In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, and in the matter of an Industrial Dispute between The Boilermakers' Society of Australia, Union of Workers, Coastal Districts, W.A.; Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Engineering Union Association of Workers; Australasian Society of Engineers Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, W.A.; The Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia and the Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Branch), Perth, Applicants, and Tomlinson Steel Limited, trading as Field Construction Co. and World Services Pty. Limited, Respondents.

WHEREAS by a reference dated the 9th day of February, 1962, the Conciliation Commissioner in the exercise of powers and authority delegated to him in accordance with section 108B of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, and acting under the provisions of section 171 (7) of the said Act, did refer to the Court of Arbitration to be heard and determined in accordance with the said Act an industrial dispute between the first four of the abovenamed applicants and the respondents, it having appeared that the said dispute could not be settled at a compulsory conference between the said parties previously held pursuant to the said Act at which conference no agreement was arrived at, and whereas when the matter was called on for hearing before the Court the fifth abovenamed applicant, viz., the Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Branch), Perth was ordered to be added as an applicant to the said reference: Now, therefore, the Court, having heard the representatives of the applicants and the respondents and the evidence tendered on behalf of the applicants and respondents, doth hereby make the following Award in determination of the said industrial dispute:—

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Metal Trades (Oil Refinery Extensions Construction) Award, 1962."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect only within the enclosure on which is situated the oil refinery at Kwinana.

5.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all employers engaged in the construction for the lubricating oil project of extensions and additions to the oil refinery plant, tanks and pipelines at Kwinana and other work incidental thereto in respect of workers coming within the classifications set out in clause 22 hereof.

6.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day or (if the employer terminates it) by payment of one (1) week's pay, except—

- (i) in the case of a casual worker when one (1) hour's notice shall suffice, and
- (ii) for the first month of employment, when the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice or a day's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty but does not do so, unless such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 12 or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

7.—Loss of Time by Strikes and Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by members of any union a party to this Award or of any other union of workers or because of the breakdown of the employer's machinery.

8.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

9.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day, Monday to Friday inclusive, and shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(b) Meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by workers during this interval.

10.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in Clause 11 shall be paid for at double time rates.

(c) (i) Rest period after overtime.—When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(ii) A worker (other than a casual worker) who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(iii) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates.

(e) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(f) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

(g) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or be paid six shillings (6s.) for a meal. If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meal or pay an amount of six shillings (6s.). If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(h) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement, subject to the approval of the shop steward.

(ii) No organisation party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

11.—Holidays.

(a) (i) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to subclause 10 (b), be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties, in lieu of any of the days named in this subclause.

(ii) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday or a Monday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday; in each such case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in

which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two (2) periods.

12.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth ($\frac{1}{12}$) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to

this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

13.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purposes of this Award, a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated jointly by the applicants and the other jointly by the respondents to this Award.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them.

(ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of regulation 106 of the regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

14.—Protective Equipment.

(a) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as, for example, hand screens, goggles, glasses, gloves, aprons, leggings and gum boots) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary. It shall be a defence by an employer charged with a breach of this subclause if he proves that he was unable to obtain either the item of equipment the subject of the charge or a suitable substitute.

(b) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective equipment and shall return same to the employer when he has finished using it or on leaving his employment.

(c) No worker shall lend another worker any such article of protective equipment issued to such first mentioned worker and, if the same are lent, both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.

(d) Before goggles, glasses, or gloves or any such substitutes which have been used by a worker are re-issued by the employer to another worker, they shall be effectively sterilised.

(e) During the time any article of protective equipment is on issue to the worker, he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

15.—Fares and Travelling Time.

The employer shall pay to all workers, in addition to the wages prescribed in clause 22 hereof, an allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per day to compensate for the excess fares and travelling time involved in travelling to and from the site of the work. Provided however that where an employer provides or arranges to be provided, free of cost to the workers, transport provided with suitable seating and weatherproof covering, from Perth to the site of the work and return adequate for the number of men who wish to avail themselves of such transport, the daily allowance payable to all workers, whether or not they do in fact use such transport, shall be five shillings (5s.) in lieu of the allowance of ten shillings (10s.) hereinbefore prescribed.

16.—Representatives Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one (1) week.

17.—Union Representatives.

The employer shall allow any job steward appointed by the union the right to discuss on the site with appropriate representatives of the employer matters affecting the workers whom he represents. Provided however that any such job steward shall not leave his place of work for the purpose of investigating or discussing with the employer's representative any such matter unless on each occasion he first obtains permission to do so from his foreman or supervisor or unless, in the absence of both the foreman and supervisor, he first notifies the leading hand.

18.—Disputes.

To facilitate the remedying of any grievance or the settlement of any dispute, the following procedure shall apply:—

(a) The job steward on the site shall discuss any matter affecting the workers concerned, with the foreman and, failing the matter being then satisfactorily resolved, he shall approach the Industrial Officer or other officer nominated by the employer to deal with such matters on the site, for further discussion.

(b) If the matter is not resolved at these discussions, the job steward shall notify the secretary of the Union of the matter and discussions will then be carried on by representatives of the employer and the union.

(c) Work shall be carried on during any such negotiations or discussions and, failing the matter being satisfactorily settled, it shall be referred to a Board of Reference or in cases where a Board of Reference would not have jurisdiction to determine the matter, to the President of the Court or the Conciliation Commissioner if the President delegates authority to him for the purpose of calling a compulsory conference under the Act.

19.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this paragraph and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours, either at the employer's office or at the works.

20.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to financial members of the unions party to this Award.

21.—Definitions.

(a) "Electrical fitter" means a worker employed in making, repairing, altering, assembling, testing, winding or wiring electrical machines, instruments, meters, or other apparatus, other than wires leading thereto, but a worker whose duty consists of placing electrodes in "neon" tubes sealed by the worker shall not be deemed for that reason to be an electrical fitter. Provided however that a worker employed as a meter tester shall not be classed as an electrical fitter.

(b) "Electrical installer" means a worker engaged in the installation of electric lighting, electric meters, bells, telephones, or motors and apparatus used in connection therewith, and includes a worker engaged in the running, repairing and testing of wires used for lighting, heating or power purposes. The term does not include a worker who fixes a motor on a concrete bed or who erects metal frames for the support of apparatus used in connection with the generation or distribution of electricity.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers under this Award shall be:—

(c) Leading Hands—"Leading hand" means any worker placed in charge of three (3) or more other workers. A leading hand shall be paid such extra rate as hereinafter prescribed, viz:—

- (i) When in charge of not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers he shall be paid nineteen shillings (19s.) per week extra.
- (ii) When in charge of more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers he shall be paid thirty-eight shillings and sixpence (38s. 6d.) per week extra.
- (iii) When in charge of more than twenty (20) other workers he shall be paid fifty-seven shillings and sixpence (57s. 6d.) per week extra.

23.—Liberty to Apply.

A general liberty is reserved to any party to this Award to apply to amend the Award by inserting new provisions therein or by varying or rescinding any provision thereof.

No. 4 of 1962.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 6th day of March, 1962, between the W.A. Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers of the one part and the Hon. Minister for Industrial Development of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Chemical Workers Wundowie Agreement and shall replace Agreement No. 25 of 1950, as amended.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers engaged in occupations mentioned herein and employed in connection with the Refinery section of the Wood Distillation, Charcoal Iron and Steel Industry, Wundowie, as carried out by the Minister for Industrial Development.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year from the date hereof.

5.—Hours (Day Workers).

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day Monday to Friday inclusive and shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(b) The meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

(c) (i) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing work to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning.

(ii) This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by workers during this interval, but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any worker of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied, the Court may grant the employer concerned exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

6.—Overtime (Day Workers).

(a) All time worked in excess of the daily rostered hours or in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Saturday.—Work performed on Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, but if work is performed in any period after 5 p.m. the worker shall be paid double time for all time worked after that hour.

Sundays.—Work performed on Sunday shall be at the rate of double time except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations, in which case the rate of time and a half shall apply.

(c) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving such premises) he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(d) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after his usual knock off time for more than one hour, or after 6 p.m. whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or be paid 5s. in lieu thereof.

(e) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than five (5) hours without a break for a meal.

(f) When a worker is required for duty during the meal interval, whereby his meal is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the time he usually commences his meal interval until he gets his meal.

(g) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

7.—Continuous Shift Workers.

(a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed 40 in any week to be worked in five shifts of eight hours each inclusive of crib time.

(b) All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours as prescribed shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves, or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts.

The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two hours, after the expiration of which, overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.

(d) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving such premises) he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(e) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after his usual knock off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or be paid five shillings (5s.) in lieu thereof.

(f) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than five (5) hours without a break for a meal.

(g) All work performed during ordinary working hours on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid at the rate of time and a half. These rates shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowances prescribed in subclause (j) hereof.

(h) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate, i.e., double ordinary rate.

(i) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(j) Shift workers, other than day shift workers, shall be paid 5 per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate for afternoon shift and 10 per cent. (10%) for night shift.

8.—Shift Work.

(a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one (1) week on day shift out of each consecutive three (3) weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter: Provided that if he is required to work for more than one (1) week consecutively on afternoon or night shift, such worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second or subsequent weeks of afternoon or night shift.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers to whom it would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to a private arrangement with another worker, nor to workers (known as "relief workers") regularly employed on continuous process work who are required to work shifts to enable other workers engaged on such work to change shifts weekly and to have their days off, if such relief worker is not required to work more night or afternoon shifts than the number of day shifts worked by him.

(b) (i) Where any particular process is carried out by workers on shifts other than day shifts and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then such workers shall be paid at overtime rates. A worker who replaces a regular shift worker on afternoon or night shift, absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive afternoon or night shifts and at the appropriate shift work rates if he works five (5) or more of such shifts consecutively.

(ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or public holiday.

9.—Rest Period After Overtime.

(a) When overtime work is necessary, it shall wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

(b) A worker, other than a casual worker, who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next that he has not at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

(c) If, on the instructions of his employer, such a worker resumes or continues work without having had such eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had eight (8) consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

11.—Extra Rates and General Conditions.

(a) Dirt Money.—Workers employed on work of an unusually dirty or obnoxious nature and whose marginal rate contains no monetary allowance for working under such conditions shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per shift in addition to the daily rate of pay.

The officer in charge shall decide whether work is dirty work within the meaning of this clause.

(b) Protective Equipment.—(i) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as for example, safety helmets, goggles and gloves) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary. Workers required to work in the rain shall, on request, be supplied with gum boots and/or oilskins by special arrangement with the management.

(ii) Every worker shall sign an acknowledgment on receipt of any article of protective equipment and shall return same to the employer when he has finished using it or on leaving his employment.

(iii) No worker shall lend another such worker any article of protective equipment issued to such first mentioned worker, and if same are lent, both the lender and the borrower shall be deemed guilty of wilful misconduct.

12.—Higher Duties.

If a worker is employed on work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary work for more than two (2) hours in any shift, he shall be paid the minimum rate for such work for the whole of the shift. If he is employed for less than two (2) hours, he shall be paid at his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

13.—Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of casual workers whose engagement shall be by the day, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or the worker fails to give the required notice, one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 17, or such absence is on account of holidays, annual leave or long service leave to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Agreement.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for wilful misconduct.

14.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union associated with it or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent with the exception of wet weather in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the officer in charge.

15.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept, a time and wages record, wherein shall be entered the name of each worker, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day and the amount of overtime, if any. Such book shall be open for inspection by an accredited representative of the Union at the plant office during working hours.

16.—Casual Workers.

Workers employed for less than one week shall be paid 10 per cent. (10%) above the rate specified for the work.

17.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate, and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

(e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.

(ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

18.—Annual Leave.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(ii) Seven day shift workers, i.e., shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof.

Where a worker with 12 months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying 12-monthly period as a seven day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two (2) consecutive weeks annual leave prescribed in subclause (a) (i) hereof increased by half a day for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.

(b) If any holiday under this Agreement falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday as aforesaid.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service. Provided that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not effect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) "Ordinary Wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof, shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

19.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Eastern Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or be taken at some subsequent date, if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

20.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties. There shall be assigned to such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

21.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of Long Service Leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

22.—Preference to Unionists.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the W.A. Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of any registered industrial union shall within fourteen days of commencing employment under this Agreement make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another registered industrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within fourteen days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the W.A. Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers.

23.—Right of Entry.

With the permission of the officer in charge, any officer of the union authorised in writing by the President and Secretary of such union shall have the right to enter the premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of conversing with or interviewing members of the union covered by this Agreement.

Provided that such officer shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work.

The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.
