ILL.S.1 Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1904-1960, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Borden: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of land, containing approximately 21 acres, known as Borden Lot No. 48 to be a Reserve for Natives (reserve

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1960, that the Governor may by Proclamation (inter alia) declare any Crown lands to be reserves for natives and may abolish a reserve; and whereas it now appears to me desirable and expedient that a reserve for natives at Narrogin should be substituted for an existing reserve thereat: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby-

- (a) declare reserve No. 25301, being Narrogin Lot 1548, to be a reserve for natives; and
- (b) abolish the reserve for natives being reserve No. 23636 declared and more particularly described and defined in a Proclama-tion issued under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of March, 1953.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1960, it is, inter alia, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose

Companies Act, 1943-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1960 (in this Order called "the Act"), that no company shall be registered by a name which inter alia contains the word "bank" or a word of like import, except in the case of a company which carries on the business of banking as its sole business; and whereas it is provided, in proviso (b) to subsection (7) of that section, that where a company formed or incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI applies has (after complying with the requirements of Part XI under its original name) changed, in the country of its incorporation, its name to a name which includes any word or words prohibited, either generally or in the circumstances of the particular case, by this Division, the Governor, if of opinion that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to refuse to allow the new name to be entered in the register in place of the former name, may authorise the Registrar to enter the new name in the register and the Registrar shall enter the new name in the register accordingly; and whereas a company by the name of Lombard (Wholesale) Pty. Limited, being a company incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of the Act applies, has (after complying with the requirements of that Part under that name) changed in the country of its incorporation to the name of Lombank Finance Pty. Limited; and whereas the Registrar has refused to allow the name of Lombank Finance Pty. Limited to be entered in the register on the ground that that name contains the word "bank" or a word of like import; and whereas His Excellency the Governor is of opinion that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to refuse to allow the name of Lombank Finance Pty. Limited to be entered in the register in place of the name Lombard (Wholesale) Pty. Limited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by proviso (b) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Act, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to enter the name of Lombank Finance Pty. Limited in the register.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on or after today.

5.—Contract of Service.

(a) The time of duty shall commence at the time and place of which the worker is notified when engaged for employment and shall continue until the employment of the worker is terminated. Provided that a silo operator engaged to start work at 5 p.m. shall not be required to continue working after 11 p.m., except to finish a ship, when he may be required to continue working until 1 a.m.

- (b) A worker employed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and between the hours of 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. shall be paid at least four (4) hours at the appropriate rate, provided that—
 - (i) a silo operator engaged to start work at5 p.m. shall be paid at least six (6) hours at the appropriate rate;
 - (ii) workers working between midnight and 7 a.m. shall be paid for at least five and one half $(5\frac{1}{2})$ hours at the appropriate rate.
- (c) Workers who present themselves by direction of the employer for work after meal hours without having been discharged shall be paid as for two (2) hours at least even if they are not turned to work.
- (d) After the expiration of the minimum period of engagement, workers shall be paid for each fraction of a half hour of duty as if it were a full half hour.

6.—Wages.

- (a) Basic Wage.—£14 16s. 7d. per week.
- (b) Margin.-£7 11s. 9d. per week.
 - (i) If during the currency of this Award the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage for the metropolitan area differing in amount from that now prescribed, then the margin herein prescribed shall be deemed to be decreased or increased as the case may be to the same extent that the present basic wage is increased or decreased.
 - (ii) The total rate of wage herein prescribed is based upon a Federal Basic Wage for six capitals of £13 16s. equivalent to an hourly rate using a divisor of 30 of 9s. 2.4d. plus a margin of 2s. making a total hourly rate of 11s. 2½d. (to the nearest halfpenny). This shall be deemed to be the ordinary rate.
- (iii) Should the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission prescribe a Federal Basic Wage for six capitals differing from that detailed in subclause (ii) hereof or a margin for waterside workers at the port of Fremantle differing from 2s. per hour the hourly rate of wage of 11s. 2½d. per hour shall be increased or decreased accordingly.
- (c) Work shall be paid for at the following rates:—
 - Between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive, ordinary rate.
 - (ii) Between 5 p.m. and midnight Monday to Friday inclusive, ordinary rate and a half.
 - (iii) Between midnight and 8 a.m. Monday to to Saturday inclusive and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturday, double the ordinary rate
 - (iv) Between noon and 2 p.m. on a Saturday (silo operators only), treble ordinary rate. Provided that in no eventuality no worker other than silo operators shall be required to work after noon on Saturday and no silo operators shall be required to work after 2 p.m. on Saturday.
- (d) Work between midnight and midnight on ordinary holidays shall be paid for at double the ordinary rate.
- (e) Work between midnight on Saturday and midnight Sunday and midnight and midnight on extraordinary holidays shall be paid for at two and a half times the ordinary rate.
- (f) Dust Rate.—A dust allowance of one shilling (1s.) per hour shall be paid to all workers.
- (g) Heat Money.—When in any period 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., 5 p.m. to midnight, or midnight to 8 a.m. the temperature inside any structures (Silo, Annexe, Government Stores depot, Shell depot, Front track shed, Back track shed) exceeds 115°F, heat money of 1s. per hour shall be paid to each worker stationed therein for the period he is employed therein. This payment shall not be continued beyond the end of the period unless the temperature as aforesaid continues to exceed 115°F.

7.—Orders for Work.

- (a) The employer shall have the right at the pick up to order a worker or workers to start work at such hour as he shall direct and the worker or workers shall start at such hour.
- (b) At the completion of work, the employer may order the worker or workers to resume duty at some subsequent time or to the next pick up for a subsequent engagement provided that such subsequent engagement shall not be on the same day.
- (c) The employer shall have the right at any time to require the worker or workers between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. to work reasonable overtime and the worker or workers when required shall work such overtime provided that a worker or workers unavailable for overtime shall notify the employer prior to the completion of the pick up. Reasonable overtime shall for a worker who has worked during the day be from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. Provided that for silo operators reasonable overtime shall be from 6 p.m. to 11 p.m.
- (d) Each worker shall work as required during the time of duty and shall transfer from job to job as directed by the employer.

8.—Working During Meal Hours.

- (a) A worker who is required to continue working during any meal hour shall be paid at the rate appropriate to the hours of work plus the rate applying between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on an ordinary day for each such meal hour or portion thereof worked, and such rate shall continue until the worker is discharged or has been allowed a full hour for a meal, any portion of a half hour worked being counted as a half hour.
- (b) A worker, of his own free will, working with the concurrence of the employer through a meal hour, shall not be entitled to meal hour rates, but shall be paid at the appropriate rate for the time so worked with a minimum payment of one (1) hour.

9.-Meal Hours.

The hours for meals shall be:— Breakfast.—7 a.m. to 8 a.m. Dinner.—Noon to 1 p.m. Tea.—5 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Provided that where work commences at or during a meal hour, that meal hour shall not be observed.

10.-Holidays.

The holidays shall be:-

- (a) Extraordinary Holidays.—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Picnic Day and Sundays.
- (b) Ordinary Holidays.—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Easter Monday, State Foundation Day, Boxing Day.
- (c) Picnic Day shall be observed on a day to be mutually agreed between the parties.

11.—Smoke-Oh.

The following smoke-ohs shall be allowed and shall be counted as time of duty without loss of pay:—

- (a) For work between midnight and 8.0 a.m.:— 3.0 a.m. to 3.30 a.m.
- (b) For work between 8.0 a.m. and 5.0 p.m.:— 10.0 a.m. to 10.15 a.m. and 3.0 p.m. to 3.15 p.m.
- (c) For work between 5 p.m. and midnight:
 - (i) When men commence or resume work at 6 p.m.—

8 p.m. to 8.15 p.m. and 10 p.m. to 10.15 p.m.

- (ii) When men commence or resume work after 6 p.m., smoke-ohs shall be taken at not more than two hours after the commencement or resumption of work and every two hours thereafter.
- (iii) When some men commence or resume work at 5 p.m. and continue working till 7 p.m. smoke-ohs for all men shall be from 7 p.m. to 7.15 p.m. and from 9 p.m. to 9.15 p.m.

- (d) For work during smoke-ohs double the appropriate rate shall be paid for the time actually worked.
- (e) The employer may advance or postpone a smoke-oh by not more than 30 minutes where work is not possible because of breakdown, shunting, rain or other circumstances beyond the employer's control. In such case the employer shall give five (5) minutes' notice of the time smoke-oh shall commence.
- (f) The employer shall indicate by an audible signal the commencing and finishing times of smoke-ohs, and shall give a warning signal three minutes prior to the finishing time of smoke-oh when workers shall commence returning to duty. A worker shall not leave the place where he is working prior to the time fixed for the commencement of the smoke-oh.

12.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Each worker shall for every thirteen (13) days qualifying service as defined in subclause (c) hereof be credited with one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ day's annual leave and to the extent of such leave so credited shall be entitled to annual leave accumulated on the foregoing basis. Provided that:
 - Leave shall be taken at some time suitable both to employer and employee.
 - (ii) If after dividing the total number of days of qualifying service by thirteen (13) odd days less than thirteen (13) remain one half (½) day's leave shall be credited in respect thereof.
 - (iii) The maximum leave which shall be credited in respect of each twelve-monthly period as reckoned from the date of first engagement of the worker shall be twenty (20) half days.
- (b) On leave becoming due to a worker the employer shall pay to him holiday pay calculated on the basis of four (4) hours at the minimum ordinary working rate of wage applicable at the date of taking the leave for each half day's leave up to the maximum of twenty (20) half days.
- (c) Qualifying service shall be calculated as follows:—
 - (1) One day shall be credited to each worker for each day between midnight Sunday and midnight Friday on which he works or performs some work. Provided that no credit shall be given to a worker who:—
 - (i) is dismissed for misconduct; or
 - (ii) unlawfully terminates his employment; or
 - (iii) fails without reasonable cause to commence or resume work as ordered.
 - (2) One day shall be credited to each worker for each day (excluding Saturdays and Sundays) up to a maximum of fourteen (14) days in each year on which he is not available for work owing to personal sickness or accident at work or otherwise reasonable proof of which shall be furnished to the employer.
 - (3) One day shall be credited to each worker for each day he is absent from work on annual leave paid for under subclause (b) hereof.
- (d) If a worker desires to leave the industry he may require payment for annual leave in respect of days of qualifying service standing to his credit. Provided that:—
 - (i) payment shall be made at the minimum ordinary working rate of wage applicable at the time of taking the leave on the basis of four (4) hours pay for each completed period of thirteen (13) days of qualifying service;
 - (ii) if such a worker returns to the industry within one month no qualifying service shall be credited to him for a further period of one month.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained herein should any worker as a result of collective or concerted action refuse for not less than twenty four hours to offer for or accept engagement all credits of qualifying service which have accrued in respect of the current twelve-monthly period shall be forthwith cancelled.

Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) Each worker shall for every twenty six (26) days qualifying service as defined in subclause (c) of Clause 12—Annual Leave be credited with four (4) hours sick leave to a maximum of 40 hours in each year as reckoned from the date of first engagement of the worker and such leave shall accumulate from year to year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues. To the extent of such leave so credited he shall except as hereinafter prescribed be entitled to payment at the minimum ordinary rate for absence caused by personal illness or injury.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to payment in respect of any period:—
 - (i) in respect of which he is entitled to payment from some other employer;
 - (ii) for which he is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act;
 - (iii) where absence is due to illness or injury caused by his own wilful default;
 - (iv) where the absence from duty has not been preceded by a period of ten (10) ordinary working days during which the employee has unless lawfully absent from the industry not worked or made himself available for work;
 - (v) in respect of which he fails to furnish a medical certificate showing that the worker has been unable on account of illness or injury to attend the pick up.
- (c) A worker who is a member of the "circle" and unable to attend the pick up because of personal illness or injury shall within twenty four hours notify the employer (or cause notification to be sent proof of which shall lie on him) that he is unable to attend, the nature of such illness or injury, and the probable duration of incapacity to attend the pick up. If the probable duration is for three days or more the worker shall forward or cause to be forwarded a medical certificate showing that the worker is incapacitated and the probable duration of incapacity.

14.—Payment for Public Holidays.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of this clause each worker who has worked or been engaged either on the working day before or the working day after a public holiday shall be entitled to be paid six (6) hours at the minimum ordinary hourly rate applicable at the date of the holiday for each of the public holidays (excluding Sundays) set out in Clause 10—Holidays.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday who:—
 - (i) has failed without reasonable excuse to offer for or accept employment; or
 - (ii) has failed without reasonable excuse to commence, continue or complete an engagement for employment without the consent of the employer; or
 - (iii) has been dismissed for misconduct; or
 - (iv) is on leave or absent from the industry.

15.—Meal Money.

Meal money of six shillings (6s.) shall be paid to the worker who is—

- (a) ordered prior to 5 p.m. to continue duty at 6 p.m. on the same day;
- (b) ordered to continue working after 1 p.m. on Sundays or holidays;
- (c) ordered to continue working after 6 p.m. on Sundays or holidays.

16.-Pick Up.

The normal time of pick up shall be from 7.45 a.m. to 9.45 a.m. daily excluding Saturdays, Sundays and Award holidays outside the Amenities Room, or other place mutually agreed upon.

17.—Inspections.

Any officer or other person authorised by the Union may, on any day for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of this Award and after giving notice to the employer or his agent, enter any premises on which the operations covered by this Award are being carried on, inspect such operations and speak to the workers, provided that such inspection shall not in any way be exercised so as to cause any delay in such operations.

18.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be made up to 5 p.m. on Wednesdays and shall be paid in cash on Friday in each week within fifteen (15) minutes of the time for finishing work. Provided that when the engagement of the worker is terminated for misconduct, negligence, unsatisfactory work, etc., all wages and holiday pay due shall be paid within fifteen (15) minutes of the termination of the engagement or if the termination of the engagement takes place outside recognised banking hours within one (1) hour of the bank re-ovening.

19.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman agreed upon between the parties or failing agreement to be appointed by the Court, and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) There shall be assigned to the Board the functions of:—
 - (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them.
 - (ii) The fixing of allowances to be paid in respect to dusty conditions, dirty work and/or other disabilities which differ from normal and which may require to be fixed from time to time.
 - (iii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

20.—First Aid.

An adequate first aid kit shall be provided and maintained by the employer and shall be accessible at all times.

21.—Existing Provisions.

This Award shall have force irrespective of any customs, agreement, or usages to the contrary and any such customs, agreements, or usages are hereby to the extent to which they are inconsistent with this Award declared to be inoperative.

22.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, who are in the opinion of the employer capable of performing the work required. Provided that no preference shall be given to men who have previously been dismissed for misconduct or unsatisfactory work.

23.--Circle.

Members of the Circle shall, unless lawfully absent from the industry, attend the pick up regularly from day to day and shall accept employment as offered by the employer. The employer shall subject to Clause 22 pick up members of the Circle to the extent that work is available on that day.

24.—Definitions.

"Circle" means those workers who agree to attend the pick up day by day and whom the employer agrees to pick up in preference to other casual labour.

"Ordinary working day" means Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday unless a holiday is observed on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday when such day shall be a

"Silo Operator" means a worker operating the machinery underneath or on top of the silo or the weighbridge.

25.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions of General Order No. 55 of 1958, except for the deletion of sub-clause 4 of Clause (f) shall apply to members of the Circle.

Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, of Western Australia, this 20th day of April, 1961, between The Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) hereinafter referred to as the Agreeinties of the open part and ferred to as the Association of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties have agreed that this Agreement known as the "Public Service Allowances Agreement, 1961", shall, and hereby does, supersede and replace the Agreement dated the 12th October, 1955, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th October, 1955, and shall continue in operation in accordance with the provisions of Clause 24 hereof.

1.-Area and Scope.

3.—Interpretations.

In this Agreement, the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the meaning hereby respectively applied to them, namely:

"Margin over the basic rate" means the grade on which an officer is being paid in accordance with the "Public Service Salaries Agreement, 1959" between the said parties hereto and any amendments thereto, or any new agreements made in substitution thereof.

"Metropolitan Area" means that area within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the Perth Railway Station.

"South-West Land Division" means the South-West Division as defined by section 28 of the Land Act, 1933-1953, and as depicted in the Appendix A hereto, excluding the area contained within the metropolitan area.

"Other areas" means the State of Western Australia, excluding the metropolitan area and the South-West Land Division.

"Public Service holidays" means the days mentioned in section 57 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1956, and any other days which the Governor may appoint as public service holidays under the said Act.

"Grace days" means holidays other than public service holidays granted by a permanent head, with the approval of the Commissioner, to some or all of his staff between Christmas and New Year.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed on Saturdays, Sundays and public service holidays other than grace days or before or after customary working hours on week days, when carried out by direction of the permanent head and with the approval of the Commissioner, shall be classed as overtime.

Where the Commissioner's prior approval has not been obtained the officer concerned shall have the right of appeal to the Commissioner if a claim for overtime is refused.

(b) (i) When overtime is paid for, payment shall be made at the rate per hour ascertained by applying the following formulae:—

Public Service Holidays.

Payment for all work performed on a public service holiday other than a grace day shall be computed on the basis of ordinary time and shall be paid in addition to the day's pay which the officer would ordinarily receive in respect of such period.

- (ii) For the purpose of this subclause, "fortnightly salary" shall not include any district allowance, personal allowance, qualifications allowance, efficiency allowance and or allowances for staff work or for performing special duties unless otherwise approved by the Commissioner.
- (c) Payment for overtime on the basis specified in subclause (b) shall only apply to an officer whose margin over the basic rate does not exceed the maximum margin prescribed for Class 7 in Schedule A of the "Public Service Salaries Agreement, 1959" and any amendments thereto; provided that time off in lieu thereof shall be granted where an officer so elects in writing before commencing to work such overtime. When time off is taken in lieu of payment as provided herein, the same formulae shall apply.
- (d) An officer whose margin over the basic rate exceeds the maximum margin prescribed for Class 7 shall be allowed equivalent time off, such time off to be taken at the convenience of the Department, provided that the Commissioner may approve of payment in special circumstances.
- (e) An officer whose normal duties are not subject to close supervision by a senior officer or whose hours of duty are not defined, shall not be entitled to claim overtime as provided for in this clause, except with the approval of the Commissioner.
- (f) No claim for payment or time off shall be allowed in respect of any day on which the additional time worked amounts to less than 30 minutes.
- (g) A break of at least 30 minutes must be made for meals between 12 noon and 2 p.m. when overtime is worked on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday, and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on any week day on which overtime is worked. Such breaks shall not be recognised as overtime.

- (h) An officer who, in an emergency and without prior notification or warning, is required to return to duty after normal working hours or on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday, shall receive overtime payment or time off in lieu thereof, for a minimum period of $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
- (i) When by direction, an officer is required to work overtime at a place other than his usual headquarters and the time spent in travelling by public transport to and from the place where overtime is to be worked is in excess of the time normally spent in travelling to and from his usual headquarters, then such excess time shall be deemed to form part of the overtime worked, provided that no payment shall be made for excess travelling time of less than 30 minutes.
- (j) The amount of any commuted allowance to cover overtime shall not be approved without prior discussions between the Commissioner and the Association.

5.-Meal Expenditure.

- (a) An officer required to work before or after normal working hours on any week day, shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from the usual place of residence, be reimbursed at the rate of 7s. 6d. for each meal purchased, providing that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled under the preceding clause.
- (b) An officer required to work on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from the usual place of residence, be reimbursed at the rate of 7s. 6d. for each meal purchased providing that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled under the preceding clause.

6.—Travelling Expenses. Intra-State.

- (a) If an officer travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside a radius of 15 miles measured from his headquarters, and is necessarily absent from his headquarters overnight, he shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to either Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day the allowance shall represent in equal proportions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purposes of computing expenses in respect of arrival at or departure from an officer's headquarters, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later or departure earlier than 8 a.m., lunch if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m., dinner if arrival is later or departure earlier than 6 p.m., and bed if arrival is later than 11 p.m.: Provided that—
 - (i) an officer who travels on official business which does not involve an absence from headquarters overnight, shall only be paid at the rates stated adjacent to Item 4, in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, subject to the officer's certification that each meal claimed for was actually purchased;
 - (ii) the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 in the schedule hereto, shall apply to all officers who travel on official business in the company of an officer ordinarily entitled to such rate, if the lastmentioned officer certifies accordingly;
 - (iii) an officer who travels officially with a Minister of the Crown shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent either to Item 1 or 4 in the schedule hereto as the case may require, for expenses necessarily incurred whilst travelling in the company of the Minister;
 - (iv) when an officer travels by railway and is provided with a sleeping berth, one-fourth deduction shall be made from the daily rate, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night and a certificate to that effect is supplied by the officer when lodging his claim;

- (v) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to fifteen per cent. of the passage money calculated on the single fare or one third of the appropriate rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, whichever is the greater; and
- (vi) an officer who, when travelling on official business, stays at any government institu-tion or travels in a ministerial railway coach free of charge, shall only be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 5 in the schedule hereto, for the period spent at such institution or on such coach.
- (b) The daily rates of reimbursement prescribed by subclause (a) shall be increased by an amount stated adjacent to Item 3 in the schedule hereto when an officer travels on land or by air north of the 26th degree of south latitude, including Shark Bav.
- (c) (i) An officer with headquarters located outside the metropolitan area who travels to Perth on official business and, as a result, is required to stay at a city hotel over one or more nights, shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 6 in the schedule hereto for expenses necessarily incurred in respect of such city hotel accommodation.
- If such country officer does not stay at a city hotel or is not absent from his headquarters overnight, any expenses necessarily incurred in respect of his travel to Perth shall be reimbursed at the appropriate rate prescribed by subclause (a).
- (ii) For the purpose of this subclause a city hotel is any hotel included in the area bounded by Wellington Street in the north, the Swan River in the east and the south and George Street in the west.
- (d) An officer stationed in the metropolitan area who is relieving at or temporarily transferred to any place within that area shall not be reimbursed the cost of mid-day meals purchased, but an officer travelling on duty within the metropolitan area which requires his absence from his headquarters over the usual mid-day meal period shall be paid at the rate set out adjacent to Item 7 in the schedule hereto for each meal necessarily purchased, provided that-
 - (i) such travelling is not within the suburb in which the officer resides; and
 - (ii) an officer's total reimbursement under this subclause for any one pay period shall not exceed the amount set out adjacent to Item 8 in the schedule hereto.

Inter-State.

- (e) An officer who travels on official business beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Items 9 or 10 in the schedule hereto as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day the allowance shall be computed in accordance with subclause (a) hereof: Provided that-
 - (i) when an officer travels by railway between Perth and Adelaide and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to 15 per cent. of the single fare of such journey;
 - (ii) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses for the time spent at sea or on board vessel shall be at a rate equal to either 15 per cent. of the passage money calculated on single fare or one third of the appropriate rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto whichever is the greater;
 - (iii) an officer shall be reimbursed at the rate stated adjacent to Item 9 and 10 in the schedule hereto as the case may require for any period spent in travelling by aircraft to and from Perth or in travelling by aircraft or railway between other States.

General.

(f) If on account of lack of suitable regular transport facilities an officer necessarily engages lodgings in Perth or other place in which his head-

- quarters are situated, for the night prior to commencing travelling in order to travel by an early morning transport, he shall be reimbursed the reasonable cost of such lodging in addition to such other reimbursements authorised by this clause.
- (g) An officer who travels on official business shall be allowed first class fares and in addition to any reimbursement of expenses at the appropriate rate prescribed by this clause, shall be reimbursed reasonable incidental expenses such as tram, bus and motor fares, if, in the opinion of the permanent head, such expenses were warranted.
- (h) Reimbursement of expenses at the rates prescribed by this clause shall not be suspended should an officer become ill whilst travelling, provided leave for the period of such illness is approved in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Regulations.
- (i) Where it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner by the production of receipts or other evidence that reimbursement at the rates prescribed in this clause would be sufficient to meet an officer's reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, he shall be paid the difference fully to reimburse him.
- (j) Reimbursement of travelling expenses for a period exceeding 14 days in any one month shall not be passed for payment to any officer by a certifying officer until the endorsement of the permanent head has been obtained on the account.
- (k) In all cases where commuted amounts for reimbursement of travelling expenses and cost of conveyance are in operation at the date of the coming into force of this Agreement, such commuted amounts shall continue to obtain, but may be subject to review by the Commissioner at any time.
- (1) The headquarters of an officer engaged on more than one work shall be considered to be the place in which the principal work is carried out, as defined by the permanent head.
- (m) An officer shall use State-owned transport unless otherwise approved by the permanent head.
- (n) Whenever an officer does not travel by Stateowned transport as per subclause (m) he shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for payment. Receipts shall not be required for any amounts under 5s., but in lieu thereof a certificate on the account form must be made as follows:

I certify that the sum of..... been actually expended by me on public service.

- (o) No officer shall engage other vehicles when there are public conveyances available when re-
- (p) When circumstances necessitate the hire of a motor car or other special means of transit, a special report shall accompany the account.
- (q) Unless specially authorised by the permanent head, taxi fares will not be allowed when the distance can be traversed by the ordinary modes of conveyance by rail, tram, omnibus or other means of public transport.

7.—Travelling Time.

An officer who, in the course of his duties, is called upon to travel after the usual time for ceasing duty may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be granted time off in respect of such time or part of such time spent in travelling.

8.—Transfer Expenses.

Intra-State

- (a) Except as provided in subclause (f) a married or single officer who is transferred to a new locality:—
 - (i) in the public interest, or
 - (ii) in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer, or
 - (iii) on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control,

shall, in addition to payment of any district allowance, be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for a period of fourteen days after arrival at his new headquarters: Provided that, if an officer is required to travel on official business during the said period of fourteen days, such period shall be extended by the time spent in travelling. Under no circumstances, however, shall the provisions of this subclause operate concurrently with those of clause 6 so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and transfer expenses for one and the same period.

- (b) If a married officer is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation for the transfer of his home within the period of fourteen days referred to in subclause (a), and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the fourteen days, be reimbursed at the rate stated adjacent to Item 3 in the schedule hereto, until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy-seven days (77) without the approval of the Commissioner. A single officer shall not be paid allowances under this subclause.
- (c) The rates of reimbursement prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 4 in the schedule hereto, when an officer is transferred north of the 26th degree of south latitude including Shark Bay.

Inter-State.

- (d) Except as provided in subclause (f) a married or single officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, shall, subject to the relevant provisions of subclause (a), be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Items 5 or 6 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for a period of twenty-one days after arrival at his new headquarters.
- (e) If a married officer who is transferred to a capital city beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth, is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation within the period of twenty-one days referred to in subclause (d) and the permanent head is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation, such officer shall, after the expiration of the twenty-one days, be reimbursed at the rate stated adjacent to Item 7 in the schedule hereto, until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy (70) days without the approval of the Commissioner. A single officer shall not be paid allowances under this subclause.

General.

(f) An officer who is transferred to departmental accommodation shall not be entitled to reimbursement under this clause. However, if such an officer is put to additional expense on transfer through circumstances beyond his control, he may receive rembursement as determined by the Commissioner.

- (g) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred by an officer on transfer, an appropriate rate of reimbursement may be determined by the Commissioner.
- (h) The provisions of clause 6, subclauses (l) to (q) inclusive, shall have equal application to this clause.

9.—Removal Expenses.

- (a) When a married officer is transferred—
 - (i) in the public interest; or
 - (ii) in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer; or
- (iii) on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control—
- -such an officer shall be reimbursed-
 - (i) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of such officer and his wife and children under 16 years of age or other children wholly dependent on him; and
 - (ii) subject to the limitations defined in subclause (d) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of his furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transsit; and
 - (iii) an allowance of £20 for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture and effects provided that the permanent head is satisfied that the value of household furniture moved by the officer is at least £200. This allowance shall not be payable in respect of the removal of the furniture and effects of a new appointee at the time of his first commencing duty.

In the case of a single officer, an application for any reimbursement under this clause may be considered by the Commissioner on the recommendation of the permanent head.

- (b) An officer who is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request, or by exchange (except as provided for in subclause (a)), must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the Commissioner.
- (c) When an officer is transferred on account of misconduct, the cost must be borne by the officer in fault, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner prior to removal.
- (d) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of furniture, including insurance whilst in transit, shall be one hundred pounds (£100) unless a higher sum is approved by the Commissioner in any special case: Provided that only necessary household furniture and effects shall be taken into consideration.
- (e) In providing for the cost of removal, an officer's motor vehicle may be taken into consideration, reimbursement in respect of which shall be as determined by the Commissioner.
- (f) Furniture and effects, where practicable, shall be removed by State-owned transport.
- (g) Before removal is undertaken, the officer shall, where practicable, obtain quotes from at least two carriers which shall be submitted to the permanent head, who may authorise the acceptance of the more suitable, provided that the maximum

amount prescribed by subclause (d) is not exceeded without the written approval of the Commissioner having first been obtained.

- (h) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.
- (i) The permanent head may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (d) to compensate for loss in any case where an officer with the prior approval of the permanent head, disposes of his furniture and effects instead of removing them to his new headquarters: Provided that such payment would not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture and effects had been removed by the cheapest method of transport available.

10.-Relieving Allowances.

Intra-State.

- (a) A married or single officer who is required to take up duty away from his usual headquarters to relieve another officer or to perform special duty, and necessarily lodges or resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence, shall, except where otherwise provided, be paid, in addition to any district allowance, at the rate stated adjacent to either Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, up to a maximum period of twenty-one days after arrival at the new locality.
- (b) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds twenty-one days, a married officer shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 3 and a single officer at the rate stated adjacent to Item 4 in the schedule hereto for the period of relief or special duty in excess of twenty-one days: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy (70) days without the approval of the Commissioner.
- (c) The allowances prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 5 in the schedule hereto, when an officer is required to relieve or perform special duty north of the 26th degree of south latitude, including Shark Bay.
- (d) If an officer, whose normal duties do not involve camp accommodation, is required to relieve or perform special duty resulting in a stay at a camp, he shall be paid camp allowance in accordance with the provisions of Clause 11, for the duration of the period spent in camp, and, in addition, shall be paid a lump sum of ten pounds (£10) to cover incidental personal expenses: Provided that an officer shall receive no more than one lump sum grant of £10 in any one period of three years.
- (e) When an officer who is required to relieve or perform special duties away from his usual head-quarters is permitted by the permanent head to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle, he shall be reimbursed the cost of petrol and oil for the return journey: Provided that the maximum amount of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed the cost of the first class rail fare for such return journey.

Inter-State.

- (f) A married or single officer who is required to relieve another or perform special duty outside the limits of the State, but within the Commonwealth, shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to either Item 6 or 7 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, up to a maximum of twenty-one days after arrival at the new locality.
- (g) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds twenty-one days, a married officer shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 8 and a single officer at the rate stated adjacent to Item 9 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for the period of relief or special duty in excess of twenty-one days: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy (70) days without the approval of the Commissioner.

General.

(h) The rate applicable to a married officer under subclauses (b) and (g) shall be paid to a single officer if the Commissioner is satisfied that the

- officer has to maintain a home and support dependent relatives therein, in a locality other than that to which he has been sent. A certificate to this effect must be furnished by a single officer claiming the higher rate.
- (i) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred, an appropriate rate of reimbursement may be determined by the Commissioner.
- (j) The provisions of clause 6 shall not operate concurrently with the provisions of this clause so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and relieving expenses for the one and the same period; however, the provisions of subclauses (1) to (q) of clause 6 shall have equal application to this clause.

11.—Camp Allowance.

- (a) An officer who, in accordance with his duty, is stationed in a fixed camp provided by a Department, shall be paid an allowance at the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for the period spent in such camp: Provided that no such allowance shall be paid when an officer occupies a departmental house within or near the precincts of a camp.
- (b) For the purpose of this clause a fixed camp may be deemed to be a camp of a permanent nature where living facilities and amenities of a good standard are provided.
- (c) An officer, who, in accordance with his duty, is stationed in a camp provided by a Department (other than a fixed camp) or is required to camp out, shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 3 or 4 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require.
- (d) If an officer is authorised by the permanent head to stay at an hotel or lodging house in lieu of camping out, he shall be paid at the appropriate rate prescribed by clause 6 for such period concerned.
- (e) The rates prescribed by subclauses (a) and (c) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 5 in the schedule when a cook is not provided in a camp, and shall be increased by an amount stated adjacent to Item 6 in the schedule when a camp is located north of the 26th degree of south latitude including Shark Bay.
- (f) The rates prescribed by subclauses (a) and (c) shall be reduced by the amount stated adjacent to Item 7 in the schedule when a fitted caravan is provided.
- (g) Payment of the rates prescribed by subclauses (a) and (c) shall be made on the basis of a seven day week and no deduction shall be made when an officer does not spend the whole or part of his week-end in camp; Provided that payment for any broken portion of a week shall be based

- on the appropriate daily rate for the number of days actually spent in camp and payment for any portion of a day shall be computed in accordance with clause 6 (a).
- (h) A single officer who supplies satisfactory proof that he is the main support of those who are related to him and reside in the State, may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be considered a married officer for the purpose of this clause.
- (i) This clause shall be read in conjunction with clauses 6, 8 and 10 for the purposes of payment of allowances and payment of camp allowance shall not be made for any period in respect of which travelling, transfer or relieving expenses are reimbursed.

12.—Boat Allowances.

- (a) An officer who, in accordance with his duty, is required to live aboard a departmental vessel, shall be paid an allowance at the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for the period he is required to live on board such vessel.
- (b) The rate prescribed by subclause (a) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 3 in the schedule when a cook is not provided on board a vessel, and shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 4 in the schedule when the vessel is operating north of the 26th degree of south latitude including Shark Bay.
- (c) A single officer who supplies satisfactory proof that he is the main support of those who are related to him and reside in the State, may with the approval of the Commissioner, be considered a married officer for the purpose of this clause.
- (d) Payment of the rates prescribed in subclauses (a) and (b) shall be made on the basis of a seven day week provided that payment for any broken portion of a week shall be based on the appropriate daily rate for the number of days an officer actually lives on board a vessel and payment for any portion of a day shall be computed in accordance with Clause 6 (a).
- (e) Payment of allowances under this clause shall not be made for any period in respect of which travelling, camp, transfer or relieving expenses are reimbursed.

13.—District Allowance.

- (a) A married officer shall be paid district allowance at the standard rate prescribed in Column II of the schedule to this clause, for the district in which his headquarters are located: Provided that a married officer whose headquarters are situated in a town or place specified in Column III of the schedule hereto shall be paid district allowance at the appropriate rate stated in Column IV of the said schedule.
- (b) A single officer shall be paid district allowance at a rate equal to one-half of the appropriate rate prescribed by subclause (a) for a married officer whose headquarters are situated in the same district, town or place: Provided that a single officer who supplies satisfactory proof that he is the main support of those who are related to him and who reside in the State, may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be considered a married officer for the purpose of this clause.

- (c) When an officer is on approved recreation leave he shall, for the period of such leave, be paid the district allowance to which he would ordinarily be entitled.
- (d) When an officer is on long service leave or other approved leave with pay (except recreation leave) he shall only be paid district allowance for the period of such leave if his family or dependants remain in the district in which his headquarers are situated.
- (e) If an officer leaves his district on duty, payment of district allowance shall cease after the expiration of two weeks unless otherwise approved by the Commissioner.
- (f) Except as provided in subclause (e), district allowance shall be paid in addition to reimbursement of any travelling expenses or camp allowance.

(b) Single Officers.—Half the appropriate rate as prescribed in (a) above for married officers.

For the purpose of this schedule the boundaries of the various districts shall be as described hereunder and as depicted in the Appendix B of this Agreement:—

- 1. The area within a line commencing on coast; thence east along lat. 28 to a point north of Tallering Peak; thence due south to Tallering Peak; thence south-east to Mt. Gibson and Burracoppin; thence to a point south-east at the junction of lat. 32 and long. 119; thence south along long. 119 to coast.

14.—Child Allowance.

- (a) An officer whose permanent headquarters are located north of the 26th degree of south latitude including Shark Bay, shall be paid an allowance at the rate of £50 per annum in respect of each one of his children of school age who is resident in the north: Provided that the total reimbursement per family unit under this clause shall not exceed £200 per annum.
- (b) An allowance under this clause shall continue to be paid to an officer when he is absent from his headquarters on long service leave, annual leave or other leave as approved by the Commissioner.

15.—Payment of Hire for Use of Officer's Own Vehicle.

- (a) An officer who is required to maintain a motor car or motor cycle for use when travelling on official business and who is not in receipt of a commuted amount in which the whole or portion of the cost of locomotion is included, shall, for journeys approved by the permanent head, be paid hire for such vehicle to cover all expenses in connection therewith, in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto.
- (b) The Commissioner may authorise a commuted amount for the hire of motor vehicles, bicycles or any other conveyance belonging to an officer.
- (c) Where an officer in the course of a journey travels through two or more of the separate areas, payment of hire at the rates prescribed by subclause (a) shall be made at the appropriate rate applicable to each of the separate areas traversed.
- (d) The Commissioner may increase the rates prescribed by this clause in any case in which he is satisfied that they are inadequate.
- (e) A year for the purpose of this clause shall commence on the first day of July and end on the $30{\rm th}$ day of June next following.

- (1) Been granted a subsidy and one or more free of interest loans and who has travelled 80,000 miles on official business since the date the last subsidy was granted and who is not indebted to the Government in respect of such loan or loans.
- (2) Been granted one or more free of interest loans but no subsidy and who is not indebted to the Government in respect of such loan or loans.

16.—Higher Duties Allowance.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, an officer, other than one classified as a Relieving Officer, who acts in a position classified higher than his own, shall with the approval of the Commissioner, be paid higher duties allowance on the basis defined in subclause (c) for the whole period he acts in such higher position: Provided that—
 - (i) he performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibility of the higher position for a continuous period of two weeks or more; and
 - (ii) he acts in the higher position for reasons other than the absence of the classified occupant thereof on normal annual leave.
- (b) For the purpose of this clause the expression "normal annual leave" shall mean the annual period of recreation leave as referred to in Public

Service Regulation 52 and shall include any public service holidays taken in conjunction with such annual recreation leave.

- (c) An officer who acts in a higher position under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the following basis—
 - (i) when acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which exceeds his own margin over the basic rate—an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over the basic rate and the minimum classified margin of the position in which he is acting; or
 - (ii) when acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which does not exceed his own margin over the basic rate—an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over the basic rate and the margin he would receive if he were permanently appointed to the position in which he is acting.
- (d) Where, because of departmental necessity the full duties and responsibilities of a higher position are temporarily performed by two or more subordinate officers, such officers shall be paid allowances as determined by the Commissioner, subject to the provisions of subclause (a).
- (e) No officer under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to relieve or act in a position classified higher than his own without the prior approval of the Commissioner.
- (f) A female officer under the age of 21 years who is permitted to relieve or act in a position classified higher than her own shall be paid an allowance as determined by the Commissioner.
- (g) An allowance under this clause shall not be payable to a female officer when acting in a male position classified within the male clerical automatic range
- (h) A female officer who acts in a male position classified above the male clerical automatic range under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis of the female basic rate plus the female margin relative to the position in which she is acting.
- (i) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position one class higher than his own for a continuous period exceeding four weeks and during such period performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibilities of such higher position, he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis set out in subclause (c) for the period in excess of four weeks.
- (j) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position classified two or more classes higher than his own under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis prescribed in subclause (c).
- (k) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall, if he acts in a higher position continuously for a sufficiently long enough period, be entitled to receive an increased higher duties allowance equivalent to the annual increment he would have received had he been permanently appointed to such higher position for the whole time he has been acting therein: Provided that in the case of a Relieving Officer acting or relieving in a position only one class higher than his own, the first four weeks of service in the higher position shall not be taken into account.
- (1) An officer who has received an increased higher duties allowance in accordance with the preceding subclause and is required to further act in the same higher position within a period of twelve months from the date he last acted in that position, shall receive an allowance at the rate received when last acting in that position.
- (m) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall continue to receive such allowance during his absence on normal annual leave or whilst absent on approved sick leave for a period of less than two weeks' duration, provided that he had qualified for payment of the

allowance by serving the required continuous period before proceeding on such leave and provided further that he resumes after such leave in the position in respect of which he was paid higher duties allowance.

- (n) If an officer who is acting in a higher position proceeds on—
 - (i) any period of long service leave;
 - (ii) a period of recreation leave in excess of the normal annual leave period;
 - (iii) a period of sick leave or military leave of two weeks' duration or more; or
 - (iv) a period of normal annual leave preceded or followed by a period of sick leave, long service leave or leave without pay—

he shall not be entitled to receive payment of an allowance under this clause for the whole or any part of the period of such leave and the continuity of his acting service in the higher position shall be deemed to be broken by his proceeding on such leave.

17.—Allowance to Officers Paying Wages.

- (a) An officer away from his headquarters, other than one whose classified duties include the payment of wages, shall, when paying wages outside the metropolitan area or at construction works within the metropolitan area, or at such other works as may be approved by the Commissioner, be paid an allowance of 5s. per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in recognition of the added responsibilities: Provided that—
 - (i) the allowance shall not exceed 10s. in any one week:
 - (ii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer when in receipt of higher duties allowance for relieving or acting in a position, the classified duties of which include the payment of wages; and
 - (iii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer whose margin over the basic rate exceeds the maximum prescribed for Class 3 in Schedule A of the "Public Service Salaries Agreement, 1959", between the same parties hereto and any amendments thereto, or any new agreements made in substitution thereof.
- (b) An officer employed in the metropolitan area, when paying wages outside that area, shall, in addition to any allowance payable in accordance with subclause (a), be paid an allowance of 5s. per day or part of any day whilst so engaged in compensation for damage to clothing and disabilities encountered.

18.—Allowance to Officers Receiving and Paying Cash.

- (a) An officer, other than one whose classified duties include receiving or paying cash or one who is in receipt of higher duties allowance under clause 16 in respect of such work, shall, when receiving or paying cash be paid an allowance at the rate of 5s. per day or 2s. 6d. per half day whilst so engaged: Provided that—
 - the officer's margin over the basic rate is not equivalent to or in excess of the minimum for the position in which he is relieving; and
 - (ii) the allowance in any one week shall not exceed the difference between the officer's weekly rate and the minimum weekly rate for the position which he is relieving.
- (b) For the purpose of this clause, half a day shall mean any period of three hours or less on any day.

19.—Board Allowance for Annual Leave.

When on annual leave, an officer who does not avail himself of the board and lodgings provided in his classification shall be granted an allowance for the period of his leave at the rate of 30s. per week.

20.—Dirty Work Allowance.

A special allowance shall be paid to an officer when engaged in any dirty work (including moving or sorting old books and documents) which is not part of the regular duty of the officer concerned and which in the opinion of the permanent head could be classed as dirty, such allowance to be assessed by the Commissioner.

21.—Protective Clothing.

In all cases where protective clothing or an allowance in lieu thereof was supplied or granted to an officer or class of officer prior to the date of the operation of this Agreement, it shall continue to be so supplied or granted.

22.—Board of Reference,

- (a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference. Such board shall consist of a chairman who shall be appointed by the Court and who shall, where possible, be an Industrial Magistrate, and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties hereto as prescribed by the regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.
- (b) On any question before the Board at any meeting the opinion of the majority shall prevail.
 - (c) The functions of the Board shall be-
 - (i) to settle, allow, determine and/or deal with any matter which the Court may from time to time refer to the Board; and
 - (ii) subject to the jurisdiction of the Court, generally to settle and/or determine any dispute or question arising out of this Agreement, except a matter involving the interpretation of any of the provisions herein or any variation in the conditions and terms hereof.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

23.—Copies of Agreement.

Every officer shall be entitled to a copy of this Agreement free of charge on application to the Commissioner.

24.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate as from and including the first day of March, 1961, and shall remain in force for a period of three years from that date, provided that either of the parties may after the 28th day of February, 1962 (or earlier in the case of the provisions of clauses 15 and 21) negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Court for an amendment to this Agreement.



Between The Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and O'Brien's Court Hotel Pty. Ltd. and Others, Respondents.

HAVING heard Mr. H. L. Johnson on behalf of the applicant and Mr. G. J. Martin on behalf of the Respondents, I, the undersigned, Conciliation Commissioner of the Court of Arbitration, in pursuance of a remission to me by the said Court in pursuance of the powers contained in section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, do hereby order and declare that the Barmaids and Barmen's Award Nod. 47 of 1949, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in terms of the attached schedule.

Schedule.

1. Clause 6—Hours.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

6.-Hours.

- (a) All work done in excess of forty (40) hours in any one week, or of eight (8) hours in any one day, or outside a daily spread of eleven (11) hours to be worked in not more than three (3) periods shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, such overtime rate to stand alone and be paid for separately and apart from the ordinary week's wages
- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award--
 - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
 - (ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- 2. Clause 7—Holidays.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

7.-Holidays.

(a) All work done on any day observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day or Boxing Day shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under Clause 12 for each day or part of a day so worked.

Provided that if as a result of the worker's own default only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day.

- (b) All work done on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time in addition to the ordinary week's wages.
- (c) On any public holiday not referred to in subclause (a) hereof, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- 3. Clause 10—Meal Times.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

10.-Meal Times.

- (a) No worker shall be required to work for more than five and a half $(5\frac{1}{2})$ hours without a break for a meal.
- (b) A worker shall be allowed one hour for a meal between the hours of twelve (12) noon and three (3) p.m. and one hour for a meal between the hours of five (5) p.m. and eight (8) p.m.

Provided that this subclause shall not apply to a worker who commences or resumes work at twelve (12) noon or later and (except in the case of a worker who is rostered to work until ten (10) p.m. or later) shall not apply to a worker who commences or resumes work at five (5) p.m. or later who shall be deemed to have had a meal between the hours referred to.

Provided further that, with the consent of the Union some other arrangement more suitable to the employer's business may be adopted.

4. Clause 11—Weekly Half Holiday.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

11.-Weekly Half Holiday.

The weekly half holiday shall commence not later than 1.30 p.m. on one week day in each week irrespective of whether there is a full day's holiday provided for under Clause 7.

Provided that if by agreement a worker works during his usual half holiday he shall be paid one (1) day's pay in addition to the ordinary weekly wage prescribed in Clause 4.

5.—These alterations will take effect as from midnight, 20th April. 1961.

Clause 8.—Wages of Time Workers.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—
