MARKETING OF ONIONS ACT, 1938-1960.

Notice to Onion Growers.

PURSUANT to a Proclamation dated 4th October, 1962, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th October, 1962, the following shall ensue from and including 1st day of November, 1962, to and including the 31st day of July, 1963:—

- (1) Property in all onions then belonging to all growers shall be vested from the growers thereof and shall become vested in and be the absolute property of the W.A. Onion Marketing Board, as owner thereof.
- (2) Every grower shall become and continue to be a "bailee in possession" on behalf of the Board of all onions produced by him.
- (3) While a grower continues to be a "bailee in possession" of all onions as aforesaid he shall be responsible to the Board for the safe keeping, storage and protection of such onions.

- (4) A grower who is "bailee in possession" of onions shall not during the bailment without the approval of the Board remove, or permit to be removed, any onions from the place where they are at the commencement of the bailment.
- (5) Any grower who, while he continues to be "bailee in possession" of any onions, sells or delivers any of such onions to any person whether for safe custody, storage and protection or any other purpose except with the authority in writing of the Board and any person other than the Board who buys or receives from a grower who is a "bailee in possession" of onions as aforesaid any of such onions as a purchaser or agent authorised by the Board shall be guilty of offence and subject to prosecution.
- (6) Each grower of onions, excepting spring onions, of a maximum diameter one and three-quarter inches marketed in bunches, shall, by not later than 31st December, 1962, complete by declaration Form No. 3 which shall be posted or delivered to the Board before that date. Copies of Form No. 3 are available at the Board office or from its field officers.
- (7) No payment for onions acquired by the Board from a grower shall be paid to such growers until Form No. 3, properly completed and declared, is received at the Board Office.
