IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of five years as from 16th August, 1960.

All that portion of Hardy Inlet south of a line drawn in a westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the eastern side of the inlet) to a point where the southern boundary of Hurford Street touches the foreshore (on the western side of the inlet); thence extending to the southern ocean and including all waters which may be or may have been cut off from the main stream by a change of course of the inlet near its junction with the ocean.

P.H.D. 1332/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1959, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order, and may abolish any such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor,

acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the said Act, doth hereby—

- (a) declare the health district known as the Swan Health District and declared so to be by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st December, 1951, to be abolished; and
- (b) declare all that portion of the State comprised in the Swan-Guildford Road District, constituted by the union as at the 30th day of June, 1960, of the Guildford Municipal District and the Swan Road District, to be a health district, and for the purposes of the said Act to be known as the Swan-Guildford Health District.

IT is hereby notified for public information in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1959, that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning on the 10th day of August, 1960, approved of the Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 1 Regulation and Amendments being amended by the City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 5 Regulation which was duly advertised in the *Government Gazettes* of the 5th, 12th and 19th February, 1960, and varies the City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 1 Regulation and Amendments by the following:—

(a) The definition "Home Occupation" in paragraph 4 of "City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme Number one Regulation and Amendments" is amended by adding after the word "horticulture" appearing in line 3 of sub-paragraph (c) the words "or for storing, repairing and manufacturing of crayfish pots and fishing gear."

(b) By adding after paragraph 16 of "City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme Number one Regulation and Amendments" the following paragraph:—

17. No person shall store, repair or manufacture crayfish pots or fishing gear within a residential zone unless—

- (i) Such crayfish pots or fishing gear are stored, repaired or manufactured at the rear of a dwelling house erected on a block of land in such residential zone (where there is such a dwelling house) or within 40 feet of the rear boundary where there is no such dwelling house or where there is no main building (hereinafter called "vacant land").

Exceptions.

- (a) The Council may permit the storing, repairing or manufacture of crayfish pots or fishing gear at the side of a dwelling house if—
- (i) the area is screened so that the crayfish pots and fishing gear are not visible from the front street; and
- (ii) The screen is not closer than 50 feet to the front fence.
- (b) The Council may permit the storing, repairing or manufacture of crayfish pots or fishing gear on vacant land other than within thirty feet of the rear boundary if—
- (i) the area is screened so that the crayfish pots and fishing gear are not visible from the front street; and
- (ii) the screen is not closer than 50 feet to the front fence.
- (ii) Such crayfish pots and fishing gear are the property of the occupier of the premises on which they are stored and provided the occupier of the premises is an active member of the fishing industry.
- (iii) Where a dwelling house is erected on the land, the area occupied by crayfish pots and fishing gear shall not be greater—
- (a) in the case of crayfish pots and fishing gear being stored, repaired and manufactured at the rear of a dwelling house than 20 per cent. of the unoccupied area at the rear of the dwelling or 500 square feet, whichever is the smaller;

(b) in the case of crayfish pots and fishing gear being stored, repaired and manufactured, at the side of a dwelling house, than 500 square feet including the land at the rear and the side so used.

- (iv) In the case of vacant land, the area occupied by crayfish pots and fishing gear shall not be greater than 500 square feet.
- (v) The crayfish pots are not stacked to a height exceeding six feet.
- (vi) The crayfish pots and fishing gear are stacked in a neat and tidy manner to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Inspector.
- (vii) The crayfish pots and fishing gear are so situated that—
- (a) the crayfish pots and fishing gear are not within the normal vision of neighbours to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Inspector;
- (b) the crayfish pots and fishing gear do not create a nuisance to persons living in adjoining or adjacent premises;
- (c) the crayfish pots and fishing gear are stacked in such a manner as to preserve the general amenity of the neighbourhood to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Inspector.

Provided in all cases that the location of the area in which any crayfish pots or fishing gear are stored, repaired or manufactured shall be subject to the approval of the Building Surveyor.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between
the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dis-
pute was referred into Court for the purpose of
hearing and determination; and whereas the
parties subsequently met and conferred and have
arrived at agreement on all matters in difference;
and whereas the parties have this day appeared
before the Court by their respective representa-
tives and requested the Court to make the said
agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore,
the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the "Industrial
Arbitration Act, 1912-1952" and all other powers
therein enabling it hereby declares the memo-
randum hereunder written to have the same effect
as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs
herein it shall be taken to mean and include
"Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Hotel Workers'
(South West Land Division) Award and replaces
Award No. 67 of 1951 as amended.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the respondents in the classifications described in clause 13 hereof.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within the South West Land Division of the State of Western Australia, excluding the area comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Definitions.

“Cellarman” shall mean a worker who is exclusively or principally engaged in the breaking down and bottling of spirituous liquors in the cellar of an hotel.

“Waiter” shall mean a worker who serves at table and attends to all the requirements of guests while having meals.

7.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) If a worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time, being not less than half an hour, but elects to remain thereon, the time he remains on the premises shall not be included in his or her working time.

8.—Spread of Shift.

(a) “Daily spread of shift” shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.

(b) “Weekly spread of shift” shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.

(c) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed seventy (70) hours.

(d) Subject to clause 11—Overtime, the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed twelve and a half (12½) hours.

9.—Breaks in Shift.

In addition to breaks of at least half an hour, but not more than one hour each for meals, there may be a break of at least two hours during each shift. Such break of at least two hours may include a meal break.

10.—Roster.

(a) A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in the office of each establishment and in such other place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.

(b) Such roster shall show—

(i) The name of each worker.

(ii) The hours to be worked by each worker each day and the breaks in shifts to be taken.

(c) (i) The roster in the office shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union at such times and place as the record book is so open for inspection.

(ii) A duly accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to inspect the roster available to the workers not more than once in any week during the times the record book is so open for inspection. Provided that the duly accredited representative must notify the employer before entering the place where the roster is kept.

(d) Such roster shall be drawn up in such manner as to show the hours of each worker for one week in advance of the date of the roster, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

11.—Overtime.

(a) All work done outside the daily spread provided in Clause 8 or beyond eight hours in any one day, or beyond forty hours in any one week, shall be deemed overtime.

(b) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. Provided that any overtime in excess of seven hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonably overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

12.—Night Work.

(a) Except in the case of night porters, any work done after 12 o'clock midnight and before 5 o'clock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

(b) Workers employed on more than four (4) night shifts in any one week shall be paid five per cent. (5%) extra for the week unless working day and night shifts in alternate weeks.

(c) The provisions of subclause (b) hereof shall not apply to night porters, casual workers, or workers employed on day and night shifts in alternate weeks.

(d) “Night shift” shall mean a shift where the workers' hours for the day finish after 8 p.m.

14.—Board and Lodging.

(a) No worker shall be compelled to board and/or lodge on the employer's premises and no employer shall be compelled to board and/or lodge

a worker; but where by mutual consent board and lodging are provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct in respect of all workers, the following amounts:—

- (i) For full board of twenty-one (21) meals per week—an amount equal to 18.5 per cent. of the male basic wage.
 - (ii) For lodging—an amount equal to 7 per cent. of the male basic wage.
- (b) Where, by mutual consent, full board is not provided, the deductions referred to in subclause (a) hereof shall be reduced proportionately.
- (c) The board and lodging allowances prescribed by this clause shall vary proportionately with the rise or fall in the basic wage.

15.—Accommodation.

(a) An employer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall consider the accommodation unsuitable, any party to this Award may refer the matter to the Board of Reference for decision, as provided in clause 33.

(b) Workers sleeping in shall be provided with a common sitting-room, apart from their bedrooms, and shall have access to a properly equipped bathroom, and also have access to a laundry at such times as are mutually agreed upon between the worker and the employer.

16.—Meals.

(a) Where full board is provided, workers shall be provided with three meals per day such as are daily served in ordinary family hotels. Such meals shall include a dinner consisting of at least three courses.

(b) Subject to clause 9, at least one half hour, but not more than one hour, shall be allowed for each meal.

17.—Junior Workers.

Male workers under the age of twenty-one (21) years may be employed as junior workers in any of the occupations covered by this Award, in the proportion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adult workers employed in the same occupation, at the following rates:—

Under 18 years of age	45
Between 18 and 19 years of age	55

Between 20 and 21 years of age	90

Provided that, where no adult is employed, one junior male may be employed, except in the kitchen.

18.—Junior Workers' Certificate.

(a) Junior workers upon being engaged shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) name in full;
- (ii) age and date of birth;
- (iii) name of each previous employer;
- (iv) class of work performed for each previous employer.

(b) No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate, or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled he shall make restitution to the employer.

19.—Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Casual workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) hours.

20.—Part Time.

Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 7 hereof, an employer shall be at liberty to employ part-time workers in the proportion of one (1) part-time worker to every four (4) full-time workers or part thereof.

For the purpose of this clause, part-time workers means workers regularly employed on a weekly basis for not less than two (2) consecutive hours per day and for a lesser period than forty (40) hours per week and on not less than two (2) or more than five (5) days per week.

Such workers whilst so employed shall be paid at the rate of 15 per cent. in addition to the time rate prescribed in the Award, and, that payment for annual leave, holidays, and sick leave, shall be on a *pro rata* basis in the same proportion as the number of hours regularly worked per week bears to forty (40) hours.

21.—Weekly Wage.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least weekly. No employer shall hold more than one day's wages in hand.

Provided that where by reason of this provision, wages become payable on a Sunday or a public holiday, such wages may be held in hand until the next following day.

(b) Workers whose weekly holiday or half day off falls on a pay day, shall be paid their wages upon a request from the worker to the employer, prior to the worker taking the day or half day off.

(c) Except for casual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis; provided that one day's notice of termination of service may be given on either side.

22.—Head Bands and Uniforms.

The employer may require plain white head bands to be worn by female employees.

Aprons, caps, collars, cuffs or any special uniforms required to be worn shall be supplied by the employer and shall be the property of the employer. Black dresses as usually worn by housemaids and waitresses and standard type uniforms as usually worn by workers in the industry shall not be deemed to be special uniforms within the meaning of this clause.

23.—Bar Work.

Any worker, other than a night porter, who performs the duties of a barman, that is, actually dispensing drinks across the bar, shall be paid the same rate as provided for barmen under the Barmaids and Barmen's Award, for the time so employed.

24.—Laundering.

If an employer requires female employees to wear aprons, caps, collars, cuffs, or any special uniforms, he shall pay to such employees four shillings (4s.) per week for the laundering of same, otherwise he shall cause the same to be laundered at his own expense.

If an employer requires white coats to be worn by his male employees, he shall pay them four shillings (4s.) per week extra for the laundering of same, or cause such white coats to be laundered at his own expense.

25.—Higher Duties.

Subject to the provisions of clause 23, any worker performing work for more than two (2) hours in any day in work carrying a higher prescribed rate of wage than that in which he is engaged shall receive such higher wage for the time so employed.

26.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, at his business premises or at each of them, if more than one, a time and wages book wherein shall be entered the name and occupation of each worker, and in the case of junior workers, the age on his last birthday, the time each worker commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked by a worker each day, the total hours worked each week and the wages paid to each worker.

(b) The record shall be entered up from day to day.

(c) The word "book" for the purpose of this clause, shall include loose leaves, if bound together and numbered consecutively.

(d) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily entering of the record, which shall be initialled, if correct, by the worker daily. The hours shown as worked in the record book shall be prima facie evidence of the correctness thereof in any proceedings for the enforcement of this Award.

(e) The book shall be open to inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the employer, on days other than Saturday and Sunday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (except from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.).

27.—Holidays.

(a) All workers (other than night porters) shall be entitled to receive one full day and one half day off duty each week.

(b) The half day off shall commence not later than 2 p.m.

(c) Night Porters.—Night porters shall be entitled to one night off duty in each week. Provided that, if work is performed by a night porter in lieu of his night off, he shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and one half. This provision shall not be availed of more than on six nights in any one year. Any dispute arising out of this provision shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

Provided further that night porters shall be paid ten shillings (10s.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed in clause 13 of this Award by virtue of the benefits conferred on other workers in subclause (a) hereof.

(d) All work done on any day observed as New Years Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday and Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day or Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under Clause 28 for each day or part of a day so worked. Provided that if, as a result of the worker's own default, only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day, an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day.

(e) On any public holiday not referred to herein, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

28.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

29.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

30.—Change and Rest Rooms.

Adequate change and rest rooms shall be provided by the employer in cases where the employees do not reside on the premises. Such rest rooms shall be provided with table, chairs and a lounge, couch or bed. These workers shall have access to a bathroom.

31.—Climbing Ladders and Cleaning of Public Lavatories.

No female worker shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, fanlights, walls or windows. No female worker shall be required to clean out men's public lavatories, or men's lavatories within the employer's establishment, unless attached to a bedroom or a suite.

32.—Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

33.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by regulations.

There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (b) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

34.—Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award, if supplied by the Union, shall be posted by the employer in the kitchen or pantry of the employer's premises where it may be readily and easily seen by the employees.

35.—Breakdown.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

36.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st day of April, 1958 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called the "transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness or injury to the worker but only to the extent of 15 working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.

(d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

- (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26th, 1950;
- (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
- (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any determination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct.

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) or paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination; the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave.
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

(a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways—

(i) in full before the worker goes on leave;

(ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheques posted to an address specified by the worker; or

(iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such a record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

I certify pursuant to Section 65 of the "Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952", that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

Clause 13.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) Subject to sub-clause (b) hereof the following days, or the days observed in lieu shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All work done on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this clause for each day or part of a day so worked. Provided that, if by agreement between the employer and the worker or as a result of the worker's own default, only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day, an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day. Provided further that at the option of the employer, the foregoing provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if all work performed on the holidays prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof is paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of such completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(k) Notwithstanding the foregoing the following provisions shall apply to all milk treatment plants situated within a 15-mile radius of the G.P.O., Perth—

(i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of four (4) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(ii) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one third ($\frac{1}{3}$) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(iii) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(iv) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(v) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(l) Liberty is reserved to apply to amend in respect of subclause (c) of original claim.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

THIS agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-52 this 4th day of August, 1960, between the Minister for Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") of the one part, and the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") of the other part witnesseth as follows:—

(a) Wherever the term "Pumper in Charge" is referred to herein, it shall mean a worker who is employed as a Pumper in Charge-engine driver.

(b) Wherever the term "Second Pumper" is referred to herein, it shall mean a worker who is employed as a Second Pumper-engine driver.

(c) "Engineer" means the officer occupying for the time being the position of Engineer, Goldfields Water Supply, Hydraulic Engineer, or any executive officer of the aforesaid engineers, as the case may be.

6.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) Such ordinary hours shall be worked by day workers in five shifts of eight hours each, Monday to Friday, and by shift workers in eight hour shifts.

(c) The hours of labour shall include all time occupied in raising steam, banking fires, starting up or closing down engines.

(d) Where circumstances permit, regular starting and finishing times may be fixed by agreement in writing between the Union and the department concerned or its representatives.

(c) (i) Where a Pumper in Charge or Second Pumper is required to attend an electric generator exceeding 10 kilowatt capacity (other than a generator used for merely lighting the works or for ancillary plant) he shall be paid an extra margin of nineteen shillings (19s.) per week.

(ii) Second pumpers in charge of plant shall be paid an extra margin of nineteen shillings (19s.) per week. Provided that these rates shall not be cumulative to the extent of increasing the margin of a worker above £4 16s.

(d) In addition to the margins prescribed in sub-clause (b) of this clause:—

(i) The Pumpers in Charge at Barbalin, Waddouring, Knungagin, Narembeen, Kondinin, Meckering and Menzies shall be paid an extra margin of twenty-seven shillings and sixpence (27s. 6d.) per week to cover all overtime worked.

(ii) The Pumpers in Charge at Meekatharra, Station Creek, Nallan and Ora Banda shall be paid an extra margin of forty shillings (40s.) per week to cover all overtime worked.

8.—Special Duties.

(a) All Pumpers in Charge and the Second Pumpers at Barbalin, Narembeen and Waddouring shall be required to undertake maintenance and repair work on the water mains and reticulations, fix and cut off services, read, remove and replace meters when necessary in addition to the duties in and around the pumping station.

(b) When not engaged on pumping at the Kellerberrin, Coolgardie, Widgiemooltha, Higginsville, Minnivale and Norseman Booster Stations or on other duties, to be employed on any general duties as directed by the Engineer Goldfields Water Supply or his deputy.

9.—No Reduction.

This Agreement shall not of itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at the date of the Agreement receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.

10.—Quarters.

(a) Pumpers in Charge—

(i) Except as hereinafter provided, where free quarters or fuel, light and water are not provided for a Pumper in Charge, an allowance as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be paid to such worker.

(ii) The Pumper in Charge at Pingelly shall be paid an amount of 12s. per week, and the Pumper in Charge at Menzies an amount of 10s. per week in lieu of free quarters, fuel, light, and water.

(b) Second Pumpers—

(i) Where quarters are provided for a Second Pumper, an amount as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be deducted for rent from the wages of the said worker by the Department.

(ii) Where free fuel, light and water are not provided for a Second Pumper, an allowance as agreed upon between the department and the worker concerned, or in default of agreement as fixed by a Board of Reference, shall be paid to such worker.

11.—District Allowances.

District allowances, calculated on the rates specified below, shall be paid to workers employed at the undermentioned stations:—

12.—Shift Work.

(a) Pumpers in Charge.—Pumpers in Charge shall take day shift or portion of day shift as necessary to meet the requirements of pumping.

(b) Second Pumpers—

(i) Where only one Second Pumper is employed, the Pumper in Charge may rotate with the Second Pumper and the shifts shall be as mutually arranged between themselves, or in default of agreement as fixed by the engineer.

(ii) Where two Second Pumpers are employed, they shall work a weekly rotation of afternoon and night shifts between themselves.

(iii) Where three Second Pumpers are employed they shall rotate day, afternoon, and night shifts amongst themselves.

(c) Where pumping is necessary outside of the hours of 8 a.m. to noon on a Saturday, or on a Sunday, each Second Pumper shall take up to an eight (8) hours shift, provided that, if the circumstances in the opinion of the Pumper in Charge require his special attention, he may take a shift.

(d) Second Pumpers when employed on afternoon shift shall be paid five per cent. (5%), and on night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to their ordinary rates for such shifts in accordance with subclause (e) hereof.

(e) For the purpose of assessing the payment of loading for shift work the following shall be the recognised hours of the various shifts:—

Day shift.—8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Afternoon shift.—4 p.m. to 12 midnight.

Night shift.—12 midnight to 8 a.m.

13.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the normal hours of eight per shift, or any additional shift, or part thereof shall, except as provided herein, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter: Provided that a worker called back to perform another shift on Sunday, after having completed his five shifts of eight hours shall be paid at the rate of double time for the time so worked.

(b) Saturday Time—

(i) Rostered shift work performed on Saturday up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(ii) The extra quarter rate shall stand alone and be paid for as an addition to the worker's weekly earnings.

(c) Sunday Time.—Rostered shift work performed on Sundays up to a maximum of eight hours in each shift shall be included in the week's work and be paid for at the rate of time and a

half. The extra half rate prescribed shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the worker's weekly earnings, provided that time worked in excess of eight hours on such Sundays shall be paid at the rate of double time, i.e. twice the ordinary rate, which rate shall be the maximum payable under this Agreement.

(d) Overtime and shift work rates shall not be cumulative on Saturday and Sunday penalty rates.

(e) The Department may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at such overtime rates, if any, as may be prescribed herein, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(f) The Union or any worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

14.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(ii) Seven day shift workers, i.e. shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed, in addition to clause (a)(i) hereof, seven consecutive days' leave including non-working days.

Where a worker with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of the twelve-monthly period as a seven day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the part of two weeks' consecutive days annual leave described in sub-clause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) Workers regularly working for the Government north of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two years, subject to the convenience of the department. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

(g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

15.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:— New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

16.—Casual Workers.

Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the usual rate in this agreement for the worker's occupation. A casual worker is one for whom work, over a period of six (6) consecutive days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.

17.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 18 hereof, as to payment for absence on account of illness.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismissal for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or from any other cause for which the employer is not responsible.

18.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer hereunder shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

19.—Payment of Wages.

When a worker is discharged before the usual pay day he shall be paid his wages when he ceases work, or it shall be forwarded to his address the day after by registered post, at the employer's risk, unless the worker desires to collect it at the office.

20.—Travelling Time, Fares, etc.

(a) When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, the employer shall pay all fares (including sleeper, where travelling is by rail and if considered necessary by the engineer) and a proper allowance at current rates for all necessary meals or board and lodging.

(b) The time necessarily occupied by all workers in travelling on duty (including waiting time) shall be paid, subject as hereinafter provided, as from the time of departure of the train or other means of transport to the arrival at destination at the ordinary rate of wages attached to the place of departure, but not to exceed eight (8) hours per day. Overtime rates shall not apply. Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days. When a worker is obliged to travel by road, a reasonable time for the road journey, as determined by the engineer, shall be allowed. No worker shall lose any time by transfer.

(c) When a worker is engaged by the Department at a place other than at the place of employment and the employer does not provide for transport for the worker, the worker shall be entitled on the completion of the job or after the completion of twelve (12) months' service on the job, whichever should first occur, to a refund of the fare actually paid by him in travelling from the place of engagement, (or from such other place as may be agreed upon between the Department and the worker) to the place of employment. The worker shall also be entitled in accordance with the provisions of subclause (e) hereof to a return fare free of cost. Provided that where a worker can travel by rail and elects to travel by other conveyance, the employer shall not be liable for payment of any expenses incurred by the worker unless the means of conveyance is approved by the engineer prior to the journey and in no case shall the worker be entitled to expenses exceeding the cost of the fare that would have been involved if the worker had travelled by rail.

(d) Where the Department has paid the fare of a worker to enable him to proceed to a job, and such worker leaves the job of his own accord or is dismissed on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory work within six (6) weeks of time of engagement, the amount of the fare to the job may be deducted from any amounts due to such worker at the time of dismissal or the termination of his service and he shall forfeit privileges of fare returns to place of engagement or such other places as provided in subclause (c) hereof.

(e) Rail fares shall be first class in the case of Pumpers in Charge and second class in the case of Second Pumpers. Return fares by rail or other means of conveyance shall also be paid on completion of job or after twelve (12) months on job.

21.—Firing and Repairs.

(a) Pumpers in Charge shall do their own firing where necessary and shall carry out such maintenance and repairs to the plant as are necessary to maintain it in efficient running order.

(b) Second Pumpers shall do their own firing where necessary and shall also do such minor repairs to the plant as in the opinion of the Pumper in Charge can be done during their shift.

22.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment shall be given in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement, to members of the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia.

23.—Interviewing Workers.

Providing he has previously notified the engineer, any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of the Union shall have the right to enter any place or premises during ordinary working hours wherein members of such Union covered by this Agreement are engaged, for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing the workers in such place or premises.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The engineer shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

24.—Inspection of Wages Sheets.

The wages sheets of the Department shall be open for inspection at the local or head office by the secretary or other authorised member of the Union, upon reasonable notice given of his desire to inspect same.

25.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement, Boards of Reference are hereby appointed, which shall each consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. Each Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the function of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of a Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

26.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full-time Government wages workers generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

27.—Camp Allowance.

Workers required to live in tents at or in the neighbourhood of the job shall be paid an additional allowance of thirty-five shillings (35s.) per week. The above allowance covers a week, whether of five, six or seven days. For broken periods this particular allowance shall be calculated at one-seventh (1/7th), viz., five shillings (5s.) per day.
