therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 4th day of June, 1962, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 115 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1959, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule, registered small shops, and those establishments which, in accordance with Order numbered 62 of 1962 made under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, observed and substituted as a holiday the day specified in that Order) and warehouses, shall be closed.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF  
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 62 of 1962.

In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, and in the matter of various Awards and Industrial Agreements.

WHEREAS special circumstances have arisen which in the opinion of the Court make it desirable and necessary to amend all Awards and Industrial Agreements made or registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, in which Foundation Day is prescribed to be a holiday without loss of pay (save and except as set out in the proviso to this Order), and whereas the representatives of the majority of industrial unions of workers and the representative of the majority of employers and of industrial unions of employers parties to those said Awards and Industrial Agreements have agreed that those said Awards and Industrial Agreements be amended in the manner hereinafter appearing, the Court hereby of its own motion, doth order and declare that any employer bound by any such Award or Industrial Agreement may at his option allow to workers employed by him in any establishment or section of an establishment under the terms of any such Award or Industrial Agreement the 24th day of April, 1962 as a holiday without loss of pay in substitution for Foundation Day in the year 1962, and it is further ordered that in respect to such employers who exercise the option conferred by this Order the relevant Award or Industrial Agreement shall be read as if, in respect to the year 1962, the words "the 24th day of April" were substituted for the words "Foundation Day," so that Foundation Day the 4th day of June, 1962 shall for such employers and all workers employed by them on that day in such establishment or section (whether or not any such worker was employed by that employer on the 24th day of April, 1962 in such establishment or section) be deemed to be an ordinary working day provided that nothing in this Order shall in any way affect or modify the provisions in respect to holidays contained in the Superphosphate Workers' Award (No. 6 of 1961) or The Sugar Refining Workers' Industrial Agreement (Registered No. 36 of 1960) Nor shall it affect, except with the consent of the industrial union of workers to which such worker is eligible to be a member the holidays prescribed by the Building Trades Award (No. 24 of 1958) for any worker who as part of his daily or weekly wages receives the allowance for lost time, statutory holidays, sick leave and follow the job prescribed by clause 9 (d) of that Award.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Minister for Agriculture, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, Hereby Declare the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Kimberley Research Station Award 1962 and shall replace Agreement No. 24 of 1950 as varied.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof.

4.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers classified in Clause 7 hereof employed by the respondent at the Kimberley Research Station, Ord River.

5.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture as the case may be of a week's wage in lieu of such notice.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker fails to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness or is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with

it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

6.—Payment of Fares.

The employer shall pay all transport fares, or shall provide transport free of charge from the place of engagement to the Kimberley Research Station, and when the workers' services are terminated because there is no further work available, return fares or transport to place of engagement shall also be paid or be provided by the employer: Provided that, in the event of any worker leaving the work of his own accord, or being dismissed on account of misconduct or unsatisfactory work within twelve (12) months of time of engagement, the amount of the fare to the job may be deducted from any amounts due to such worker at the time of dismissal, and he shall forfeit privileges of free return to place of engagement.

8.—Hours.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided the ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week, to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Saturday inclusive. A majority of the workers concerned and the employer may mutually agree upon the starting and finishing time for each day.

(b) The hours of domestics and stockmen shall not exceed eighty (80) per fortnight to be worked in any ten (10) days in such fortnightly period.

9.—Overtime.

(a) (i) All work performed outside the daily spread of hours or in excess of forty (40) hours per week or.

(ii) All work performed by domestics and stockmen in excess of eighty (80) hours per fortnight shall be deemed to be overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and one half.

(b) All work performed by a domestic on a day or days on which he or she is rostered off duty shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.

(ii) The union or worker or workers covered by this award shall not in any way whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

#### 10.—Spread of Shifts.

The daily spread of shifts shall mean the period between the time when the worker first commences work and the time when he or she finishes work for the day. The daily spread of shifts shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

#### 11.—Deductions.

(a) Workers provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to a maximum of 28 per cent. of the male basic wage; provided that no charge shall be made when a worker is away during annual leave.

(b) The deductions as specified above shall be made from the wages set out herein.

#### 12.—Public Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day (January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that by agreement between the Union and the employer the local race day for the district may be substituted for one of the above holidays.

(b) Whenever any holiday falls on a worker's ordinary working day and the worker is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.

(c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.

(d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.

(e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.

(f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

#### 13.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve month's continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a workers' period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid, subject to such day being taken at a time mutually arranged between employer and worker.

(c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such annual leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for pecculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for pecculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(f) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.

(g) Workers regularly working for the Government North of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the Department. Such workers who proceed to Fremantle and Geraldton during the period of such leave shall be allowed once in each two (2) years reasonable travelling time on the forward and return journeys between the place of their employment and either of the said ports.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 14.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Award.

#### 15.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-twelfth (1/12th.) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.

(a) (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

16.—District allowance.

District allowance shall be paid in accordance with the relative provisions of Award No. 35 of 1952 as may be amended.

17.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

18.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the said Union shall within 14 days of commencing employment under this Award make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another industrial union, shall, upon expiration of his current membership with such other union, within 14 days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

19.—Definitions.

"General farm hand" shall mean a worker called upon to carry out all duties associated with the various activities of the respondents to this Award relating to the operating and servicing of farm machinery and equipment in addition to other work involved in primary agricultural production.

"Leading hand" shall mean a worker who is in charge of, and directs the work of, three or more workers under this Award.
