NAVIGABLE WATERS REGULATIONS.

Harbour and Light Department,
Fremantle, 28th December, 1962.

ACTING pursuant to the powers conferred by regulation 48A of the Navigable Waters Regulations, the Harbour and Light Department doth, by this notice—

- (1) define and set aside the following areas of navigable waters for the purpose of water skiing, namely—

(a) Ocean Areas—

(i) all the navigable waters of the Indian and Southern Oceans, except those meeting the shore at Port Denison and Busselton and the Ports of Fremantle, Bunbury and Albany;

(ii) Port Denison, all the waters seaward and to the north of William Street; and

(iii) Busselton, all the waters seaward between the foot of Carey Street and the foot of Milne Street, eastward of Busselton Jetty (a distance of approximately 600 feet); and all the waters seaward between Lennox Drain and the western boundary of location 34;

(b) Swan River Areas—all waters of the river lying—

(i) between an imaginary line from the main grandstand on Ascot racecourse intersecting a T notice board on the racecourse and prolonged across the river to the windmill on the west bank and an imaginary line being the prolongation of Epsom Avenue across the river at the Ascot Inn, Belmont;

(ii) between an imaginary line from a spit post at or about the centre of Belmont Park racecourse due east to the opposite bank and an imaginary line between the two chimneys of the Swan Portland cement works on the southern bank and the chimneys of the brickworks on the northern bank;

(iii) between the south-western end of Heirisson Island (and on either side of the island) to the Bunbury Railway Bridge as an area for the Western Australian Water Ski Association;

(iv) within a radius of 1,000 feet from Point Resolution at Dalkeith;

- (v) within a radius of 1,500 feet from the point of the junction of Osborne Parade with the foreshore, at Claremont;
- (vi) within 500 feet of the foreshore, for a distance of 2,000 feet to both the north-west and the south-west of Chidley Point, Mosman Park;
- (vii) within 500 feet of the foreshore, for a distance of 2,500 feet to both the west and north-east of Point Roe, Mosman Park;
- (viii) within a radius of 1,500 feet from the point of the junction of Stock Road with the foreshore, at Attadale;
- (ix) within a radius of 2,500 feet from the point of the junction of Cunningham Street, with the foreshore in Lucky Bay, Applecross;
- (x) within a radius of 1,500 feet from a point halfway between the Queen Street Jetty and the Narrows Bridge at South Perth. This site is reserved for commercial ski schools only;
- (xi) within a radius of 1,500 feet from a point on the foreshore 1,000 feet east of end of the stone wall at Mend Street, South Perth; and
- (xii) within a radius of 1,500 feet from the point where the prolongation of Scott Street meets the foreshore at South Perth;
- (c) Canning River Areas—all the waters of the river lying—
- (i) within 1,500 feet of the foreshore, between Brian Avenue and Canning Avenue, at Mount Pleasant;
- (ii) within 1,000 feet of the foreshore, between a point (marked by a sign) where a prolongation of the south-western boundary of the Esplanade meets the foreshore (south of Deepwater Point) and a point where the prolongation of the southern boundary of Queens Road meets the foreshore, at Mount Pleasant;
- (iii) within a radius of 1,000 feet from the point where the southern boundary of Cloister Avenue meets the foreshore, at Canning Bridge;
- (vi) within a radius of 1,000 feet from a point on the foreshore 1,000 feet south of the southern boundary of Edgewater Road, at Manning; and
- (v) within 1,000 feet of the foreshore, between Dairy Point and the point where the prolongation of the northern boundary of Corinthian Road meets the foreshore, at Ross-moyne;
- (d) Mandurah—all the waters lying within that portion of Peel Inlet known as the Southern Estuary;
- (e) Augusta—all the waters lying within Hardy Inlet known as the Dead-water; and
- (f) Geraldton—all the waters lying within 1,000 feet of the shore within a distance of 3 chains, extending in a southwesterly direction from the western boundary of Gregory Street;
- (2) impose as a condition of water ski-ing in any of the abovementioned areas of navigable waters that every person engaged therein shall conform with the rules of the West Australian Water Ski Association for the time being in force;
- (3) limit the speed of motor boats to that of eight knots within all the waters lying—
- (a) within Bull's Creek from its junction with the Canning River;
- (b) within the area known as Aquinas Bay to the north of an imaginary line from the tip of Mount Henry to the spit post at the foot of the sand slide below Unwood Crescent;
- (c) between Canning Bridge and an imaginary line drawn between Point Heathcote and the outer edge of Como Jetty;
- (d) between the Fremantle Traffic Bridge and an imaginary line drawn from Direction Point to Preston Point;
- (e) within the river at Mandurah, between the Bar and the entrance to Peel Inlet;
- (f) within the Murray River;
- (g) within the Serpentine River;
- (h) within the Moore River; and
- (i) within the entrance channel to Oyster Harbour, Albany, between King George Sound and the first beacon, on the post, on the left hand side of the channel;
- (4) set aside the following areas for the racing of speed-boats—
- (a) Perth Water—southern side—Coode Street—course defined by buoys—W.A. Speedboat Club.
- (b) Collie River—an area bounded by a line being the extension eastwards of the northern boundary of Wellington Location 23 on the north, and by a line being an extension northward of the eastern boundary of Reserve No. 25417—Bunbury Speedboat Club; and
- (5) revoke the notices published in *Government Gazette*, pursuant to the powers conferred by the Navigable Waters Regulations, on 20th January, 1961, 27th January, 1961, and 27th October, 1961.

(a) The ordinary hours of work exclusive of meal intervals shall be forty (40) per week.

(b) Provided that—

(i) within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, in any week in which one Award holiday occurs on an ordinary working day the hours of work shall be thirty-two (32) and in any week in which two Award holidays occur on ordinary working days the hours of work shall be twenty-four (24);

(ii) within a radius of five (5) miles from the Post Office, Collie, in any week in which one Award holiday occurs on

an ordinary working day, the hours of work shall be thirty-three (33) hours twenty (20) minutes and in any week in which two Award holidays occur on ordinary working days the hours of work shall be twenty-six (26) hours forty (40) minutes.

(c) Within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the G.P.O., Perth, such hours shall be worked from Monday to Friday inclusive and notwithstanding anything in this Award elsewhere contained, when Boxing Day is observed on a Tuesday any time worked on the preceding Saturday, or at Easter any time worked on Easter Saturday, or when Boxing Day is observed on a Friday any time worked on the following Saturday, shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

2. Clause 6.—Overtime.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

6.—Overtime.

(a) All overtime shall be paid for in addition to the ordinary wage at the rate of time and one quarter for the first two (2) hours and time and a half thereafter.

2. After Clause 10 add the following new clause 10 (a):—

10A. Shift Work—Commissioning Tests.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 9—Hours—and Clause 10—Overtime—an employer may require any worker to work shift work on commissioning tests in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (i) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week nor eight (8) hours in any one (1) day to be worked in five (5) shifts between 8 a.m. Monday and 8 a.m. Saturday. Such hours shall be inclusive of crib time which shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes to be taken in relays so as not to cause a stoppage of operations and at such times deemed convenient by the employer.
- (ii) All time worked during ordinary hours on night shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (iii) Subject to paragraphs (iv) and (v) hereof, all time worked beyond eight (8) hours on any shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (iv) All time worked on a Saturday shift which shall be deemed to be a shift commencing on Saturday irrespective of the number of hours actually worked on that day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (v) All time worked on a Sunday shift which shall be deemed to be a shift commencing on Sunday irrespective of the number of hours actually worked on that day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (vi) The day and night shifts to be worked under the provisions of this clause shall change weekly and for this purpose alternative workers usually covered by Clauses 9 and 10 hereof may be employed on the Saturday or Sunday shift for the purpose of effecting such change of shifts but such workers shall be allowed a period of at least eight (8) hours off duty between the shift worked under paragraphs (iv) and (v) hereof and the hours ordinarily worked in accordance with Clause 9 of this Award.
