IN pursuance of the provisions of section 11 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1960, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the Proclamation dated 17th November, 1960 (published in the Government Gazette on 25th November, 1960), prohibiting all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule thereto, from 1st January, 1961, until 31st December, 1965, inclusive, by providing that during the currency of the said Proclamation it shall be lawful to use a prawn net not exceeding 12 feet in length and having meshes of not more than one inch throughout for the capture of prawns only in the waters of that part of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet described in the schedule hereto, provided that no such net is set closer than 12 feet to any other such net

set therein, or closer than 25 feet to any part of the platform abutting on the Mandurah Bridge, and provided further that no such net is set in the fairway of such Channel Entrance.

Schedule.

All that portion of Peel Inlet bounded by lines starting from the eastern corner of location 972, Murray, and extending westerly to the south-eastern boundary of location 5; thence generally northeasterly and northerly along boundaries of the said location 5, and location 58, to the north-eastern corner of the latter location; thence eastnorth-easterly along the southern side of the Mandurah Bridge to the common boundary of the Murray and Cockburn Sound Land Districts; thence generally southerly along the said boundary to the south-western corner of an island situate south of Channel Island and near Creery Island; thence westerly to a point of land situate about 14 chains north-easterly from the eastern corner of location 972 aforesaid; and thence generally south-westerly, along the shores of the Peel Inlet to the starting point.

- (d) The re-survey of the area.

Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1959. AUGUSTA-MARGARET RIVER ROAD BOARD.

Town Planning Scheme No. 2. Townsite of Margaret River.

A.—Preliminary.

- 1. Area.—This scheme shall apply to the Margaret River Townsite as designated on Plans Nos. 2 and 3 held at the office of the Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Plan").
- 2. Definitions.—In this Scheme unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively:—
 - "Board" means the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.
 - "Boarding house" means and includes any house or edifice building or other structure, permanent or otherwise, and any part of such premises (not being premises licensed under a publican's general, wayside house or hotel license) in which more than six persons, exclusive of the family of the keeper thereof, are harboured or lodged or board for hire or reward from week to week, or for more than a week, or provision is made for more than six persons (exclusive as aforesaid) to be so lodged or boarded, but the term does not include any premises used as a boarding school which has been approved under the Education Act, 1928-1955.
 - "Duplex house" means a single storey building comprising two dwellings, each being complete self-contained units so designed as to give the external appearance of a single dwelling.
 - "Extractive industry" means an industry engaged in the quarrying or the excavation of minerals either for treatment at the source of supply or for the supply of raw materials to other industries.
 - "Filling Station" means a business premises used principally for the supply of liquid fuels for motor vehicles including the supply of lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, and the carrying out of minor repairs to motor vehicles only in normal working hours and so as not to create undue noise, smoke, fumes or smell.
 - "Industry" means and includes each of the following operations:—
 - (i) Any manufacturing process carried on for gain whether or not such process results in the production of a finished article;
 - (ii) the breaking up, dismantling of any chattels, goods or any article for trade, sale or gain or ancillary to any business;
 - (iii) the winning of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, minerals, rock, stone, and similar substances;
 - (iv) repairing, laundering and servicing of articles including vehicles, machinery and the extermination of pests other than on site work on buildings, works or land.

And when carried on on land upon which any of the above operations are carried on:—

- (v) The storage of goods used in connection with any of the above operations;
- (vi) the provision of amenities for persons engaged in such operations;
- (vii) the sale of goods resulting from such operations;

- (viii) any work of administration or accounting in connection with the undertaking.
- "Light Industry" means an industry in which the processes do not harm or cause nuisance or annoyance to occupants in the adjoining locality by reason of noise, vibration, smoke, smell, fumes, vapour or steam, dust or grit, oil, waste water or waste products and in which machinery used is powered by electricity.
- "Lodging house" means and includes any house or edifice building or other structure permanent or otherwise, and any part of such premises (not being premises licensed under a publican's general, wayside house or hotel license) in which persons are harboured or lodged for hire for a single night, or for less than a week at one time, or in which not more than six persons exclusive of the family of the keeper thereof, are lodged for hire or reward from week to week or for more than a week or in which rooms are let to more than two persons for living accommodation under a contract in the nature of a sub-tenancy running from week to week.
- "Offensive trade" means and includes any of the trades specified in the Second Schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1957, and any other trade or trades declared to be offensive under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1957, by a Proclamation of the Governor published in the Government Gazette of Western Australia.
- "Sawmill" means a mill or premises where logs or large pieces of timber are sawn, but does not include a joinery works unless logs or larger pieces of timber are sawn therein.
- "Service Station" means a business premises used principally for the supply of liquid fuels, lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, and the carrying out of repairs to motor vehicles.

B.—Zoning.

Residential Zone:

- 3. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured red brown on the Plan are hereby classified as Residential Zones.
- 4. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Residential Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A dwelling house.
 - (b) A duplex house.
 - (c) A doctor's or dentist's surgery attached to a residence.
- 5. Duplex Houses.—No person shall erect or use any building as a duplex house unless such building is erected on a parcel of land having a frontage of not less than sixty-six (66) feet and an area of not less than eight thousand (8,000) square feet.

Business Zone:

- 6. Area.—Those portions of Margaret River Townsite which are coloured blue on the Plan are hereby classified as Business Zones.
- 7. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Business Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A shop.
 - (b) A combined shop and dwelling.
 - (c) An office.
 - (d) A bank.
 - (e) An athletic or social or residential club.
 - (f) A theatre or cinema.
 - (g) A public hall.
 - (h) A workroom or workrooms or store-room or store-rooms connected with a retail business in which not more than one-half of the total floor area of such business is used as a workroom or workrooms or storeroom or store-rooms.

- (i) A doctor's surgery or a dentist's surgery.
- (j) A dwelling house, if the lot on which the dwelling house is erected has a frontage of not less than fifty (50) feet and an area of not less than six thousand (6,000) square feet and all buildings are set back an additional distance of not less than forty (40) feet from the building line.

Hotel Zones:

- 8. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured orange on the Plan are hereby classified as Hotel Zones.
- 9. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in an Hotel Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) An hotel.
 - (b) A private hotel.
 - (c) A boarding house.
 - (d) A lodging house.

Public Building Zone:

- 10. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured yellow green on the Plan are hereby classified as Public Building Zones.
- 11. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Public Building Zone except for one or more of the following uses:—
 - (a) Public Hall.
 - (b) A theatre or cinema.
 - (c) A church.
 - (d) An office.
 - (e) A bank.
 - (f) A post office.
 - (g) A public library.
 - (h) A fire station.
 - (i) A police station.
 - (j) A court house.
 - (k) An infant health centre.
 - (1) A school.
 - (m) A hospital.
 - (n) An athletic, social or residential club.
 - (o) A boarding or lodging house.
 - (p) An administrative and public building used by the Board, a State or Commonwealth Department, but not including works depots.
 - (q) Public Tennis Courts.
- 12. No person shall construct any building other than an outbuilding in a Public Building Zone except upon a block or blocks of land of an area of not less than 15,000 square feet. Provided that this provision shall not apply to any person who is the owner of a block of land of an area of less than 15,000 square feet and is not the owner of any adjoining block or blocks of land. If after the publication of this Scheme in the Government Gazette a building exists or is afterwards erected in a Public Building Zone on a block of land of an area of less than 15,000 square feet and the owner of that block of land also owns the adjoining block of land he shall not thereafter dispose of either of the blocks of land separately from the other.
- 13. No person shall construct any building other than an outbuilding in a Public Building Zone unless he provides for the users of the building a paved parking area capable of accommodating at least eight motor cars. Provided that the Board may dispense with this provision in any particular case.

Filling Stations and Service Station Zone:

14. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured mauve outlined with blue on the Plan are hereby classified as Filling Station and Service Station Zones.

- 15. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Filling Station and Service Station Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A filling station.
 - (b) A service station.
- 16. (1) No person shall use any land for a service station or a filling station unless it is more than one-quarter of a mile from an existing service station or filling station, or from a site for which a permit has been issued unless the Board determine otherwise. If the station covered by such permit has not been erected within six (6) months, the permit shall lapse and a new application made.
- (2) In a service station or filling station no person shall use more than one-half of the ficor area of the premises as a workroom.

Industrial Zone

(i) Light Industrial Zones.

- 17. Area.—Those parts of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured hatched purple on the Plan are hereby classified as Light Industrial Zones.
- 18. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Light Industrial Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A light industry.
 - (b) A lock-up canteen upon the premises of a factory used primarily to provide meals and refreshments for the employees of the factory.
 - (c) A factory showroom or office upon the premises of or adjoining the factory.
 - (d) A warehouse or storeroom.
 - (e) A residence if upon a lot which has been subdivided before the coming into operation of this Scheme.
 - (f) A service station or filling station.

(ii) General Industrial Zones.

- 19. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured purple on the Plan are hereby classified as General Industrial Zones.
- 20. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a General Industrial Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) An industry.
 - (b) A canteen upon the premises of a factory used primarily to provide meals and refreshments for the employees of the factory.
 - (c) A factory showroom or office upon the premises of or adjoining the factory.
 - (d) A service station.
 - (e) A warehouse or storeroom.

Industrial Zone Provisions.

- 21. (1) No person shall stock or place any fuel or raw materials or products or by-products or wastes of manufacture in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone, nearer to a road or street than the building line.
- (2) No person shall in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone use the land between the building line and the road or street for any purpose other than a means of access, for parking of vehicles, for loading or unloading vehicles, or for lawns, gardens or trade displays.
- (3) Facades: No person shall erect or cause to be erected a building other than a residence, in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone unless the facade of the building be constructed of brick, stone or concrete, or in the case of frame buildings, of corrugated asbestos or aluminium cladding to a design to be approved by the Board.
- (4) Within a Light Industrial Zone or a General Industrial Zone, a residence on land forming part of or adjoining a factory, occupied by a caretaker of or an employee of the factory and set aside for

the exclusive use of the occupants may be allowed by the Board where it is established that such residence is necessary to the proper operation of the industry, but the Board shall allow not more than one such residence for each factory.

Open Space Zones:

- 22. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured grey green on the Plan are hereby classified as Open Space Zones.
- 23. Uses.—No person shall use any land or buildings in an Open Space Zone except for public recreation for the use of sporting clubs or for such purposes as are specified in any vesting order or lease relating to any particular land or building. Rural Zones:
- 24. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are coloured white on the Plan are hereby classified as Rural Zones.
- 25. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structures in a rural Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) Any use permitted in a Residential Zone.
 - (b) Agriculture, horticulture, forestry and the keeping of poultry and livestock.
 - (c) With the special approval of the Board an offensive trade may be permitted in a Rural Zone.
 - (d) With the special approval of the Board an extractive industry may be permitted in a Rural Zone.

Special Zones:

- 26. Area.—Those portions of the Margaret River Townsite which are specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby classified as Special Zones.
- 27. Uses.—Notwithstanding that the areas set out in the First Schedule hereto are within other Zones the land or any building or structure thereon may be used for the purposes set against the various parcels of land respectively in the said Schedule in addition to the other uses permitted in the Zone in which the land is situated.

C.—General Provisions.

- 28. No land shall be built on until it is drained and provision made for the disposal of roof water or household or trade wastes as the case may be to the satisfaction of the Board.
- 29. The minimum area of a lot on which a dwelling or a shop and attached dwelling may be erected is 6,000 square feet. A second dwelling may not be erected on an allotment of land on which a dwelling exists until a subdivision has been approved by the Town Planning Board and all other appropriate authorities so that each dwelling shall stand on a separate lot.
- 30. Lot Frontages.—(1) No new residential lot shall be created with a frontage of less than 95 links unless the lot is tapered in which case the lot must have a frontage of not less than 76 links and be at least 85 links in width at a distance of 30 feet back from the frontage.
- (2) A new residential lot may also be permitted by the Board with a frontage of less than 95 links but not less than 75 links in cases where the area of the new lot will be greater than 32 perches and the area of the land to be subdivided is less than three roods, and not more than two new lots are created.
- (3) No new business site shall be created with a frontage of less than 20 feet or a depth of less than 80 feet.
- (4) All new business sites must be provided with a rear right of way of a minimum width of 20 feet.
- (5) On lots already partially used for business purposes and where no further subdivision into business lots has been sought, no new buildings will be permitted unless a rear right of way is provided or a temporary 20 feet wide entry maintained at the side of the business premises.
- 31. Site coverage.—(1) For land in a Residential Zone—no more than $\frac{1}{3}$ (one third) of the site shall be built upon.

- (2) For land in Business Zone—no more than $\frac{2}{3}$ (two-thirds) of the site shall be built upon.
- 32. Building Lines.—The building line for any building or structure shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be not less than the following:—
 - (a) For land in a Residential Zone—twenty-five (25) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (b) For land in a Business Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (c) For land in an Hotel Zone—fifty (50) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (d) For land in a Filling Station or Service Station Zone thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts and a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from adjoining properties.
 - (e) For land in Light Industrial Zones—fifty (50) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (f) For land in a General Industrial Zone fifty (50) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (g) For land in a Public Building Zone thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts and a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from adjoining properties.
 - (h) For land in a Rural Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
- 33. Curved Streets.—Where the road or street alignment is curved, irregular, or not at right angles to the side boundaries of the land, a person may erect a building in front of the building line, provided that the mean of the greatest and least distance of the building from the road or street is not less than the distance fixed for the appropriate building line.
- 34. Corner Blocks.—Where a parcel of land has a frontage to more than one road or street, the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) With the approval of the Board, in a Residential Zone or a Light Industrial Zone a person may erect a building nearer to one only of the roads or streets than the building line but not nearer than fifteen (15) feet to that road or street.
 - (b) With the approval of the Board, in a Business Zone a person may erect a building nearer to one only of the roads or streets than the building line but not nearer than ten (10) feet to that road or street.
- 35. Existing Adjoining Buildings.—If in the case of any parcel of land buildings have been erected on the lots adjoining on both sides and one or both of these buildings is in front of the building line, the Board may permit a building to be erected on that parcel of land in front of the building line but not nearer to the road or street than the rearmost of the two buildings, but in any case not nearer to the road or street than (10) feet.
- 36. Prohibition.—Subject as aforesaid, no person shall erect or cause to be erected any building or structure nearer to a road or street than the building line.
- 37. Advertising Devices.—(1) Except as hereinafter provided no person shall within the Margaret River Townsite permit to be erected or placed in his land or shall erect or exhibit any advertisements advertising hoardings illuminated signs or other advertising devices.
- (2) Signs indicating names professions businesses trade callings or trade products may be exhibited on the land or buildings on or in which the profession business or trade is conducted.
- (3) The Board may grant temporary approval for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days for advertisements or hoardings to be erected giving public notice of a public function on the payment of a deposit of five pounds (£5) and on such other

conditions as the Board may nominate. The deposit shall be refunded when the advertisements and hoardings have been removed or may be used by the Board to cover the costs of removal.

(4) The Board may grant approval for a period not exceeding two years for the erection of signs giving information to the travelling public in positions approved in writing by the Board. The person erecting the signs shall maintain them in good order and condition.

D.—Existing Uses.

- 38. (1) If at the date of publication of this Scheme in the Government Gazette any land, building or structure is being lawfully used for a purpose or built on in a manner not permitted by this Scheme, such land, building or structure may continue to be used for that purpose or in that manner, but no such building or structure shall be added to or altered unless special permission to do so is granted by the Board.
- (2) If at the date of publication of this Scheme in the Government Gazette any land, building or structure is being used for a purpose or built on in a manner not permitted by this Scheme and such use or purpose is afterwards discontinued or changed or the buildings removed so that it conforms to this Scheme, no person shall thereafter use such land, building or structure for any purpose or in any manner not permitted by this Scheme.
- (3) If any building or structure is at the date of the publication of this Scheme in the Government Gazette being used for a purpose or constructed in a manner not permitted by this Scheme, and is subsequently destroyed or damaged by fire or otherwise to the extent of more than seventy-five (75) per cent. of its value, it shall not thereafter be repaired, rebuilt, altered or added to for the purposes of being used for any purpose not permitted by this Scheme or in a manner not permitted by this Scheme unless special permission to do so is granted by the Board.

E.—Administration.

- 39. Compensation.—Claims for compensation by reason of the operations of this Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette.
- 40. Responsible Authority.—The Responsible Authority for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

IT is hereby notified for public information in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1959, that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning approved of the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board Town Planning Scheme No. 3 for the townsite of Augusta as published hereunder on the 20th day of January, 1961.

V. L. STEFFANONI, Deputy Chairman Town Planning Board. Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1959. AUGUSTA-MARGARET RIVER ROAD BOARD. Town Planning Scheme No. 3.

Townsite of Augusta.

A.—Preliminary.

- 1. Plans.—The Plans relating to this Scheme are held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board and consist of the following:—
 - (a) Lands Department Litho No. 441A/40 (hereinafter called "the plan"), and
 - (b) Augusta North Sheet.
 - (c) Augusta South Sheet.
 - (d) Flinders Bay Sheet (hereinafter called "the Detail Plans").
 - (e) Augusta Central Sheet.
- 2. Area.—This Scheme shall apply to the Augusta Townsite as designated and coloured red on the Plan.
- 3. Definitions.—In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively:—

"Board" means the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

- "Boarding house" means and includes any house or edifice, building or other structure, permanent or otherwise, and any part of such premises (not being premises licensed under a publican's general, wayside house or hotel license) in which more than six persons, exclusive of the family of the keeper thereof, are harboured or lodged or board for hire or reward from week to week, or for more than a week, or provision is made for more than six persons (exclusive as aforesaid) to be so lodged or boarded; but the term does not include any premises used as a boarding school which has been approved under the Education Act, 1928-1955.
- "Duplex house" means a single storey building comprising two dwellings, each being complete self-contained units so designed as to give the external appearance of a single dwelling.
- "Extractive industry" means an industry engaged in the quarrying or the excavation of minerals, either for treatment at the source of supply or for the supply of raw materials to other industries.
- "Filling station" means a business premises used principally for the supply of liquid fuels for motor vehicles, including the supply of lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, and the carrying out of minor repairs to motor vehicles only in normal working hours and so as not to create any undue noise, smoke, fumes or smell.

"Industry" means and includes each of the following operations:—

- (i) Any manufacturing process carried on for gain whether or not such process results in the production of a finished article;
- (ii) the breaking up, dismantling of any chattels, goods or any article for trade, sale or gain or ancillary to any business;
- (iii) the winning of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, minerals, rock, stone and similar substances;
- (iv) repairing, laundering and servicing of articles, including vehicles, machinery and the extermination of pests other than on site works on buildings, works or land.

And when carried on on land upon which any of the above operations are carried on—

(v) the storage of goods used in connection with any of the above operations:

- (vi) the provision of amenities for persons engaged in such operations;
- (vii) the sale of goods resulting from such operations;
- (viii) any work of administration or accounting in connection with the undertaking.
- "Light Industry" means an industry in which the processes do not harm or cause a nuisance or annoyance to occupants in the adjoining locality by reason of noise, vibration, smoke, smell, fumes, vapour or steam, dust or grit, oil, waste water or waste products and in which machinery used is powered by electricity.
- "Lodging house" means and includes any house or edifice, building or other structure, permanent or otherwise, and any part of such premises (not being premises licensed under a publican's general, wayside house or hotel license) in which persons are harboured or lodged for hire for a single night, or for less than a week at one time, or in which not more than six persons exclusive of the family of the keeper thereof. are lodged for hire or reward from week to week or for more than a week or in which rooms are let to more than two persons for living accommodation under a contract in the nature of a sub-tenancy running from week to week.
- "Offensive Trade" means and includes any of the trades specified in the Second Schedule of the Health Act, 1911-1957, and any other trade or trades declared to be offensive under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1957, by a Proclamation of the Governor published in the Government Gazette of Western Australia.
- "Sawmill" means a mill or premises where logs or large pieces of timber are sawn, but does not include a joinery works unless logs or larger pieces of timber are sawn therein.
- "Service Station" means a business premises used principally for the supply of liquid fuels, lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, and the carrying out of repairs to motor vehicles.

B.—Zoning.

Residential Zone:

- 3. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured red brown on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Residential Zones.
- 4. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Residential Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A dwelling house.
 - (b) A duplex house.
 - (c) A doctor's or dentist's surgery attached to a residence.
- 5. Duplex Houses.—No person shall erect or use any building as a duplex house unless such building is erected on a parcel of land having a frontage of not less than sixty-six (66) feet and an area of not less than eight thousand (8,000) square feet.

Group Residential:

- 6. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured red brown outlined in darker brown on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Group Residential Zones.
- 7. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Group Residential Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) Any use permitted in a Residential Zone.
 - (b) The construction and use of more than one dwelling house on an allotment of land if the area of land used for each dwelling and the area surrounding it used exclusively by the occupants of each dwelling exceeds 80 feet by 50 feet.

- (c) A motel.
- (d) The parking of caravans.
- (e) A caravan park or the parking of individual caravans.
- (f) A camping area.
- (g) A boarding house.
- (h) A lodging house.

Business Zone:

- 8. Area.—Those portions of Augusta Townsite which are coloured blue on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Business Zones.
- 9. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Business Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A shop.
 - (b) A combined shop and dwelling.
 - (c) An office.
 - (d) A bank.
 - (e) An athletic or social or residential club.
 - (f) A theatre or cinema.
 - (g) A public hall.
 - (h) A workroom or workrooms or storeroom or storerooms connected with a retail business in which not more than one-half of the total floor area of such business is used as a workroom or workrooms or storeroom or storerooms.
 - (i) A doctor's surgery or a dentist's surgery.
 - (j) A dwelling house if the lot on which the dwelling house is erected has a frontage of not less than 50 feet and an area of not less than 6,000 square feet and all buildings are set back an additional distance of not less than 40 feet from the building line.

Hotel Zones:

- 10. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured orange on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Hotel Zones.
- 11. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in an Hotel Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) An hotel.
 - (b) A private hotel.
 - (c) A boarding house.
 - (d) A lodging house.

Public Building Zones:

- 12. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured yellow green on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Public Building Zones.
- 13. Uses.—No person shall use any land or building or structure in a Public Building Zone except for one or more of the following uses:—
 - (a) Public Hall.
 - (b) A theatre or cinema.
 - (c) A church.
 - (d) An office.
 - (e) A bank.
 - (f) A post office.
 - (g) A public library.
 - (h) A fire station.
 - (i) A police station.
 - (j) A court house.(k) An infant health centre.
 - (l) A school.
 - (m) A hospital.
 - (n) An athletic social or residential club.
 - (o) A boarding or lodging house.
 - (p) An administrative and public building used by the Board, a State or Commonwealth Department, but not including works depots.
 - (q) Public tennis courts.

- 14. No person shall construct any building other than an out-building in a Public Building Zone except upon a block or blocks of land of an area of not less than 15,000 square feet. Provided that this provision shall not apply to any person who is the owner of a block of land of an area of less than 15,000 square feet and is not the owner of any adjoining block or blocks of land. If after the publication of this Scheme in the Government Gazette a building exists or is afterwards erected in a Public Building Zone on a block of land of an area of less than 15,000 square feet and the owner of that block also owns the adjoining block of land he shall not thereafter dispose of either of the blocks of land separately from the other.
- 15. No person shall construct any building other than an out-building in a Public Building Zone unless he provide for the users of the building a paved parking area capable of accommodating at least eight motor cars. Provided that the Board may dispense with this provision in any particular case.

Filling Stations and Service Stations Zone:

- 16. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured mauve outlined with blue on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Filling Station and Service Station Zones.
- 17. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Filling Station and Service Station Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A filling station.
 - (b) A service station.
- 18. (1) No person shall use any land for a service station or a filling station unless it is more than one-quarter of a mile from an existing service station or filling station or from a site for which a permit has been issued unless the Board determine otherwise. If the station covered by such permit has not been erected within six (6) months, the permit shall lapse and a new application made.
- (2) In a service station or a filling station no person shall use more than one-half of the fioor area of the premises as a workroom.

Industrial Zones:

(i) Light Industrial Zones.

- 19. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured hatched purple on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Light Industrial Zones.
- 20. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Light Industrial Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) A light industry.
 - (b) A lock-up canteen upon the premises of a factory used primarily to provide meals and refreshments for the employees of the factory.
 - (c) A factory showroom or office upon the premises of or adjoining the factory.
 - (d) A warehouse or storeroom.
 - (e) A service station or filling station.

(ii) General Industrial Zones.

- 21. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured purple on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as General Industrial Zones.
- 22. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a General Industrial Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) An industry.
 - (b) A canteen upon the premises of a factory used primarily to provide meals and refreshments for the employees of the factory.
 - (c) A factory showroom or office upon the premises of or adjoining the factory.
 - (d) A service station.
 - (e) A warehouse or storeroom.

Industrial Zone Provisions.

- 23. (1) No person shall stack or place any fuel or raw materials or products or by-products or wastes of manufacture in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone nearer to a road or street than the building line.
- (2) No person shall in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone use the land between the building line and the road or street for any purpose other than a means of access, for parking of vehicles, for loading or unloading vehicles, or for lawns, gardens or trade display.
- (3) Facades.—No person shall erect or cause to be erected a building other than a residence, in a Light Industrial Zone or in a General Industrial Zone unless the facade of the building be constructed of brick, stone or concrete, or in the case of frame buildings, of corrugated asbestos or aluminium cladding to a design to be approved by the Board
- (4) Within a Light Industrial Zone or a General Industrial Zone, a residence on land forming part of or adjoining a factory occupied by a caretaker of or an employee of the factory and set aside for the exclusive use of the occupants may be allowed by the Board where it is established that such residence is necessary to the proper operation of the industry, but the Board shall allow not more than one such residence for each factory.

Open Space Zones:

- 24. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured grey green on the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Open Space Zones.
- 25. Uses.—No person shall use any land or buildings in an Open Space Zone except for public recreation for the use of sporting clubs or for such purposes as are specified in any vesting order or lease relating to any particular land or building.

Rural Zones:

- 26. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are coloured white on the Detailed Plans and those areas which are within the area coloured red on the plan but are outside the areas covered by the Detail Plans are hereby classified as Rural Zones.
- 27. Uses.—No person shall use any land or any building or structure in a Rural Zone except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (a) Any use permitted in a Residential Zone.
 - (b) Agriculture, horticulture, forestry and the keeping of poultry and livestock.
 - (c) With the special approval of the Board an offensive trade may be permitted in a Rural Zone.
 - (d) With the special approval of the Board an extractive industry may be permitted in a Rural Zone.

Special Zone

- 28. Area.—Those portions of the Augusta Townsite which are specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby classified as Special Zones.
- 29. Uses.—Notwithstanding that the areas set out in the First Schedule hereto are within other zones the land or any building or structure thereon may be used for the purposes set against the various parcels of land respectively in the said Schedule in addition to the other uses permitted in the zone in which the land is situated.

C.-General Provisions.

- 30. No land shall be built on until it is drained and provision made for the disposal of roof water or household or trade wastes as the case may be to the satisfaction of the Board.
- 31. The minimum area of a lot on which a dwelling or a shop and attached dwelling may be erected is 6,000 square feet. A second dwelling may not be erected on an allotment of land on which a dwelling exists until a subdivision has been approved by the Town Planning Board and all other appropriate authorities so that each dwelling shall stand on a separate lot.

- 32. In a Group Residential Zone the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) No land shall be subdivided into areas of less than one acre except that land used or to be used for the purpose of a boarding house or lodging house may with the consent of the Board be of less than one acre.
 - (b) Not more than six houses shall be erected on one acre of land.
 - (c) Each house and the land surrounding it shall have a frontage to public or private road or way of not less than fifty (50) feet.
 - (d) No building shall be constructed within fifty (50) feet of the side or rear boundaries of the land.
 - (e) An area within and adjacent to the side and rear boundaries of the land shall if natural trees do not exist be planted with trees.
- 33. Lot Frontages.—(1) No new residential lot shall be created with a frontage of less than 95 links unless the lot is tapered in which case the lot must have a frontage of not less than 76 links and be at least 85 links in width at a distance of 30 feet back from the frontage.
- (2) A new residential lot may also be permitted by the Board with a frontage of less than 95 links but not less than 75 links in cases where the area of the new lot will be greater than 32 perches and the area of the land to be subdivided is less than three roods, and not more than two new lots are created.
- (3) No new business site shall be created with a frontage of less than 20 feet or a depth of less than 80 feet.
- (4) All new business sites must be provided with a rear right of way of a minimum width of 20 feet.
- (5) On lots already partially used for business purposes and where no further subdivision into business lots has been sought, no new buildings will be permitted unless a rear right of way is provided or a temporary 20 feet wide entry maintained at the side of the business premises.
- 34. Site Coverage.—(1) For land in a Residential Zone—no more than one-third of the site shall be built upon.
- (2) For land in a Business Zone—no more than two-thirds of the site shall be built upon.
- 35. Building Lines.—The building line for any building or structure shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be not less than the following:—
 - (a) For land in a Residential Zone or in a Group Residential Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (b) For land in a Business Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts except in the case of those areas coloured blue on Augusta Centre Sheet in which cases the building lines are the distance of the blue area from the road or street upon which such land abuts as marked on the said sheet.
 - (c) For land in a Hotel Zone—fifty (50) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (d) For land in a Filling Station or Service Station Zone thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts and a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from adjoining properties.
 - (e) For land in Light Industrial Zones—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
 - (f) For land in a General Industrial Zone fifty (50) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.

- (g) For land in a Public Building Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts and a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from adjoining properties.
- (h) For land in a Rural Zone—thirty (30) feet from the alignment of the road or street on which such land abuts.
- 36. Curved Streets.—Where the road or street alignment is curved, irregular, or not at right angles to the side boundaries of the land, a person may erect a building in front of the building line, provided that the mean of the greatest and least distance of the building from the road or street is not less than the distance fixed for the appropriate building line.

- 40. Advertising Devices.—(1) Except as hereinafter provided no person shall within the Augusta Townsite permit to be erected or placed in his land or shall erect or exhibit any advertisements advertising hoardings illuminated signs or other advertising devices.
- (2) Signs indicating names professions businesses trade callings or trade products may be exhibited on the land or buildings on or in which the profession business or trade is conducted.
- (3) The Board may grant temporary approval for a period not exceeding thirty days for advertisements or hoardings to be erected giving public notice of a public function on the payment of a deposit of five pounds (£5) and on such other conditions as the Board may nominate. THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia dot hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above named parties:-

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Buildir Trades Award" and replaces Awards numbered (of 1951; 74 of 1951; 1 of 1952; 4 of 1952; 5 (1952; 10 of 1952 and 11 of 1952, as amended.

Schedule of Respondents.

3.—Definitions.

- (a) "Bricklayer" means a worker engaged in bricklaying, brick-cutting, firework (including kiln work), furnaces, or furnace work of any description, setting cement bricks, cement blocks and cement pressed work, setting coke slabs or coke bricks, or plaster partition blocks, or any other work which comes or which may be adjudged to come within the scope of brick work generally.
- (b) "Rubble waller" means a worker who does all or any of the following classes of work whether hammer dressed or sawn:—
 - (i) Foundation work.
 - (ii) Building random rubble uncoursed; or building squared rubble in courses or regular coursed rubble; and dressing quoins or shoddies in connection with any such work;

but this definition shall not of itself be taken to prejudice or affect the right of any other classes of tradesmen or workers to do any class or kind of work they have hitherto been accustomed to do.

(c) "Builders' labourers". For the purpose of this Award, builders' labourers are divided into three (3) classes, as follows:—

Class 1-

- (i) Scaffolders, riggers, dogmen, gear hands.
- (ii) Workers engaged in underpinning and timbering basements.
- (iii) A worker engaged in the rough finishing of granolithic surfaces on which a wooden or tiled or other like flooring is to be superimposed or a worker in control of a trowelling machine.

Class 2-

- (iv) Hod carriers, mortar mixers, persons wheeling to and from the lift or engaged in filling boxes with materials to be lifted with winch, hoist, elevator or crane required for serving bricklayers, plasterers or masons and workers controlling any such winch or hoist.
- (v) Workers engaged in the erection of steel stanchions, girders, principals and the erection of steel structural work when such work is part of the contractor's contract and under his direct control.
- (vi) Workers engaged on furnace work and bakers' ovens.
- (vii) Workers engaged in mixing, preparing and delivering of materials used hot, such as bitumen, trinidad and other similar patented materials.
- (viii) Workers engaged in the setting and jointing of pipes for sewerage or storm water drainage.
- (ix) Drainage workers engaged in connection with building operations.
- (x) Workers engaged in the timbering of shafts, pits or wells in or around buildings.
- (xi) Workers engaged in the preparation of granolithic surfaces but not the finishing thereof.
- (xii) Workers engaged in the mixing of plastic materials and the cleaning up of fioors and woodwork after the application of such materials.
- (xiii) Workers engaged in preparing or bending or placing into position steel reinforcements in concrete in connection with building operations.
- (xiv) Workers engaged in using a jackhammer.
- (xv) Workers engaged in the demolishing and removing of buildings.

Class 3-Workers engaged in-

- (xvi) mixing, preparing or delivering or packing of concrete in connection with the erection of structures or buildings:
- (xvii) clearing, excavating or levelling off of sites for buildings when such work is under the building contractor's contract and under his direct control;
- (xviii) road construction work in connection with approaches to buildings inside the building line (other than road construction work governed by any Award of the Court of Arbitration or Agreement registered with that Court);
- (xix) general labouring comprising men engaged as builders' labourers not included under the two (2) previous classifications.

(d) Carpentry and Joinery-

(i) "Carpenter and joiner" means a worker engaged upon the erection, repair, ornamentation, and demolition of work in wood for re-erection, or of any form of construction work in wood, and upon the work usually done by carpenters and joiners in any engineering or millwright shop or yard, the building of dams, bridges, jetties and/or wharves, or the fixing of any other work in wood, metal or plastic usually done by carpenters and joiners in hospitals, mills,

freezing works, cool stores, and all other places where carpenters and joiners are usually employed, and upon the making, preparing and fixing of any other material usually used in joinery or construction necessitating the use of carpenters' tools or machines in lieu thereof, including—

- (a) metal ceilings, the fixing of the following asbestos products—plain and corrugated sheets, gutters, downpipes, ridgings, rain heads, ventilators and skylights, fascia and bargeboards;
- (b) metal shop fronts and fittings;
- (c) the setting out and laying of wood blocks or parquetry or wooden mosaic flooring;
- (d) all prefabricated buildings in wood construction in factories or on site.
- (ii) "Setter out" means a carpenter and joiner who sets out work (other than wood blocks or parquetry flooring) for three (3) or more other carpenters and joiners.
- (iii) "Detail worker" means a carpenter and joiner who sets out and works upon staircases, bar, kitchen or office fittings or any similar detail work from architects' plans or blue prints.

(e) Painting-

- (i) "Painter" means a worker engaged in any manner whatsoever in connection with—
 - (a) the painting of buildings of any nature, fences, petrol or oil containers of over fifty (50) gallons' capacity, jetties, bridges, and of wireless masts, electric light standards or fiagpoles when erected; or
 - (b) graining, hanging of wall papers or substitutes therefor, decorating, glazing, marbling, gilding, puttyglazing, kalsomining, distempering, colour washing (but not lime washing, except where the lime wash is mixed with colour), staining, varnishing, plastic relief, stripping off of old papers, removing of old paint or varnish; or
 - (c) the preparation of all work connected with any of the above branches of the trade, and of all materials required for any of the above branches of the trade;

but the term shall not include one worker, who is employed for the purpose of mixing plastic material with its necessary vehicle and cleaning up floors and woodwork after the application of plastic relief, and such worker shall be classed as a builder's labourer.

"Lime washing" means the application to surface by means of a spray or brush of lime which has been slacked down with water or binder.

(ii) "Glazier" means a worker who-

- (a) fits and fixes leadlights and stained windows into prepared positions; or
- (b) fits and fixes glass or any of its kindred products, including vitrolite, either with putty or beads (either nailed or screwed) into any place prepared for its reception by a tradesman and/or cuts such glass or such other product; or
- (c) cuts glass or any of its kindred products including vitrolite, for any purpose.

Provided that nothing in this definition shall apply to work done by shop salesmen, picture frame or furniture makers, or to any other worker who is at the date of

- this Award bound by any Award of the Court of Arbitration or Industrial Agreement made under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and registered in the Court of Arbitration.
- (iii) "Signwriter" means a worker who, besides having a knowledge of painting, kalsomining, staining, varnishing, and limewashing, does any of the following work:—
 - (a) Lettering of every description, size or shape applied by brush on any surface or material which, without limiting its meaning, shall include stone, wood, iron, metal, brick, cement, glass (plain or fancy), canvas, paper, calico, sheeting, bunting, silk, satin, wire blinds.
 - (b) Designing for windows, posters, show window and theatre displays, honour rolls, illuminated addresses, neon signs, stencils, display banners.
 - (c) Gilding, i.e., the application of gold, silver, aluminium or any metal leaf to any surface.
 - (d) Designing and laying-out of cut-out displays of all description, either pictorial, scenic or lettering.
 - (e) Screen process work, i.e., the designing, setting up and the operation for duplication of signs on any material whether of paper, fabric, metal, wood, glass or any similar material.

(f) Plastering-

- (i) "Plasterer" means a worker employed or usually employed on plastering work.
- (ii) "Plastering work" shall mean-
 - (a) all internal and external plastering and cementing whether manual or mechanical means be used, including hard wall plaster and texture work where the materials used in such texture work consist only of plaster or cement or both;
 - (b) fixing of wood lathing and metal lathing or any similar or other substitute which may be used as a ground for plastering work; and
 - (c) the fixing of precast plaster or any other kind of plaster required to be finished off with plastered joints;
 - (d) the fixing of pressed cement work and ornaments and plaster partition blocks;
 - (e) plastering in sewers, septic tanks. water channels and relining of pipes;
 - (f) the fixing of plain and ornamental tiles on walls or fioors;
 - (g) the top dressing of concrete work finished in cement, granolithic or patent colouring, and all cement composition work and plain or fancy paving, except such work as is included in the definition of a builders' labourer unless such work is done by a worker who is engaged or employed as a plasterer;
 - (h) the fixing and laying of cork or substitutes such as solomit in cool chambers and in refrigeration chambers;
 - (i) the working of fiintcote where used with sand, cement and/or granulated cork and/or sawdust.
- (iii) The following work is not included in the foregoing definition:—
 - (a) Work authorised to be done by workers under any other Award or Industrial Agreement.
 - (b) Work done by plumbers.

- (g) Plumbing.—"Plumber" means a worker employed or usually employed in executing any plumbing, gas fitting, pipe fitting, or domestic engineering work, or who executes any work in or in connection with—
 - (i) sheet lead, galvanised iron or other classes of sheet metal generally used by plumbers;
 - (ii) the fixing of lead, wrought, cast or sheet iron, copper, brass or other classes of pipe work, including earthenware pipes, ventilating or air-conditioning appliances;
 - (iii) water (hot or cold), steam (other than for power purposes), gas, air, oil (for heating or cooking purposes), vacuum systems and sewerage installations;
 - (iv) house, ship, sanitary, chemical and/or general plumbing;
 - (v) fire service work:
 - (vi) fitting and fixing asbestos corrugated sheets, guttering, down pipes, ridging, rain heads, ventilators, skylights, fascia and barge boards:
 - (vii) irrigation installations.

(h) Stonemasonry-

- (i) "Stonemason" means a worker who cuts by hand and/or fixes all classes of natural stone that has to be cut to a mould or template, or which has to be proven by a square or straight edge or set to a level or line.
- (ii) The term "Stonemason" shall also include a worker who fixes manufactured stone to the facade of a building.
- (iii) "Natural stone" includes granite, trachite, slate, bluestone, limestone, marble and sandstone.

4.-Scope.

This Award shall apply-

- (a) to all employers in the industries carried on by the respondents as set out in the Schedule of Respondents attached hereto, in respect of workers coming within the classifications set out in clause 9 hereof and of apprentices in the trades to which apprenticeship is provided; and
- (b) in respect to such workers to all employers whose principal business consists of the performance of contracts in which the main work to be done is of one or more of the kinds of work set out in the definitions contained in clause 3 of this Award: Provided that in neither case shall this Award apply to the painting of ships nor to any Government Department, Trading Concern or Instrumentality.

5.—Area.

This Award shall operate throughout the State of Western Australia.

6.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the commencement of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

7.—Contract of Service.

One (1) day's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service of any worker, other than a casual worker (where the notice shall be one (1) hour) or an apprentice.

If the required notice of termination is not given, one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

For the purposes of this clause, notice given at or before the usual starting time of any ordinary working day shall be deemed to expire at the completion of that day's work.

8.—Preference to Unionists.

- (a) In this clause, the term "unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of one of the industrial unions of workers parties to this Award.
- (b) In engaging or dismissing labour (other than apprentices or cadets), preference of employment shall be given to unionists, provided that such unionists are adequately experienced in the class of work to be performed and are otherwise competent to perform the work: Provided further that it shall be a defence on the part of an employer charged with engaging a worker other than a "unionist" when a "unionist" was available for such engagement, that the employer, having made enquiries from the appropriate Union or, if in the country areas, other reasonable enquiries, did not know that any "unionist" competent to perform the class of work involved was available.
- (c) Any worker whose application for membership of the Union has been refused, shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar, whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall, pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar, have the same rights under this clause as a "unionigt"
- (d) Subject to subclause (e) hereof, workers (other than apprentices or cadets) who are not "unionists" shall within seven (7) days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause, by an accredited representative of the applicant union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by a Respondent to this Award.

(e) Exemptions-

- (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.
- (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption, and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven (7) days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (d).
- (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—
 - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;
 - (b) if the worker objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union;
 - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.
- (iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall, within seven (7) days of the decision, make application for membership of the applicant Union and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by a Respondent to this Award.
- (f) No employer shall, while to his knowledge adequately experienced unionists competent to perform the class of work are available, retain in his employment any worker for a period of more than seven (7) days after being advised by the Union concerned that such worker has not complied with either subclause (d) or paragraph (iv) of subclause (e) of this clause or for a period of more than seven (7) days after a conviction for a breach of this clause in reference to the employment of such worker.

(g) An employer (or the workers employed by him) whose principal business is not the construction, demolition, maintenance, renovation or repair of buildings, dams, bridges or jetties, shall not commit a breach of this clause by reason of such workers performing work of a kind set out in the definitions contained in clause 3 of this Award, provided that such workers are members of a Union to which other workers of that employer are eligible to belong.

9.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers under this Award (other than duly registered apprentices) shall be:—

Note 1.—The tool allowances prescribed in paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) of this subclause, each include an amount of sixpence (6d.) for the purpose of enabling the workers to insure their tools against loss or damage by theft and fire.

Note 2.—The abovenamed allowances shall not be paid where the employer supplies the workers with all necessary tools.

The employer shall supply all necessary tools for the use of stonemasons, except when engaged on building construction, when the worker, if required to supply his own tools, shall receive a tool allowance at the rate of four shillings (4s.) per week.

(d) Allowance for lost time, ten (10) statutory holidays and ten (10) days sick leave and follow the job; to vary 8\frac{1}{3}\% of any increase or decrease in wages:—

(f) Casual Workers.—Any worker who is employed for a period of less than one (1) week (exclusive of hours of overtime worked) shall be classed as a casual worker and shall be paid five per cent. (5%) extra for the time employed.

Note.—A worker usually employed in or about his employer's business premises shall not be entitled to the Lost Time and Disabilities allowances prescribed by subclauses (d) and (e) of this clause except when he is required to and does work on the site in connection with the erection or demolition of a building exceeding 250 square feet in floor area or when he works on the repair, maintenance, renovation or ornamentation of buildings or structures, which are not directly concerned with the activities of the establishment in which or of the employer by whom he is employed.

10.—Payment of Wages.

- (a) When a worker is discharged or lawfully terminates his service, he shall then be paid all wages due to him before leaving the job: Provided that where a worker is employed at the time of termination under the distant work clause, all monies due may within twenty-four (24) hours of such termination be posted at the employer's risk, to an address nominated by such worker or, failing such nomination, to his last known address: Provided further that it shall be a defence to any prosecution for a breach of this subclause that circumstances (other than lack of available funds) entirely beyond the employer's control prevented compliance therewith.
- (b) An employer shall not keep more than one (1) day's pay in hand.
- (c) Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each week at or before the usual finishing time on the normal pay day of each week.
 - (d) Wages shall not be paid in the meal time.
- (e) Subject to subclause (a) hereof, where a worker is required to spend time in waiting for wages or attending the employer's office on a subsequent day, he shall be paid at the ordinary rate of pay for the time so spent, in addition to any fares incurred: Provided that this subclause shall not apply where such waiting or attending was due to an underpayment caused by a genuine mistake or by a genuine dispute as to the amount due.
- (f) Subject to subclause (a) hereof, all wages must be paid in cash, except that by agreement with the worker concerned, payment for distant work may be made by cheque the acceptance of which by the worker is conditional upon the cheque being paid on presentment.

11.—Piecework.

- (a) No employer shall employ a worker nor shall any worker accept employment for work under this Award at piecework or labour only rates or at the rates for labour and material unless the rates for such work shall have been fixed by the Court. Liberty to apply to fix any such rates is hereby given to any party to this Award.
- (b) No person who is a member of any Union a party to this Award shall, except in the capacity of a servant or worker, enter into any contract to execute any work involving service of a kind for which the rates and conditions are fixed by this Award, nor shall any employer bound by this Award enter into any contract for the execution of any such work with any member of any such Union except under the relationship of master and servant.
- (c) Upon application to the Court by any party to this Award (liberty to apply being hereby reserved) the operation of paragraph (b) hereof may be suspended in relation to work usually performed by any particular class of workers for such time and upon and subject to such conditions as the Court thinks proper.
- (d) Nothing contained in this clause shall be deemed to render any contract made in breach of subclause (b) hereof unenforceable or void nor to modify or alter the terms of any such contract.

12.—Terms of Service.

- (a) Each worker shall faithfully serve his employer on the work in which he is employed, in compliance with the terms and conditions of this Award.
- (b) A worker employed by an employer shall not without the express consent of such employer and the Union accept temporary or other employment with any other employer whilst in such employ, nor shall such worker undertake a contract or subcontract to perform any other work whilst his employment by the firstmentioned employer continues.

13.—Leading Hands.

- (a) Any worker referred to in clause 9 hereof who is placed in charge for not less than one (1) day of—
 - (i) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers referred to in the said clause shall be paid three shillings and tenpence (3s. 10d.) per day extra;
 - (ii) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers referred to in the said clause shall be paid seven shillings and eightpence (7s. 8d.) per day extra;
 - (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers referred to in the said clause shall be paid eleven shillings and sixpence (11s. 6d.) per day extra.

Where the leading hand works under the supervision of a foreman or of the employer for the major portion of the day, the extra rates set out in this subclause shall be halved.

(b) Any labourer, being a licensed scaffolder, who, in compliance with the provisions of Section 11 of the Inspection of Scaffolding Act, 1924-1955, is employed or engaged in the supervision of the erection or demolition of scaffolding or gear on any scaffold exceeding or likely to exceed twenty-seven feet (27 ft.) in height from the horizontal base shall be paid the rate for a leading hand even although he may not be in charge of not less than three (3) men.

14.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) Workers using Ramset Guns or other explosive tools shall while using such tools be paid one penny half-penny $(1\frac{1}{2}d.)$ per hour in addition to the prescribed rate.
- (b) Workers employed on the following work shall be paid at the rate of threepence (3d.) per hour in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed:—
 - (i) Working for more than one (1) hour continuously in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees F.
 - (ii) Stonemasons renovating or cleaning down old stone work on buildings.
 - (iii) The construction of a multi-storied building above the fourth storey thereof: Provided that such extra rate shall not be payable when the exterior walls have been erected and the windows completed and fixed in position.

For the purpose of this paragraph, the number of stories shall be calculated from the street level and includes the ground floor.

- (c) Workers employed on the following work shall be paid at the rate of sixpence (6d.) per hour in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed:—
 - (i) Working on a boat-type or swinging scaffold. "Swinging scaffold" means any scaffold suspended from overhead gear and not supported from the ground and which, by reason of the operations carried out on it or by reason of wind force or vibration is likely to swing or sway. (No employer shall permit an apprentice who has served less than two (2) years to work on a boat-type or swinging scaffold and no such apprentice shall work on any such scaffold.)
 - (ii) Excessively dirty work which is likely to render the worker or his clothes dirtier than the normal run of work (with a minimum payment as for four (4) hours when employed on such work).
 - (iii) Insulating work in an average temperature of forty-five (45) degrees F. or under.
 - (iv) Working for more than one (1) hour continuously in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to exceed 130 degrees F.

- (v) Working in dust-laden atmosphere in joiners' shops where dust extractors are not provided or in such atmosphere caused by the use of materials for insulating, deafening or pugging work (as, for instance, pumice, charcoal, silicate of cotton or any other substitute) or from earthworks.
- (vi) Working in any confined space in and around a building. "Confined space" means one of which the dimensions are such that the workman must work in an unusually stooped or cramped position or without adequate ventilation or where confinement within a limited space is productive of unusual discomfort to him.
- (vii) Engaged in repairs to sewers.
- (viii) Builders' labourers carrying tools or materials which exceed thirty pounds (30 lb.) in weight or which are by their nature or size awkward to carry on a ladder or stair run exceeding twelve (12) feet.

Loads.—Where bricks are being used the worker shall not be required to carry—

- (a) more than forty (40) bricks each load in a wheelbarrow (on a scaffold) to a height of fifteen (15) feet from the ground;
- (b) more than thirty-six (36) bricks each load in a wheelbarrow over and above a height of fifteen (15) feet on a scaffold;

The type of wheelbarrow shall be agreed upon with the Unions.

- (ix) Plumbers doing sanitary plumbing work on repairs to sewer drainage or wastpipe services in any of the following places:—
 - (a) Infectious and contagious diseases hospitals or any block or portion of a hospital used for the care of or treatment of patients suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - (b) Morgues.
- (x) Bricklayers employed on chimney shafts over fifty (50) feet from the ground. For every additional fifty (50) feet or fraction thereof an additional threepence (3d.) per hour shall be paid.
- (d) Workers employed on the following work shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the prescribed rate whilst so employed:—
 - (i) While working in any place where the worker's clothing becomes wet with soakage due to working without effective protective clothing in continuous rain or where water is continually dripping or where there is water underfoot so the worker's feet become wet. This shall not apply to natural surfaces made wet by rain.

This paragraph shall also apply to workers employed in bridge and jetty construction where the worker or his clothes become wet through the action of the water.

- (ii) Repairs to ovens or furnaces or on underpinning.
- (e) Plasterers using flintcote shall be paid fourpence (4d.) per hour extra, except when flintcote is applied by hawk and trowel by plasterers to walls and ceilings when the rate shall be eightpence (8d.) per hour extra.
- (f) (i) All work done by plumbers on a ship of any class shall be paid for at the rate of ninepence (9d.) per hour in addition to the rates set out in Clause 9—
 - (a) whilst under way; or
 - (b) in wet places or confined spaces; or
 - (c) in a ship which has done one trip or more, in a fume or dust laden atmosphere, in bilges, or when cleaning blockages in soil pipes or waste pipes or repairing brine pipes; and

(d) on all pipe work carried out under the plates in the engine and boiler rooms and oil fuel tanks, one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per hour extra.

For the purpose of this paragraph "wet place" means one in which the clothing of the worker necessarily is wetted to an uncomfortable degree or one in which water accumulates underfoot.

- (ii) Well Work.—A plumber or labourer required to enter a well thirty feet (30 ft.) or more in depth for the purpose in the first place of examining the pump, pipe or any other work connected therewith, shall receive an amount of two shillings and ninepence (2s. 9d.) for such examination and one shilling and eightpence (1s. 8d.) per hour extra thereafter for fixing, renewing or repairing such work.
- (iii) Permit Work.—Any licensed plumber called upon by his employer to use his license issued to him by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department for any period in any one week, shall be paid five pounds (£5) for that week, in addition to the rate prescribed in Clause 9.
- (iv) Plumbers on Sewerage Work.—Plumbers, or apprentices in their third, fourth and fifth year, on work involving the opening up of house drains or wastepipes for the purpose of clearing blockages or for any other purpose, or work involving the cleaning out of septic tanks or dry wells, shall be paid a minimum of two shillings and ninepence (2s. 9d.) per day, in addition to the prescribed rate, whilst so employed.
- (g) Stonemasons putting in foundations for memorials in cemeteries shall be paid seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) extra for each foundation: Provided that this shall not apply where concrete piers are put in with post-hole diggers.
- (h) Stonemasons working on the wall (cottage work and foundation work in coastal stone excepted) shall be paid threepence (3d.) per hour extra.
- (i) Setter Out.—A "Setter out" in a joiner's shop shall be paid four shillings and tenpence (4s. 10d.) per day extra above the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed for his trade, but where a worker qualifies for an allowance under this subclause and also under clause 13, he shall be entitled to whichever allowance is the higher, but not to both.
- (j) Detail Worker.—A joiner engaged on detail work shall be paid four shillings and tenpence (4s. 10d.) per day extra above the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed for his trade, but where a worker qualifies for an allowance under this subclause and also under clause 13, he shall be entitled to whichever allowance is the higher, but not to both.
- (k) Grinding Facilities.—The employer shall provide adequate facilities for the workers to grind tools, either at the job or at the employer's premises and workers shall be allowed time to use the same whenever reasonably necessary.
- (1) Chemical and Manure Works and Oil Refineries.—Journeymen and builders' labourers working in chemical and manure works and oil refineries shall receive threepence (3d.) per hour additional to the rate prescribed.
- (m) (i) Lead Paint Surfaces not to be Dry-Rubbed etc.—No surface painted with lead paint shall be rubbed down or scraped by a dry process
- (ii) Width of Brushes.—All paint brushes shall not exceed five (5) inches in width and no kalsomine brush shall be more than seven (7) inches in width.
- (iii) Meals not to be taken in Paint Shop.—No worker shall be permitted to have a meal in any paint shop or place where paint is stored or used.
 - (n) Spray Painting (Painters):—
 - Lead paint shall not be applied by a spray to the interior of any building.
 - (ii) All workers (including apprentices) applying paint by spraying shall be provided with full overalls and head covering and respirators by the employer.

- (iii) Where from the nature of the paint or substance used in spraying, a respirator would be of little or no practical use in preventing the absorption of fumes or materials from substances used by a worker in spray painting, the worker shall be paid a special allowance of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day.
- (o) Unusually Obnoxious Conditions.—Workers who are called upon to work in unusually obnoxious conditions, for which no special rate is prescribed, shall be paid such extra rate (if any) as may be agreed upon between the representatives of the employer and the Union or, failing agreement, as shall be determined by a Board of Reference.
- (p) Water and Soap.—Water and soap shall be provided in each shop or on each job by the employer for the use of painters.
- (q) First Aid Outfit.—Where ten (10) or more workers are employed on a job, the employer shall provide a supply of bandages and antiseptic dressings for use in cases of accident.
- (r) Provision of Boiling Water.—The employer shall, where practicable, provide boiling water for the use of his workers on each job, at lunch time.
- (s) Sanitary Arrangements.—The employer shall comply with the provisions of section 102 of the Health Act, 1911-1952.
- (t) Attendants on Ladders.—No worker shall work on a ladder at a height of over twenty (20) feet from the ground when such ladder is standing in any street, way or lane where traffic is passing to and fro, without an assistant on the ground.
- (u) Electrical Sanding Machines.—The use of electrical sanding machines for sanding down paint work shall be governed by the following provisions:—
 - (i) The weight of each such machine shall not exceed thirteen (13) lb.
 - (ii) Every employer operating any such machine shall ensure that each such machine, together with all electrical leads and associated equipment is kept in a safe condition and shall, if requested so to do by any worker, but not more often than once in any four weeks, cause the same to be inspected by a licensed electrical worker under the Electricity Act and the Regulations made thereunder.
 - (iii) Employers shall provide and supply respirators of a suitable type to each worker and shall maintain same in an effective and cleanly state at all times.

Where respirators are used by more than one worker, each such respirator shall be sterilised or a new pad inserted after use by each such worker.

- (iv) Employers shall also provide and supply goggles of a suitable type: Provided that goggles with celluloid lenses shall not be regarded as suitable.
- (v) All workers shall use such protective equipment when using electrical sanding machines of any type.
- (v) Adequate precautions shall be taken by all employers for the safety of workers employed on retaining walls of dams. Any dispute as to the adequacy of precautions taken shall be referred to a Board of Reference.
- (w) The employer shall comply with all provisions of the Inspection of Scaffolding Act, 1924-1955, and any Regulations made thereunder.

15.—Inclement Weather.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 33 (Breakdowns, etc.) each worker (other than a casual worker) shall be paid an allowance at ordinary rates for time lost through inclement weather, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) That such allowance shall not exceed the equivalent of eight (8) hours' pay in any one week.

- (b) That weather shall not be regarded as inclement for the purposes of this clause unless the employer or his representative on the job, and the worker or a representative of the worker, agree that it shall be so regarded. Failing such agreement, weather shall not be regarded as inclement and work shall continue;
- (c) that any intermission of work owing to inclement weather, regarded as such aforesaid, shall immediately cease and work shall be immediately resumed on the employer or his representative calling for a resumption of work;
- (d) that a worker shall not be entitled to payment as provided for in this clause unless he remains on the job until a decision to cease work for the day has been made by agreement between the employer or his representative and the worker or his representative;
- (e) that the intermission of work by workers who would be exposed to or working in inclement weather, so regarded in accordance with this clause, shall not be a ground for intermission of work in places where workers are not so exposed to or are not called upon to work in such inclement weather.

16.—Change Room.

Where no other reasonably suitable place is available, the principal contractor shall (unless it is impracticable to do so) provide on each job a suitable and convenient change room where the workers may change their clothes. The change room shall not be used for storing lime, cement or other similar materials.

17.—Protection of Workers' Tools.

- (a) Carpenters and Joiners.—The employer shall provide a waterproof and reasonably secure place where the workers' tools (when not in use) may be locked up apart from the employer's plant or material.
- (b) Other Workers Except Builders' Labourers.— The employer shall, when practicable, provide a reasonably secure place on each job for the safe-keeping of the workers' tools when not in use.
- (c) The employer shall indemnify a worker in respect of any tools of the worker stolen, if the employer's failure to comply with this clause is a material factor in contributing to the stealing of the tools.

18.—Fares and Travelling Time.

- (a) For all workers required on any day to report directly to the job, the following allowance shall be paid to workers and apprentices to compensate for excess fares and travelling time from the worker's home to his place of work and return:—
 - (i) On places of work within a radius of two(2) miles from the G.P.O., Perth—Nil.
 - (ii) On places of work beyond a radius of two
 (2) miles and within a radius of twelve
 (12) miles from the G.P.O., Perth—5s.
 3d. per day.
 - (iii) For each additional mile up to thirty (30) miles—6d. per mile.
 - (iv) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (v), work performed at places beyond thirty (30) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, shall be deemed to be distant work unless the employer and the workers, with the consent of the Union, agree in any particular case that the travelling allowance for such work shall be paid under this clause in which case an additional allowance of eightpence (3d.) per mile shall be paid for each mile in excess of thirty (30) miles.
 - (v) In respect to work carried out from an employer's depot situated more than thirty (30) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, the main Post Office in the town in which such depot is substituted as the centre for the purposes of this clause.

- (vi) Apprentices shall be paid three-quarters (3/4) of the above rates.
- (vii) Where transport to and from the job is provided by the employer from and to his depot or such other place more convenient to the worker as is mutually agreed upon between the employer and worker, half the above rates shall be paid: Provided that the conveyance used for such transport is provided with suitable seating and weatherproof covering.
- (b) For travelling during working hours from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another, a worker shall be paid by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares and reasonable expenses in connection with such travelling.

19.—Distant work.

- (a) Where a worker is sent by his employer or is engaged or selected or advised by an employer or his agent to proceed to a job or is told by an employer or his agent that a job will be available at such distance that he cannot return to his home each night, the employer shall provide board and lodging or shall pay the expenses reasonably incurred by the worker for board and lodging: Provided that where the employer provides board and lodging, except that the worker is required to provide bedding, an allowance of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per week shall be paid by the employer.
- (b) When any worker is required to travel at night, sleeping berth accommodation shall be provided by the employer.
- (c) Time occupied in travelling (including waiting for transport connections) up to a maximum of eight (8) hours each day shall be paid for at ordinary rates. Time occupied after arriving at the destination awaiting commencement of work during ordinary working hours shall be deemed to be time occupied in travelling.
- (d) The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling and shall pay a meal allowance of five shillings (5s.) for each ordinary meal actually and reasonably required during such travelling: Provided that neither the amount of the return fare nor the amount payable for the return travelling shall be payable if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or within one (1) working week of his commencing work on the job, for incompetency, or if the worker terminates or discontinues his work on the job within one (1) month of his commencing it: Provided further that where such travelling is to or from or within the area of the State north of latitude 26° S., the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (i) The worker shall pay the original fare.
 - (ii) One-third of the amount of such fare shall be refunded by the employer to any worker who continues for each of the first three (3) months of the duration of the job, with the full fare being refunded by the employer to a worker who continues in his service until the completion of any job of less than three (3) months' duration or to any worker dismissed by the employer within the first three (3) months of the employment, unless such dismissal was due to the worker's misconduct.
 - (iii) Where a worker continues in the employer's service at a distant job for three (3) months or six (6) months, he shall be paid by the employer either one-half or the full amount as the case may be of the fares incurred in returning to his home, with the full amount of such fares being payable by the employer to a worker who continues in his service until the completion of any job of less that six (6) months' duration or to any worker dismissed by the employer within the first six (6) months of the employment, unless such dismissal was due to the worker's misconduct.
- (e) The employer shall provide free transport for the workers' tools. Provided that free transport for tools shall not be provided when a worker severs his own contract of service.

- (f) Where a worker uses any kind of conveyance of his own in travelling, the amount of fare that would have been reasonably incurred had the worker used a public conveyance shall be paid by the employer to the worker.
- (g) If a worker elects to return to his home at the weekend after three (3) months' continuous service away from home in the employ of the one employer and thereafter at the end of each threemonthly period, he shall be paid a second-class return rail or road bus fare on the pay day which immediately follows the date on which he returns to the job, unless travelling facilities are provided. This shall not apply where the worker has visited his home at the employer's expense during the three-monthly period.
- (h) When a worker has been engaged by the one employer for six (6) months to work at a distant place from which it was not practicable to return to his home at the end of three (3) months he shall at the end of six (6) months be granted one (1) day's leave without pay to enable him to return to his home during such "long" week-end and, unless travelling facilities are provided, he shall be paid a second-class return rail or road bus fare on the pay day which immediately follows the date on which he returns to the job: Provided that a worker on jobs in the area of the State north of latitude 26 deg. S. shall after working continuously for an employer for six (6) months without returning to his home be paid an additional three (3) days' pay and after working for an employer continuously for twelve (12) months be granted two (2) days' leave without pay and be paid his return air fares between the job and his home on the pay day immediately following his return to the job: Provided further that for any specified job in the area north of latitude 26 deg. S., with the consent of the Union, any other arrangement acceptable to the workers may be substituted for the foregoing provision.

20.—District Allowance.

(a) In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 9 hereof, allowances shall be paid at the rates set out below, to the workers employed in the following areas:

- (6) That area of the State north of a line running east from Carnot Bay to the South Australian border

- (b) The above allowances cover a week, whether of five (5), six (6) or seven (7) days. For periods of less than five (5) days, one-seventh of the above shall be payable for each day or part thereof: Provided, however, that workers who have worked at least one-half of a week shall be given the benefit of Sunday in the calculation of district allowances.
- (c) Workers living in messes provided by the employer shall be paid half the rates prescribed in subclause (a).

21.—Camp Allowances.

- (a) Camp Allowance.—Where workers are required to live in tents at or in the neighbourhood of the job, a tent allowance at the rate of five shillings and threepence (5s. 3d.) per week shall be paid.
- (b) Pitching and Striking Camp.—In cases where the nature of the work necessitates the pitching of a temporary camp, and when such camp is shifted to suit the requirements of the work, then the employer shall allow full pay for the catual time researchly taken in striking and the actual time reasonably taken in striking and pitching camp and the erection of bunks. employer or his representative shall decide as to what is a reasonable time for the striking and pitching, and payment shall be made accordingly. In the event of any dispute arising under this subclause, the same may be decided by the Board of Reference

22.-Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) Subject as hereinafter provided, such hours shall be worked on the first five (5) days of the week and eight (8) hours shall be worked on each day between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with an interval of not less than forty-five (45) minutes for lunch.

Provided, however-

- (i) that in the case of repairs and renovations to shops or business premises where the work is likely to cause discomfort and inconvenience to the users of the premises, the foregoing hours may be altered to 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., on the first five (5) days of the week, but a shift shall not be broken except for the duration of the meal period. Where the employer avails himself of the proviso to this subclause, he shall notify the Union in writing within forty-eight (48) hours of the commencement of the job:
- (ii) that in the case of emergency work, worker in the plumbing industry may be rostered to work on Saturday morning and such work may be counted as part of his forty-hour week. The altered starting and finishing times necessitated by such an arrangement shall be as agreed between the worker and the employer;
- (iii) that for any work in the area north of latitude 26 deg. S., the starting and finishing times herein prescribed may be altered by agreement in writing between the employer and any accredited Union official;
- (iv) that an employer may employ his workers on shifts under the provisions of Clause 37 of this Award.

23.—Overtime.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of clause 22 hereof, a worker who commences work between midnight and 6 a.m., shall be paid at the rate of double time until his usual starting time and, subject thereto, all work performed outside the normal limits of the hours of labour shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Any worker who has left the premises at which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one (1) hour shall receive payment for one (1) hour at overtime rates.

- (c) If a worker is required to work during the recognised meal period so that the commencement of the meal period is postponed for more than half (\frac{1}{2}) an hour, that worker shall receive payment at double time rates until he gets his meal: Provided that where it is necessary for work to continue uninterrupted, a lunch break of not less than forty-five (45) minutes shall be allowed between the hours of 11.15 a.m. and 1.30 p.m., to workers engaged on such work.
- (d) Subject to the preceding subclause, if a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not in consequence obtain during the shift the full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained or any portion lost.
- (e) The expression "recognised meal period" means the period customarily observed as the meal period between fixed times on the job, or at the works, as the case may be, except where the time of commencement of the customary period is altered by mutual consent of the employer and the workers on a job to suit the convenience of the workers or the building proprietor, in which case the altered times shall be the basis of any rights under the preceding subclauses (c) and (d).
- (f) Any worker who is required to continue working for more than two (2) hours after his usual knock-off time on any day shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal or, in lieu of such meal, shall be paid an allowance of five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker who has been notified on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime.

- (g) (i) Rest Period After Overtime.—When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.
- (ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to paragraph (iii) of this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.
- (iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

24.-Holidays.

(a) The following shall be regarded as holidays, but not paid holidays:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

Provided that where the "Allowance for lost time, etc." is not paid in accordance with the provisions of clause 9 hereof, the holidays set out above shall be without deduction of pay.

- (b) All workers required to work on the days named in subclause (a) hereof, or on any Sunday shall be paid double time rate for all time worked on any such day.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

- (d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) (i) Workers Receiving Lost Time Allowance.—If a worker completes one (1) week's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period and lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-twentysixth (1/26th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed week of continuous service.
- (ii) Other Workers.—If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelvemonthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer, through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (j) "Picnic Day" shall be the second Monday in November of each year.
- (k) For the purpose of this clause "double time rate" shall be the rate which would have been payable to the worker on that day had it not been a holiday (including all allowances paid in accordance with the provisions of Clause 9 hereof) multiplied by two (2). The fact that the "lost time allowance" includes an amount calculated in reference to holidays shall not be regarded as a reason for reducing the amount that would otherwise be payable under this subclause.
- (1) Payment for holidays and annual leave shall be at the ordinary rate as prescribed in Clause 9, plus the allowances shown therein paid in accordance with the provisions of Clause 9 hereof.
- (m) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

25.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st day of April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty (20) completed years of continuous service.
- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the 1st day of April, 1958, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of

the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

- (ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
 - (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
 - (b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen (15) working days in any year of his employment;
 - (c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
 - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June, 26, 1950:
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
 - (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two (2) months from the date of such termination;
 - (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six (6) months from the date of such termination;
 - (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;

(i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least twenty (20) years' service the amount of leave shall be—
 - (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct: the amount of leave shall be—
 - (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
 - (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least ten (10) years' service but less than fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to twenty (20) years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award but in

the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.
 - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies— $\,$
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first thirteen (13) weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave:
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
 - (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death, pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death, pay to the personal representative, of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.
- (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.
- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
- (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State Law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
- (4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three (3) years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of twenty (20) or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 1st day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of long service leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

26. Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) This clause shall only apply where a worker is not paid the "Allowance for lost time, etc." in accordance with the provisions of clause 9 hereof.
- (b) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service. Provided that subject to subclause (h) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.
- (c) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (d) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (e) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (f) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

- (g) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (f) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.
- (h) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (b) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

27.—Board of Reference.

- (a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
 - (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

28.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

29.—Provision of Appliances.

- (a) Builders' Labourers.—Employers shall provide all necessary plant and tools free of charge.
- (b) Carpenters.—The employer shall provide the following tools when they are required on the job—Dogs and cramps of all despription, bars of all description, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, trammels, hand and thumb screws, soldering irons, spanners from three-quarters of an inch (\frac{3}{4}\) in.) upwards and all power driven tools and machines on construction jobs.
- (c) Painters.—The employer shall provide all tools in connection with the painting trade, excepting putty knife, strippers, scissors, duster, paperhanging brush, roller, two (2) lining fitches, a two-foot (2 ft.) rule, hammer and hacking knife.
- (d) Signwriters.—Signwriters shall provide themselves with a full set of pencils and fitches, rest stick, wash leather and a two-foot (2 ft.) rule.
- (e) Plasterers.—The employer shall supply all floating rules, darbies, trammels, centres, buckets and sieves. Stands for plasterers' mortar boards not less than two feet six inches (2 ft. 6 in.) from the ground or where practicable and safe from a scaffold level, shall be provided for the plasterer by the employer when requested.

(f) Plumbers-

(i) The following tools shall be provided by the employer:—

Metal pots, plumbing irons, mandrils, long dummies, stocks and dies for iron and brass pipes, cutters, all tongs over twelve inches (12 in.), vyces, hack saw blades, taps and chisels for brick and concrete.

and the employer shall also supply all tools required for work to be performed on wrought iron and lead pipes over two inches (2 in.) in diameter, and a worker shall supply only the usual kit bag of tools and blow lamp.

(ii) Plumbers shall supply themselves with all tools set out hereunder—

Lead dresser, bending stick, bossing stick, bossing mallet, 1 set of $1\frac{1}{2}$ in bobbins, 1 set of 2 in bobbins, 1 bent pin, two $1\frac{1}{2}$ in mandrils, two 2 in mandrils, 1 set 12 in snips, one set 10 in bent snips, 1 square 12 in (carpenter's), one set wiping cloths, one brace (ratchet), one set wood bits, one steel compass 8 in or 9 in, one 2 ft rule (carpenter's), 4 in bobbins, cane handled dummy, panel saw, ladle, hammer (bricklayer's), caulking tools, rasp, file, hack saw, gas pliers, steel float, rivet set, groover, 1 shave hook, 1 claw hammer, 1 spirit level, 1 pair pliers, cold chisel 6 to 9, plumb bob, 60 ft. chalk line, wall drills, footprints 7 in., footprints 12 in., pointing trowel, screwdriver 10 in. and 14 in., bevel (carpenter's), 1 crescent wrench, 10 in., blowlamp, nest of keyhole saws.

- (g) Bricklayers.—The employer shall supply scrutch combs and blades when required.
- (h) A worker in receipt of a tool allowance shall provide himself with all necessary tools, kept in suitable condition for the performance of his work (other than those tools to be provided by the employer in accordance with this clause).

A worker who fails to provide all such tools when required shall be guilty of a breach of this Award and shall not be entitled to the tool allowance prescribed in this Award until he complies with this clause.

30.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

- (a) The Secretary or any authorised officer of the Union or Association shall be allowed free access to any job or shop at any time to interview any of the workers if he desires to do so. Provided that in doing so he does not unduly interfere with the work in progress.
- (b) The Secretary or any authorised representative of the Union or Association shall have the right to visit and inspect any factory or works or any part thereof during the time that work is being carried on outside the ordinary working hours and to interview workers therein.

31.-Record Book.

- (a) The employer shall make and keep a record or records showing—
 - (i) the name and trade of each worker and location of employment;
 - (ii) the starting and finishing times on each day;
 - (iii) the hours worked;
 - (iv) the wage and overtime (if any) paid;
 - (v) the amount of fares and travelling time paid;
 - (vi) taxation deductions.
- (b) Each week such record shall be signed by the worker or a receipt completed by the worker upon receipt of his wages and such record or receipt shall be available for inspection by the Secretary or other duly accredited representative of the Union at any time during working hours at the employer's business premises, and such person may take extracts therefrom: Provided that if such records are not available when demanded because of being at

the job or by reason of a cause beyond the employer's control, the employer shall within twenty-four (24) hours notify the Union of a reasonable time and place at which they may be inspected.

- (c) Details of how his wages are made up shall be available to the worker at the time of payment.
- (d) Any system of automatic recording by machines shall be deemed a record for the purposes of this clause.

32.—Posting of Award and Union Notices.

No employer shall prevent an official of the workers' Union from posting a copy of this Award, or any Union notice, not exceeding fourteen inches (14 in.) by nine inches (9 in.) in a suitable place on any job.

33.—Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

34.—Cadets.

- (a) Notwithstanding anything herein contained or implied, a bona fide registered builder shall be permitted to appoint one (1) son (or any other nominee) as a Cadet to learn all branches of the building trade. The rates and conditions for cadets shall not be less favourable than the applicable rates and conditions prescribed for apprentices by this Award.
- (b) Only one (1) such cadet at any particular time shall be permitted any employer.
- (c) This clause shall apply only to an established business employing three (3) or more journeymen, each one of whom shall be a qualified tradesman from three (3) or more building trades as defined in clause 3 of this Award.
- (d) The employer of a cadet shall notify the Industrial Registrar within fourteen (14) days of his engagement. Upon receipt of such notification, the Registrar shall give the unions fourteen (14) days in which to object to the employment of the cadet.
- (e) On receipt of an objection, the matter shall be referred to the Court and the Court, after hearing the parties, may make such order as it thinks fit.

35.—Apprentices.

- (a) The term of apprenticeship shall be five (5) years.
- (b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the following proportions:—
 - Bricklaying, Stonemasonry, Plastering.—As allowed under the Building Trades Apprenticeship Regulations.
 - Carpentry and Joinery, Plumbing.—One (1) apprentice to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen employed by him, provided the fraction shall not be less than one (1).
 - Painting, Signwriting, Glazing.—One (1) apprentice to every three (3) or fraction of three (3) journeymen employed by him in that branch, provided the fraction shall not be less than one (1).

(d) The employment of apprentices in the brick-laying, stonemasonry and plastering trades shall be governed by the provisions of the Building Trades Apprenticeship Regulations.

- (e) Subject to Regulation 25 of the Apprenticeship Regulations, 1953, the following shall apply to the training of carpentry and joinery apprentices:—
 - (i) Every apprentice shall either-
 - (a) attend regularly and punctually any appropriate vocational class or classes of instruction; or
 - (b) study any approved correspondence course appropriate to his trade.
 - (ii) Where an apprentice lives within 12 miles of a Government or other approved technical school where a course appropriate to his trade and grade is provided, he must attend this course.
 - (iii) The hours of attendance in appropriate trade classes shall be eight hours per week for the first school year of his apprentice-ship—February to November—in his appropriate technical course and eight hours per fortnight for the three subsequent school years: Provided that time lost during such training shall be made up during the fifth year of apprenticeship.
- (f) Subject to Regulation No. 27 of the Apprenticeship Regulations, 1953, apprentices from any district in country areas where an appropriate technical class is not established, shall attend an approved technical centre for two (2) week's training each year without loss of pay.
- (g) The employer shall be under no obligation to teach an apprentice to carpentry and joinery, any work in connection with metal ceilings where that work is not performed by such employer.
- (h) A tool allowance of one-third (\frac{1}{3}) of the amount payable to tradesmen shall be paid to apprentices (except in the stonemasonry trade) in their first year and of two-thirds (\frac{2}{3}) of the amount payable to tradesmen, in such apprentices' second year, and of the same amount as is payable to tradesmen in their third, fourth and fifth years of apprenticeship.
- (i) The employer shall provide each apprentice in the painting trade during his first year with a putty knife, stripper and duster.
- (j) No apprentice to the painting or signwriting trades shall be registered in accordance with the provisions of this Award until such time as he has lodged with the Registrar a certificate to the effect that he does not suffer any disability by reason of colour blindness.

36.—Prohibition of Females or Junior Workers.

The employment of females or junior workers (except cadets or apprentices as defined by the Apprenticeship Regulations) on any work which if performed by an adult male worker would be subject to the provisions of this Award, is prohibited, unless the consent of the appropriate Union is in each case first obtained, and if any female or junior worker (except a cadet or apprentice as so defined) is so employed in breach of this clause, such worker shall be paid not less than the wages for an adult male performing similar work, without however, relieving the employer from any penalty on conviction for such breach of the Award. Provided that if an employer who has committed a breach of this clause satisfies the Court in which any proceedings relating to such breach are brought, that such breach was caused by his inadvertently omitting to register a worker as a probationer with a view to apprenticeship pursuant to Regulation No. 5 of the Apprenticeship Regulations, 1953, and that such omission was remedied within fourteen (14) days from the expiration of the time prescribed for registering such probationer, the junior worker concerned shall only be entitled as from the commencement of his service, to the rate for first year apprentices, without however, relieving the employer from liability for any penalty for a breach of the Regulation.

37.—Shift Work.

(a) (i) On concrete silos construction where it is found necessary to pour concrete by continuous pour methods, the employer may employ workers on shift work, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Unions concerned.

- (ii) One (1) month's notice shall be given of his intention of doing so, but such notice need not specify the exact commencing date of the pour.
- (iii) When such shift work is to be worked, the loading shall be on the ordinary rates, including all allowances as prescribed in Clause 9 of this Award, plus twenty-five per cent. (25%) for day, afternoon and night shift.
- (iv) The normal working hours for shift work shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours per day—Monday to Friday inclusive: Provided that overtime shall be double time as defined in sub-clause (k) of Clause 24.
- (v) All work on any Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday shall be paid at the ordinary penalty rates for such day.
- (vi) Work under this Award shall not be recognised as shift work unless five (5) consecutive afternoons or nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime.
- (vii) Twenty (20) minutes crib time for shift workers shall be taken in relays at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work and no deduction shall be made therefor.
- (viii) A crib time shall be taken not less than four (4) or more than five (5) hours after the commencement of the shift.
- (ix) Suitable waterproof covering shall be provided when necessary.
- (x) Lighting shall be sufficient to provide full safety conditions.
- (xi) Necessary precautions shall be taken against arc welding flashes.
- (b) Shift work may be worked in superphosphate works under similar conditions to those set out in the next preceding subclause hereof except that the notice to be given to the Unions shall be at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice.

38.—Liberty to Apply.

- (a) Liberty to any party to this Award to apply at any time is granted— $\,$
 - (i) in respect to clause 4—Scope;
 - (ii) in respect to the matters in which liberty is reserved by clause 11 hereof;
 - (iii) clause 21—Camp Allowances;
 - (iv) clause 25-Long Service Leave;
 - (v) clause 35—Apprentices.
- (b) Liberty is also reserved to any Industrial Union of Workers a party to this Award to apply to amend—
 - (i) subparagraph (g) of paragraph (ii) of subclause (f) of clause 3—Definitions (Plasterers).
 - (ii) subclauses (g) and (i) of clause 24—Holidays.
- (c) Liberty is reserved to any Industrial Union of Employers or to any employer a party to this Award to amend clause 20—District Allowance.
- (d) Liberty is reserved to any employer to have the provisions of clause 37 (Shift Work) applied to any specific operations.
- (e) General liberty to apply is reserved to respondent, \mathbb{K} . Vilips.

39.—Exemptions.

Broken Hill Proprietary Limited in respect to workers employed by it solely on maintenance work shall be exempted from complying with the provisions of clause 10 and for such workers may reduce the meal period prescribed in subclause (b) of clause 22 to a period of not less than thirty (30) minutes.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 20 of 1960.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Appli-cant, and Universal Tyre and Rubber Co., National Tyre Service Pty. Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Com-missioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement") **'A**greement.'')

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Tyre Repair and Retreading Industry Award" and replaces Award No. 9 of 1947.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall operate over that portion of the State south of the 26th parallel of latitude and west of the 123rd degree of longitude and shall apply to the workers referred to in clause 24 hereof who are employed by the respondents.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Hours.

Subject to clause 6 hereof the ordinary working hours shall be worked between Monday to Friday inclusive and shall not exceed forty (40) hours in any one week, nor eight (8) in any one day, and except in the case of shift workers shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

6.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

- (b) All work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 15 (a) hereof shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (c) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (d) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid overtime rates until he gets his meal.
- (e) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.
- (f) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (g) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall, in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (h) In the calculation of overtime rates, each day shall stand alone. Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.
- (i) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts.

7.—Meal Money.

A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

8.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice one (1) week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

9.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

10.-Casual Workers.

- (a) Any worker dismissed through no fault of his own before the expiration of one (1) week of his employment shall be considered casual and shall receive ten per cent. (10%) above the rate specified for the work performed.
- (b) The services of a casual worker may be terminated by one (1) hour's notice, given by either employer or worker, on any day.

11.-Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum Wage, may be paid such lesser wages as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

12.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this paragraph, and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twenty-four (24) hours either at the employer's office or at the works.

14.--Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 6 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) Any worker absenting himself from work without reasonable cause, proof of which shall lie upon him, on the whole or any portion of the working day preceding, or on the whole or any portion of the working day succeeding a holiday provided for herein, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

15.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the

- worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (f) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (d) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

16.-Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, in the case of a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion the employer before paying for any further absence in the same year may insist on the worker obtaining a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty because of personal ill-health, even although such absence was for less than three (3) days.

17.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a Chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

- (c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—
 - (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them.
 - (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (d) The provisions of Regulations 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

18.—Right of Entry.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

19.—Award, etc., to be Posted.

Every employer shall allow Union notices except those which on reasonable grounds he considers objectionable and a copy of this Award to be posted up by the Union in a place accessible to the workers and approved by the employer.

20.—Junior Workers' Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate, or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any Junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled, he shall make restitution to the employer.

21.-Shift Work.

- (a) An employer may, if he so desires, work his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Union and of the intended starting and finishing times of ordinary working hours of the respective shifts.
- (b) (i) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.
- (ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.
- (c) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.
- (d) Where a shift commences at or after 11 p.m., then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

22.-No Reduction.

Nothing in this Award shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

23.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with the one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.
- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be the service of the worker with the transmittee.
- (ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
 - (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
 - (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
 - (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any Award in respect of annual leave.
 - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after 26th June, 1950;
 - (ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—
 - (a) The transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
 - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
 - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
 - (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State Law;
 - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be---
 - (a) In respect of 20 years' service so completed —13 weeks' leave;
 - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (a) by his death;
 - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct.

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
 - (i) by his death; or
 - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
 - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.
 - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
 - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
 - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—
 - (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
 - (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
 - (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
 - (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
 - (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
 - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
 - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
- (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.
- (4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three (3) years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of twenty (20) or more years' service of employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 24 of 1960.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Hon. Minister for Industrial Development, Western Australia, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

4.—Scope.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of casual workers whose engagement shall be by the day, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 17 or such absence is on account of holidays, annual leave or long service leave to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for wilful misconduct.

7.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct pay-The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union associated with it or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent with the exception of wet weather in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the officer in charge.

8.—Higher Duties.

If a worker is employed on work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary work for more than two (2) hours in any shift, he shall be paid the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. (a) Dirt Money.—Workers employed on work of an unusually dirty or obnoxious nature and whose

marginal rate contains no monetary allowance for working under such conditions shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per shift in addition to the daily rate of pay.

The officer in charge shall decide whether work is dirty work within the meaning of this clause.

(b) Wet Money.—Workers while working in wet places shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per shift in addition to the rate prescribed.

"Wet places" shall mean places where the water is over the workers' ankles or top of gum boots when provided, or where in performing the work the splashing of water and mud saturates their clothing, or where protection is not provided to prevent splashings or drippings sufficient to saturate their clothing. The officer in charge shall decide whether a place is a "wet place" within the meaning of this clause.

- (c) Slag Bogging.—Any worker required to bog slag at distances of 6 feet or more from the edge of the slag pit shall be paid an additional allowance of 10s. per shift.
 - (d) Protective Equipment-
 - (i) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as for example, safety helmets, goggles and gloves) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary. Workers required to work in the rain, shall, on request, be supplied with gum boots and/or oilskins by special arrangement with the management.
 - (ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective equipment and shall return same to the employer when he has finished using it or on leaving his employment.
 - (iii) No worker shall lend another worker any such article of protective equipment issued to such first mentioned worker, and if same are lent, both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.
 - (iv) Before goggles, or gloves or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the employer to another worker they shall be effectively sterilised.
 - (v) During the time any article of protective equipment is on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.
- (e) Junior workers shall be deemed to be included in the foregoing provisions of this clause.

10.—Hours (Day Workers).

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day Monday to Friday inclusive and shall be worked between the hours of $7\ a.m.$ and $5.30\ p.m.$

Provided that the spread of hours for workers engaged on ore handling shall be between ${\bf 6}$ a.m. and ${\bf 10}$ p.m.

Provided further that any shift commencing on or after 2 p.m. shall be regarded as an afternoon shift, and the appropriate shift penalty rate shall be paid for all work performed thereon.

- (b) The meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.
- (c) (i) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning.
- (ii) This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by workers during this interval, but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any worker of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied, the Court may grant the employer concerned exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

11.—Overtime (Day Workers).

- (a) All time worked in excess of the daily rostered hours or in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter
- (b) Saturday.—Work performed on Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, but if work is performed in any period from 5 p.m. on Saturday, the worker shall be paid double time for all time worked after that hour.

Sundays.—Work performed on Sunday shall be at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations, in which case the rate of time and a half shall apply.

- (c) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving such premises) he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (d) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after his usual knock off time for more than one hour, or after 6 p.m. whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or be paid 5s. in lieu thereof.
- (e) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than five (5) hours without a break for a meal
- (f) When a worker is required for duty during the meal interval, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the time he usually commences his meal interval until he gets his meal.
- (g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

12.—Continuous Shift Workers.

- (a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed 40 in any week to be worked in five shifts of eight hours each inclusive of crib time.
- (b) All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours as prescribed shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves, or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts.

The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two hours, after the expiration of which, overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.

- (d) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving such premises) he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (e) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after his usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or be paid five shillings (5s.) in lieu thereof.
- (f) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than five (5) hours without a break for a
- (g) All work performed during ordinary working hours on Saturdays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter, and on Sundays at time and a half. These rates shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowances prescribed by subclause (j) hereof.

- (h) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate, i.e., double ordinary rate.
- (i) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (j) Shift workers, other than day shift workers, shall be paid 5 per cent. in addition to the ordinary rate for afternoon shift and 10 per cent. for night shift.

13.-Shift Work.

- (a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one (1) week on day shift out of each consecutive three (3) weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter: Provided that if he is required to work for more than one (1) week consecutively on afternoon or night shift, such a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second or subsequent weeks of afternoon or night shift.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers to whom it would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to a private arrangement with another worker, nor to workers (known as "relief workers") regularly employed on continuous process work who are required to work shifts to enable other workers engaged on such work to change shifts weekly and to have their days off, if such relief worker is not required to work more night or afternoon shifts than the number of day shifts worked by him.
- (b) (i) Where any particular process is carried out by workers on shifts other than day shift and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then such workers shall be paid at overtime rates. A worker who replaces a regular shift worker on afternoon or night shift, absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive afternoon or night shifts and at the appropriate shift work rate if he works five (5) or more of such shifts consecutively.
- (ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

14.—Rest Period After Overtime.

- (a) When overtime work is necessary, it shall wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.
- (b) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.
- (c) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

15.-Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be

- paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date, if the worker so agrees.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.
- (f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

16.—Annual Leave.

- (a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months's continuous service with such employer.
- (ii) Seven-day shift workers, i.e. shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof.
- Where a worker with 12 months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying 12-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two consecutive week's annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof increased by one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
- (b) If any holiday under this Award falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period, one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.
- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (d) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period.
- (e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be

recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

- (f) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.
- (g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

17.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate, and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or miscon-
- (e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.
- (ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

18.—Interviewing Workers.

With the permission of the officer in charge, any officer of the Union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such Union shall have the right to enter the premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of conversing with or inter-viewing members of the Union covered by this Award.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

19.—Shop Stewards.

Stewards to be appointed by the Union shall be recognised by the employer. The employer shall be notified in writing by the Union of the Shop Stewards appointed.

20.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There shall be assigned to such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

21.—Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours.

22.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Award.

23.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any registered industrial union shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another registered industrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other Union, within fourteen (14) days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

24.—No Reduction.

Any worker who has been, prior to the date of this Award, in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than that prescribed by the Award heretofor in force shall not by reason of this Award suffer any reduction in the amount by which such higher rate of pay exceeded the amount formerly prescribed. Such excess amount shall not be affected by this Award.

25.—Reduction of Workers.

Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed, the Manager, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and all things being equal shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the company.

26.—Definitions.

"Casual Worker" means a worker whose employment is terminated through no fault of his own before the expiration of one week.

"Junior Worker" means a male worker under the age of twenty-one (21) years.

27.—General Conditions.

The provisions of the Factory and Shops Act shall apply in respect to Lunch Room, Change Room, Toilet Facilities, Washing Facilities, Drinking Facilities and First Aid.

28.—First Aid Attendants.

First aid attendant appointed as such by the employer shall be paid 1s. per shift in addition to his usual rate of pay.

29.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable under the provisions of this Award shall be as follows:-
