WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1959, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district, and include or remove, as the case may be, the name of a fire district or local authority in or from Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby-

(a) adjust the boundaries of the Wagin Fire District by substituting for the area of land at present comprising that fire dis-trict the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Wagin more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder;

- (b) remove the names Wagin Fire District and Municipal District of Wagin from Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act; and

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1959. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 192/61.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1959, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, unite any two or more fire districts the areas of which are contiguous into one fire district, and include the name of a local authority in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Cockburn more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Cockburn Fire District to that fire district;
- (c) unite the Cockburn Fire District and the contiguous Metropolitan Fire District into one fire district under the name of the Metropolitan Fire District; and
- (d) include the name of the local authority the Shire of Cockburn in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act by adding at the end of column two thereof the item, "Municipal District of the Shire of Cockburn."

3.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all salaried officers of the staffs of the Royal Perth, Princess Margaret, Fremantle Hospital, Perth Chest Hospital, Perth Dental Hospital, King Edward Memorial Hospital, for Women and/or any Public Hospital (as defined by the Hospitals Act, 1927-1955) whose maximum margins do not exceed £1,541, with the exception of medical officers and such other persons as are covered by other Awards and/or Agreements regis-tered under the Industrial Arbitration Act 1912tered under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952; Provided that this Award shall exclude the area or areas occupied by the Home of Peace Incorporated.

4.—Definitions.

For the purpose of the Award, unless the contrary intention appears:-

 - (ii) male or female officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared; the nearest \mathfrak{k} to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage respectively for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52-1/6th).
 - (iii) the basic rate at the date of this Award is as follows:----

(c) "Rostered Worker" means a worker for whom the ordinary hours of duty may include work on Sundays.

5.-Classification of Offices and Officers.

(a) The classification of offices and officers employed by the employer and the fixing of salaries of officers shall be vested in the employer subject to the right of appeal as provided in Clause 49 of this Award.

(b) In making a classification under this Clause the employer shall classify an officer in either the Professional, Clerical or General Section according to the class of work required to be performed and shall adhere to the salary scales provided in this Award.

(c) Reclassification of offices and officers shall take place at intervals and on the date fixed for Public Service Reclassifications.

(d) The employer shall provide an annual standard publication showing establishment, name of officers, titles of positions, and classifications, and shall provide the Association with a copy of such publication.

(e) The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay expressed in this Award is the rate payable under the provisions of subclause (a) of Clause 7 to a male Clerical Division officer at the age of twenty-seven (27) years or during the seventh year of adult service.

This rate was determined as from 1st February, 1960, at a margin of £371 per annum over the basic rate.

(f) (i) The rates of pay prescribed in this Award shall be adjusted to the same extent and concurrently with adjustments made to the relative rates payable to officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, provided that—

(ii) Any rates of pay prescribed in this Award which do not coincide with the rates payable to officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act shall be adjusted as prescribed in subclause (f) (i) to the extent of maintaining the relative margins over or percentages of the basic rate applicable to such officers at the time of this Award.

18.—Persons Temporarily Employed.

(a) Subject to the provisions of Clause 3 of this Award, a person temporarily employed in a salaried capacity, shall be paid at a rate of pay equivalent to the rate that would be payable in accordance with this Award to a permanent officer of not more than equal efficiency should he or she be engaged on similar duties.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 51 persons occupying established positions shall after serving the probationary period referred to in Clause 51 and subject to passing the necessary medical examination be deemed to be permanently employed as from the commencement of such employment unless prior to six months following such probationary period—

- (i) the parties otherwise agree; or
- (ii) the Board of Reference otherwise determines.

Provided that any dispute in respect of persons who at the date of this Award have occupied established positions for a period longer than that referred to above shall be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

19.—Annual Increments.

Except where otherwise expressly provided, employees shall, subject to good conduct, diligence and efficiency, proceed to the maximum of their respective classifications by annual increments.

20.-X-Ray Staff.

Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained within this Award X-Ray Staff who at the date of this Award were employed by any of the respondents to this Award on a 35 hour and four week annual leave basis, shall continue to be employed on such basis whilst employed by any of the Respondents to this Award.

21.—Hours of Duty.

The hours of duty for salaried officers covered by this Award shall be as follows:---

- (a) Engineers and Storekeepers.—40 hours per week to be worked on 8 hours per day Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (b) Laundry Foremen, Housekeepers, Head Orderlies, Deputy Head Orderlies and Instrument Technicians and the Splint Maker in Charge, Princess Margaret Hospital.—The hours of duty and commencing and finishing hours shall remain on the basis existing prior to this Award; that is to say, the same as that of the departmental staff under their control and supervision.
- (c) Dietitians and Food Supervisors.—40 hours per week to be worked on any five consecutive days of each week.
- (d) Casualty Clerks, Telephonists, Operating Theatre Technicians, X-Ray staff and such clerical staff as is required in this department shall work.—37½ hours per week to be worked on any five consecutive days each week or, alternatively may be rostered for such hours over any number of weeks up to and including four (4) such roster to provide for an average of 37½ hours per week, two (2) consecutive days off duty in each week. Provided that such rostering shall not apply in any X-Ray department where the 'on call' system under subclause 22 (d) applies.

- (e) For all other officers not specifically designated in subclauses (a) to (d) the ordinary hours of duty shall be thirty-seven and one half $(37\frac{1}{2})$ each week, Monday to Friday inclusive: Provided that should these officers be required by the employer in the public interest to perform essential duties on Saturday mornings between the hours of 9 a.m. and noon, then the work shall be rostered and, at the discretion of the employer, the following will apply:—
 - (i) During the week in which the Saturday morning duties are to be performed, the daily hours of duty from Monday to Friday shall be reduced to provide for the time of duty on Saturday morning between the hours of 9 a.m. and noon; or
 - (ii) payment or time off in lieu shall be granted in accordance with Clause 22.
- (f) The daily hours of duty shall include a break for a meal of not less than one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ hour and not more than one (1) hour, but such time shall not be included as part of the week's work.
- (g) (i) The spread of any shift shall not exceed ten (10) hours and shall include any meal break.
 - (ii) Spread of the shift shall mean the time which elapses between the commencement and the termination of the worker's ordinary hours of duty on any day.

22.—Overtime.

(a) Subject to subclause (g) of this clause, overtime shall mean all time worked by the direction of the employer in excess of or outside the usual hours of duty of the worker concerned.

(b) (i) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. Provided that all overtime worked between 12 midnight and 6 a.m. shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) (ii) For the purpose of assessing overtime each day shall stand alone.

(c) (i) Payment for overtime shall be computed on the rate applicable to the day on which the overtime is worked: Provided that double time, i.e., twice the ordinary rate shall be the maximum rate payable under this Award.

(ii) Except in the case of workers who come within the provisions of Clause 23, all time worked on Sunday and after 12 noon on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(d) (i) A worker who is instructed by his employer to hold himself on call during his period off duty, shall be paid such allowance as may be agreed between the employer and the association or, failing agreement, as determined by the Board of Reference.

(ii) Provided that in the event of an employee being recalled for any purpose during his off duty period he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates based on the rate applicable to the day but the worker shall not be obliged to work for two (2) hours if the work required has been completed in less time. Provided that if he is called out more than once within a period of two hours from the start of a previous call out he shall not be entitled to any further payment for time worked within that period of two hours, provided further, that a worker who is accommodated at the hospital when on call shall only be paid for time worked.

(iii) Engineers rostered on "call duty" shall at all times be available for duty outside normal working hours. Overtime shall not be paid for such call work, but the officers concerned shall be entitled to an additional two weeks' leave per annum with pay. (iv) An employee on call who is not accommodated at the hospital shall if required for duty during his off duty period—

- (a) be provided with transport to and from his home; or
- (b) be refunded the cost of such transport; or(c) be paid a vehicle allowance as provided in Clause 27 whichever is appropriate.

(e) In lieu of payment for overtime, a worker may if he so requests, be allowed time off proportionate to the payment to which he is entitled, but such time off shall be allowed where a worker so elects in writing before commencing to work the overtime.

(f) Subclauses (b) and (e) of this clause shall not apply to workers whose margin over the basic rate exceeds the maximum margin prescribed for Class 7 in Clause 6 of this Award. Subject to subclause (g) of this Clause, these workers shall—

- (i) be paid at overtime rates where they are rostered for regular overtime;
- (ii) in all other cases be allowed time off equivalent to the overtime worked, such time off to be taken at the convenience of the employer.

(g) No claim for payment or time off shall be allowed in respect of any day on which the additional time worked amounts to less than thirty (30) minutes.

(h) Time off in lieu of overtime under this clause or under clause 21 of this Award may at the convenience of the employer be allowed to accumulate, but no more than one week of such accumulation may be taken in conjunction with annual leave.

(i) A break of at least thirty (30) minutes must be made for meals between 12 noon and 2 p.m. when overtime is worked on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday, and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on any week day on which overtime is worked. Such breaks shall not be recognised as overtime.

23.—Special Provisions—Rostered Workers.

(a) A shift work penalty rate of seven and a half per cent. $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$ shall be paid to workers who are required to work afternoon or night shift as defined hereunder for each afternoon and or night shift worked:—

- (i) Afternoon shift.—Commencing between 12 noon and 6 p.m.
- (ii) Night shift.—Commencing between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

(b) All ordinary hours worked between midnight Friday and midnight Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(c) All ordinary hours worked between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(d) The penalty rates prescribed in subclauses (b) and (c) shall be in substitution for and not cumulative on the penalty rates prescribed in subclause (a).

24.—Meal Allowance.

(a) An officer required to work before or after normal working hours on any week day shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from the usual place of residence, be reimbursed at the rate of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) for each meal purchased, providing that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two (2) hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled under the preceding clause.

(b) An officer required to work on a Saturday, Sunday or public service holiday shall, when such additional duty necessitates taking a meal away from the usual place of residence, be reimbursed at the rate of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) for each meal purchased, providing that the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two (2) hours. Such reimbursement shall be in addition to any payment for overtime to which he is entitled under the preceding clause. (c) The employer may provide a meal in accordance with subclauses (a) and (b) of this clause in which case no allowance under this clause shall be payable.

25.—Travelling Expenses.

Intra-State.

(a) If an officer travels on official business between his headquarters and a place situated outside a radius of fifteen (15) miles measured from his headquarters, and is necessarily absent from his headquarters overnight, he shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to either Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day, the allowance shall represent in equal proportions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purposes of computing expenses in respect of arrival at or departure from an officer's headquarters, breakfast shall be allowed for if arrival is later or departure earlier than 8 a.m., lunch if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m., dinner if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m. and bed if arrival is later than 11 p.m.: Provided that—

- (i) an officer who travels on official business which does not involve an absence from headquarters overnight, shall only be paid at the rates stated adjacent to Item 4, in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, subject to the officer's certification that each meal claimed for was actually purchased;
- (ii) the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 in the schedule hereto, shall apply to all officers who travel on official business in the company of an officer ordinarily entitled to such rate, if the last mentioned officer certifies accordingly;
- (iii) an officer who travels officially with a Minister of the Crown shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent either to Item 1 or 4, in the schedule hereto as the case may require, for expenses necessarily incurred whilst travelling in the company of the Minister;
- (iv) when an officer travels by railway and is provided with a sleeping berth, one-fourth deduction shall be made from the daily rate, except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night and a certificate to that effect is supplied by the officer when lodging his claim;
- (v) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to fifteen per cent. (15%) of the passage money, calculated on the single fare or one-third (¹/₃) of the appropriate rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, whichever is the greater; and
- (vi) an officer who, when travelling on official business stays at any government institution or travels in a ministerial railway coach, free of charge, shall only be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 5 in the schedule hereto, for the period spent at such institution or on such coach.

(b) The daily rates of reimbursement prescribed by subclause (a) shall be increased by an amount stated adjacent to Item 3 in the schedule hereto when an officer travels on land or by air North of the 26th degree of South latitude, including Shark Bay.

(c) (i) An officer with headquarters located outside the metropolitan area who travels to Perth on official business and, as a result, is required to stay at a city hotel over one or more nights, shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 6 in the schedule hereto for expenses necessarily incurred in respect of such city hotel accommodation.

If such country officer does not stay at a city hotel or is not absent from his headquarters overnight, any expenses necessarily incurred in respect of his travel to Perth shall be reimbursed at the appropriate rate prescribed by subclause (a),

(ii) For the purpose of this subclause a city hotel is any hotel included in the area bounded by Wellington Street in the North, the Swan River in the East and the South and George Street in the West.

(d) An officer stationed in the metropolitan area who is relieving at or temporarily transferred to any place within that area shall not be reimbursed the cost of mid-day meals purchased, but an officer travelling on duty within the metropolitan area which requires his absence from his headquarters at the rate set out adjacent to Item 7 in the schedule hereto for each meal necessarily pur-chased, provided that—

- (i) such travelling is not within the suburb in which the officer resides; and
- (ii) an officer's total reimbursement under this subclause for any one pay period shall not exceed the amount set out adjacent to Item 8 in the schedule hereto.

Inter-State.

(e) An officer who travels on official business beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 9 or 10 in the schedule hereto as the case may require. Where an allowance under this subclause is payable for less than a day the allowance shall be computed in accordance with subclause (a) hereof: Provided that-

- (i) when an officer travels by railway between Perth and Adelaide and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to 15 per cent. of the single fare of such journey;
- (ii) when an officer travels on board a vessel and the fare paid includes subsistence, reimbursement of expenses for the time spent at sea or on board vessel shall be at a rate equal to either fifteen per cent (15%) of the passage money, calculated on single fare, or one-third $\binom{1}{3}$ of the appropriate rate stated adacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, whichever is the greater; and
- (iii) an officer shall be reimbursed at the rate stated adacent to Items 9 and 10 in the schedule hereto as the case may require for any period spent in travelling by aircraft to and from Perth or in travelling by aircraft or railway between other States.

General.

(f) If on account of lack of suitable regular transport facilities an officer necessarily engages lodgings in Perth or other place in which his head-quarters are situated, for the night prior to com-mencing travelling in order to travel by an early morning transport, he shall be reimburged the morning transport, he shall be reimbursed the reasonable cost of such lodging in addition to such other reimbursements authorised by this clause.

(g) An officer who travels on official business shall be allowed first class fares and in addition to any reimbursement of expenses at the appropriate rate prescribed by this clause, shall be reimbursed reasonable incidental expenses such as tram, bus and motor fares, if, in the opinion of the employer, such expenses were warranted.

(h) Reimbursement of expenses at the rates prescribed by this clause shall not be suspended should an officer become ill whilst travelling, pro-vided leave for the period of such illness is approved in accordance with the provisions of this Award.

(i) Where it can be shown to the satisfaction of the employer by the production of receipts or other evidence that reimbursement at the rates prescribed in this clause would be insufficient to meet an officer's reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, he shall be paid the difference fully to reimburse him.

(j) Reimbursement of travelling expenses for a period exceeding fourteen (14) days in any one month shall not be passed for payment to any officer by a certifying officer until the endorsement of the employer has been obtained on the account.

(k) In all cases where commuted amounts for reimbursement of travelling expenses and cost of conveyance are in operation at the date of coming into force of this Award, such commuted amounts shall continue to obtain, but may be subject to review by the employer at any time.

(1) The headquarters of an officer engaged on more than one work shall be considered to be the place in which the principal work is carried out, as defined by the employer.

(m) An officer shall use state-owned transport unless otherwise approved by the employer.

(n) Whenever an officer does not travel by Stateowned transport as per subclause (m), he shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for payment. Receipts shall not be required for any amounts under five shillings (5s.) but in lieu thereof a certificate on the account form must be made as follows:-

service.

(o) No officer shall engage other vehicles when there are public conveyances available when required.

(p) When circumstances necessitate the hire of a motor car or other special means of transit, a special report shall accompany the account.

(q) Unless specially authorised by the employer, taxi fares will not be allowed when the distance can be traversed by the ordinary modes of con-veyance by rail, tram, omnibus or other means of public transport.

26.—Transfer Expenses.

(a) Except as provided in subclause (f), a married or single officer who is transferred to a new locality shall, in addition to payment of any district allowance, be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, for a period of fourteen (14) days after arrival at his new headquarters: Provided that, if an officer is required to travel on official business during the said period of fourteen (14) days, such period shall be extended by the time spent in travelling. Under no circumstances, however, shall the provisions of this subclause however, shall the provisions of this subclause operate concurrently with those of Clause 25 so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in re-spect of both travelling and transfer expenses for one and the same period.

(b) If a married officer is unable to obtain reasonable accommodation for the transfer of his home within the period of fourteen (14) days referred to in subclause (a). and the employer is satisfied that the officer has taken all possible steps to secure reasonable accommodation. such officer shall. after the expiration of the fourteen (14) days, be reimbursed at the rate stated adjacent to Item 3 in the schedule hereto. until such time as he has secured reasonable accommodation: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed seventy-seven (77) days without the approval of the employer. A single officer shall not be paid allowances under this subclause.

(c) The rates of reimbursement prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 4 in the schedule hereto, when an officer is transferred North of the 26th degree of South latitude, including Shark Bay.

General.

(d) An officer who is transferred to departmental or hospital accommodation shall not be entitled to reimubursement under this clause. However, if such an officer is put to additional expense on transfer through circumstances beyond his control, he may receive reimbursement as determined by the employer.

(e) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred by an officer on transfer. an appropriate rate of reimbursement may be determined by the employer.

(f) The provisions of Clause 25. subclauses (l) to (q) inclusive. shall have equal application to this clause.

27.—Payment of Hire for Use of Officer's Own Vehicle.

(a) An officer who is required to maintain a motor car or motor cycle for use when travelling on official business and who is not in receipt of a commuted amount in which the whole or portion of the cost of locomotion is included shall, for journeys approved by the employer be paid hire for such vehicle to cover all expenses in connection therewith, in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto.

(b) The employer may authorise a commuted amount for the hire of motor vehicles. bicycles or any other conveyance belonging to an officer.

(c) Where an officer in the course of a journey travels through two or more of the separate areas. payment of hire at the rates prescribed by subclause (a) shall be made at the appropriate rate applicable to each of the separate areas traversed.

(d) The employer may increase the rates prescribed by this clause in any case in which he is satisfied that they are inadequate.

(e) A year for the purpose of this clause shall commence on the first day of July and end on the 30th day of June next following—Schedule "A" attached.

28.—Removal Expenses.

(a) When a married officer is transferred-

- (i) in the public interest: or
- (ii) in the ordinary course of promotion and transfer; or

(iii) on account of illness due to causes over which the officer has no control—

such an officer shall be reimbursed-

- (i) the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of such officer and his wife and children under sixteen (16) years of age or other children wholly dependent on him: and
- (ii) subject to the limitations defined in subclause (d). the actual reasonable cost of conveyance of his furniture, including insurance of such furniture whilst in transit: and
- (iii) an allowance of twenty pounds (£20) for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture and effects. provided that the employer is satisfied that the value of household furniture moved by the officer is at least two-hundred pounds (£200). This allowance shall not be payable in respect of the removal of the furniture and effects of a new appointee at the time of his first commencing duty.

In the case of a single officer. an application for any reimbursement under this clause may be considered by the employer.

(b) An officer who is transferred from one locality to another solely at his own request, or by exchange (except as provided for in subclause (a)), must bear the whole cost of his removal unless otherwise approved by the employer.

(c) When an officer is transferred on account of misconduct, the cost must be borne by the officer in fault, unless otherwise determined by the employer prior to removal.

(d) The maximum reimbursement for cost of conveyance of furniture. including insurance whilst in transit. shall be one-hundred pounds (\pounds 100) unless a higher sum is approved by the employer in any special case: Provided that only necessary household furniture and effects shall be taken into consideration.

(e) In providing for the cost of removal, an officer's motor vehicle may be taken into consideration, reimbursement in respect of which shall be as determined by the employer.

(f) Furniture and effects. where practicable. shall be removed by state-owned transport.

(g) Before removal is undertaken, the officer shall, where practicable, obtain quotes from at least two carriers which shall be submitted to the employer, who may authorise the acceptance of the more suitable, provided that the maximum amount prescribed by subclause (d) is not exceeded without the written approval of the employer having first been obtained.

(h) Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid.

(i) The employer may, in lieu of cost of conveyance, authorise payment of an amount not exceeding the maximum prescribed by subclause (d) to compensate for loss in any case where an officer, with the prior approval of the employer, disposes of his furniture and effects instead of removing them to his new headquarters: Provided that such payment would not exceed the sum which would have been paid if such furniture and effects had been removed by the cheapest method of transport available.

29.—Relieving Allowances.

(a) A married or single officer who is required to take up duty away from his usual headquarters to relieve another officer or to perform special duty, and necessarily lodges or resides temporarily away from his usual place of residence shall, except where otherwise provided. be paid, in addition to any district allowance, at the rate stated adjacent to either Item 1 or 2 in the schedule hereto, as the case may require, up to a maximum period of twenty-one (21) days after arrival at the new locality.

(b) If the period of relief or special duty exceeds twenty-one (21) days. a married officer shall be paid at the rate stated adjacent to Item 3 and a single officer at the rate stated adjacent to Item 4 in the schedule hereto, for the period of relief or special duty in excess of twenty-one (21) days: Provided that the period of reimbursement under this sub-clause shall not exceed seventy (70) days without the approval of the employer.

(c) The allowances prescribed by sub-clauses (a) and (b) shall be increased by the amount stated adjacent to Item 5 in the schedule hereto, when an officer is required to relieve or perform special duty north of the 26th degree of South latitude, including Shark Bay.

(d) When an officer who is required to relieve or perform special duties away from his usual headquarters is permitted by the employer to travel to the new locality in his own motor vehicle, he shall be reimbursed the cost of petrol and oil for the return journey: Provided that the maximum amount of reimbursement under this subclause shall not exceed the cost of the first-class rail fare for such return journey.

General.

(e) The rate applicable to a married officer under subclause (b) shall be paid to a single officer if the employer is satisfied that the officer has to maintain a home and support dependent relatives therein, in a locality other than that to which he has been sent. A certificate to this effect must be furnished by a single officer claiming the higher rate.

(f) Where it can be shown by the production of receipts or other evidence that an allowance payable under this clause would be insufficient to meet reasonable additional costs incurred, an appropriate rate of reimbursement may be determined by the employer.

(g) The provisions of Clause 25 shall not operate concurrently with the provisions of this clause so as to permit an officer to be paid allowances in respect of both travelling and relieving expenses for the one and the same period; however, the provisions of subclauses (1) to (q) of Clause 25 shall have equal application to this clause.

30.—Travelling Time.

An officer who, in the course of his duties, is called upon to travel after the usual time for ceasing duty may, at the discretion of the employer, be granted time off in resect of such time or part of such time spent in travelling.

31.—Higher Duties Allowance.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, an officer, other than one classified as a Relieving Officer, who acts in a position classified higher than his own, shall with the approval of the employer be paid higher duties allowance on the basis defined in subclause (c) for the whole period he acts in such higher position: Provided that—

- (i) he performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibility of the higher position for a continuous period of two (2) weeks or more; and
- (ii) he acts in the higher position for reasons other than the absence of the classified occupant thereof on normal annual leave.

(b) For the purpose of this clause, the expression "normal annual leave" shall mean the annual period of recreation leave as referred to in clause 41 of this Award and shall include any public service holidays taken in conjunction with such annual recreation leave.

(c) An officer who acts in a higher position under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the following basis:—

- (i) When acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which exceeds his own margin over the basic rate —an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over the basic rate and the minimum classified margin of the position in which he is acting; or
- (ii) when acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which does not exceed his own margin over the basic rate—an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over the basic rate and the margin he would receive if he were permanently appointed to the position in which he is acting.

(d) Where, because of necessity the full duties and responsibilities of a higher position are temporarily performed by two or more subordinate officers, such officers shall be paid allowances as determined by the employer, subject to the provisions of subclause (a).

(e) No officer under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall be permitted to relieve or act in a position classified higher than his own, without the prior approval of the employer.

(f) A female officer under the age of twenty-one (21) years who is permitted to relieve or act in a position classified higher than her own shall be paid an allowance as determined by the employer.

(g) An allowance under this clause shall not be payable to a female officer when acting in a male position classified within the male clerical automatic range.

(h) A female officer who acts in a male position classified above the male clerical automatic range under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis of the female basic rate, plus the female margin relative to the position in which she is acting.

(i) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position one class higher than his own for a continuous period exceeding four (4) weeks and during such period performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibilities of such higher position, he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis set out in subclause (c) for the period in excess of four (4) weeks.

(j) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position classified two or more classes higher than his own, under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basic prescribed in subclause (c).

(k) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall, if he acts in a higher position continuously for a sufficiently long enough period, be entitled to receive an increased higher duties allowance equivalent to the annual increment he would have received had he been permanently appointed to such higher position for the whole time he has been acting therein: Provided that in the case of a Relieving Officer acting or relieving in a position only one class higher than his own, the first four (4) weeks of service in the higher position shall not be taken into account.

(1) An officer who has received an increased higher duties allowance in accordance with the preceding subclause and is required to further act in the same higher position within a period of twelve (12) months from the date he last acted in that position, shall receive an allowance at the rate received when last acting in that position.

C

(m) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall continue to receive such allowance during his absence on normal annual leave or whilst absent on approved sick leave for a period of less than two (2) weeks' duration, provided that he had qualified for payment of the allowance by serving the required continuous period before proceeding on such leave and provided further that he resumes after such leave in the position in respect of which he was paid higher duties allowance.

(n) If an officer who is acting in a higher position proceeds on—

- (i) any period of long service leave;
 - (ii) a period of recreation leave in excess of the normal annual leave period;
- (iii) a period of sick leave or military leave of two (2) weeks' duration or more; or
- (iv) a period of normal annual leave preceded or followed by a period of sick leave, long service leave, or leave without pay—

he shall not be entitled to receive payment of an allowance under this clause for the whole or any part of the period of such leave and the continuity of his acting service in the higher position shall be deemed to be broken by his proceeding on such leave.

32.-Child Allowance.

(a) An officer whose permanent headquarters are located North of the 26th degree of South latitude including Shark Bay, shall be paid an allowance at the rate of fifty pounds (£50) per annum in respect of each one of his children of school age who is resident in the North: Provided that the total reimbursement per family unit under this clause shall not exceed two-hundred pounds (£200) per annum.

(b) An allowance under this clause shall continue to be paid to an officer when he is absent from his headquarters on long service leave, annual leave or other leave as approved by the employer.

33.—Dirty Work Allowance.

A special allowance shall be paid to an officer when engaged in any dirty work (including moving or sorting old books and documents), which is not part of the usual duty of the officer concerned and which, in the opinion of the employer, could be classed as dirty work; such allowance to be assessed by the employer.

34.—District Allowance.

(a) A married officer shall be paid district allowance at the standard rate prescribed in Column II of the schedule to this clause, for the district in which his headquarters are located: Provided that a married officer whose headquarters are situated in a town or place specified in Column III of the schedule hereto shall be paid district allowance at the appropriate rate stated in Column IV of the said schedule.

(b) A single officer shall be paid district allowance at a rate equal to one-half of the appropriate rate prescribed by subclause (a) for a married officer whose headquarters are situated in the same district, town or place: Provided that a single officer who supplies satisfactory proof that he is the main support of those who are related to him and who reside in the State may, with the approval of the employer, be considered a married officer for the purpose of this clause.

(c) When an officer is on approved recreation leave he shall, for the period of such leave, be paid the district allowance to which he would ordinarily be entitled.

(d) When an officer is on long service leave or other approved leave with pay (except recreation leave) he shall only be paid district allowance for the period of such leave if his family or dependants remain in the district in which his headquarters are situated.

(e) If an officer leaves his district on duty, payment of district allowance shall cease after the expiration of two (2) weeks unless otherwise approved by the employer.

(f) Except as provided in subclause (e), district allowance shall be paid in addition to reimbursement of any travelling expenses.

- (6) That area of the State North of a line running East from Carnot Bay to the South Australian border.

35.—Allowance to Officers Receiving and Paying Cash.

(a) An officer other than one whose classified duties include receiving or paying cash or one who is in receipt of higher duties allowance under clause 31 in respect of such work shall, when receiving or paying cash, be paid an allowance at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per day or two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per half-day whilst so engaged: Provided that—

- (i) the officer's margin over the basic rate is not equivalent to or in excess of the minimum for the position in which he is relieving; and
- (ii) the allowance in any one week shall not exceed the difference between the officer's weekly rate and the minimum weekly rate for the position which he is relieving.

(b) For the purpose of this clause, half a day shall mean any period of three (3) hours or less on any day.

36.—Allowance to Officers Paying Wages.

(a) An officer away from his headquarters, other than one whose classified duties include the payment of wages shall, when paying wages outside the metropolitan area or at construction works within the metropolitan area, or at such other works as may be approved by the employer, be paid an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day or part of any day whilst so engaged, in recognition of the added responsibilities: Provided that—

- (i) the allowance shall not exceed ten shillings (10s.) in any one (1) week;
- (ii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer when in receipt of higher duties allowance for relieving or acting in a position, the classified duties of which include the payment of wages; and
- (iii) no allowance shall be paid to an officer whose margin over the basic rate exceeds the maximum prescribed for Class 3, Clause 6 of this Award.

(b) An officer employed in the metropolitan area, when paying wages outside that area shall, in addition to any allowance payable in accordance with subclause (a), be paid an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day or part of any day whilst so engaged, in compensation for damage to clothing and disabilities encountered.

7.—Protective Clothing and/or Uniform.

(a) The hospitals may supply and require to be worn, such protective clothing as is considered necessary.

(b) Any hospital may supply uniforms and require them to be worn at all times when considered necessary by that hospital, provided that any such protective clothing and/or uniforms shall be laundered free of charge and remain the property of the hospital.

(c) Where the employer requires a uniform to be worn, such uniform shall be supplied in accordance with subclause (b) or an allowance shall be paid to each staff member required to wear a uniform. The amount of such allowance shall be agreed upon between the employer and the Association and, failing agreement, shall be referred to the Board of Reference provided for in Clause 53.

38.—Qualification Allowance—Male Clerical Division Officers.

(a) Diplomates.—A male adult clerk who holds the diploma in Commerce of the University of Western Australia or the diploma in Public Administration of the Perth Technical College; or

the diploma of the Australian Institute of Hospital Administration;

or passes the final examinations in all subjects in the syllabus of—

an Institute of Accountants, Secretaries or Cost Accountants approved by the employer; or passes—

in five (5) units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science, Economics or Law at the University of Western Australia; or

holds or passes-

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the employer is equivalent to any of the aforesaid, and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in Column "A" of the schedule hereunder, shall be paid qualification allowance at the rate expressed in Column "B" of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

(b) Graduates.—A male adult clerk who holds a degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Law of the University of Western Australia; or

who holds or passes—

a qualification or examination which in the opinion of the employer, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in Column "A" of the schedule hereunder, shall be paid qualification allowance at the rate expressed in Column "C" of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

(c) Payment of an allowance under the provisions of this clause shall cease—

- either—
 - (i) as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a margin for which no qualification allowance is provided, or
 - (ii) by the effluxion of a period of ten (10) years from the date on which the officer first became entitled to payment of an allowance under this clause,

whichever occurs first: Provided that in the event of (ii) hereof, payment of the allowance shall not cease before the 30th June, 1965.

An officer who obtains more than one of the qualifications mentioned in this clause shall only be entitled to payment of the allowance prescribed in either Column "B" or "C" of the schedule as the case may require, and no payment shall be made for more than one of the qualifications obtained.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Award, the classes and grades applicable to female officers in the Professional, Clerical and General Divisions shall be as indicated in subclause (b) of this clause.

(c) In making a classification under this clause, the employer may— $\!\!\!\!$

 (i) in the case of female officers classified in the Professional or General Divisions amalgamate two or more classes; and (ii) in the case of female officers classified in the Clerical Division amalgamate any two classes.

(d) A female Professional or Clerical Division officer who has obtained promotion to either class 1, 2, 3 or 4 as set out in subclause (b) of this clause and who has completed not less than twenty clause and who has completed not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service, shall be paid an allowance of thirty pounds (£30) per annum; provided the employer is satisfied as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer; and provided further that an allowance under this subclause shall not apply to an officer classified in accordance with subclause (e).

(e) A female Professional Division officer who occupies one of the following positions or such other position as the employer may determine from time to time shall be paid the same margin as that prescribed for a male Professional Division officer occupying an identical position; provided that-

- (i) such female officer possesses the academic qualifications described herein; and
- (ii) the duties and responsibilities of her position are the same as for the related male position-

Title of Position; Required Academic Qualifications.

Psychologist.-Degree of Bachelor of Arts (major in Psychology).

Chemist and Research Officer.—Degree of Bachelor of Science. Laboratory Technologist.—Diploma of Australasian Institute of Medical La-boratory Technology or Bachelor of Science. Science.

Dieticans .-- Diploma of School of Dietetics.

Occupational Therapists.-Diploma of Occupational Therapy. Almoners.—Diploma of Social Studies.

Social Workers.—Diploma of Social Studies.
 Social Workers.—Diploma of Social Studies University Course.
 Registered Pharmacists.—Diploma of W.A. Pharmaceutical Council or its equivalent.

Physiotherapists .--- Diploma of Physiotherapy.

(f) Female Radiographers who hold the Diploma of the Australian Institute of Radiography by ex-amination, shall be paid the margin prescribed for male radiographers possessing the same qualifications.

40.-Married Man's Allowance.

A male clerk who is a married man or who is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the employer shall be entitled to an allowance equivalent to the difference between his margin and the next higher margin as prescribed in Clause 7 of this Award, until he attains the maximum margin of his grading, when such al-lowance shall cease and be converted to salary.

41.-Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as paid holidays:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Mon-day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Royal Show Day (for officers stationed in the metropolitan area, and any alternative day observed as a Public Ser-vice holiday in any town outside the metropolitan area where officers are stationed), Queens' Birth-day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and any other days which may be proclaimed as Public Service holidays.

(b) A period of two (2) weeks' annual leave with pay shall be granted annually to an officer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service.

(c) Should any of the holidays referred to in subclause (a) hereof occur during the period an officer is on annual leave, a day in lieu of any holidays shall be added to the period of annual leave; provided that no day shall be added where any of the prescribed holidays falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

(d) Any officer required to work on a holiday as prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid for the time so worked as if it were an ordinary day and

shall in addition be paid a day's pay; provided that in lieu of the additional day's pay, a day's leave with pay shall be added to the annual leave or shall be taken at some subsequent date at the option of the employer. Provided also that leave to be added to annual leave under this clause and under Clauses 21 (e) and 22 (e) shall not exceed in total a maximum of one (1) week.

(e) An officer not completing one (1) year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of annual leave in proportion to his or her length of service.

(f) Shift workers (i.e., workers who rotate after-noon and/or night shift with day shift as defined in Clause 23 (a)) shall be granted an additional week's leave: Provided that workers whose shifts are not subject to regular rotation shall be granted one (1) working day's additional leave (with a maximum of five (5) working days) for each seven (7) weeks actually worked on afternoon and/or night shift. Provided that workers who have completed thirty-two (32) weeks on afternoon and/or night shift shall be granted an additional week.

(g) Officers stationed North of the 26° of South attude shall be entitled to an additional one (1) week's paid leave per annun with free passes South each year for the officers. Married officers shall be granted free passes South for wife and dependent family under sixteen (16) years of age.

42.—Board Allowance for Annual Leave.

When on annual leave, an officer who does not avail himself of the board and lodgings provided in his classification shall be granted an allowance for the period of his leave at the rate of thirty shillings (30s.) per week.

43.-Leave without Pay.

(a) On the application of any officer, the employer may grant to him leave of absence without pay for a period not exceeding twelve (12) months.

(b) The period during which any officer is absent on leave granted pursuant to subclause (a) hereof shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

44.--Short Leave.

(a) The employer may, on sufficient cause being shown, grant an officer leave of absence not exceed. ing two (2) days but all such periods of leave shall be properly recorded and, at the discretion of the employer, shall or shall not be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated leave.

(b) Provided that if the leave granted under subclause (a) hereof exceeds three (3) days in any one (1) year, the excess shall be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated leave.

45.—Sick Leave.

(a) An officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall as soon as possible advise his superior officer in sufficient time to enable arrangements to be made for the per-formance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b) An officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will resume duty, to enable any necessary arrangements to be made.

(c) No sick leave with pay shall be granted without an adequate medical certificate, provided that if for any cause it is inconvenient for an officer to obtain a medical certificate which would allow him to be granted sick leave, such officer may have short leave granted to him by the employer, such period to be deducted from the three (3) days per annum which may be granted under clause 44 of this Award or from his annual leave.

(d) An officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown on the first certificate shall thereupon furnish a further certificate and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the period respectively covered by such certificates.

(e) The employer on receipt of an application for leave of absence on account of illness and supported by a certificate of a registered medical practitioner, may require a further certificate from a Government Medical officer. If in the opinion of the employer this further certificate does not endorse the certificate of the medical practitioner, the officer shall pay the fee due to the Government Medical officer.

(f) The basis of determining the leave which may be granted shall be ascertained by crediting officers with the following periods, such leave to be cumulative:— Working

(g) Where an officer has been granted fourteen (14) months' continuous leave with pay he shall not be entitled to receive further leave with pay until he has completed a period of duty of not less than four (4) weeks.

(h) The maximum period allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed nine (9) months on full pay and five (5) months on half pay.

(i) (a) Persons temporarily employed for a continuous period of less than (3) years may be granted sick leave by the employer as follows:—

- (i) Where continuous service does not exceed six (6) months—three (3) working days on full pay.
- (ii) Where continuous service exceeds six (6) months but does not exceed eighteen (18) months—ten (10) working days on full pay, less any leave granted under paragraph (i).
- (iii) Where continuous service exceeds eighteen
 (18) months but is less than three (3)
 years—ten (10) working days on full pay and ten (10) working days on half pay, less any leave granted under paragraphs
 (i) and (ii).

(b) Persons temporarily employed for a continuous period of not less than three (3) years may be granted sick leave by the employer on the basis of fifteen (15) working days for the first three (3) years of service and seven (7) working days for each year of service thereafter. Provided that—

- (i) at the time of this Award such leave as has accrued to the temporary officer's credit, insofar as it is in excess of that prescribed in subclause (b) shall remain;
- (ii) for temporary officers other than those covered by subclause (b) (i)—the maximum credit allowable at the date of the commencement of this Award and for the first year thereafter shall be fifteen working days;
- (iii) the maximum period of sick leave allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed four (4) months.

(j) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause, except under such special circumstances as may be approved by the employer.

(k) No leave on account of illness or injury shall be granted with pay if the illness or injury has been caused by misconduct of the officer or by circumstances within his control.

(1) The employer in order to satisfy himself in any case may send a registered medical practitioner to attend on and examine the officer at his residence and if the report of the practitioner is, in the opinion of the employer, not favourable to the application of the officer concerned, the fee payable to the practitioner shall be deducted from any money which is or becomes payable to the said officer by the employer.

(m) Where in the discharge of his duties, an officer sustains injuries which would be compensative in accordance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act and which necessitates the granting of leave under this Award, half the period only of such leave on full pay and/or half pay respectively shall be charged against his sick leave entitlements or sick leave credits as the case may be.

(n) Where an officer transfers to another hospital, a party to this Award, the period of sick leave that has accrued to the officer's credit shall remain to such officer's credit and the provisions of subclause (f) (i) of this clause shall continue to apply to such officer.

46.—Resignations, Retirements and Dismissals.

(a) No officer, other than a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period, shall leave the employer, until the expiration of one (1) month's written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the employer and, in the absence of such notice, the employer may withold holiday or other pay up to an amount of one (1) month's salary.

(b) In the case of a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period, the provisions of subclause (a) shall apply except that the period of notice and retention of holiday or other pay shall be two (2) weeks.

Except as hereinafter provided, one (1) month's written notice shall be given by the employer to an officer, other than a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period whose services are no longer required: Provided that no officer shall be dismissed unless he or she has received one (1) month's previous notice of his or her dismissal, or pay for such period in lieu thereof; and provided further that a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period shall receive two (2) weeks' notice or pay for such period.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclauses (a) and (b), the employer may at any time, without prior notice, dismiss an officer for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for serious misconduct.

47.—Payment of Salaries.

(a) Salaries shall be paid fortnightly but, where the usual pay day falls on a public holiday, payment shall be made on the previous day.

(b) A fortnight's salary shall be computed by dividing the annual salary rate by three hundred and thirteen (313) and multiplying the result by twelve (12).

(c) The hourly rate shall be calculated as one seventy-fifth (1/75th) of the fortnight's salary for those working a thirty seven and a half $(37\frac{1}{2})$ hour week and by one eightieth (1/80th) of a fortnight's salary for those working a forty (40) hour week.

48.—Channel of Communication.

No employer shall (during the currency of this Award), recognise or negotiate with any organised body other than the Association in regard to the conditions of employment of workers covered by this Award.

49.—Rights of Appeal.

(a) An Appeal Board consisting of a chairman, mutually agreed between the parties to this Award or, failing agreement, selected by the Court from the nominees of the parties, and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by a member of the Association against a decision of the employer in respect of the title, classification, reclassification or salary of such member.

(b) Written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the empoyer within one (1) month of the publication of such title, classification, reclassification or salary.

(c) The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on all the parties.

50.—Conduct of Appeals.

(a) Every appeal to the Appeal Board shall be made in writing, addressed to the Appeal Board and signed by the appellant; short particulars of the appellant's claim or complaint must be stated therein.

(b) Every appellant shall lodge four (4) copies of his notice of appeal.

(c) Seven (7) days' notice at least shall be given to the parties concerned of the date fixed for the hearing of every appeal to the Appeal Board.

(d) Every appellant shall within four (4) days of the receipt of notice of the date fixed for the hearing, supply the other parties to the proceedings with lists of the witnesses he intends to call and any party to an appeal who intends to oppose the same shall, if required so to do, forthwith supply to the appellant a list of witnesses he intends to call.

(e) The Appeal Board may at any time allow an appellant to amend the statement of the grounds of his appeal on such terms (if any) as to the Appeal Board shall appear just.

(f) The Appeal Board may in its discretion adjourn the hearing of any appeal for any good or sufficient reason.

(g) No appeal shall be heard by the Appeal Board unless the appellant supplies the Appeal Board, at least four (4) days prior to the hearing, with three (3) copies of a statement in writing of the facts upon which the appellant relies and also serves a copy of such statement upon the representative of the employer, three (3) days prior to the hearing.

51.—Probationary Service Prior to Appointment to Permanent Staff.

Each newly engaged officer shall serve to the satisfaction of the employer a probationary period of six (6) months before he or she is considered for appointment to the permanent salaried staff. All notices of engagement and appointment shall be given in writing.

52.—Variation of Provisions.

The provisions of Clauses 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 38, 40, 42, 43, 44, 45 and 54, which are based on similar provisions applicable to the State Public Service shall be varied from time to time in accordance with the similar provisions of the State Public Service.

53.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

54.-Long Service Leave.

(a) An officer who has completed seven (7) years' continuous service in a permanent capacity (3)-52581

or ten (10) years' continuous service in a temporary capacity or eight and one-half $(8\frac{1}{2})$ years' continuous service of which not less than eighteen (18) months shall have been served in a temporary capacity and the balance in a permanent capacity, shall be entitled to three months' long service leave on full pay.

(b) for each and every subsequent period of seven (7) years' continuous service in a permanent capacity, an officer shall be entitled to an additional three (3) calendar months' long service leave on full pay.

(c) Upon application by an officer, an employer may approve of the taking by the officer—

- (i) of double the period of long service leave entitlement on half pay, in lieu of the period of long service leave entitlement on full pay; or
- (ii) of any portion of his long service leave entitlement on full pay or double such period on half pay.

(d) Continuous service shall not include the period during which an officer is on long service leave or any period exceeding two (2) weeks an officer is absent on leave without pay or any service an officer may have before reaching the age of eighteen (18) years.

(e) An officer who resigns (except a female officer who resigns because of marriage or approaching marriage) or is dismissed, shall not be entitled to long service leave or payment for long service leave other than that leave that had accrued to him prior to the date on which he resigned or the date of the offence for which he is dismissed.

(f) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be treated as part of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(g) Long service leave shall be taken as it falls due at the convenience of the employer but within seven (7) years next after becoming entitled thereto; Provided that the employer may approve the accumulation of long service leave not exceeding six (6) months in all in any particular case. In the case of an officer who on the 5th March, 1948, had accumulated or within five (5) years of such date had accumulated at least six (6) months' long service leave on full pay, the employer may approve the accumulation of his long service leave entitlement (inclusive of the long service leave already accumulated) up to a maximum of twelve (12) months.

(h) A lump sum payment for long service leave accrued in accordance with this clause and for pro rata long service leave shall be made in the following cases:—

- (i) To an officer who retires at or over the age of sixty (60) years or who has retired on the grounds of ill health, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the officer has completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service.
- (ii) To a female officer who resigns on marriage or approaching marriage, provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the officer had completed not less than three (3) years' continuous service before the date on which her resignation becomes effective and provided further that she produces a Marriage Certificate before any payment is made.
- (iii) To an officer who has retired for any other cause; provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the officer had completed not less than three (3) years' continuous service before the date of his retirement.
- (iv) To the widow of an officer or such other person as may be approved by the employer in the event of the death of an officer; provided that no payment shall be made for pro rata long service leave unless the officer had completed not less than twelve (12) months' continuous service prior to the date of his death.

(i) A calculation of the amount due for long service leave accrued and for pro rata long service leave shall be made at the rate of salary of an officer at the date of retirement, resignation or death, whichever applies and no such payment shall exceed the equivalent of twelve (12) months' salary.

(j) Long service leave accrued prior to the issue of this Award shall remain to the credit of the officer.

(k) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (d), (e), (g), (h) and (l) of this clause, the service of an employee shall not be deemed to have been broken—

- (i) by resignation, if he resigns from the employment of an employer a party to this Award and commences with another employer a party to this Award within one working week of the expiration of any period for which payment in lieu of annual leave and/or public holidays has been made by the employer from whom he resigned or, if no such payment has been made, within one working week of the day on which his resignation became effective;
- (ii) if his employment is ended by his employer a party to this Award for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service but only if—
 - (a) the employee resumes employment with an employer a party to this Award not later than six (6) months from the day on which his employment ended; and

(b) payment pursuant to subclause (h)

(iii) by any absence approved by the employer as leave whether with or without pay.

(1) The expression "continuous service" in this clause includes any period during which an officer is absent on full pay or part pay, from his duties in the hospital service, but does not include—

- (i) any period exceeding two (2) weeks during which the officer is absent on leave without pay;
- (ii) any period during which the officer is taking his long service leave entitlement or any portion thereof;
- (iii) any service of the officer prior to his attaining the age of eighteen (18) years;
- (iv) any service of the officer who resigns (except the female officer who resigns because of or with a view to marriage) or is dismissed, other than service prior to such resignation or to the date of any offence in respect of which he is dismissed when such prior service has actually entitled the officer to long service leave under this clause.

55.—Term of Award.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.
