WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board, from time to

time, and at any time, by proclamation declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedule hereunder be declared a totalisator agency region for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 17th day of April, 1961, the land described in the schedule hereunder shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960.

Schedule.

All that portion in Perth of the municipal district of the City of Perth comprising the area bounded by lines starting from the point of intersection of the western boundary of Pier Street with the southern boundary of Wellington Street, and extending in an easterly direction across Pier Street and along the southern boundary of Wellington Street to the point of its intersection with the western boundary of Lord Street; thence in a southerly direction along that western boundary to the point of its intersection with the northern boundary of Victoria Square; thence in westerly, southerly and easterly directions along the northern, western and southern boundaries of Victoria Square, crossing Murray Street to the point of intersection of the southern boundary of Victoria Square with the western boundary of Victoria Avenue; thence in a southerly direction along that western boundary across Hay Street, St. George's Terrace and Terrace Road to the point of intersection of that boundary with the northern boundary of Riverside Drive; thence in a westerly direction along that northern boundary across an unnamed street and Barrack Street and William Street to the point of intersection of that boundary with an imaginary line in prolongation in a south-easterly direction of the north-eastern boundary

of Spring Street; thence in a north-westerly direction along that imaginary line and the north-eastern boundary of Spring Street to the point of intersection of that street with the south-eastern boundary of Mount Street; thence at right angles across Mount Street to the north-western boundary of that street and along that boundary in a north-easterly direction to the point of its intersection with the southern boundary of St. George's Terrace; thence in a westerly direction along that southern boundary to the point of its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of Malcolm Street; thence across St. George's Terrace to the point of intersection of its northern boundary with the north-eastern boundary of St. George's Place and along that north-eastern boundary in a north-westerly direction to the point of its intersection with the southern boundary of Hay Street; thence across Hay Street to the point of intersection of its northern boundary with the eastern boundary of George Street and along that eastern boundary in a northerly direction across Murray Street to the point of intersection of that boundary with the southern boundary of Wellington Street; thence in an easterly direction along that southern boundary to the point of its intersection with the furthestmost easterly boundary of Milligan Street; thence in a south-westerly direction along that easterly boundary to the point of its intersection with the northern boundary of Murray Street; thence in an easterly direction along that northern boundary across King Street, Queen Street, William Street, Forrest Place and Barrack Street to the point of intersection of that boundary with the western boundary of Pier Street; and thence in a northerly direction along that western boundary to the starting point.

the closure of that Company's mines shall be re-engaged on the basis of district seniority in each classification, subject to suitability for the particular duties to be carried out.

(2) This decision shall not apply to any re-engaged employee who actually commenced work prior to 24/12/60.

(3) (i) Seniority of metal tradesmen, including plumbers, under this Award, shall date from the time:

(a) An indentured tradesman commenced employment in the industry;

(b) A worker, became qualified to receive his tradesman's rights certificate;

(c) an apprentice became a journeyman.

(ii) In the case of a worker who had not qualified for a tradesman's rights certificate, such worker shall hold seniority from the date he commenced work under this Award in his previous classification.

(4) The seniority of carpenters, bricklayers and painters shall date from the time they commenced work within their classifications as tradesmen.

(5) Tradesmen's assistants shall be re-engaged in their order of district seniority, irrespective of classification.

(6) Any dispute as to the application of this clause shall be referred to the Board of Reference for settlement.

2. This amendment shall take effect forthwith.

No. 6 of 1961.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 23rd day of March, 1961, between the Honourable Minister for Police of the one part, and the Western Australian Police Union of Workers of the other part, whereby the parties Covenant and Agree as follows:—

1.—Term of Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the 23rd day of March, 1961, subject to the parties having the right to negotiate for any variation of this Agreement within the said term.

2.—Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Western Australian Police Force (hereinafter referred to as Employees) and shall be binding upon the abovenamed parties and shall operate over the whole State.

3.—Commissioned Officers.

The ratio of the Commissioned Officers to lesser ranks, excluding Probationary Constables, shall be maintained as 1 to 33, and the number of such commissioned officers shall include the Deputy Commissioner and the Chief Inspector for the purpose of computing the ratio. Of every three inspectors, there shall be not less than one first and one second class.

4.—Non-Commissioned Officers.

(a) Excluding members of the Criminal Investigation Branch, Women Police and Probationary Constables, the ratio of non-commissioned officers to lesser ranks, shall be maintained at 1 to 5; and the proportion of first, second and third class sergeants shall be maintained at not less than 1 as to 2 as to 3.

(b) The ratio of non-commissioned officers in the Criminal Investigation Branch shall be maintained as one non-commissioned officer to 1.5 of lesser ranks, and the proportion of first, second and third class sergeants shall be maintained at not less than 1 as to 2 as to 3.

(c) The ratio of Women Police non-commissioned officers shall be maintained at one non-commissioned officer to 5 of lesser rank, excluding probationary women police.

5.—Brevet Ranks and Special Promotions.

Brevet ranks or special promotions are not to be included in any classification for the computing of the ratio.

6.—Classified Positions.

There shall be the following classified positions and the employee occupying any of such positions shall not be of lesser rank than the rank shown hereunder:—

(a) 1st Class Sergeant.

Officer-in-Charge of each shift at Central Station.

Officer-in-Charge of each shift at Fremantle Station.

Senior Prosecuting Officer, Perth.

Senior Prosecuting Officer, Fremantle.

Officer-in-Charge, Staff Office, Perth.

Officer-in-Charge, Traffic Branch, Fremantle.

Officer-in-Charge, Traffic Branch, Victoria Park.

Officer-in-Charge, Police School.

(b) In addition to the positions enumerated above, 1st Class Sergeants shall be employed as follows:—

At all Stations where a District Inspector has his headquarters (one to each such headquarters).

Traffic Branch, Perth (3).

Liquor Inspection Branch, Perth (1).

(c) 2nd Class Sergeant.

Assistant Prosecuting Officer, Perth.

District Office Clerk, Perth.

7. The proportions referred to in this Agreement may be increased to meet departmental requirements with a corresponding reduction in the 3rd Class ranks.

8. This Agreement shall not in itself operate to reduce the present rank of any commissioned or non-commissioned officer.

9.—Cancellation of Previous Agreement.

This Agreement supersedes Industrial Agreement No. 4 of 1958, which said Industrial Agreement is hereby cancelled.
