the Wyndham Water Area pursuant to the said Order in Council.

Busselton Water Board—Proposed Loan £6,000.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, a Water Board may, with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, of the Busselton Water Board borrowing the sum of six thousand pounds (£6,000) for a period of fifteen years, repayable by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments with interest at the rate of five pounds ten shillings (£5 10s.) per centum per annum for the work approved by Order in Council dated the 17th May, 1960, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th May, 1960, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the 1st day of November, 1960.

Wyndham Country Water Area and Rating Zone.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

1. UNDER section 4 (6) of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, the Water Area constituted, defined and now subsisting as a water area under and for the purposes of that Act under the name or designation shown in the Schedule "A" hereunder of this Order is hereby abolished.

2. Whereas it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1957, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Country Water Area; and whereas by section 10 of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Rating Zone in a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Wyndham Country Water Area as defined in Schedule "B" hereunder and assign the name "Wyndham Country Water Area" thereto and also doth hereby constitute the Wyndham Rating Zone as defined in Schedule "B" hereunder and assign the name "Wyndham Rating Zone" thereto.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 1st day of July, 1960.

Wyndham Water Area as constituted and defined by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, dated 18th July, 1919.

Schedule "B."

Wyndham Country Water Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Wyndham Lot 600 (reserve 24041), a point on the low water mark of Cambridge Gulf, and extending generally easterly along northern boundaries of that lot, lot 654 and again lot 600 to its north-eastern corner and onwards to the eastern side of Ranford Street; thence generally south-south-easterly along that side, the eastern side of Mueller Street, the eastern boundary of lot 615, and again the eastern side of Mueller Street to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern side of Wright Street; thence west-south-westerly to the summit of Emu Hill; thence south-westerly to an angle post on the eastern side of road number 1347, situate 20 chains and 25 links southerly from the southern side of Reginald Street; thence generally south-south-easterly along that side to the left bank of 3 Mile Creek; thence generally north-easterly upwards along that bank to the northern corner of lot 446 (reserve 21453); thence east-south-easterly to a point on the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of lot 532, situate 11 chains and 30 links northerly from the easternmost north-eastern corner of that lot; thence southerly to and along that boundary and eastern boundaries of lots 484, 531 (reserve 24690), 492 to 487 inclusive and 485 and onwards to the existing five-inch C.I. main from King River; thence west-north-westerly to an angle on the south-western side of the Great Northern Highway, situate at the southern end of Red Hill Pass; thence generally northerly along western sides of that highway to a point situate in prolongation west-north-westerly of the southern boundary of reserve 4007; thence west-north-westerly along that prolongation to the low water mark of Cambridge Gulf aforesaid, and thence generally north-north-easterly along that low water mark to the starting point, as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 31827. The salary scales set out in this schedule are fixed in relation to the annual equivalent of the weekly basic wage declared by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, and the classification contained in the schedule is based on the annual equivalent of £692 as on the first of January, 1957.

2. The salary scales for adult male teachers and officers set out in Part II of this schedule shall be subject to adjustment after that date either up or down to the nearest £1 of the annual equivalent of the weekly basic rate declared from time to time by the Court.

3. The salaries of male junior officers whose rates are less than the basic wage shall be adjusted *pro rata* with the adult male minimum rate, calculated to the nearest £1.

4. No male teacher of the age of 21 years shall receive less than the basic wage rate.

5. Teachers located in areas for which an independent basic wage rate has been declared different from the metropolitan basic wage rate shall have their salaries adjusted by the difference between such rates calculated to the nearest £1.

6. The salaries of female teachers and officers other than clerical assistants in schools shall be subject to adjustment either up or down at the rate of 70 per cent. to the nearest £1 of any adjustment applicable to the salaries of male teachers.

(c) Students who obtain the Teachers' Certificate and have completed all of the requirements other than the educational thesis for the Bachelor of Education Degree shall be placed on a basic grade in accordance with subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, but if they satisfactorily complete the requirements of the educational thesis for the Bachelor of Education within one year from the date of completion of College training, they may be placed retrospectively on Grade 6 from the date of appointment ex College.

3. (a) Except as provided in any other subparagraph of this paragraph, progression along the salary scale shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

(b) A teacher shall not proceed beyond Grade 9 of the basic scale unless he has obtained over the previous two years an average efficiency mark of not less than 77 and a mark of not less than 77 in the final year.

(c) A teacher holding the Teacher's Certificate who has served for one year on Grade 6 and has obtained over the previous two years an average efficiency mark of not less than 77 and a mark of not less than 77 in the final year will proceed direct to Grade 9.

(d) A teacher shall not proceed beyond Grade II unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate.

(e) A teacher shall not proceed beyond Grade 13 unless over the previous three years he has obtained an average efficiency mark of 80 and a mark of not less than 80 in the final year.

(f) (i) A teacher who has served for one year on Grade II and has obtained the efficiency assessment specified in subparagraph (e) of this paragraph shall proceed direct to Grade 14 if he has obtained the Teachers' Higher Certificate or its equivalent.

(ii) A teacher who has not obtained the qualifications specified in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph may not proceed beyond Grade 17.

(g) Subject to continued satisfactory service, a teacher who has obtained the Teachers' Higher Certificate shall proceed by annual increments to Grade 21.

(h) A teacher who obtains a promotion to a position carrying additional responsibility allowance shall continue his normal progression on the basic scale and shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance of his new position that will give him an increase in salary as a result of his promotion.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2 of 1960.

Between The Royal Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and N'Gala Mothercraft Home and Training Centre Incorporated, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Mothercraft Home and Training Centre Nurses' Award" and replaces Award No. 41 of 1955, as amended.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to registered nurses, Mothercraft and student nurses, employed by the respondent.

4.—Term.

This Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Definitions.

"Nurse" shall mean and include one who is registered or entitled to be registered in Western Australia under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1957.

"Matron" shall mean the nurse in control of the Nursing Service and performing other duties at the Hospital.

"Tutor" shall mean a nurse engaged in full time teaching of student nurses.

"Sister" shall mean a nurse with general certificate who has had not less than two years' experience after registration.

"Mothercraft Nurse" is one who is registered or entitled to be registered as such in Western Australia under the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1957.

"Trainee" shall mean a student undergoing training in a registered training school.

"Federation" shall mean the Royal Australian Nursing Federation (Western Australian Branch) Industrial Union of Workers, Perth.

6.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary hours of work shall be forty (40) hours per week exclusive of meal times, provided that for trainees the hours worked shall be in straight shifts of eight (8) hours each.

(b) Morning and afternoon tea shall be provided by the employer, to be taken as convenient, without deduction of the time involved.

(c) Those on day duty shall be allowed at least one and a half (1½) days' continuous time off duty per week, and those on night duty shall be allowed at least one and a half (1½) days' continuous time off duty per week or three (3) days' continuous time off duty per fortnight.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of—

- (i) Time and a half for the first eight hours;
- (ii) Double time thereafter.

(b) Less than thirty (30) minutes overtime per week or one (1) hour's overtime per fortnight as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

8.—Holidays.

(a) Every worker covered by this Award, where not otherwise provided for, shall be entitled to four (4) weeks' leave on full pay for each twelve (12) months' service: Provided that a fortnight shall be taken during the first twelve (12) months and the balance to be taken on completion of training.

(b) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying 12 monthly period an employee lawfully leaves her employment, or her employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the employee, the employee shall be paid one-third (⅓) of a week's pay at her ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service. Provided that in the case of first year student nurses, the minimum period of service shall be three months.

(c) In addition to her salary, the worker on leave shall, where board and lodging allowance as prescribed by clause 18 is not included in the salary, be entitled to receive such allowance for the period of her leave.

(d) Leave shall be paid for in advance at the rate of salary the worker was receiving at the time of taking such leave.

(e) An employee who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs her contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

9.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) Subject as hereinafter provided sick leave shall be granted on the basis of ten (10) working days on full pay for each year of service.

(ii) If, in any calendar year any absence through sickness exceeds the workers' current entitlement, and, by service subsequent to the sickness becomes entitled to further sick leave with pay, payment may be adjusted at the end of that calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, whichever is the sooner.

(iii) Any unused portion of the sick leave herein prescribed up to a maximum of seven (7) working days in each year shall be allowed to accumulate and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(b) Workers in the employ of the Board of Management of N'gala Mothercraft Home and Training Centre Incorporated, at the commencement of this clause shall be allowed an initial credit on the following basis:—

(i) Where continuous service exceeds three (3) years—forty-five (45) working days less any sick leave taken during the preceding triennial period.

(ii) Where continuous service is less than three (3) years—an amount calculated on the entitlement provided for in subclause (a) hereto, less any sick leave taken from the commencement of service to the date this amendment comes into force.

(c) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate, provided that if in any case it is not convenient for the employee to obtain a medical certificate, sick leave may be granted on other evidence satisfactory to the employer, but such leave shall be limited to two (2) consecutive days in any one period and a total of three (3) days in any calendar year.

(d) (i) The maximum period of sick leave allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed six months.

(ii) A worker who has been granted six months continuous sick leave with pay shall not be entitled to receive further sick leave with pay until a period on duty of not less than four weeks has been completed.

(e) Any period during which a worker is absent on leave without pay shall not be included as part of such worker's period of continuous service for the purpose of this clause.

(f) A worker who is absent on approved annual leave, long service leave, or leave without pay, shall not be eligible for leave under this clause during the currency of such approved leave.

(g) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

10.—Termination of Service.

(a) Except in the case of dismissal for misconduct a worker's services shall not be terminated unless she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice or pay for such period in lieu thereof.

(b) No worker shall, without the consent of her employer resign without first having given fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her intention so to do; and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold holiday or other pay up to the amount of fourteen (14) days' wages: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a nurse who has received a summons for duty with any of the armed forces of Australia.

(c) A worker dismissed for misconduct shall have the right of appeal against such dismissal to a Board of Reference or to such person as may be agreed upon by her with her employer, and such worker shall be entitled to a written statement as to the reason for her dismissal from her employer within fourteen (14) days of the said employer's having received a written request for such statement.

(d) This clause shall not apply to casual employees.

11.—Trainees.

(a) The period of training shall be such as is prescribed in the regulations issued by the Nurses' Registration Board.

(b) Any employer taking a trainee on probation shall, within fourteen (14) days thereafter, register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in writing.

(c) Within one (1) month from the end of the period of probation an agreement in writing as required by the Act shall be executed and signed by the employer, the trainee, and, where the trainee is under twenty-one (21) years of age, the parent or legal guardian of the probationer. There shall be three (3) executed copies of such agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one by the trainee or her parent or guardian, and one shall be lodged with the Registrar.

(d) Mothercraft trainees shall be employed for a period of four (4) months on probation; such period shall count as part of the term of service.

(e) The agreement may be cancelled by mutual consent of the parties, but notification of such cancellation must be forwarded to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days from the date thereof.

(f) The employer, with the consent of the Court, may discharge a trainee from service and cancel the agreement for misconduct or wilful disobedience or any other cause which the Court may deem sufficient: Provided, however, the employer shall be entitled to impose any other disciplinary measures as are provided in the indentures.

(g) Trainees who do not pass their final examinations may be retained until such examinations are passed, and during such period they shall be paid at the rate provided for trainees in their final year. But such extended period shall in no case exceed twelve (12) months.

(h) The employer shall report to the Court in writing the result of all examinations immediately the result is available, showing—

- (i) The names of the candidates sitting;
- (ii) the training school attended;
- (iii) the result of the examinations.

This report shall be available for inspection by the Union secretary or her authorised nominee.

(i) The proportion of trainees in a mothercraft training school approved by the Nurses' Registration Board shall be not more than eight (8) trainees to each certificated nurse.

12.—Laundry and Uniforms.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to all reasonable laundry work at the expense of the employer, but where the uniform of any worker cannot be laundered at the home an allowance of four shillings (4s.) per week shall be paid to that worker.

(b) The employer shall provide all uniforms, which shall at all times remain the property of the employer, provided that—

- (i) Mothercraft trainees shall pay an amount of three guineas (£3 3s.) towards the cost of initial uniforms at the commencement of their training, but on completion of the first twelve (12) months of training the amount of three guineas (£3 3s.) shall be refunded to the trainee.
- (ii) In lieu of providing uniforms the employer may pay an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per week.

13.—Rosters.

A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in such place as it may conveniently and readily be seen by each worker concerned. The roster shall be posted not less than forty-eight (48) hours preceding the day on which the roster commences. The roster shall be available to the Union Secretary for inspection at all reasonable times. Rosters may be altered at any time if the centre exigencies render any alteration necessary.

14.—Time and Wages Book.

(a) A time book shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the Union Secretary, or her nominee, appointed in writing under the seal of the Union. Each worker must record daily in such book the exact time on which she starts and finishes duty and also time booked off for meals,

(b) The salary sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection at the office of the centre by the Union secretary or her nominee appointed as aforesaid.

(c) Any system of automatic recording by means of a machine shall be deemed a compliance with the provisions of subclause (a) so far as the particulars actually recorded are concerned.

15.—Interviews.

The Union Secretary shall be entitled to interview members of the Union on the centre's premises at reasonable times.

16.—Notices.

If the Union so requests, a copy of this Award shall be posted on a board of reasonable size in a place where it may be conveniently and readily seen by every worker concerned. The Union Secretary may also post thereon such other notices relating to Union matters as are reasonable.

17.—Preference.

All other qualifications being equal, preference of employment shall be given to members of the Federation.

Provided that any worker who is not a member of the Federation shall, within twenty-eight (28) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership of the said Federation.

18.—Living Allowance.

(a) Where board and lodging are provided the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker an amount equal to thirty-three and one-third per cent. (33 $\frac{1}{3}$ %) of the female basic wage. Provided that student nurses who are paid a percentage of the basic wage shall receive free board and lodging assessed at the above rate.

(b) In all cases the ratio of the value of board to that of lodging in the board and lodging allowance shall be two to one.

(c) The Federation Secretary or her nominee duly appointed in writing under the seal of the Federation shall be entitled to inspect such food and accommodation at reasonable times.

(d) Where a worker is required to live out a payment of one pound three shillings and sixpence (£1 3s. 6d.) per week shall be made by the employer in approved cases. Provided that any dispute between the Federation and the employer shall be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(e) Where workers who are paid on a living out basis are provided with meals by the employer, deduction shall be made from their wages at the rate of one twenty-first (1/21) of the allowance for board in accordance with subclause (b) hereof for each meal provided.

19.—Long Service Leave.

(i) An employee who has completed ten (10) years' continuous service, reckoned from the first day of November, 1935, in one hospital or under one employer shall be entitled to long service leave for three (3) months on full pay, or six (6) months on half pay. Time spent on long service leave or in absence for more than two (2) weeks without pay shall not be considered as part of such qualifying service.

(ii) An employee who resigns or is retired or dismissed (except for misconduct) and has long service leave due to her, shall receive three (3) months' full pay.

(iii) After the completion of the next term of ten (10) years' service, the employee shall be entitled to another long service leave of three (3) months, and similarly, after the next term of seven (7) years, on the same conditions as apply to the first term of long service leave.

(iv) This clause shall not apply when there is in existence a special agreement for long service leave. If an employee has been employed continuously by several employers, whether the Minister for Public Health or a hospital board or boards established under the Hospitals Act, 1927, or as a district sister under clause 32 of this Award, her service shall be counted as continuous for the purpose of qualifying

for long service leave; provided she has been employed for a minimum period of two (2) years by each employer, unless the employee submits a reason which in the opinion of such employer is a good and sufficient reason for entering into employment with another employer before the expiration of two years' service.

The employee must furnish written proof of such continuous service. The employer at the time of the application for long service leave shall be the person responsible to the employee for long service leave and payment therefor.

20.—Casuals.

A mothercraft nurse employed for a period of less than two (2) weeks shall be deemed a casual worker and be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the rate specified in this Award.

If a casual worker is still required at the end of two (2) weeks, she may be re-employed as a casual with payment as aforesaid for another two (2) weeks.

21.—Other Provisions.

(a) Trainees sitting for the examination held by the Nurses' Registration Board, shall be taken off night duty for at least four (4) weeks, as far as practicable, before the examinations are held.

(b) For Nurses' Registration Board examinations, as far as practicable, three (3) consecutive days off, i.e., one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) days to be days off for the week, and one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) days of examinations.

(c) Trainees shall not be placed on more than two (2) consecutive months on night duty in any one year.

22.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement, or any of them;

(ii) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

23.—Salaries.

(a) Salaries shall be paid at least twice per calendar month or fortnightly, at the option of the employer; provided that by agreement between the employer and the Union the salary may in any particular case be paid once per calendar month.

(b) The minimum salary per week payable to employees shall be as set out hereunder:—

Between The West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers (Perth), Applicant, and BP Refinery (Kwinana) Limited, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Oil Refinery Cleaners Award 1960."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within the South-west Land Division of Western Australia.

4.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers engaged in the classification referred to in Clause 22 hereof in the Oil Refining Industry.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Definition.

"Casual Worker" means a worker whose employment is terminated through no fault of his own before the expiration of one week.

7.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day Monday to Friday inclusive.

The meal interval on day work shall not exceed one (1) hour.

8.—Overtime.

(a) Except as hereinafter mentioned, all work performed in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 7 and all work performed on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in sub-clause 15 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Overtime on Shift Work shall be based on the rate payable for Shift Work.

(d) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after his usual knock-off time for more than two hours, he shall be provided with any meal required or be paid five shillings in lieu thereof. Provided that such payment need not be made to workers living in the same locality as their place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

(e) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(f) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.

(g) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves.

9.—Shift Work.

A worker employed on afternoon shift shall be paid seven and a half per cent. (7½%) in addition to his ordinary rate.

10.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

11.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for not more than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

12.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of casual workers, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 14 or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct.

13.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

14.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

15.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to Clause 8 hereof be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

Any worker absenting himself from work without reasonable cause, proof of which shall lie upon him, on the whole or any portion of the working day succeeding a holiday provided for herein, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(b) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(c) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which, in the case of that worker, would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(d) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

16.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st day of April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transferee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transferee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transferee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

(a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.

(b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.

(c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.

(d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

(i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

(ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;

(iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

5. Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

(a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;

(b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;

(c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;

(d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State Law;

- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notified the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this sub-clause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award (or agreement), but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

(a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;

(b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of sub-clause (c) applies—

(a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award (or agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—

(i) in full before the worker goes on leave;

(ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or

(iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

2. Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the 1st day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award (or Agreement) with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

(a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;

(b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 1st day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

17.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he

shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this paragraph, and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours either at the employer's office or at the works.

18.—Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Notice Boards.

Notices previously approved by the employer may be posted by representatives of the Union at approved points in the Refinery.

20.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a Chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them.

(ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of Regulation 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

21.—Representatives Interviewing Workers.

The Secretary or other full-time representative of the Union, authorised in writing by the President or Secretary of the Union, shall be allowed to enter the Refinery not more than once in any week for the purpose of inspecting working places and shall be permitted to interview workers during the recognised meal period and at the change of shifts. Such secretary or representative may, if he so desires, be accompanied by any other member of the Union employed by the respondent, not actually on duty.

22.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable under the provisions of this Award shall be as follows:—
