WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1961, that no licensee shall in the Goldfields district have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of liquor or sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises at any time before nine o'clock in the morning or after eleven o'clock at night upon any day in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license or of an airport license or of a restaurant license; and whereas it is enacted by the proviso to that subsection that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, by Proclamation, from time to time extend, reduce or vary the hours in any licensing district or part of a licensing district within the Goldfields district, and that the hours so extended, reduced or varied shall in that licensing district or part of a district thereupon have effect; and whereas the Licensing Court has recommended to me, the Governor, that the hours hereinbefore mentioned should be reduced in the licensing district hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby reduce the hours referred to in subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1961, in the Licensing district of Mount Magnet, to the hours between 10 a.m. and 11 p.m.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 8140/60.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

(a) B class and higher traffic:—

The rates shall be calculated on a throughout mileage basis via the railhead, as shown in Tariff 6, the minimum rate being B class (Smalls Minimum).

(b) Traffic Classified at lower rates than Class B:—

The classified rates and conditions shall apply for the rail and road mileages separately, with a minimum of M class on the road portion, or the freight at B class for the throughout mileage, whichever is the cheaper.

(b) * Trailers—

(i) Freight charges on goods conveyed on road trailers taken over by senders or consignees shall be assessed to or from points shown on Pages 28 to 29 of Tariff 6 hereof. Should a trailer be required at an intermediate point freight charges to or from the next furthest place on the road truck route shall apply.

(ii) No hire charge shall apply for the use of trailers provided they are returned to the Commission within eight working hours of the trailer being made available, or before the departure of the next appropriate road truck.

(iii) Demurrage charges shall be paid at £2 per trailer for eight working hours or part, beyond the free time shown in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph.

(c) * Off-Route Services—

(i) Where off-route services are required, the freight charges for the road portion of the journey as per (a) above shall be assessed to the place in advance of the point where the deviation from the normal route occurs. Also an off-route charge of 3s. 6d. shall apply, calculated from the deviation point to the loading or delivery point.

(ii) Where traffic classified at rates lower than B class is conveyed, such rates (with a minimum of M class) shall apply for the direct road mileage involved to or from the railhead, subject to a minimum of 3s. 6d. per mile calculated on the distance to and from the point of loading or unloading and the railhead, where this is cheaper than charging as per subclause (c) (i) hereof.

(iii) The off-route charges shall have application for each journey over the off-route section.

(iv) Where more than one pick-up is made on the same off-route journey the charges shall be apportioned on a pro-rata basis.

(v) A free loading or unloading period of one hour shall be granted, after which waiting time at 10s. per man hour shall be charged.
