WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1961, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to

be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedules hereunder be declared totalisator agency regions for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the land described in the schedules hereunder shall be totalisator agency regions for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1961, in the case of the land described in the First Schedule, as from and including the 9th day of July, 1962, and, in the case of the land described in the Second Schedule, as from and including the 23rd day of July, 1962.

First Schedule.

The whole of the land contained in the municipal district of the town of York.

Second Schedule.

The whole of the land contained in the townsite of Kalamunda, as defined in the *Government Gazette* published on the 5th June, 1959.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 4th day of July, 1962, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 60891/55.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time alter or extend the

boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area or of any District; and whereas it is desirable to extend the boundaries of the said Area and of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage District as hereinafter described: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, and of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage District, are hereby extended by including therein the land described in the schedule hereto.

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the right bank of the Serpentine River and the western boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 135 (portion of Class A Reserve 3355) and extending southerly in prolongation of that boundary to the southern side of Falls Road (road number 971); thence generally westerly along that side to the northernmost north-western corner of location 289; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to and along the northern boundaries of location 628 and Serpentine Town Lot 58 to the north-western corner of that lot; thence west-north-westerly to the north-eastern corner of location 487; thence westerly along the northern boundaries of that location and Serpentine Agricultural Area Lot 92 and onwards to the eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence generally northerly along that side to the right bank of the Serpentine River aforesaid, and thence generally south-easterly upwards along that bank to the starting point.

Being the land delineated and shown bordered brown on Plan M.W.S.S. and D.D., W.A. No. 8733.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 6th day of July, 1962.

3. To the extent that any by-law howsoever made either before or after this Scheme comes into operation is inconsistent with this Scheme for the within area then to the extent of such inconsistency and within the area to which this Scheme applies the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

4. The responsible authority for carrying out this Scheme is the City of South Perth.

Arrangement of Scheme.

5. This Planning Scheme is divided into the following Parts and Schedules:—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

PART II.—ZONING.

PART III.—RESERVED LAND.

PART IV.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS AS TO CERTAIN ZONES AND USES.

PART V.—NON-CONFORMING USES.

PART VI.—GENERAL.

First—Land Use Map (Annotated Map No. 1).

Second—Planning Scheme Map (Annotated Map No. 3).

Third—Standard Service Station Layout.

Interpretation.

6. In this Scheme unless the context otherwise indicates the following terms shall have the following meaning set against them hereunder respectively:—

"Act" means The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961.

"Advertising hoardings" includes any building or sign constructed painted or howsoever erected for the display of an advertisement.

"Approved date" means the date on which the notice of the approval of this Planning Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

"Building" includes any structure and any part thereof whether fixed moveable or otherwise permanent or temporary and includes tents. Fences erected on surveyed boundaries are excluded.

"Building line" bears the meaning set out in the Local Government Act, 1960, as amended.

"Building set back line" means a line fixed at a distance as prescribed in clause 38 hereof from the building line or where no building line exists the frontage between which line and the building line or frontage as the case may be: No building other than fences, swimming pools and appurtenances thereto not projecting more than two (2) feet above the surface of the ground and uses incidental to gardens may be erected.

"Car park" means a site or building used primarily for parking private cars or taxis whether a public or private park but not including parts of the public road used for parking or a taxi rank, and does not include land on which cars are displayed for sale.

"Commercial floor space" means the total area of floor space measured from the inside faces of external walls but excluding passages and amenities, lifts, stairs, plant and storage rooms and areas used exclusively for the parking of wheeled vehicles if such areas are either within the building or below the surface of the ground and finished with a flat roof and reinforced concrete including access to and from such areas, and "office floor space" has the same meaning.

"Duplex house" means a building comprising two dwellings each being complete and self contained.

"Flats" means any building constructed or used for the purpose of residence and containing two or more separate tenements and includes single unit flats as set out in clause 403 of Uniform General Building By-laws contained in *Government Gazette* (No. 54) of 1961.

"Foreshore" means that portion of land as is comprised within the following boundaries: To the west by Mendis Street, to the east

by Ellam Street, to the south by Mill Point Road and to the north by Perth Water.

"Frontage" means—

- (a) The boundary between an allotment and the street which the allotment abuts upon or to which it is adjacent.
- (b) When an allotment abuts upon or is adjacent to two or more intersecting streets the boundary between the allotment and either one of the intersecting streets.

General conditions:—

- (i) For the purpose of this Scheme the width of the frontage of any land shall be deemed to be the distance measured in a horizontal plane at right angles to one of the boundaries of the side of the land from its intersection with the alignment of the street to the opposite boundary of the land or a prolongation of the boundary. In the event of the side boundaries of the land not being parallel the average of the distances so measured shall be the width of the frontage.
- (ii) Where a corner of an allotment at the junction or intersection of any streets has been truncated:
 - (a) The width of the frontage shall be measured from a point at the intersection of the prolongations of the side and front boundaries of the allotment.
 - (b) The area shall be calculated as if the land thereby excised were portion of the allotment.

"Home occupation" means a business carried on with the permission of the responsible authority within a house or curtilage of a house which—

- (a) does not entail the employment of any person not a member of the occupier's family except in the case of a professional man;
- (b) does not occupy an area greater than 200 square feet;
- (c) does not require any essential service main of a greater capacity normally required in the zone in which it is located.

"Hotel" means premises in respect of which is granted a Publican's General License or an Hotel License under the Licensing Act, 1911, as amended, or re-enacted.

"House" means a building used primarily for living purposes as one separate dwelling. The term also includes such outbuildings and recreational uses as are ordinarily used therewith.

"Light industry" means an industry in which the processes carried on and the transport of the materials, goods and commodities to and from the premises will not cause any injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste water, waste products, grit, oil or otherwise and in which the machinery used if any is powered by electricity.

"Lot" bears the meaning given to it in the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961, and allotment has the same meaning.

"Map" means a Planning Scheme map comprised in any of the schedules hereto.

"Motel" means any premises used or intended to be used for providing accommodation to the travelling public at large for reward and denominated by the owner or occupier

by the use of the word "Motel." Whether alone or in conjunction with other words and without limiting the generality hereof a motel may be or comprise premises licensed under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911.

"Non-conforming use" means the use of land which though lawful immediately prior to the coming into operation of this Scheme is not in conformity with the provisions of the zone or reserve within which it is located.

"Offices" means any building constructed or used for general clerical purposes and including the purpose of his occupation by advertising agent, banker, drycleaner (reception and delivery only), employment agency, estate agent, government office (clerical only), hairdresser, hire car service (clerical only), insurance, Local Government authority (clerical only), photographer, police station, post office, public typistes and secretarial service, taxi service, travel agent.

"Office floor space" bears the same meaning as commercial floor space.

"Plot ratio" bears the meaning set out in Uniform General By-laws contained in *Government Gazette* (No. 54) of 1961.

"Private Hotel" means residential premises in respect of which may be granted any license other than a Publican's General License under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911, as amended.

"Professional offices" means any building constructed or used for the purpose of his profession by an accountant, architect, artist, author, barrister, chiroprapist, consular official, dentist, doctor, engineer, masseur, nurse, physiotherapist, quantity surveyor, solicitor, surveyor, teacher (other than a dancing teacher or a music teacher) or town planner, and "professional person" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Registered club" means a club registered or deemed to be registered under the Licensing Act, 1911, as amended.

"Service station" means business premises for the supply of liquid fuels, lubricants, accessories and parts for motor vehicles, tractors and engines and which shall be designed to the standards set out in the Fourth Schedule but does not include panel beating, spray painting or motor engineering works.

"Shop" means any permanent roofed building constructed and used for retail sales and is not used by or in association with any service station, used car dealer, warehouse or wholesaler.

"Service industry" means a light industry carried on in premises having a retail shop front and in which goods may be manufactured only for sale on the premises or a shop being used as a depot for receiving goods to be serviced by the industry.

Application of Scheme.

7. After the approved date—

- (a) all alterations to or modifications of existing works or buildings;
- (b) the carrying out constructions or erection of all new works or new buildings; and
- (c) the use of or the adoption for the use of any land building or works;

otherwise than in conformity with the provisions of this Planning Scheme are prohibited.

PART II.—ZONING.

In this Scheme the Planning Area set out and described on the map in the Second Schedule hereto is divided into the following zones:—

- (a) Multi Storey Flats—Zone A.
- (b) Multi Storey Flats—Zone B.
- (c) Residential Zone A.
- (d) Commercial Zone A.
- (e) Commercial Zone B.

- (f) Business Development Zone.
- (g) Special Business Zone.
- (h) Special Zone A.
- (i) Special Zone B.
- (j) Special Zone C.
- (k) Special College Extension Zone.
- (l) Civic Uses Zone.
- (m) Service Station Zone.
- (n) Public Assembly Zone.

9. The provisions of this Part and Part III hereof shall be subject to the conditions and provisions contained in Part IV and V of this Scheme.

Multi Storey Flats—Zone A.

10. (i) The several pieces of land coloured brown on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Multi Storey Flats—Zone A.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Houses.
- (b) Duplex houses.
- (c) Home occupation.
- (d) Flats.
- (e) Car parks.
- (f) Professional offices.
- (g) A shop within a flats building which is designed to service the needs only of the flats and is not visible from any public place.
- (h) Boarding houses.
- (i) Private hotels.
- (j) Places of worship.

Multi Storey Flats—Zone B.

11. (i) The several pieces of land coloured brown with a blue border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Multi Storey Flats—Zone B.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Houses.
- (b) Duplex houses.
- (c) Home occupation.
- (d) Flats.
- (e) Professional offices.
- (f) Car parks.
- (g) Cafes, dining rooms, restaurants.
- (h) Private hotels.
- (i) Office within a residential building.
- (j) A shop within a flats building which is designed to service the needs only of the flats and is not visible from any public place.
- (k) Boarding houses.
- (l) Places of worship.
- (m) Clubs, registered clubs.

(iii) Within this zone no fence which is greater in height than four (4) feet shall be erected closer to the frontage than the building set back line.

Residential Zone A.

12. (i) The several pieces of land coloured pink on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Residential Zone A.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Flats provided that flats built on any lot abutting the Esplanade shall have a floor area for each separate flat unit of not less than 600 square feet excluding any provision for verandahs and balconies covered ways and light courts.
- (b) Houses.
- (c) Duplex houses.
- (d) Boarding houses.
- (e) Private hotels.
- (f) Home occupation.
- (g) The office of a professional person where it is part of and ancillary to a house on the same site.
- (h) Car parks.
- (i) Places of worship.

Commercial Zone A.

13. (i) The several pieces of land coloured light blue with dark blue border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Commercial Zone A.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Shops, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within such shop is used for the display of goods for sale.
- (b) Offices.
- (c) Professional offices.
- (d) A flat, flats or house above or at the rear of any shop, office, or professional office provided that if at the rear on the ground floor it shall be not closer than 50 feet to the building line.
- (e) Car parks.
- (f) Service industry, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within the building is used for the display of goods for sale.

Commercial Zone B.

14. (i) The several pieces of land coloured blue with brown stripes on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Commercial Zone B.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Shops, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within such shop is used for the display of goods for sale.
- (b) Offices.
- (c) Professional offices.
- (d) Flats in which at least the ground floor is used solely for purposes of shops as aforesaid or offices or both.
- (e) Television Studios.
- (f) Car Parks.
- (g) Service Industry, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within the building is used for the display of goods for sale.

Business Development Zone.

15. (i) The several pieces of land coloured blue, blue stripes and blue border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Business Development Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Shops, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within such shop is used for the display of goods for sale.
- (b) Hotels.
- (c) Clubs, registered clubs.
- (d) Offices.
- (e) Professional offices.
- (f) Service industry, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within the building is used for the display of goods for sale.
- (g) Service stations.

Special Business Zone.

16. (i) The several pieces of land coloured light blue with dark blue diagonal cross on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Special Business Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Houses.
- (b) Flats.
- (c) Cafes, tea house or gardens, kiosks and such other uses as in the opinion of the responsible authority may enhance the facilities of the sur-

rounding areas and provide an amenity for the public.

Special Zone A.

17. (i) The several pieces of land coloured light green and dark green diagonal stripes on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Special Zone A.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or buildings or the construction of any building or works is hereby prohibited unless such land or building is used for any of the purposes following and the development of such reserves contained in the foreshore area as shall be nominated by the responsible authority according to any of the uses therein allowed has been commenced and continued so that the development of such reserves is carried on contemporaneously with the development of any land within this zone.

Purposes:—

- (a) Flats.
- (b) Sports grounds.
- (c) Swimming pools.
- (d) Sports stadia.
- (e) Car parks.
- (f) Cafes, dining rooms or restaurants.
- (g) Motels.
- (h) Botels.
- (i) Roads.
- (j) Gardens, waterways and ornamental lakes, small craft mooring and servicing.
- (k) Shops, provided that the maximum width of frontage at street level within such shop is used for the display of goods for sale.
- (l) A shop within a flats building which is designed to service the needs only of the flats and is not visible from public places.
- (m) Houses.
- (n) Hotels.
- (o) Schools.
- (p) Duplex houses.
- (q) home occupation.
- (r) Places of worship.
- (s) Service stations and petrol filling stations.
- (t) Private hotels.
- (u) Professional offices.

Special Zone B.

18. (i) The piece of land coloured brown with blue cross on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Special Zone B.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Golf club.
- (b) Any use in Multi Storey Flats-Zone B provided that its use is associated with or developed by the Royal Perth Golf Club Inc.

Special Zone C.

19. (i) The several pieces of land coloured green diagonal stripes and green border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Special Zone C.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Private schools.
- (b) Private kindergartens.
- (c) Churches or chapels.
- (d) Private playing fields and such other uses ancillary to religious institutions and private schools including houses as the responsible authority shall allow.

Special College Extension Zone.

20. (i) The several pieces of land of various colours overlaid with diagonal green stripes on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Special College Extension Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Houses.
- (b) Any use allowed in Special Zone C.

Civic Uses Zone.

21. (i) The several pieces of land coloured yellow and lettered "C" on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Civic Uses Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Houses.
- (b) Kindergartens.
- (c) Creches.
- (d) Libraries.
- (e) Public halls.
- (f) Places of public assembly.
- (g) gardens.
- (h) Car parks.
- (i) Roads and road widenings.

(iii) Within this zone land may be acquired either by agreement with the owner thereof and in default of agreement and with the consent of the Governor, by compulsory acquisition under the provisions of the Act by the responsible authority for purposes of the above uses and for no other purposes.

Service Station Zone.

22. (i) The several pieces of land coloured light blue with white dot and dark blue border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Service Station Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Service stations.
- (b) Car parks.

Public Assembly Zone.

23. (i) The several pieces of land coloured blue stripes and red border on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Public Assembly Zone.

(ii) Within this zone the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Public halls.
- (b) Places of public assembly.
- (c) Places of public worship.
- (d) Lodges.
- (e) Art galleries.

PART III.—RESERVED LAND.

24. In this scheme the planning area set out and described in the map in the Second Schedule hereto is divided into the following reserves:—

- (a) Private land which may be acquired by the responsible authority.
- (b) Civic uses reserve.
- (c) Crown land reclaimed.
- (d) Public recreation reserves.
- (e) Proposed new roads.
- (f) Proposed closure of roads.
- (g) Public roads.
- (h) Restricted access highway.

Private Land which may be Acquired by the Responsible Authority.

25. (i) The several pieces of land coloured red on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the private land which may be acquired by the responsible authority.

(ii) Within this reserve, land may be acquired either by agreement with the owner thereof and, in default of agreement, with the consent of the Governor by compulsory acquisition, under the

provisions of the Act, by the responsible authority for purposes of car parks, roads and parks and for no other purpose.

Civic Uses Reserve.

26. (i) The several pieces of land coloured yellow with brown border and lettered "C" on the map in the Second Schedule with or without other colour overlay and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Civic Uses Reserve.

(ii) Within this reserve the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than civic uses and such other uses which the responsible authority may permit to comply with the overlaying zone is hereby prohibited.

Crown Land Reclaimed.

27. (i) The pieces of land on the map in the Second Schedule coloured blue bordered by black line to Perth Water and a broken line away from Perth Water and included in which is land within such lines overlaid by other colours and symbols is Crown land which shall subject to the consent of the appropriate Minister be vested in the responsible authority.

(ii) Within this reserve such land—

- (a) where not overlaid by other colours and symbols shall be used solely for the purposes of public access, public recreation, sports pavilions, dressing sheds, parks, gardens, waterways, ornamental lakes, small craft mooring and public conveniences.
- (b) where overlaid by other colours and symbols shall be used solely for the purposes pertaining to such colours and symbols respectively as in this scheme set out.

Public Recreation Reserves.

28. (i) The several pieces of land coloured green on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the Public Recreation Reserves.

(ii) Within this reserve the use of any land or building or the construction of any building or works for any purpose other than the following is hereby prohibited:—

- (a) Public recreation, sports pavilion, dressing sheds and public conveniences.
- (b) Roads.
- (c) Access ways.
- (d) Car parks.
- (e) Golf course.
- (f) Playing fields.
- (g) Auditoriums.
- (h) Botanic gardens.
- (i) Waterways or ornamental lakes.
- (j) Yacht clubs.

Proposed New Roads.

29. (i) The several pieces of land coloured yellow or overlaying other colours in yellow on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map comprise the proposed new roads.

(ii) Within this reserve the use of any land for any purpose other than roadways and ancillary uses is hereby prohibited.

Proposed Closure of Roads.

30. (i) The roads or parts thereof shown by symbol black crosses on road reserves on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map are hereby closed or stopped up and all rights-of-way and other easements to which the same are subject are hereby extinguished.

(ii) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (i) of this clause in relation to any road or roads which at the approved date forms or form the only means of access to any land, the responsible authority shall, until either alternative access is available or access is no longer required, permit the use of such road or roads for the purposes of such access.

(iii) The responsible authority shall make such arrangements and agreements as are necessary for the removal of any service installations and fixtures which may have been lawfully laid over, on or under such road or roads.

(iv) Save as is provided in subclause (ii) of this clause land forming a closed road shall not be used for any purpose other than an access way for abutting owners or in accordance with the use pertaining to the zone or reserve indicated by the underlying colour or symbol on the map in the Second Schedule.

Public Roads.

31. Roads uncoloured on the map in the Second Schedule and indicated as such in the legend to such map are public roads.

The maintenance of public roads is the responsibility of the responsible authority.

Restricted Access Highway.

32. The highway described and coloured orange on the map in the Second Schedule is a restricted access highway under the control of the Main Roads Department pursuant to the Public Works Act.

PART IV.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS AS TO CERTAIN ZONES AND USES.

33. Wherever in this Part a maximum or minimum limit is provided or allowed for any purpose such maximum or minimum limit may be utilised to the full extent notwithstanding the provisions of any other by-law order or regulation imposing a greater or lesser limit and in the event of any conflict such other by-law order or regulation shall to the extent thereof be void and of no effect.

Car Parking.

34. Wherever in this Scheme provision is made for the use of land for the uses hereinafter set out in the zone specified alongside such use no building shall be constructed or used for such use unless car parking facilities of approved paving or hard standing surfaces or garages to the extent set out below together with all necessary access ways is provided on the land on which such building is erected:—

(a) Flats—All zones where permitted:

One car parking space or garage for as many cars as there are flat units within the flats.

(b) Professional Offices and Offices—All zones where permitted other than Commercial Zone A:

One car parking space or garage at the rate of one car for every 500 square feet of office floor space or part thereof together with extra car parking space or garage set aside for clients' use at the rate of one car parking space for every 1,500 square feet of office floor space or part thereof.

(c) Private Hotels and Boarding Houses—All zones where permitted:

One car parking space or garage for every bedroom.

(d) Shops—All zones where permitted other than Commercial Zone A:

Two (2) square feet of car parking space or garage for every square foot of commercial floor space.

(e) Places of Public Worship and Assembly—All zones where permitted:

Car parking space sufficient to provide one car for every six seats available for the public unless permitted by the Responsible Authority to use adjoining public parking areas.

(f) Cafes, Dining Rooms and Restaurants—All zones where permitted except Commercial Zone A:

Car parking space sufficient to provide one car park for every six seats available for customers.

(g) Clubs—All zones where permitted:

One car parking space or garage for every 500 square feet of floor space.

(h) Hotels and Registered Clubs—All zones where permitted:

One car parking space or garage for every 20 square feet of floor and ground area open to the public for the consumption of liquor plus one car parking space or garage for every bedroom.

Design.

35. (i) No building of more than two storeys shall be erected or built in any zone within this Scheme unless and until the responsible authority has approved the design subject to the principles herein contained and the following conditions have been complied with:—

- (a) The responsible authority is satisfied that such building will not destroy local amenities and will not clash in harmony with the exterior designs of adjoining buildings.
- (b) Such building is designed by and erected under the supervision of a duly qualified architect or engineer.
- (c) In considering the design of any such building within the Special Zone A the responsible authority shall take into consideration the relationship which such building or buildings proposed within the area bear to the development of public utilities, amenities and other uses planned for the foreshore area considered as a whole.
- (d) In considering the design of any building within the Business Development Zone the responsible authority shall take into consideration the provisions in the zone for car parking space, vehicular access, pedestrian ways and general layout relative to the development uses proposed for the whole zone and within this zone the development of single lots shall be considered as part of a general design for the whole zone.

(ii) The responsible authority may appoint an advisory committee consisting of the Mayor or his nominee and four architects or town planners being ratepayers of the municipality of South Perth and being selected by the responsible authority and approved by the President of their respective Institutes to advise the responsible authority on all questions of design and other matters falling within this clause.

Height Restrictions.

36. (a) No building within a Special Business Zone, Residential Zone, Commercial Zone A, Service Station Zone or Public Assembly Zone—

- (i) shall be greater in height than fifty (50) feet above the mean ground level of the allotment and subject thereto.
- (ii) shall have more than three storeys used for purposes of residence.

(b) No building erected for the purpose of a house within the Special College Extension Zone shall have more than two storeys.

(c) No building within the Civic Uses Zone shall have more than two storeys.

(d) Within a Multi Storey Flats—Zone A, Multi Storey Flats—Zone B, Commercial Zone B, Business Development Zone, Special Zone A and Special Zone B any building may subject to compliance with this Part have any number of storeys up to but not exceeding thirty.

Such building when it has more than three storeys is a multi storey building for the purpose of the next following clause.

Bulk Control and Site Coverage.

(a) In accordance with the requirements of the Uniform Building By-laws the following maximum plot ratios are prescribed for buildings in the following zones:—

(b) Where a zone permits multi storey buildings combining residential and non-residential purposes, no such building shall be erected with a plot ratio exceeding a figure being the ratio of the plot ratios comprised in paragraph (a) hereof proportionate to the respective purposes contained in such building.

(c) No building in any zone other than the following excepted buildings shall be constructed closer to the side and rear boundaries of the lot than ten (10) feet:—

Excepted Buildings:

- (i) All buildings in Commercial Zone A.
- (ii) All buildings in Business Development Zone.
- (iii) All houses in all zones.
- (iv) The ground floor of flats buildings in Commercial Zone B where the ground floor is used solely for the purposes of shops or offices or both provided that the provisions of this clause shall apply to all floors above normal ground floor.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other by-law, order or regulation to the contrary the responsible authority may in its discretion but within the limits hereinbefore set out vary the position of any building in relation to the boundaries of the lot on which it stands so that in relation to buildings already erected or proposed to be erected on neighbouring lots each building may have access to the greatest amount of light and view possible.

Building Set Back Line.

38. The building set back line for various roads is prescribed hereunder:—

- (a) Esplanade.—Forty (40) feet provided that houses may be constructed to within twenty-five (25) feet of the building line, and buildings within the Special Business Zone and Business Development Zone may be constructed to a building line to be determined by the responsible authority.
- (b) Melville Parade.—Forty (40) feet, provided that houses may be constructed to within twenty-five (25) feet of the frontage.
- (c) Mill Point Road.—Forty (40) feet.
- (d) Labouchere Road.—Forty (40) feet.
- (e) All other streets or roads not being within Business Development Zone, Commercial Zone A and Commercial Zone B.—Twenty-five (25) feet.

Provided that where the lot is situated at the corner of two or more roads then not being within Business Development Zone, Commercial Zone A and Commercial Zone B, then such distances may in the discretion of the responsible authority be reduced below the distance specified above.

Flat Frontages.

39. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme no flats shall be erected on any lot with a frontage of less than the distance specified alongside such type of flats in the table hereunder:—

	Frontage Minimum. Feet.
Flats of any height	66
Flats of up to two storeys	45

Provided that with the approval of the responsible authority, flats of one storey may be erected on a lot with a frontage of less than 45 feet.

Advertising.

40. In all zones except Commercial Zone A and Commercial Zone B, Business Development Zone and Special Business Zone no advertisement, hoarding or sign shall be constructed or used which—

- relates to any use not being carried on on the lot where the advertisement, hoarding or sign is erected;
- is larger in area than six (6) square feet;
- uses letters or figures of greater width and height than three (3) inches;
- if illuminated and within 500 feet of a traffic intersection is of such colour as to be confused with the traffic lights;
- clashes in design (in the opinion of the responsible authority) with the general harmony and beauty of the neighbouring area.

Prohibition of Mechanised Vending Devices.

41. No device for the mechanised vending of goods shall be used except where in this Scheme shops, service stations, service industries, clubs and registered clubs, private hotels, hotels, and motels are allowed.

Nuisance.

42. No land within this Scheme shall be used in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise, vibration or waste products in such a quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.

Prohibition of Unsightly Objects.

43. No person shall cause allow or permit to be placed on any building or any part of the same any article, object or thing which shall be visible from any street way or public place or from any other land or building or any part thereof, and which is in the opinion of the responsible authority, offensive unsightly or otherwise calculated to mar or spoil the locality. Without in any way limiting this clause the terms article object or thing shall be deemed to include any sign, article of wearing apparel, article of domestic use or washing.

PART V—NON-CONFORMING USES.

Continuance of Non-Conforming Existing Use.

44. (1) Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) of this clause this Planning Scheme shall not preclude—

- the continuance of the non-conforming use of any land or building which was lawfully used immediately before the approved date; or
- the enlargement, rebuilding or extension of any building or the continuance of the use of the building as so enlarged rebuilt or extended for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the

approved date provided the building as so enlarged, rebuilt or extended does not extend beyond—

- the lot or lots on which the building was situated immediately before the approved date; or
- any adjoining land which immediately before the approved date was in the same ownership and might lawfully have been used for the same purposes.

Provided that the provisions and controls set out in Part IV of this Scheme shall if applicable apply to any such enlargement rebuilding or extension of any building aforesaid.

(2) No such land shall be used closer to the frontage or any other boundary of the land, nor shall any building be constructed thereon closer to the frontage or any other boundary of such land or to a greater height than, in either case, that permitted for uses and buildings which conform with the provisions of the zone within which the non-conforming use is located.

Change of Non-Conforming Use.

45. The responsible authority may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another con-forming use, provided the proposed use is in the opinion of the responsible authority less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use or closer to the intended use of the zone.

Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use.

46. Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this part when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued for a continuous period of two (2) years such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of this Planning Scheme.

Uncompleted Development.

47. When the construction of any building or the development of any land has been commenced in accordance with any permit issued before the approved date, the use of such building or land for the purpose for which such construction or development was commenced shall for the purposes of this part be deemed to have been a use lawfully existing immediately before the approved date. A building will be deemed "commenced" when the footings thereof are poured.

PART VI.—GENERAL.

Disposal of Land.

48. The responsible authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which has been acquired by it pursuant to the provisions of this Scheme in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of this Scheme and for this purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

Compensation.

49. Claims for compensation by reason of this Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these provisions are first published in the *Government Gazette*.

Enforcement of Provisions.

50. (a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with any of the provisions of this Planning Scheme the responsible authority may, by notice in the manner set out in clause 51 hereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30) clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme, which are not being complied with and at the same time it may, pursuant to subsection 1 of section 10 of the Act, advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions of such notice in the time limited for compliance then the responsible authority by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.

(b) Any expenses incurred by the responsible authority in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

Notices.

51. Any notice given under paragraph 50 hereof—

- (a) shall be addressed to the owner, occupier or lessee of the land or building in question;
- (b) shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Planning Scheme has been contravened;
- (c) shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within thirty clear days after the service of such notice, to discontinue such contravention of the scheme and take such action as the responsible authority may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the scheme; and
- (d) shall where necessary advise the person to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the responsible authority will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person.

Penalties.

52. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Planning Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein shall be liable to such penalties as are prescribed in the Act.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 8 of 1962.

Registered 25th May, 1962.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 16th day of May, 1962, between The Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") of the one part, and Cementation Company (Australasia) Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "employer") of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Vibroflo-tation Workers' Agreement, 1962."

2.—Arrangement.

1. Title.
2. Arrangement.
3. Area.
4. Scope.
5. Term.
6. Contract of Service.
7. Hours.
8. Overtime.
9. Shift Work.
10. Annual Leave.
11. Absence through Sickness.
12. Breakdowns, etc.
13. Board of Reference.

17. Wages.
18. Maximum Rate.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply within the area actually occupied by and operated upon by the employer.

4.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the workers employed by the employer in the classification referred to herein.

5.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one (1) year as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service (except in the case of casual workers) shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day.

In the case of casual workers, the contract of service shall be hourly, terminable by one (1) hour's notice.

Provided that if the required notice is not given one (1) week's pay (or in the case of casual workers, one (1) hour's pay) shall be paid by the employer or forfeited by the worker.

7.—Hours.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) Not less than one-half hour or more than one (1) hour shall be allowed for a meal.

(c) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

8.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the ordinary hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) In the computation of overtime, each day's work shall stand alone. Provided that when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.

(c) All work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 16 (a) shall be paid for at double time rates, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

(d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates.

(e) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer, or paid five shillings (5s) for a meal.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No payments need to be made to workers living in the same locality as the job who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime, or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

(f) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall, in any way whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirement of this subclause.

(g) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.

9.—Shift Work.

(a) The employer may, if he so desires, work any of his workers on shifts.

(b) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shifts and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon shifts or night shifts are worked on that process then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.

(c) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift.

(d) The sequence of shift work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph (b) by reason of the fact that the works are closed on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

10.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any holiday under this Agreement falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) (i) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(ii) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the Union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two (2) periods.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

11.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: provided that payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the

worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

12.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or part of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Agreement:—

(i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them.

(ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(d) The provisions of regulation 106 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

14.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid once fortnightly.

15.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

16.—Holidays.
