Police Act, 1892-1961. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor. IL.S.] By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Vic-torian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Com-panion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted *(inter alia)* by section 89A of the Police Act, 1892-1961, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Police, by Proclamation, prohibit-

- (a) the use or possession of any slot machine, or class or classes of slot machine; or
- (b) the use or possession in any place, class or classes of place of any slot machine, or class or classes of slot machine,

named in the Proclamation; and whereas the Comsuch slot machine as is mentioned in the schedule hereto be prohibited: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby prohibit the use and possession of every slot machine such as is mentioned in the schedule hereto after 14 days from the day of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

# Schedule.

Every slot machine that-

- (a) has any recording or accounting device (other than one device recording each player's progress score) fitted within or upon it:
- (b) returns, or purports to return, to the player, or entitles the player to, any money or money's worth (including the right to

use or play the machine for an additional or longer period), on the contingency of any score recorded by it;

- (c) affords, or purports to afford, any advantage to a player for the insertion of more than one coin or token, prior to the com-mencement of use or play; or
- (d) is a machine of the kind generally known and described as a poker machine, fruit machine or roulette machine or is a mechanical device in the nature of, or similar to, any of them.

Between The Coastal District Committee, Amal-gamated Engineering Union, Association of Workers; The State Executive Australasian Society of Engineers, Industrial Association of Workers; The Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (West Australian Branch) Workers of Australia (West Australian Branch) Perth; The Boilermakers' Society of Australia Union of Workers, Coastal Districts W.A. and Federated Moulders (Metal) Union of Workers, Perth, Applicants, and Christiani-Nielson & Clough; D. F. D. Rhodes Pty. Ltd.; M. A. Michael Pty. Ltd.; Geraldton Building Co. Pty. Ltd. and Vickers Hoskins Pty. Limited, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

# Schedule.

#### 3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers covered by the classifications set out in the Schedule attached hereto and employed in or in connection with construction and maintenance work on the Ord River Project.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall operate over that portion of the State of Western Australia within a radius of fifty (50) miles from the township of Kununurra.

#### 5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) months from the date hereof.

#### Definitions.

(a) "Casual Worker".—Casual worker means a worker whose employment is terminated through no fault of his own before the expiration of one week.

(b) "Tradesman".--Means a worker, not being an apprentice, who in the course of his employ-ment works from drawings or prints, or makes precision measurements or applies general trade experience.

(c) "First-class welder".--Means a worker using electric arc or acetylene, petrol or coal gas blow pipe on any work other than—

- (i) filling castings, or
- (ii) cutting scrap metal, or
- (iii) welding with the aid of jigs, or

(iv) operations specifically mentioned as being the work of a second, third or fourth class welder in the definitions of those terms hereunder.

(d) "Second-class welder"—Means a worker who—

- (i) uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in filling castings, or
- (ii) welds with the aid of jig, or
- (iii) operates automatic welding machines for the setting up of which he is not responsible, or
- (iv) operates a profile cutting or a straight line cutting machine.

(e) "Third-class welder".—Means a worker who uses any of the foregoing types of welding apparatus in tacking preparatory to the completion of work by any other worker.

(f) "Fourth-class welder".—Means a worker using an electric spot or butt-welding machine, or cutting scrap with oxy-acetylene blow pipe, petrol or coal gas blow pipe.

(g) (i) "Boilermaker" means a tradesman as defined in paragraph (ii) hereof who is employed in the fabrication, erection and/or repairing of steel or iron ships or of boilers or other vessels subject to greater pressure than the weight of their contents, but does not include drilling by stationary machines.

(ii) "Tradesman" means an adult worker who is required to develop work from scaled drawings or prints, or to make templates, or to apply general trade experience without the guidance of a foreman or other tradesman, and includes riveting by hand or machine, caulking, chipping and working rivet busters.

(h) "Steel Construction Tradesman" means an adult worker who is required to develop work from scaled drawings or prints, or to make templates, or to apply general trade experience without the guidance of a foreman or other tradesman and includes riveting by hand or machine, caulking, chipping and working rivet busters.

#### 7.-Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day, or (if the employer terminates it) by payment of one (1) week's pay, except—

- (i) in the case of a casual worker when one (1) hour's notice shall suffice, and
- (ii) for the first month of employment, when the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice or a day's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 18 or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

#### 8.—Preference.

(a) In this clause, the term "unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of one of the industrial unions of workers parties to this Award.

(b) In engaging or dismissing labour (other than cadets), preference of employment shall be given to unionists, provided that such unionists are adequately experienced in the class of work to be performed and are otherwise competent to perform the work: Provided further that it shall be a defence on the part of an employer charged with engaging a worker other than a "unionist" when a "unionist" was available for such engagement, that the employer, having made enquiries from the appropriate Union or, if in the country areas, other reasonable enquiries, did not know that any "unionist" competent to perform the class of work involved was available. (c) Any worker whose application for membership of the Union has been refused, shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar, whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall, pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar, have the same rights under this clause as a "unionist."

(d) Subject to subclause (e) hereof, workers (other than cadets) who are not "unionists" shall within seven (7) days of being engaged, apply for membership and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by a Respondent to this Award. Workers who are unionists when engaged shall also maintain financial membership whilst employed by any Respondent to the Award.

(e) Exemptions-

- (i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.
- (ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption, and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven (7) days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (d).
- (iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—
  - (a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;
  - (b) if the worker objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union;
  - (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.
- (iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall, within seven (7) days of the decision, make application for membership of the applicant Union, and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by a Respondent to this Award.

(f) No employer shall, while to his knowledge adequately experienced unionists competent to perform the class of work are available, retain in his employment any worker for a period of more than seven (7) days after being advised by the Union concerned that such worker has not complied with either subclause (d) or paragraph (iv) of subclause (e) of this clause or for a period of more than seven (7) days after a conviction for a breach of this clause in reference to the employment of such worker.

#### 9.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

#### 10.-Wages.

(a) The minimum rates payable to workers shall be in accordance with the Schedule attached hereto. The rates, for convenience sake, are set forth in weekly amounts.

(b) A casual worker shall be paid at the rate of ten percent (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed by this Award.

#### 11.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

# 12.-Special Rates and Provisions.

(a) Height Money.—Workers (except riggers and splicers on buildings) engaged in the erection of steel frame buildings, bridges and gasometers at a height of fifty feet (50 ft.) or more above the nearest horizontal plane shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per day extra.

(b) Dirt Money.—Threepence (3d.) per hour extra shall be paid workers when engaged on work of an unusually dirty nature, where clothes are necessarily unduly soiled or injured or boots are unduly injured by the nature of the work done.

(c) Confined Space.—Eightpence (8d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when working in "confined space" which means: A compartment or space the dimensions of which necessitate a worker working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position, or without proper ventilation.

(d) Hot Places.—Workers required to work in a boiler which has not been cooled down, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for each hour so worked, in addition to any dirt and confined space money payable. Any broken time of less than one (1) hour shall be paid for as one (1) hour.

(e) Protective Equipment—

- (i) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as, for example, hand screens, goggles, glasses, gloves, aprons, leggings and gum boots) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary.: It shall be a defence to an employer charged with a breach of this subclause if he proves that he was unable to obtain either the item of equipment the subject of the charge or a suitable substitute.
- (ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective equipment and shall return same to the employer when he has finished using it or on leaving his employment.
- (iii) No worker shall lend another worker any such article of protective equipment issued to such first-mentioned worker, and if the same is lent, both the lender and borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.
- (iv) Before goggles, glasses, or gloves or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the employer to another worker, they shall be effectively sterilised.
  - (v) During the time any article of protective equipment is on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

(f) When working pneumatic riveter of the percussion type and other pneumatic tools of the percussion type, workers shall be paid fourpence (4d.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.

(g) The work of an electrical fitter shall not be tested by a worker of lower grade.

(h) A tradesman (not employed as a first class welder) who, in addition to his employment as such, is also required to do welding other than heating and cutting of a minor nature, shall be entitled to receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged.

(i) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

#### 13.—Outside Work.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except where travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid. (b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates, up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period from the time of starting on the journey; provided that when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

#### 14.—Travelling.

(a) The fares of a worker proceeding for the first time from the place of engagement to work at Kununurra shall be paid by the employer who may deduct the amount thereof from the subsequent earnings of the worker. Provided that the amount so deducted shall be refunded to the worker if he continues to work for the employer for at least six months or, if the work ceases sooner, for so long as the work continues.

(b) If the worker continues to work for an employer for at least six months the employer shall, on termination of the worker's engagement by the employer except in the case of misconduct by the worker, pay the fare of the worker back from Kununurra to the place of engagement if the worker so desires.

#### 15.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week, and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day, Monday to Friday inclusive, and except in the case of shift workers, shall be worked between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Provided that other starting and finishing times may be fixed in particular cases by agreement between the employer and the Union concerned.

(b) (i) Meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(ii) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by workers during this interval but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any worker of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied, the Court may grant the employer concerned exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

(iii) In respect to any employer where the majority of the workers employed are not subject to this Award, the provisions of this clause shall not apply, but the workers shall be entitled to the rest period if any, which may be allowed to the majority of workers aforesaid.

(c) By agreement between the employer and his workers, the ordinary hours may be worked on the basis of eighty (80) hours per fortnight.

#### 16.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any weekday, other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on Sundays or on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) of clause 17 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days. Provided that by agreement between the employer and the worker concerned payment for work done on any of the holidays prescribed in subclause (17a) hereof except Christmas Day and Wyndham Cup Day, may be made at ordinary rates and a period equivalent to the time so worked shall be added to the worker's entitlement to annual leave. (c) (i) Rest period after overtime. When overtime is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates.

(e) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.

(f) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(g) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

(h) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid five shillings (5s.) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall unless he has notified the worker concerned on the previous day or earlier, that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(i) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(j) When computing overtime any district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

## 17.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to clause 16 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day Wyndham Cup Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two periods.

(j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 18.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more or where it is unreasonably difficult for the worker to obtain such a certificate.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

#### 19.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of regulation 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

# 20.—District Allowance.

(a) Except as otherwise provided herein all workers covered by this Award shall be paid in addition to the wages prescribed herein an amount at the rate of three pounds ten shillings ( $\pounds$ 3 10s.) per week of seven (7) days.

(b) Workers provided with free board and lodging shall only be entitled to payment of half the allowance prescribed in subclause (a) hereof.

(c) Liberty is reserved to the respondents to apply to vary this clause.

#### 21.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate. This clause shall be deemed not to include any of the rates prescribed in clause 12 hereof.

#### 22.-Record Book.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this

provision to the extent of the information recorded. (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the union during the usual office hours at the employer's office or other convenient place and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this paragraph, and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours either at the employer's office or at the works.

# 23.—Right of Entry.

On notifying the officer in charge an accredited representative of the Union shall have the right to enter any place at any time during which work is being carried on by workers covered by this award but shall not interfere with the carrying out of such work.

### 24.—Cadets.

(a) Notwithstanding anything contained or implied herein, a bona fide employer shall be permitted to appoint one (1) son (or any other nominee) as a cadet to learn all the branches of the trade or calling of such employer. Only one (1) such cadet at any particular time shall be permitted any employer.

(b) The employer of a cadet shall notify the Industrial Registrar within fourteen (14) days of his engagement. Upon receipt of such notification, the Registrar shall give the union fourteen (14) days in which to object to the employment of the cadet.

(c) On receipt of an objection the matter shall be referred to the Court and the Court, after hearing the parties, may make such order as it thinks fit.

(d) University, Technical College and School of Mines Students. Provision may be made by agreement between the parties as to terms and conditions of employment, but any such agreement shall be submitted to the Court for approval within one (1) month after the making thereof.

# 25.-Long Service Leave.

#### (a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

#### (b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st December, 1961 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include-

- (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
- (b) Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
- (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
- (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
  - (i) As a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
  - (ii) As a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
  - (iii) In any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the cominencement of such service. (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding:

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4)hereof) count as service.

#### (c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed —13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
  - (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference. of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave innmediately prior to such termination.

#### (d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

#### (e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference, the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—
  - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;
  - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
  - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

# (g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

#### (h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

### (i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of December, 1961, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

#### (j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

#### (k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

# 26.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to either of the parties hereto to apply in respect to conditions for shift work. In witness whereof this Award has been signed by the President of the Court and the Seal of the
