WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in section 29 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 19153/68 as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 1 of section 29 of the said Act, that is to say, for a "Gravel Reserve and Road": Now, therefore I, the Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 19153/68 for the purpose aforesaid.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1959, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby appoint Ashburton Hall Clark to be a Member of the Children's Court at Onslow.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. 10534/10.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 26591 (Victoria Location 10688) for Parklands at Kalbarri should be placed under the control of the Shire of Northampton as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Shire of Northampton as a Board of Management subject to the conditions as set out in the schedule

hereto in regard to the foreshore frontage of the reserve to a depth of one chain from high water mark, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

(b) Preservation of the existing foreshore alignment and sand banks.

(c) Preservation of the feeding grounds for water fowl, fish and other aquatic life.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3492/62.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Act, shall be leased for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid, by Instrument of Lease in accordance with the form in the Fourth Schedule of the Act, to any person (as defined in the said section); and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 26590 (Swan Location 7523) shall be leased for a term of 99 years to the Fremantle Rowing Club (Incorporated) to be held in trust for the purpose of "Use and Requirements of the Fremantle Rowing Club and Free Public Pedestrian Access": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased to the Fremantle Rowing Club (Incorporated) to be held in trust for the purpose of "Use and Requirements of the Fremantle Rowing Club and Free Public Pedestrian Access" for a term of 99 years at a peppercorn rental, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The lease shall be determined if at any time the club relinquishes possession of Reserve No. 26589 (Swan Location 7522) or fails to use either reserve for their respective purposes.

(ii) Pedestrian public shall have the right of free access to and over the whole of location 7523 at all times.

(iii) The club shall keep the foreshore clean and clear of algae, rubbish and debris.

Corr. No. 1337/60—That Reserve No. 26601 (Nelson Location 12699) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kojonup in trust for the purpose of Gravel.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

No. 15 of 1961.

Between Bread Manufacturers' (Perth and Suburbs) Industrial Union of Employers of Western Australia, Applicant, and West Australian Operative Bakers' Union of Workers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties:—

Award.

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Bakers' (Metropolitan) Award No. 15 of 1961 and replaces Award No. 72 of 1948, as amended and consolidated and replaces Award No. 15 of 1955, as amended, as to the area between the radii of 25 miles and 28 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-eight (28) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

5.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the bread making industry (being that industry in which bread or Vienna bread as each is defined in the Bread Act 1903-1962, is made) and to all employers and workers of the classifications mentioned in Clause 8 hereof engaged in that industry, including any worker employed by a bread manufacturer in the making of yeast goods if such worker is in the course of that employment engaged in the making of bread or Vienna bread.

6.—Definitions.

(a) "Baker" shall mean a person employed in or in connection with the mixing, handling, moulding or baking of dough. Provided that such a worker may be required by the employer to perform any general work in connection with the bakehouse.

(b) "Jobber" shall mean a man casually employed for not less than two (2) hours except in the making of doughs during any one day or night.

(c) "Single hand" shall mean a baker who is employed in a bakehouse where there is no other person regularly employed in the mixing, handling or baking of dough, except where the employer regularly and substantially works in the bakehouse.

(d) "Foreman" shall mean a baker who has charge of the work and of one or more workers, including apprentices, in the bakehouse. Where an employer is himself substantially engaged in doing the actual work of an operative baker and also exercising supervision of the work in the bakehouse, he may be classed as a foreman, but not otherwise.

(e) "Making a dough" shall include all work incidental to, preparing for, and finishing off the work of a doughmaker.

(f) The words "making of" when used in connection with bread, Vienna bread or yeast goods shall include the baking thereof.

7.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary hours of work, exclusive of meal intervals, shall be as follows:—

(i) In an ordinary week forty (40) hours.

(ii) In a week in which one Award holiday occurs on an ordinary working day, thirty-two (32) hours.

(iii) In a week in which two Award holidays occur on ordinary working days, twenty-four (24) hours.

(b) The hours of work each day shall be arranged to suit the requirements of the shop.

(c) (i) For all workers, except when making doughs, the starting time shall, subject to subclauses (d) and (f) hereof, be not earlier than 3 a.m. on Monday and 4 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, with a finishing time of not later than 6 p.m. On Thursday the starting time shall be not earlier than 4 a.m., with a finishing time of not later than 12 noon and a further starting time of not earlier than 8 p.m., nor later than 10 p.m., with a finishing time of not later than 12 noon on Friday.

(ii) Any worker, except a doughmaker, required to work on the ordinary working days for which hours are prescribed in paragraph (i) of this subclause, before 5 a.m. on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday shall be paid at the rate of double time for such time so worked.

(iii) Any worker making doughs may also make yeast goods outside of the starting and finishing times prescribed in paragraph (i) hereof but no other worker shall make or be allowed to make such goods outside the said times.

(d) (i) When a multiple delivery day falls on a Monday, the starting time shall be not earlier than 12.01 a.m. on that day. When a multiple delivery day falls on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday, the starting time shall be not earlier than 8 p.m. on the day preceding such multiple delivery day.

(ii) Subject as hereinafter provided, the starting time following all holidays as provided in Clause 10 hereof shall be not earlier than 3 a.m. When a holiday (other than Christmas Day) falls on a Thursday, work may be commenced not earlier than 8 p.m. on that day and any work so performed on that day shall stand alone and be deemed overtime and be paid for at the rate of ordinary time in addition to the ordinary week's pay.

(iii) When Boxing Day is observed on a Tuesday, there shall be a further starting time of not earlier than 8 p.m. nor later than 10 p.m. on the next preceding Friday, with a finishing time not later than 12 noon on Saturday: Provided that, notwithstanding anything in this Award elsewhere contained, any time so worked shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(iv) At Easter or when Boxing Day is observed on a Friday, there shall be a further starting time of not earlier than 8 p.m. nor later than 10 p.m. on that Friday holiday with a finishing time not later than 12 noon Saturday: Provided that, notwithstanding anything in this Award elsewhere contained, any time so worked shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(v) The loading prescribed in paragraph (ii) of subclause (c) shall not apply to any hours worked pursuant to this subclause.

(e) There shall be no fixed starting or finishing time for a worker making doughs.

(f) Except as hereinafter provided, no worker other than a worker making doughs, shall be allowed on the employer's premises more than half (½) an hour prior to the starting time: Provided

that in the case of defective fermentation or other unavoidable cause or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or for any other cause beyond the control of the employer, proof of which shall in each case be on the employer, workers may attend and be employed upon all necessary work for a period up to but not exceeding one (1) hour prior to the starting time: And provided further that the employer and/or his foreman or, if no foreman is available, one worker acting in place of such a foreman, shall be allowed on the employer's premises and may work for one (1) hour prior to the starting time but shall not commence dividing or scaling off by machine or hand as the case may be.

(g) No worker shall be allowed to resume work until he has had a clear six (6) hours off.

(h) Any worker, other than a doughmaker, called upon to make a hand dough or doughs outside the prescribed starting or finishing times for less than the full shift, shall be allowed a minimum of two (2) hours for the first dough and thereafter the actual time worked and such time may be deducted from his working hours the following day; otherwise overtime conditions at doughmaker's rates for overtime shall be paid: Provided, however, that any time necessarily spent in standing by shall be paid for.

(i) Any worker, other than a doughmaker, called upon to make a dough or doughs with the assistance of a machine, outside the prescribed starting and finishing times for less than a full shift, shall be allowed one (1) hour for the first dough containing four hundred and fifty (450) lbs or more flour and thereafter shall be allowed the actual time engaged in the work: Provided that any time necessarily spent standing by shall be paid for.

(j) An employer shall be deemed *prima facie* to be guilty of a breach if bread is found drawn from his oven earlier than one (1) hour after the prescribed starting time.

(k) Meal Time.—A meal interval of not less than twenty (20) minutes nor more than forty (40) minutes shall be allowed to each worker after the completion of not less than two and a half (2½) hours work and not more than five (5) hours work.

(l) Crib Time.—After every four (4) hours by which the time worked by him in any shift exceeds four (4) hours, a worker shall be entitled to a crib time or rest period of ten (10) minutes which shall count as part of the time worked and which shall be taken at a time to suit the convenience of the employer, either before or after the time when the entitlement accrues.

8.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:—

(a) Basic Wage:

(For the purpose of these calculations "workers" shall be deemed to include "apprentices".)

(c) There shall be a foreman in each bakehouse where more than one (1) worker is employed, but where a single-hand baker is employed, the existing custom shall continue.

(d) (i) Workers, including apprentices, who are called upon to work outside of the prescribed hours in paragraph (i) of subclause (c) of Clause 7 while rebuilding operations or alterations of plant are in progress, or by permission of the Minister under paragraph (c) of subsection (6) of section 12 of the Bread Act, 1903-1962 or under the provisions of subclause (f) of Clause 7 hereof by reason of defective fermentation, shall be paid time and a half for all time worked outside of the hours so prescribed.

(ii) Any time so worked shall be deemed to be part of the ordinary weekly hours.

(iii) No work shall be done under the provisions of this subclause by reason of rebuilding operations or alterations of plant unless and until permission is obtained from the Registrar, who shall satisfy himself as to the extent of the work and shall grant a definite period in which this work must be completed, after notice having been given to both unions of an application having been made.

9.—Overtime.

(a) All time, except any which stands alone, worked in excess of the hours prescribed as a week's work under Clause 7 (a) hereof, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All time worked in excess of ten (10) hours on the night shift preceding a double delivery day or in excess of twelve (12) hours on the night shift preceding a treble or quadruple delivery day, shall stand alone and be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) No permanent hand shall work overtime in any bakehouse on work for which jobbers have been engaged, while there are jobbers available in the bakehouse for such work.

(d) Work done on a holiday prescribed in Clause 10 (a) of this Award shall stand alone and a worker doing such work shall be paid for the first eight (8) hours thereof, ordinary time in addition to his week's pay and thereafter double time so as to give an effective payment of double time for all such work but, subject to the provisions of Clause 7 (d), no work shall be done on such a holiday except on the making of a dough.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;

(ii) no organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall, in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(f) When a worker, other than a doughmaker, makes doughs on a Sunday during the hours prescribed for a week's work under Clause 7 (a) he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for such work but such time shall be counted in his week's hours of work.

(g) A worker shall be paid time and one half for any work done in any seventh (7th) shift (excluding shifts worked solely on making doughs) worked by that worker during the hours prescribed for a week's work under Clause 7 (a) and double time for any subsequent shifts but such time shall be counted in his week's hours of work.

(h) For the purposes of any calculations necessary under this Award:—

- 8 to 22 minutes shall be deemed ¼ hour.
- 23 to 37 minutes shall be deemed ½ hour.
- 38 to 52 minutes shall be deemed ¾ hour.
- 53 to 67 minutes shall be deemed 1 hour.

## 10.—Holidays.

(a) (1) Subject to the provisions of subclauses (d) of each of Clauses 7 and 9, the following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be granted as holidays to all workers without deduction of pay, namely—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, East Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(ii) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday or Monday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday; in each case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.

(b) Any worker who is absent from work for any cause other than sickness (proof whereof shall lie on the worker) on the working day immediately before or the working day immediately following any of the days mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, shall not be entitled to payment for the holiday.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If, after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave, as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) On any public holiday, not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(h) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to jobbers.

(j) Upon a worker's annual leave falling due he must take and be given same within three (3) months thereafter, unless an agreement is reached otherwise between the employer, the worker and the Union and, except by such agreement, at least two (2) weeks' notice shall be given to each worker of the time when he will take his annual leave. By agreement between the employer, the Union and the worker, such leave may be given and taken in two parts.

## 11.—Higher Duties.

Workers called upon to perform duties for which a higher rate is prescribed than that which they are in receipt of, shall be paid such higher rate for such time as they are actually performing such higher duties, if employed under four (4) hours, and if employed for four (4) hours or more, they shall receive a day's pay at such higher rate.

## 12.—Record and Right of Entry.

(a) A time and wages book shall be kept by the employer in the bakehouse, in which each worker shall enter the time he starts and finishes work each day, the hours worked each week and the amount of wages received, together with his signature for same. Such book shall be open for inspection during ordinary working hours by a duly

accredited official of either the applicant or respondent union and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. If for any reason the book be not available at the bakehouse when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours. Any system of automatic recording by mechanical means shall be deemed a compliance with this clause to the extent of the information recorded. A portion of the bakehouse building, partitioned off to form an office, shall be deemed to be part of the bakehouse.

(b) The secretary of either the West Australian Operative Bakers' Union of Workers or the Bread Manufacturers' (Perth and Suburbs) Industrial Union of Employers of Western Australia and/or any other person or persons authorised in writing by such unions shall have the right of entry into any bakehouse at any time during which work is being performed or it is alleged that work is being performed.

## 13.—Termination of Employment.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture as the case may be of one (1) week's wages.

(b) This clause shall not apply to jobbers.

## 14.—Accommodation.

(a) Each employer shall be required to provide suitable accommodation for workers to change their working clothes and suitable washing facilities.

(b) Liberty is reserved to the respondent union of workers to apply at any time to amend this clause.

## 15.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, a worker shall be entitled to work for the proposed lesser rate but in the event of the decision granting a higher rate, this must be paid retrospectively.

## 16.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the union or of the unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 17.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (f) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has not been allowed in any year to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of four (4) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to payment under this clause.

#### 18.—Apprentices.

(a) Apprentices shall, with the approval of the employer and the union, be interchangeable between town and country bakeries for the purpose of experience and their service shall be deemed to be continuous for long service leave and all other benefits, provided they return to their original employer.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one (1) apprentice to every four (4) or fraction of four (4) journeymen permanently employed: Provided that an employer who is bona fide working as a baker shall be regarded as a journeyman permanently employed.

(c) (i) Apprentices shall be paid as under:—

(ii) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply at any time to amend this subclause.

(d) Apprentices shall be taught and, subject to the Apprenticeship Regulations, examined as per apprenticeship syllabus.

(e) No apprentice shall make dough in the first three (3) years of his apprenticeship, except during ordinary baking hours.

#### 19.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

(ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 20.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958 if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty (20) completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

(a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;

(b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen (15) working days in any year of his employment;

(c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;

(d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

(i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

(ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;

(iii) in any of the Armed Forces under National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

(a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;

(b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;

(c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;

(d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;

(e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six (6) months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least twenty (20) years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of twenty (20) years' service so completed—thirteen (13) weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each ten (10) years' service completed after such twenty (20) years—six and a half (6½) weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to twenty (20) years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to twenty (20) years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least ten (10) years' service but less than fifteen (15) years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of thirteen (13) weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to twenty (20) years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled, the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—

(a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference, the employer shall give to a worker at least one (1) month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three (3) separate periods in respect of the first thirteen (13) weeks' entitlement and in not more than two (2) separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

(i) In full before the worker goes on leave;

(ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or

(iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment, a proportionate amount on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State Law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker, a period of three (3) years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

(a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;

(b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State Law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of twenty (20) or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State Law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

21.—Allowance.

When a jobber travels more than one (1) mile from his place of residence direct to his place of employment and return he shall be paid an amount of sixpence (6d.) per mile for each mile so travelled.

22.—Preference.

(a) In this clause, the term "unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of the industrial union of workers party to this Award.

(b) Any worker whose application for membership of the union has been refused shall have the right of appeal to the Industrial Registrar, whose decision on such matter shall be final. Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall, pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar, have the same rights under this clause as a "unionist."

(c) Subject to subclause (d) hereof, workers (other than apprentices) who are not "unionists" shall, within seven (7) days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause by an accredited representative of the respondent union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by an employer covered by this Award. Workers who are unfinancial members of the union of workers party to this Award shall become financial and maintain such financial membership whilst employed by any employer covered by this Award.

(d) Exemptions:

(i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth, (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.

(ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar if it is forwarded by registered post within seven (7) days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (c).

(iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—

(a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;

(b) if the employee objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union; and

(c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.

(iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall, within seven (7) days of the decision, make application for membership of the respondent union and if accepted as a member maintain financial membership whilst employed by an employer covered by this Award.

(e) No employer shall, while to his knowledge adequately experienced unionists competent to perform the class of work required are available, retain in his employment any worker for a period of more than seven (7) days after being advised by the union concerned that such worker has not complied with either subclause (c) or paragraph (iv) of subclause (d) of this clause or for a period of more than seven (7) days after a conviction for a breach of this clause in reference to the employment of such worker.

23.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Each worker shall be paid his wages once weekly and they shall be made up to at least the end of the shift on the day immediately preceding the day of payment.

(b) A jobber shall be paid his wages on the ordinary pay day or on the completion of his period of engagement whichever is the earlier.
