WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960, that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board, from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedule hereunder be declared a totalisator agency region for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 8th day of May, 1961, the land described in the schedule hereunder shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1959.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 662/36.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1959, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Busselton Fire District, which district is referred to in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, by substituting for the Busselton Road District set out in column two of such Part opposite that fire district that portion of the Busselton Road District described and set out in the schedule to this Order in Council.

Busselton Water Board—Proposed Loan £9,000.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 6/39.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, a Water Board may, with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, of the Busselton Water Board borrowing the sum of nine thousand pounds (£9,000) for a period of fifteen (15) years, repayable by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments with interest at the rate of five pounds ten shillings (£5 10s.) per centum per annum for the work approved by Order in Council dated the 22nd March, 1961, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th March, 1961, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the 1st day of October, 1961.

Millstream Catchment Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 554/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 9 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator may, by Order in Council, constitute a Catchment Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Millstream Catchment Area as defined in the schedule hereunder, and assign the name of "Millstream Catchment Area" thereto.

Limitation of Terms of Loans.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 823/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 608 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that a council shall not issue debentures unless upon condition expressed in the debenture that the municipality shall repay the principal sum mentioned in it on a day mentioned in it and being within a period of 36 years from the day of the issue of the series of which it is one, or such lesser period mentioned in it as is limited by order made by the Governor; and whereas it is further enacted by subsection (2) of that section that the Governor, by order, may limit the maximum term of a loan for a particular class, or for particular classes, of works or undertakings, to a period of less than 36 years; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the maximum term of a loan for a particular class of works or undertakings specified in the schedule to this Order in Council be limited to the term respectively set against that particular class in that schedule: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 608 of the said Act, doth hereby order that the maximum term of a loan for a particular class of works and undertakings specified in the schedule to this Order in Council be limited to the term respectively set against that particular class in that schedule.

Between The West Australian Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Cuming Smith and Mount Lyell Farmers' Fertilisers Ltd. and Cresco Fertilisers (W.A.) Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Superphosphate Workers' Award and replaces Award No. 26 of 1957.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all classes of workers referred to in Clause 9 hereof engaged in the manufacture of superphosphate.

4.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

5.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the date hereof.

6.—Hours.

(a) Day Workers: Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive.

(b) Shift Workers: The ordinary hours of shift workers, inclusive of twenty (20) minutes crib time (which shall be taken at such a time, when possible, as to avoid a stoppage of work) shall not exceed—

- (i) Forty (40) hours in any one (1) week, or
- (ii) Eighty (80) hours in two (2) weeks, at the option of the employer, to be worked in rotating shifts not exceeding eight (8) hours each day.

(c) Watchman's Hours: Watchman's hours shall not exceed forty-eight (48) per week, but he shall be allowed one day off for each four (4) weeks without deduction of pay.

7.—Shift Work.

(a) Continuous process may be worked, and shift shall rotate weekly, so that, as far as practicable all workers shall have a fair share of day shifts.

(b) Where a worker is called on to work a quick shift he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for such quick shift. A "quick shift" shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift without having had at least eight (8) hours off.

(c) Shift workers other than those on day shift shall be paid five per cent (5%) extra for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

(d) Continuous shift workers shall be paid time and a half for Saturday work.

8.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for work done before the recognised time for starting work and after the recognised time for ceasing work in each factory.

Each day shall be reckoned by itself.

This subclause shall not apply to men working on shifts.

Overtime for work done by workers (other than those on continuous shifts) on any day other than specified holidays or Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Overtime for work done by men working on continuous shifts shall be paid for at the rate of double time (i.e., time in addition to ordinary time) for all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day of twenty-four (24) hours or on any rostered day off, except so far as the excess is, owing to arrangements between the workers themselves, or is owing to the relieving man not coming on duty and relieving at the appointed time, in which latter case the overtime rate shall be paid when the period exceeds one (1) hour.

(c) Any worker who is required to work on Sundays shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at the rate applicable for that day.

(d) Where a worker, without being notified on the previous day, has to continue working after the usual knock off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid five shillings (5s.) in lieu thereof.

Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker residing in the same locality as his place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;

(ii) no organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

Call Back.—When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

For the purpose of convenience, the wages prescribed above are expressed in weekly amounts. The provisions of clause 13, Contract of Hiring, shall read in conjunction with this clause.

No junior workers less than seventeen (17) years of age shall be employed in wheeling bags of superphosphate or other similar material up an inclined ramp or board. No boy of less than eighteen (18) years of age shall be employed on night shift.

Casual Workers.—Any employer employed for less than one (1) week shall be entitled to ten per cent. (10%) per day, in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed for the particular class of work in which he is employed.

10.—Extra Rates and Conditions.

(i) Except where specifically prescribed elsewhere in this clause, the method of calculating the extra rates provided in this clause shall be as follows:—

Any worker carrying out the special duties mentioned in this clause for less than half (½) of one (1) day or shift shall be paid the extra allowance on a pro rata basis for the time actually employed on such work.

Where such worker performs the work for half (½) or more of one (1) day or shift, he shall be paid the extra allowance for the whole of such day or shift.

(ii) Two shillings (2s.) per day over the minimum rates prescribed herein shall be paid to men employed, working on a scaffold fifteen (15) feet or more above ground or floor level.

(iii) Work done in the meal time or any portion thereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but this shall not apply to cases involving completion of work commenced before such meal time, and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the commencement thereof, in which case the meal time will be extended by such period beyond the ordinary time.

(iv) Any worker placed by the employer in charge of three (3) or more other workers shall be paid twenty shillings (20s.) per week, or if placed in charge of less than three (3) other workers shall

be paid ten shillings (10s.) per week in addition to the margin prescribed for the work being performed.

(v) In addition to the rates of wages prescribed in clause 9 hereof, the following special rates shall be paid:—

(vi) In addition to the rates of wages prescribed in clause 9 hereof a disability rate of ten shillings (10s.) per week shall be paid.

11.—Protective Clothing.

(i) Dust glasses or goggles shall, where necessary, be supplied to workers.

(ii) Rubber gloves and either knee or ankle rubber boots shall, when required, be provided for the use of men who work in or about acid plants.

(iii) Loaders out and baggers shall be provided with leather aprons.

(iv) One pair of boots per annum shall be provided for bin excavator men.

(v) Workers having completed 12 months' continuous service with an employer shall be entitled to receive free of cost from the employer—

- (a) in the case of acid plant workers, two issues of working clothes per annum, and
- (b) in the case of all other workers, one suit of working clothes per annum.

12.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification for less than half (½) of one (1) day or shift shall be paid the higher rate for the time actually employed on such work.

Where a worker performs duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification for half (½) or more of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of such day or shift.

13.—Contract of Hiring.

(a) The contract of hiring of any worker with at least one (1) month's continuous service shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the week terminable by one week's notice on either side given at anytime. The termination of the contract of service of such worker may take effect by the payment or forfeiture (as the case may be) of a week's wages.

(b) During the first month of employment the contract of hiring shall be from day to day and one day's notice shall be given or one day's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(c) Nothing herein shall derogate from the employer's right at common law to dismiss a worker without notice for misconduct or other sufficient cause.

14.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent, except such stoppage is due to shortage of railway trucks.

15.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

16.—Time and Wages Record.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his usual place of business, or at each of them, if more than one, a book containing a record of the names of all workers employed by him at the particular factory, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime, if any. Such book shall be open to inspection by the Secretary, or such person as may be appointed by the Union, on any day during working hours.

17.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to subclause (c) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) All work done on any of the holidays specified in subclause (a) hereof (except Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day) shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday or Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of treble time.

(d) All work done on Sundays (except by shiftmen and watchmen) shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All work done on Sundays by shiftmen shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All work done on Sundays by watchmen shall be paid for at the rate of ordinary time.

(e) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(f) In addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (e) hereof, seven-day shift workers, that is shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one week's leave. Where a worker with 12 months' continuous service is engaged for part of the qualifying 12-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (e) hereof increased by one-twelfth of a week for each month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(g) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(h) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leave his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service, or in the case of a worker referred to in subclause (f) hereof, such payment shall be one-quarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage.

(i) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(j) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (h) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(k) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(l) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

18.—Sick Pay.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

(i) Name in full.

(ii) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on his certificate, nor shall the employer in such case be deemed guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the Award founded upon an age limitation, except in the case of collusion.

(d) If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate, he shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

20.—Board of Reference.

The Court may order, for the purposes of the said Award the appointment of a Board or Boards of Reference and assign to such Board or Boards the following functions and powers arising under or out of the said Award, namely—

- (i) to adjust any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time;
- (ii) to decide or report to the Court upon any other matter which the Court may from time to time refer to any such Board.

Separate Boards of Reference may be appointed where deemed necessary or advisable for different localities.

Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) representatives, one representative to be nominated by each party.

Save as herein provided, the provisions of regulation 92 shall apply.

21.—No Discrimination.

No employer shall, in the employment or dismissal of his workers, discriminate in any way against the members of the Union, nor shall they, in the conduct of their business, do anything with a view to directly or indirectly injuring the Union.

22.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transferee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transferee the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be the service of the worker with the transferee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness or injury to the worker but only to the extent of 15 working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any Award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

- (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after the 26th June, 1950.

(ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946.

(iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate Union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct, the amount of leave shall be—
- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2)

hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;

- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between employer and the worker.

(f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave; and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In the case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the

amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the 1st day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment, and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 1st day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion, is viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

I certify pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
