WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1959, that for the purposes of that Act the word "town" or "townsite" means and that Act the word "town" or "townsite" means and includes, *inter a.ia*, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is thereby empowered, to declare by Proclamation to be a town or townsite for the purposes of that Act; and whereas by Proclama-tion dated the 26th day of January, 1949, pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of February, 1949, the Governor declared certain land situate within the Moora Road District, more particularly described, defined and delineated in the schedule to that Proclamation, to be a town-site, to be known as "Miling," within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by that Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare so much of the land particularly described, defined and delineated in the schedule hereto situated within the boundaries of the Moora Road District not already declared a townsite to be a townsite within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act and to be added to and form part of the townsite known as "Miling."

Redivision into Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 3270/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919, doth hereby—

- (1) redivide the Rockingham District into four wards by-
 - (a) transferring portion of the Rural Ward to form the Singleton Ward, the boundaries of which are de-scribed in Schedule "A" hereto;
 - (b) transferring that portion of the Rural Ward as described in Schedule "B" hereto to the Town Ward;
 - (c) transferring that portion of the Rural Ward as described in Schedule "C" hereto to the Safety Bay Ward;
- (2) determine that the number of members for each ward shall be as follows:-

Town Ward—three members. Safety Bay Ward—three members. Rural Ward—two members. Singleton Ward-one member.

Schedule "A."

Singleton Ward Formerly Portion of the Rural Ward.

All that portion of the Rural Ward of Rockingham Road District bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the low water mark of the Indian Ocean in prolongation westerly of the southern side of a one-chain road passing along southern boun-daries of reserve 30716, Peel Estate Lot 1094 and part lot 901, a point on the Rockingham Road District boundary and extending easterly to and along

that side to the western side of road No. 6104; thence generally southerly along that side and the western side of road No. 10984 to the northern bounwestern side of road No. 10984 to the northern boun-dary of part of lot 3 of Cockburn Sound Location 16, as shown on Land Titles Office Deposited Plan 3064, a point on the Rockingham Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence westerly and generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plans 341D/40 and 2004 (40) warting point. 380A/40.)

Schedule "B."

Transfer of Territory from Rural Ward to Town Ward.

All that portion of the Rural Ward of Rockingham Road District bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the northern side of Office Road (road No. 1771) and the eastern side of Mandurah Road (road No. 1255) and extending generally south-south-easterly along the eastern side of Mandurah Road aforesaid to the southernmost corner of Cockburn Sound Location 189, a point on the Rockingham Road District boundary; thence south-easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Peel Estate Lot 22; thence westerly and southerly to and along the northern and the western boundaries of that lot to its southwestern corner; thence generally south-westerly along boundaries of lot 1287 ("A" class reserve 24411) to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of Rockingham Town Lot 268 (reserve 20226); thence westerly along that prolongation to the southernmost south-eastern corner of that lot, a point on the existing Town Ward boundary; thence north-easterly, northwesterly and again north-easterly along that boun-dary to a northern boundary of the Rockingham Road District; and thence easterly along that boundary and onwards to the starting point. All that portion of the Rural Ward of Rocking-ham Road District bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the eastern side of road No. 40 the intersection of the eastern side of road No. 40 and the southern boundary of Rockingham Town Lot 268 (reserve 20226), a point on the present Safety Bay and Town Wards' common boundary and extending easterly along the southern boundary of lot 268 aforesaid and onwards to a western boundary of Peel Estate Lot 1287 ("A" class reserve boundary of Peel Estate Lot 1287 ("A" class reserve 24411); thence generally south-easterly and south-erly along boundaries of that lot to the north-west-ern corner of lot 1127; thence again southerly along the western boundary of that lot and onwards to the southern side of Safety Bay Road (road No. 10168); thence westerly along that side to the east-even side of voed No. 40 aforesaid a point on the ern side of road No. 40 aforesaid, a point on the present Safety Bay Ward boundary; and thence north-westerly along that side to the starting point. thence westerly, northerly, easterly, again north-erly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 2442; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location and onwards to the southern boundary of the northern severance of Kojonup Loca-tion 5800; thence westerly along that boundary and onwards to the south-eastern corner of location 8764; thence westerly, southerly and south-westerly along boundaries of that location to its south-western corner; thence generally south-westerly along south-eastern boundaries of location 8122 to the south-eastern corner of location 4500; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location to the eastern boundary of location 4371; thence southerly and westerly along boun-daries of that location to its south-western corner and onwards westerly, northerly and again west-erly along boundaries of location 6153 to the south-eastern corner of location 5796; thence westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to its south-western corner; thence westerly along southern boundaries of locations 8093 and 2446 and onwards to the easternmost south-eastern corner of location 4349; thence westerly, southerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards along southern boundaries of locations 4348, 5312, 3786, 2015, 3442, to the south-eastern corner of location 1903; thence westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 1346; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location to its south-western corner, a point on the Gnowangerup Townsite boundary; thence generally northerly, generally north-westerly and generally southerly along that townsite boundary to the south-western corner of that townsite, a point on the eastern boundary of location 5512; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and the southern boundary of location 5497 and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 4431; thence south-erly and westerly along boundaries of that location to its south-western corner; thence south-westerly to the south-eastern corner of location 5379; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location to the eastern boundary of location 4116; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and the southern boundary of loca-tion 3859 to the north-eastern corner of location do65; thence southerly and westerly along boun-daries of that location and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 5990; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the eastern boundary of location 7094; thence south-erly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the north-eastern corner of location 1962; thence southerly, westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 276; thence west-erly along the southern boundary of that location to its south-western corner, a point on the Gnowangerup Road District boundary aforesaid, and thence generally northerly and generally east-erly along that road district boundary to the starting point. Between Western Knitters Pty. Ltd., Sekem Products Pty. Ltd. and others, applicants, and The Western Australian Clothing and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Knitting Trades Award and replaces Award No. 25 of 1950 as amended.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers who are eligible for membership of the Respondent Union, employed in the Industries carried on by the Applicants, in the classifications described in clause 12 hereof.

4.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

5.—.Term.

The term of this Award shall be for one (1) year as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours for all workers shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week, and shall be worked as follows:---

- (i) Day Workers.—Between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (ii) Shift Workers.—The actual times at which shifts are commenced and finished shall be mutually arranged and agreed upon between the employer and the worker and the Union shall be notified of these times.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed in excess of forty (40) hours per week or in excess of the normal daily hours shall be deemed overtime and paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Such overtime shall stand alone and shall be paid for in addition to the ordinary rate.

(c) All time worked on Sundays or on any of the holidays prescribed in Clause 23 (a) of this Award shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(d) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid five shillings (5s. 0d.) in lieu thereof.

Provided that such payment need not be made to a worker living in the same locality as the factory who can reasonably return home for a meal.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:—

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

8.-Suspension of Work.

(a) Subject to the provisions of clause 17 hereof, one day's notice of suspension of work, or that a worker will not be wanted to attend at the factory or workshop shall be given, and the employer shall be liable only for payment of wages up to the time of the expiration of such notice.

(b) In the event of the worker's services being terminated whilst suspended from work under this clause, the provisions of clause 16 shall apply, and the worker shall either receive or give the necessary notice or pay in lieu as therein provided.

(c) Any of the holidays referred to in subclause (a) of clause 22 which occur during a period of suspension shall be observed as paid holidays unless such holidays occur on a Saturday or Sunday.

9.--Outdoor Work.

All work shall be done in the workshop provided and controlled by the employer except as hereinafter provided:—

> Should an employer desire to employ, or worker desire to be employed outside the factory he or she may, for such purpose, make application to the Board of Reference for permission.

10.—Respite.

Where a female worker is employed for more than four (4) hours continuously, she shall be allowed an interval of ten (10) minutes for refreshment during such period, without deduction from the wage, and such interval shall be computed as part of her working time.

11.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Wages shall be paid at least weekly.

(b) Where the engagement of a worker is terminated all moneys due to such worker shall be paid within five (5) minutes of the termination of the contract of service.

13.—Charge Hands.

Where a worker is responsible for the work of three (3) or more other workers, he shall receive at least one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day in addition to the minimum rate of wage prescribed for his class of work.

14.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on any one day for more than half of such day on work in a higher class than that which he is usually engaged in shall be paid for the full day at the highest prescribed rate for any such work, but, if engaged for half a day or less on such higher class work, he shall be paid at the prescribed rate for the actual time he performs such higher class work.

15.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was receiving payments in excess of the rates herein prescribed.

16.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service of all workers, excepting casual workers shall be a weekly one terminable by two days' notice given on either side. If the by two days notice given on either side. If the two days' notice is not given two days' pay shall be paid or forfeited as the caes may be. Any worker employed for less than five (5) consecutive working days, exclusive of any hours of overtime which may be worked, shall be classed as a casual worker, and one hour's notice on either side shall be sufficient to terminate the employment.

17.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be allowed to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the Union or any other Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent: Provided that the employer shall not make any deduction from the wage for such time as may lapse until the worker is patiend by the employer that the the worker is notified by the employer that his services will not be required pending a resumption of work, or repairs being effected.

18.---- Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any old, infirm or slow worker who is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall provide a record to be kept at a place where it is easily accessible to the employer and the worker. The record shall show employer and the worker. The record shall show the name of each worker, the nature of his employ-ment, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker.

(b) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the record. Such record shall be open to inspection during working hours by the Secretary of the Union or any person authorised in writing by him.

20.-Junior Workers.

(a) Junior workers may be employed in all branches of the industry, provided that no junior female under the age of 18 years shall be placed in charge of a pressing machine.

(b) Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

- (1) Name in full;
- (2) age and date of birth;
- (3) name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer;
- (4) class of work performed for each previous employer.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age, either in the above certificate or verbally to the employer, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

(c) Junior workers shall not be employed in excess of the following proportions:-

Three (3) juniors to each worker receiving the adult rate of pay: Provided that, where no adult or fully-paid worker is employed, one junior worker may be employed.

Any employer shall have the right to apply to the Board of Reference for a greater proportion of junior workers, and the Board of Reference may grant such employer additional junior workers where the employer is able to justify his application before the Board.

21.-Visiting Workshop or Factory.

The Union Secretary, or a duly accredited representative of the Union, shall be allowed to interview workers in the workshop or factory during lunch time, and to post notices of Union meetings.

22.-Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employers' establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a workers' period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day, being an ordinary working day, for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

23.-Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance that that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default. (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

24.-Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award, or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

25.-Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award if supplied by the Union shall be kept in a place where same may be inspected by any person concerned.

26.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the first day of April, 1958 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this sub-clause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning. (4) Such service shall include-

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment;
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act 1903-1956 and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
- (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act 1939-1946;
- (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be reemployed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this sub-clause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be:----

- (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is term-inated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justfy such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allow-ances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways-
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to off-set any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) The settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a Chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any em-ployer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this Clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

Between Fire Brigade Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Coastal Districts) of Western Australia, Applicant, and Western Australian Fire Brigades Board, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovename parties, and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

(c) Workers shall be eligible to progress to second class after completion of ten months' service as third class, and from second class to first class after twelve months' service as second class. Provided that no fireman eligible by length of service to the higher class shall be passed to the higher class by the Board unless he be certified as competent by the Chief Officer and recommended for such promotion.

(d) Where less than a full week is worked, workers shall be paid at per daily rate of wages for seven days a week.

(e) The margins shown in clause 3 (b) shall be payable while 56 hours per week are worked and the parties agree that in the event of any reduction in working hours the margins shall revert to the amounts shown in brackets against the respective classifications

4.—Service Allowance.

(Additional to items in Clause 3.)

After five (5) years' service workers shall be paid a long service allowance of five shillings (5s.) per week; after ten (10) years' service an additional allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week, and after fifteen (15) years' service a further two shillings and sixpence (2s.6d.) per week and after twenty (20) years' service a further additional allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be paid.

5.—Emergency Calls.

Any worker while off duty who is called upon to work outside his platoon hours shall be paid at the rate of time and one half per hour or part thereof. Time to commence when the call is re-(30) minutes after the receipt of such call until the signing off at the station. The minimum payment under this clause shall be for one hour at rates as specified in clause 13.

6.—Driving Allowance.

(a) Workers who are rostered or called upon to drive running fire appliances at any of the Board's stations shall be paid one shilling per shift in addition to their ordinary rate of pay.

(b) Workers whilst engaged in driving on jour-neys extending beyond 24 hours shall be paid twenty shillings (20s.) per day in addition to their ordinary rate of pay and in such cases no over-time shall be paid. Such workers shall be entitled to the travelling allowance under clause 9 hereof.

7.—Relieving.

(a) Any worker stationed in the metropolitan area and required to take up duty outside such area for a period of less than three (3) months shall be regarded as "relieving" and shall be entitled to the allowance provided in clause 9.

(b) Relieving shall be spread over as many of the staff as possible.

8.—Relieving an Officer.

(a) In addition to the ordinary rates of pay, flat rate payments of (i) fifteen shillings (15s.) per week and (ii) five shillings (5s.) per week respec-tively shall be paid to the senior worker on each they shall be paid to the senior worker on each shift at a fire station (i) in the country and (ii) in the metropolitan area (excluding the fire stations at Perth and Fremantle) in recognition in each case of such senior worker being in charge of the station during any absence of the officer who would normally be in charge.

(b) A fireman or senior fireman at either of the fire stations at Perth and Fremantle who in the absence of an officer is the senior man in charge of an appliance when it is taken from the station for fire fighting purposes shall be paid an additional one shilling (1s.) per hour, with a mini-mum payment of one shilling (1s.) for the time he is in charge of such appliance.

9.-Travelling or Relieving Allowance.

All workers actually travelling or relieving beyond the metropolitan area shall be paid an allowance of 21s. per day.

10.-Meal Allowance.

A worker relieving away from his home station, In a worker reneving away from his nome station, unless notified on the previous day, shall be allowed five shillings (5s.) for each meal necessarily in-curred; provided that no allowance shall be paid where the worker receives an allowance under clause 9 of this Award.

Provided further that in no case shall the worker be entitled to the allowance as aforesaid for more than the first day of any period of relieving.

11.-Goldfields Allowance.

Workers employed at Kalgoorlie and Boulder shall receive an allowance of two shillings and fourpence (2s. 4d.) per week.

12.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The hours of duty shall be worked on a system of three shifts by workers known as the "A" platoon, the "B" platoon, and the "C" platoon and each platoon shall perform an average weekly tour of duty of 56 hours over a period or cycle of six weeks. Provided that a probationary fireman shall not be drafted to a platoon nor be called upon to attend at the station on Saturdays, Sundays, and gazetted public holidays.

(b) The 24-hour daily tour of duty shall be performed by two of the three platoons, as under:-Day Shift.—8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the same day. Night Shift.—6 p.m. to 8 a.m. on the following

day.

The platoon rostered for duty on the day shift shall assume duty on the station at 8 a.m. and remain on duty until 6 p.m. on the same day, and the platoon rostered for duty on the night shift shall assume duty on the station at 6 p.m. and remain on duty until 8 a.m. on the following morning.

Each platoon shall, in rotation work two con-secutive day shifts and two consecutive night shifts in a period or cycle of six days.

Each platoon shall, in rotation, be off duty except as provided in clauses 5 and 13 for 24 hours between the conclusion of the second day shift, and the commencement of the first night shift and, except as provided in clauses 5 and 13, for 48 hours between the conclusion of the second night hift and the commencement of first day whift of shift and the commencement of first day shift of the second six-day cycle.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing it is provided that a worker may, for the efficient working of the service, be required to change from one platoon to another.

(d) Day Shift.—All routine duties and drills, except as hereinafter provided, shall be performed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. and the platoon shall stand by on the station for fire calls from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Night Shift.—The platoon shall stand by on the station for fire calls from 6 p.m. to 8 a.m. on the following morning. The bells shall be rung at 7.15 a.m.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing, it is provided that a worker, while on duty at the station, may be called upon to perform any of the following duties:---

- (i) Watchroom duty;
- (ii) Any work incidental to a fire call or emergency call for special services ordinarily performed by firemen;
- (iii) Station domestic work:
- (iv) The manning and driving of any of the Fire Brigade Board's motor vehicles;
- (v) Work of an urgent nature incidental to a breakdown of fire alarms, fire appliances or equipment; provided that if work of this nature extends beyond one hour, a penalty rate of two shillings (2s.) an hour in addition to the worker's ordinary rate shall be paid.
- (vi) Drill under night conditions for an aggregate period of not more than six (6) hours per year.

13.—Overtime.

Any work done outside the platoon hours including travelling within the metropolitan area, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except as otherwise herein provided. For this purpose overtime shall be calculated on the basis of forty-eight hours per week.

14.—Meal Hour.

One hour shall be allowed for each meal which shall be taken on the home station. Where a worker is on out-duty the meal hour, as far as is practicable, shall be taken on the home station between 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

15.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each complete month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for more than one rostered shift.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault. neglect or misconduct, or where the worker does not notify his station of his sickness within four hours of the commencing time of his shift.

16.—Accident Pay.

Full pay shall be paid for accidents on duty whether occasioned incidental to a fire call or not.

17.-Uniforms.

All uniforms, as required, shall be supplied by the Board.

18.—Watchroom Duty.

Watchroom duty shall be performed as required by the Chief Officer.

19.—Residence.

No restriction shall be placed on men who are off duty as to place of residence, duty, or otherwise except as provided in clause 5 (Emergency Calls).

20.—Salvage Duties.

Where possible, opportunity shall be given to workers to change into dry clothing where their uniforms have become wet.

21.—Annual Leave.

After the expiration of one (1) year's service, workers shall be entitled to twenty-eight (28) days' annual leave on full pay and thereafter a pro rata allowance. Provided that no leave shall accrue to any worker until he has served three (3) complete months.

22.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly.

23.—Vacancies.

When a vacancy occurs in a rank higher than first class, applications shall be invited by the Chief Officer from qualified men in the classes below that in which the vacancy occurs, and all things being equal, a selection shall be made from such applicants for the vacancy.

24.—Transfers.

When transferring from one station to another, a worker shall be granted all reasonable expenses including second class rail fares and sleepers, if applicable, for himself, his wife and for all children under 16 years of age, irrespective of his mode of transport. Provided that the Board shall not be liable for and shall be indemnified against any claims for accidents in the case of a cash payment and the travel being by private transport. Provided also that this clause shall not apply in cases where a worker is transferred from one station to another as a punishment.

25.—Cleaning After Fires.

Reasonable time not exceeding thirty minutes shall be allowed for changing and cleaning after completion of duties on return from a fire and prior to leaving the Station. Provided that the worker shall see that the time of his departure from the Station is recorded in the Occurrence Book, and submits a claim on the form provided for the purpose.

26.-Charges Against Employees.

When a worker is suspended and is summoned to appear before an officer of the Fire Brigades Board to answer a charge he shall be informed of the particular charge at least forty-eight hours before the hearing thereof, and shall have access to all reports which are put in as evidence against him. He shall have an advocate from the union to assist him. He shall be allowed to call evidence on his behalf, and to hear all evidence against him.

27.-Appeal Board.

Every worker shall have the right of appeal from a decision of the Fire Brigades Board affecting his employment, to an appeal board constituted of one representative of the Fire Brigades Board, one representative of the union and a stipendiary magistrate (or some other person appointed by the Court) as chairman.

28.—Membership of the Union.

Every man employed as a permanent or probationary fireman must when assuming duty apply for membership in the Western Australian Fire Brigades Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Coastal Districts) and, if elected, remain a member of the union whilst in the service of the Board.

29.—Definition.

In the construction of these presents the term "worker" shall apply to and include the several classes of workers specified in clause 3.

30.-Bedding.

All beds and bedding requirements, including mattress covers, shall be provided by the Fire Brigades Board, and replacements due to fair wear and tear shall also be provided by the Board.

31.—Holidays.

On Saturdays after 12 noon, on Sundays, and on all gazetted public holidays, firemen shall not engage on work other than that specified in clause 12, subclause (c) (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v).

32.—Seniority.

Seniority shall rank in the following order:-

- (1) Senior Fireman.
- (2) First Class Fireman.
- (3) Second Class Fireman.
- (4) Third Class Fireman.

33.—Application of Award.

Nothing herein contained shall apply to auxiliary firemen who may be employed under the conditions laid down from time to time in the rules and regulations issued under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act.

34.-Board of Reference.

A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purpose of this Award. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties; the chairman shall be mutually selected by the parties, failing their agreement the Industrial Registrar shall act as chairman. Such Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of-

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them:
- (b) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

35.-Term of Award.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date of issue.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the par-ties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared and whereas the parties have this day appeared and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agree-ment an Award of the Court: Now therefore, the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memoran-dum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:---

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Engine Drivers (Carnarvon Municipal Council) Award.

3.---Scope.

This Award shall apply to all engine drivers engaged in the production of electric current at the undertakings conducted by the Respondent: Provided that it shall not apply to the driving of any internal combustion engine of 30 or less B.H.P., or any engine or electric motor or any pump on which no engine driver is employed as such but the starting and stopping of and attention to which is done by a worker the greater part of whose time is taken up with other work.

4.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of twelve (12) months from the date hereof.

5.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the Electric Power Stations conducted by the Respondent in the locality in which the said Respondent operates.

6.-No Reduction.

Nothing in this Award shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

7.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours each.

(b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines or in banking fires shall be included.

8.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) (i) In the case of continuous or recurring work necessarily done in the ordinary course directly for the establishment's usual production or service on Sunday, Australia Day, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day and Boxing Day, as well as other days of the week, ordinary work performed on a Sunday or on any of the holidays named in this subclause shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first eight (8) hours and double time thereafter.

(ii) All time of duty on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day and Xmas Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, or which is necessary or owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time or which is effecting periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award— $% \left({{{\left({{{{\bf{n}}_{{\rm{c}}}}} \right)}_{{\rm{c}}}}} \right)$

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) Seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof. Where a worker with twelve months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) hereof increased by one-tweifth of a week for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(c) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(d) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid onesixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service, or in the case of a worker referred to in subclause (b) hereof, such payment shall be onequarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each such month he is so engaged.

(e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave. (f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

 $({\rm g})$ The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Contract of Service.

Except as provided in subclause (b) of Clause 13, all employment shall be by the week.

11.—Shift Work.

(a) Where practicable all shifts shall rotate weekly.

(b) Where a worker works afternoon or night shift only or afternoon and night shift in rotation but does not work day shift one week out of three, he shall receive one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the rates prescribed in Clause 16.

(c) Shift workers when employed on afternoon shift shall receive five per cent. (5%) and on night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to their ordinary rates for such shifts.

(d) Seven day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be paid for work performed as part of the ordinary working hours on Saturday and Sunday at the rate of time and one half. These extra rates shall be in substitution for and not in addition to the penalty prescribed in subclauses (b) and (c) hereof.

12.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service; Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) hereof of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.

13.—Definitions.

(a) "Engine Driver" means any worker who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity or any other motive power (other than manual or animal power) used for the purpose of generating electric current.

(b) "Casual Worker" means and includes worker competent to do the work he is engaged to do and who is, without any fault of his own, dis-missed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of one (1) week from and including the day he starts work.

14.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

15.-Time and Wages Record.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept time and wages record in which shall be entered:-

- (i) The name of the worker;
- (ii) the nature of the work performed;
- (iii) the hours worked each week; and
- (iv) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid each week.

Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with the provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours at the employer's allowed to take extracts therefrom.

16.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wage to be paid to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:-

1. These rules may be cited as the Totalisator Agency Board Rules, 1961.

2. In these rules unless the context requires

- otherwise— "Chairman" means the Chairman of the
 - Board; "Secretary" means the person for the time being appointed to or acting in the office of secretary to the Board;
 - expressions used in these rules have the same respective meanings as in the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960.

Proceedings of the Board. Meetings.

3. (1) The Chairman shall convene the first meeting of the Board to be held at a time and place appointed by him, and the Board shall meet accordingly and shall hold such further meetings as it considers necessary for the efficient conduct of its affairs.

(2) The meetings held pursuant to this rule are called "ordinary" meetings.

4. The Chairman of his own volition, or if requested to do so at any time by any four members, shall forthwith convene a special meeting of the Board.

5. (1) The Secretary shall cause to be given to each member in writing, either delivered personally or sent by post or telegraph, notice of every meeting of the Board at least forty-eight hours before the time appointed for the commencement of the meeting unless the Chairman directs that shorter notice should be given because of an emergency, in which case the Secretary shall cause the shorter notice to be given to each member.

(2) In the case of a special meeting the notice of the meeting shall specify the business to be dealt with at that meeting.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subrules (1) and (2) of this rule, where it appears to the Chairman that, by reason of the urgency of the matter required to be dealt with by the Board, there is insufficient time available to convene a meeting to deal with that matter, if the matter in question is decided by a majority of the Board ascertained by separate communication to each member available, the decision shall be deemed to be the decision of the Board as if it were made at a duly convened meeting of the Board.

6. (1) Four members or their respective deputies constitute a quorum of the Board and may carry out the functions of the Board as effectively as if all members were present.

(2) If a quorum is not present within half an hour of the time appointed for the commencement of a meeting, the business lapses and the business set down for attention at that meeting shall be the business, or included in the business, for attention at the next ordinary or special meeting of the Board.

7. (1) At meetings of the Board each member present shall vote on questions submitted at the meeting.

(2) All questions shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting.

(3) The Chairman, or the person appointed his deputy when presiding, has a deliberative vote and, in the event of an equality of votes, has a casting vote.

8. (1) The Secretary or, if he is not available, any other officer of the Board authorised by the Board to do so, shall keep proper minutes of resolutions carried, business transacted, and proceedings effected at each meeting of the Board.

(2) The minutes of the meeting shall be submitted to the members for confirmation either at the same or a subsequent meeting and when confirmed shall be signed by the Chairman.

(3) Production of the minute book purporting to have been signed by the Chairman is conclusive evidence of the matters recorded in the minutes.

9. The order of business at ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows:—

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting;
- (b) matters arising from the minutes of the previous meeting;
- (c) correspondence;
- (d) statement of receipts and payments since the previous meeting;
- (e) accounts;
- (f) matters relating to officers, servants and agents of the Board;
- (g) motions;
- (h) notices of motion; and
- (i) such other matters as any member desires to bring before the Board.
