WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 5 of the Local Courts Act, 1904-1958, that the Governor may, by Proclamation, order that courts to be called Local Courts shall be held at such places as he thinks fit; and whereas it is further enacted (*inter alia*) by section 10 of the Act that the Court shall be held in the place appointed by the Governor once at least in such period of time as the Governor directs by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby order that a Local Court shall be held at Rockingham and further I direct that such Court shall be held once at least in each period of three months.

Health Act, 1911-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 1826/62.

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 60 of the Health Act, 1911-1962, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has received details of a plan for the installation of a sewer in part of the town-site of Denmark, and is satisfied that the scheme is formulated in accordance with the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1962, and that the cost and provisions for repayment justify the undertaking, and that the works, if carried out in the manner designed, will be of benefit to that portion of the district which the works are intended to serve: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the Shire of Denmark, being the local authority for the district, be empowered to undertake the construction of the said works.

Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1962.

- (b) by adding to the item, "Synthetic Anti-Histamine Drugs except preparations for external use or for motion sickness only" in that schedule, the words, "unless otherwise included in this Schedule".

Forests Act, 1918-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests 1848/35, Lands 2439/28.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dedicate any Crown lands as State Forests within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the area of Crown land in the Wellington District described in the schedule hereto as an addition to State Forest No. 25.

Land Act, 1933-1962.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 1024/62.—That Reserve No. 26612 (Cockburn Sound Location 2000) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Slow Learning Children's Group of Western Australia (Incorporated), to be held in trust for the purpose of an "Occupational Therapy Training Centre Site."

Corres. 1138/61.—That Reserve No. 26425 (Walliston Lot 124) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to Edwin Arthur Saunders, Murray John Padgett, Jamie Malcolm Wallis and Arthur Cowell as Trustees under the Methodist Church Model Deed of Western Australia 1912, to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Churchsite (Methodists)."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the condition that the lands shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960.

Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.
Lacey Street, Cannington, Extension.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 60803/61.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087, and as described in Order in Council of 19th June, 1957, and subsequent Orders in Council, shall be extended in the following manner, by adding the area described in the schedule hereunder and including it in Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines commencing at a point in the centre of Albany Highway, Beckenham, on the prolongation of the south-eastern boundary of lot 1, Albany Highway, and proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundaries of the said lot 1 and of lot part 40, Highbury Crescent, to and across the existing drain reserve situated in the said lot part 40 and continuing along the south-eastern boundary of the said lot part 40; thence northerly along the western boundary of the said lot part 40 to Highbury Crescent; thence north-easterly along the boundary between the said lot part 40 to Highbury Crescent; thence north-easterly along the boundary between the said lot part 40 and Highbury Crescent to the western corner of lot 37, Highbury Crescent; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of the said lot 37 and north-easterly along the southern boundaries of the said lot 37 and of lot 31, Highbury Crescent, and north-westerly along the eastern boundary of the said lot 31 into Highbury Crescent; thence north-easterly along Highbury Crescent to the prolongation of the western boundary of lot 23, Highbury Crescent; thence north-westerly along the said boundary and south-westerly along the northern boundaries of lots 24 to 28 inclusive, Highbury Crescent; thence north-westerly along the eastern boundaries of lots 30 and 3, Highbury Crescent, to and across an unnamed road and continuing across the road reserve to the centre of Nicholson Road, Cannington; thence north-easterly along Nicholson Road to the prolongation of the western boundary of lot 70, Albany Highway; thence north-westerly along the western boundaries of lots 70 to 67 inclusive, Albany Highway, and north-easterly along the northern boundary of the said lot 67 to Albany Highway; thence northerly across Albany Highway to the north-western corner of lot 76, Albany Highway, thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of the said lot 76 and north-westerly and north-easterly along the south-western and north-western boundaries respectively of lot 95, James Street, into James Street; thence north-westerly along James Street into Bickley Road; thence easterly along Bickley Road and north-easterly along Crawford Street to and past Hogarth Street to the centre of Sevenoaks Street; thence south-easterly along Sevenoaks Street to Beckenham Street, Beckenham, and south-westerly along Beckenham Street; thence south-easterly along Wilpon Street and south-westerly along Coleman Place to the northern boundary of lot part 49, Albany Highway; thence south-easterly and south-westerly along the northern and eastern boundaries respectively of the said lot part 49 to and across Albany Highway; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Albany Highway to the south-eastern boundary of lot 2, Albany Highway, and south-westerly along

the said boundary to the centre of Wimbledon Street; thence north-westerly along Wimbledon Street into Albany Highway to the point of commencement as shown in colour on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087.

Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.
Marjorie Avenue, Riverton, Extension.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 60803/61.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1960, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7087, and as described in Order in Council of 19th June, 1957, and subsequent Orders in Council, shall be extended in the following manner, by adding the area described in the schedule hereunder and including it in Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Governor is empowered by section 12 (2) (g) and (h) of the Local Government Act, 1960, on presentation of an effective petition, to alter the boundaries of, or abolish wholly or in part, Wards existing in a district, or to create new Wards in a district, and is further authorised by paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of the said section to determine and alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality, and is further authorised by paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of the said section to make orders to give effect to an alteration in the number of the members of a Council or to give effect to an alteration of the number of wards; and whereas the Governor is further empowered, on the exercise of a power conferred by section 12, to direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected, shall go out of office and when, and to direct the holding on a day appointed by the order of an election of such members so affected as the case requires; and whereas the Shire of Plantagenet is divided into eight Wards and has allotted to it ten members; and whereas the Shire of Plantagenet has submitted a petition praying that the number of Wards should be reduced to six and that the number of Councillors should be increased to eleven; and whereas it is considered desirable to grant the petition of the Council of the municipality: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (1) abolish the existing wards of the Shire of Plantagenet and create new wards as designated in the schedule hereto;

- (2) determine that the number of offices of councillor assigned to the municipality of the Shire of Plantagenet shall be eleven, of which two shall be allocated to each of the wards with the exception of the Rocky Gully Ward, which shall be represented by one Councillor only;

- (3) direct that all existing members of the Plantagenet Shire Council shall go out of office on the 25th day of May, 1963, and direct that an election be held on that day to return eleven members to the Council.

- (1) create a new Ward to be known as the Gooseberry Hill Ward as set out in the schedule hereto;
- (2) alter the boundaries of the Lesmurdie, Heidelberg, and Maida Vale Wards so that their boundaries will conform to those set out in the schedule hereto;
- (3) describe the boundaries of the Kalamunda Ward as set out in the schedule hereto;
- (4) determine that the number of offices of councillor assigned to the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda shall be nine, there being two councillors for each Ward with the exception of the Kalamunda Ward, which will be represented by one councillor only;
- (5) direct that all members of the Kalamunda Shire Council shall go out of office on the 25th day of May, 1963, on which day an election shall be held to return nine councillors.

Between The West Australian Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Universal Milling Co. Pty. Ltd. and British Metal Corporation (W.A.) Pty. Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determinations, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declare the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Mineral Earths Employees' Award and replaces Award No. 6 of 1956, as amended.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the process, trade, business or occupation of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding, or pulverising rocks, earths, clays or ores.

4.—Area.

This Award shall apply over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

5.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Hours.

The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) in any one week and shall not exceed (8) in any one day and shall be worked between Monday and Friday inclusive.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All work performed before the usual starting time or beyond the usual finishing time, or beyond eight (8) hours on any one day or shift

shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Call back.—Where a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates.

(c) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(d) All work performed on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(e) Any worker who is required to work on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at the rate applicable for that day.

(f) Where a worker without being notified on the previous day or earlier is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid six shillings (6s.) in lieu thereof; Provided that this payment need not be made to any worker residing in the same locality as his place of employment, who can reasonably return home for a meal.

(g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) no organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

8.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as set out hereunder:—

Mill attendant shall mean a worker who is classified as such by the employer and who shall be responsible for seeing that the mill or mills are kept running, and who if necessary shall effect all adjustments and running repairs to such mills.

(d) No male junior under 18 years of age shall be employed on night shift.

(e) Any worker employed for less than one week shall be classed as a casual worker and shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent (10%) in addition to the ordinary wage.

(f) Any male worker placed by the employer in charge of thirteen or more other male workers shall be paid thirteen shillings (13s.) per week in addition to the rates prescribed in subclause (b) hereof.

(g) Workers employed milling, handling or calcining copper and/or zinc except in or in connection with the closed circuit Hardinge conical ball mill plant operated by Universal Milling Co. Pty. Ltd. shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to the rates prescribed in subclause (b) hereof.

9.—Shift Work

(a) Workers employed on afternoon shift shall be paid at the rate of five per cent (5%) in addition to their ordinary wage. Workers employed on night shift shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent (10%) in addition to their ordinary wage.

(b) Shift workers shall be allowed twenty (20) minutes for crib in each shift without deduction of pay.

(c) Crib time shall be taken in relays at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work.

(d) Shifts shall change weekly.

(e) Where a shift commences at or after 11 p.m., the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

10.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

11.—Contract of service.

Except in the case of casual workers the contract of service of each worker covered by this Award shall be a weekly one terminable by one week's notice given on either side on any day. If an employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.

12.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

13.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

14.—Time and Wages Record.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his usual place of business, or at each of them, if more than one, a record of the names of all workers employed by him at the particular factory, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime if any. Such a book shall be open to inspection by the Secretary or such person as may be appointed by the Union, on any day during working hours.

15.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars—

(i) name in full;

(ii) age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of a worker being wrongly stated either on the

certificate, or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled, he shall make restitution to the employer.

16.—Holidays.

(a) (i) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall subject as hereinafter provided be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties in lieu of any of the days named in the subclause.

(ii) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday or a Monday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday; in each such case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) All work done on any of the holidays specified in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker the worker shall be paid one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$ th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(i) (i) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(ii) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the Union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two periods.

(j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

17.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfthth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

18.—General.

(a) Dust glasses, goggles, respirators or other protective equipment shall where necessary be supplied to workers who request such equipment.

(b) Employers shall provide reasonable washing and sanitary conveniences.

19.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

(ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961 which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

20.—Liberty.

Liberty is reserved to all parties to apply in respect to continuous shift work.

21.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service

(1) The Long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the 1st April, 1958, if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

(a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;

(b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.

(c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;

(d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—

(i) as a member of a Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;

(ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;

(iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

(a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;

(b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;

(c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;

(d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determination under either Commonwealth or State law;

(e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;

- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be—

- (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death, or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual, or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) In full before the worker goes on leave;
- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(f) No worker, shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker, and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

(2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—

- (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
- (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State Law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for any satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State Law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

Between The West Australian Shop Assistants' and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth and The Eastern Goldfields Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicants, and Ampol Petroleum Limited, Mobil Oil Australia and others, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(NOTE.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Storemen (Oil Companies) Award 1962" and replaces Agreement No. 13 of 1952 as amended.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the respondents in the classifications described in Clause 12 hereof in oil stores or installations, in or in connection with the receiving, handling, or dispatching of oil and/or petroleum products or their containers, but shall not apply to depot-keepers, depot superintendents, officers in charge, or checkers, or any worker who is at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, to which the Union is not a party. Nothing in this Award shall be deemed to cover workers employed as: General labourers, gardeners, rubbishmen, head blenders or manufacturers in charge.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the whole of the State of Western Australia.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

6.—Definitions.

(a) "Leading hand" shall mean a worker who is appointed in writing as a leading hand by the officer in charge of the depot, installation and/or warehouse.

(b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that the minimum engagement for a casual hand shall not be less than four (4) hours in any one day, to be worked in one continuous period.

A casual hand engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate of pay for casuals.

(c) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand, and paid not less than the appropriate minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for casual hands, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dismissed for incompetence or unsuitableness or for any cause referred to in clause 16 hereof.

(d) "Adult": For the purposes of this Award the word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over, or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

(e) "Confined space" shall mean a working space, the dimensions of which necessitate a worker working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position, or without proper ventilation, or where confinement within a limited space is productive of unusual discomfort.

(f) "Dirty work" shall mean handling the following substances, other than in closed containers: Agrol, Fuller's earth, sulphuric acid, graphite, aluminium stearate, filling and handling lime sulphur, also, subject to the provisos hereinafter mentioned, other work which a foreman and a workman shall agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature. In case of disagreement between a foreman and a workman the workman or a shop steward on his behalf shall be entitled within 24 hours to ask for a decision on the workman's claim by the executive officer responsible for the management or superintendance of the plant concerned. In such a case a decision shall be given on the workman's claim within 48 hours of its being asked for, (unless that time expires on a non-working day, in which case it shall be given during the next working day) or else the said allowance shall be paid. In any case where the Union alleges that an employer or his representative is unreasonable or capricious in relation to such claims he shall have the right to bring such case before the Board of Reference: Provided that the normal handling of materials used in the oil industry other than those listed above shall not be regarded as work of an unusually dirty or offensive nature.

7.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Subject to clause 23 hereof such hours shall be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

8.—Overtime.

(a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(ii) Any work performed between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

All work performed after 12 noon on Saturday or on a Sunday or any of the holidays prescribed in clause 11 shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(iii) Where a worker is required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked, he shall be paid for all such work performed at the rate of double time until his usual starting time next day.

(iv) Except as provided in subclause (a) (iii) hereof in the computation of overtime each day shall stand by itself.

(v) If a worker is required to work during his usual lunch interval, Monday to Friday, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all time so worked.

(vi) (i) When a worker is recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, a worker shall not be required to work the full three (3) hours if the job for which he was recalled is completed within a shorter period but if such worker is subsequently recalled to work within the period of three (3) hours for which payment has been made, an additional payment shall not be made nor shall any extra overtime be paid in respect of any period covered by such minimum payment.

(ii) This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for a worker to return to his employer's premises to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours or where the overtime is continuous (subject to any reasonable meal break which may be allowed) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

9.—Meal Time.

(a) Not more than one (1) hour shall be given and taken for a meal.

(b) Lunch intervals shall be taken between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m.: Provided that by agreement between the employer and the Union, these hours may be varied.

(c) A tea break shall be granted to all workers required to continue working after their usual knock off time: Provided that at the option of the employer, workers may be required to continue working until 6 p.m. without a break for a meal.

(d) A worker working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of twenty (20) minutes without deduction of pay after each four (4) hours of overtime worked if the worker continues to work after such crib time.

(e) The meal breaks referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

10.—Meal Money.

If required to continue working after his usual finishing time from Monday to Friday, each worker shall be paid six shillings (6s.) meal money: Provided that meal money shall not be payable when a worker is required to work on after his usual finishing time for one hour or less.

Meal money shall be paid when overtime is required to be worked after 5 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. If a worker is not notified the previous day that he is to work a full day on Saturday or Sunday and is required to work after 12 noon, meal money shall be paid for the mid-day meal.

11.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) (i) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to clause 8 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that another day may be taken as a holiday by arrangement between the parties in lieu of any of the days named in the subclause.

(ii) Where Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Monday and where Boxing Day falls on a Sunday such holiday shall be observed on the next succeeding Tuesday; in each case the substituted day shall be deemed a holiday without deduction of pay in lieu of the day for which it is substituted.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive week's leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) (i) A worker who is justifiably dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(ii) In special circumstances and by mutual consent of the employer, the worker and the Union concerned, annual leave may be taken in not more than two periods.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(j) Where a worker is entitled to annual leave under this clause, he shall be given at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer for such worker to take his annual leave.

12.—Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award.

(e) "Casual hands" other than casuals provided for in subclause (i) hereof, shall be paid at the rate of 10 per cent. in addition to the rates prescribed in subclauses (a), (b) and (d) of this clause.

(f) Workers engaged in decanting or filling bitumen into drums, tanks or other containers shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per day extra whilst so employed.

(g) Workers engaged in spray painting shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per day extra whilst so employed.

(h) Workers engaged on "dirty work" or in "confined spaces" as defined in clause 6 hereof shall be paid an allowance at the rate of eightpence (8d.) per hour whilst so engaged.

13.—Change Room.

Where an employer usually has more than six (6) workers engaged under the terms of the Award, he shall provide his workers with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and to use a room in which to partake of their meals. Such

room shall be situated within a reasonable distance of the employer's place of business and shall be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

14.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

15.—Proportion of Juniors.

The number of male juniors shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male adults and thereafter one junior to every two or fraction of two male adults.

16.—Engagements.

Except in the case of casual hands, one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

17.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the following particulars:—

- The name of the worker.
- The class of work performed by him.
- The wages and overtime (if any) paid to each worker.
- The age of each junior worker.
- The hours worked each day.

Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

Such record or records shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day, from Monday to Friday inclusive.

18.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

20.—Country Work and Travelling Time.

(a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class except when travelling by coastal boat when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period, from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

21.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

22.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(e) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

23.—Shift Work.

(a) An employer may if he so desires work his establishment or any part thereof on shifts.

(b) (i) Where any work is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon shifts are worked on that work, then workers employed on such afternoon shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.

(ii) For the purpose of this clause, afternoon shift means a shift finishing after 6 p.m. and at or before 11 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

(iii) The sequence of shift work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraphs by reason of the fact that the works are closed on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

(c) (i) The loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be ten per cent. (10%) for afternoon shift.

(ii) If a worker is required by his employer to work on afternoon shift for more than four (4) consecutive weeks, the loading on the ordinary rates of pay for afternoon shift shall be twenty per cent. (20%) for all consecutive afternoon shifts in excess of the said four (4) weeks until the worker resumes on day shift.

(iii) A paid crib time of not less than 30 minutes shall be allowed to workers on afternoon shift.

(iv) No worker shall be transferred to afternoon shift unless he has had 48 hours' notice of such transfer.

(v) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work.

24.—Special Conditions for Casual Hands Referred to in Clause 12 (i).

(a) Work performed during the tea hour: When a casual hand is required for duty during his tea hour, whereby his meal is postponed, he shall be paid at the rate of double time until he gets his meal.

(b) Pick up:—

(i) The engagement places shall be at the employer's stores.

(ii) A casual hand shall, as from the time of being picked up, be paid the rate prescribed in clause 12 (i) of this Award. Provided that a casual hand, having been picked up and turned to work, which is outside the scope of clause 12 (i), shall be paid the rate provided in that clause, as for four (4) hours, at the least, but thereafter, and until turned to work within the scope of the said subclause, he may be paid such lesser rate as may be elsewhere prescribed for work outside such scope.

25.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

26.—Maximum Weight.

No junior worker under the age of seventeen (17) years shall be required to lift a weight greater than 60 lb.

27.—District Allowances.

(a) In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 12 hereof, allowances shall be paid at the rates set out below, to the workers employed in the following areas:—

(b) The above allowances cover a week, whether of five (5), six (6) or seven (7) days. For periods of less than five (5) days, one-seventh (1/7th) of

the above shall be payable for each day or part thereof: Provided, however, that workers who have worked at least one half of a week shall be given the benefit of Sunday in the calculation of district allowances.

(c) Where board and lodging are provided by the employer the worker shall be paid half the rates prescribed in subclause (a.) hereof.

Clause 13.—Continuous Shift Workers.

Delete subclause c) of this clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

(c) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangements between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may

be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked except that when the employer has received at least twelve (12) hours notice of such absence or when such time in excess of (2) hours is worked immediately following a regularly rostered overtime shift, double time shall be paid for the whole of the extra time worked.

Clause 17.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

Add to subclause (c) of this clause, the following proviso:—

Provided that for a seven (7) day shift worker annual leave payments shall be the amount which the worker concerned would have received had he worked his actual roster, but excluding overtime.

After Clause 28 insert a new clause, as follows:—

29.—Preference.

(a) In this clause, the term "Unionist" means a worker who is a financial member of any industrial union of workers party to this Award.

Such worker who has exercised his right of appeal shall, pending the decision of the Industrial Registrar, have the same rights under this clause as a "Unionist."

(d) Subject to subclause (e) hereof, workers who are not "Unionists" shall within seven (7) days of being supplied with the necessary application form for membership and a copy of this clause, by an accredited representative of the applicant union, apply in the prescribed manner for membership and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by the respondent to this Award.

(e) Exemptions:—

(i) Any worker may apply in writing to the Industrial Registrar, Court of Arbitration, Perth, (whose decision shall be final) for exemption from this clause.

(ii) An applicant for exemption shall detail in the application to the Industrial Registrar his reasons for desiring exemption, and such application shall only be valid and considered by the Industrial Registrar, if it is forwarded by registered post within seven (7) days of the applicant's receipt of the application for membership as prescribed in subclause (d).

(iii) The Industrial Registrar in the exercise of his discretion may grant exemption with such conditions as he deems desirable—

(a) if the applicant is a financial member of any other registered industrial union;

- (b) if the worker objects on the grounds of conscientious religious belief to becoming a member of any industrial union;
- (c) for any other reason which the Industrial Registrar deems sufficient.

(iv) A worker refused exemption by the Industrial Registrar shall, within seven (7) days of the decision, make application for membership of the applicant union and, if accepted as a member, maintain financial membership whilst employed by the respondent to this Award.

(f) The respondent shall not, while to his knowledge adequately experienced unionists competent to perform the class of work are available, retain in his employment any worker for a period of more than seven (7) days after being advised by the Union that such worker has not complied with either subclause (d) or paragraph (iv) of subclause (e) of this clause, or for a period of more than seven (7) days after a conviction for a breach of this clause in reference to the employment of such worker, or for a period of more than seven (7) days after the employer has been advised by the Union that the worker has not exercised his right of appeal under subclause (c) hereof following the rejection of his application for membership or having exercised such appeal has had such appeal rejected by the Industrial Registrar.

(d) A worker required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours, without being notified on the previous day or earlier that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with any meal required by the employer or paid six shillings (6/-) in lieu thereof.

If the amount of overtime required to be worked necessitates a second or subsequent meal, the employer shall, unless he has notified the workers concerned on the previous day or earlier that such second or subsequent meal will also be required, provide such meals or pay an amount of four shillings (4/-) for each such second or subsequent meal.

No such payments need be made to workers living in the same locality as their workshops who can reasonably return home for such meals.

If a worker in consequence of receiving such notice has provided himself with a meal or meals and it not required to work overtime or is required to work less overtime than notified, he shall be paid the amounts above prescribed in respect of the meals not then required.

17. Sick Leave.—Delete this Clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that subject to subclause (d) hereof payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that the sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

18. Tools.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

(a) Woodworkers and other branches requiring files and hacksaw blades, bench vices, cramps (above four inches) and rasps for the execution of their work, to be supplied with same by the employer.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

(No. 26 of 1962.)

Between Swan Brewery Company Limited, Emu Brewery Limited, Western Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited and Barrett Bros. & Burston & Co. Proprietary Limited Trading as Union Maltings and Breweries and Bottleyards Employees' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia.

THIS agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 1st day of December, 1962 between the Swan Brewery Company Limited; the Emu Brewery Limited; and the West Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited and Barrett Bros. & Burston & Co. Proprietary Limited Trading as Union Maltings, all of Perth and Fremantle (hereinafter in these presents call "the employers") of the one part, and the Breweries and Bottle Yards Employees Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, of Perth, being an industrial union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961 (hereinafter in these presents called "the Union") of the other part whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions and provisions set out herein shall, in all cases, be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed performed and complied with according to the true intent and meaning thereof by the parties hereto and that it is also hereby mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that this Agreement shall apply to the whole of the employees embraced in the Schedule herein contained.

1.—Interpretation.

For the purpose of this Agreement:—

- (a) "Casual hand" shall mean any person who is not employed continually for more than forty ordinary working hours 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
- (b) "Cylinder man" whenever used in this Agreement shall mean a worker who is generally employed at a majority of the undermentioned occupations, namely, filling, preparing, carbonating and racking beer from a chilling cylinder, but shall not mean any employee who is casually employed in any of the last mentioned processes.
- (c) "Bottle-washer" shall mean any person employed washing bottles by hand or machinery.
- (d) "Fireman" shall mean a person employed in a stokehold attending a steam boiler or gas-producing plant.
- (e) "Nightcellarman and nightmalsters" shall apply only to cellarman and malsters who are employed on night duties.
- (f) "Leading hands" are employees who are in charge of and responsible for the work of others.
- (g) "Month" shall mean calendar month.

2.—Wage.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities undermentioned is as follows:—

It is hereby mutually agreed that the existing margins include an amount of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) granted by the Employers at the request of the Union in anticipation of any increase in margins under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961 and in consideration of this allowance, the Union agrees to waive the benefit of the first two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) of the amount of any such eventual increase during the term of this Agreement or any renewal thereof.

Cold Cellars.—Workers in cold rooms or cellars with a temperature of less than 45 deg. Fah. (excluding cellarman) shall be paid 5s. per week in addition to the minimum rate.

Boiler Cleaning (which shall include scraping, cleaning and painting cylinders).—For all time which they may be employed at this class of work, workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification.

Ammonia Coils.—For all time which they may be employed chipping, cleaning, scraping or painting ammonia coils workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification, and whilst so engaged shall be supplied free with goggles, pullovers and respirators and allowed reasonable time before the end of each shift to cleanse themselves.

Coal Handling.—Workers employed on breaking, crushing and handling coal in bunkers or bins shall, for all time whilst so engaged be entitled to be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification.

Boots.—The employers agree to supply boots to those workers employed at bottle washing on the tanks at the tubs at the filters, at the cask-washing shed and at the bottlers, to be worn during working hours, same to be supplied free of cost by the employers.

Oilers and Aprons.—The employers agree to provide oilskin coats and leather aprons for carters, to be used whilst the employers' work is being done only.

Overalls.—The employers will provide overalls for those employees engaged in cleaning boilers or economisers whilst so engaged. The overalls will remain the property of the employers and will be retained after completion of the tasks. They will then be cleaned for future re-issue and use for the same purposes.

Pullovers.—The employers will provide pullovers for the use of employees permanently employed in Cold Cellars. The pullovers will remain the property of the employers who will also arrange to have them laundered from time to time.

3.—Hours.

Forty hours shall constitute an ordinary week's work for all workers. Such hours shall (except as to shift workers) be worked on the following basis:—

- (a) All workers other than those mentioned in subclauses (b) and (c) hereunder.—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, to be worked within a spread of hours of 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. with one hour for lunch.
- (b) Firemen.—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 5 a.m. on any day. The employer may require any fireman to start work at any time after 5 a.m.
- (c) Night Cellarmen and Night Malsters.—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 4.30 p.m. nor after 2 a.m. on any ordinary working day.

4.—Shift Work.

(a) Workers may be employed—

- (i) on "regular shift work" that is in regular rotation from week to week on two or three shifts spread over 16 or 24 hours respectively day shift to be worked from 7.30 a.m. to not later than 3.30 p.m. afternoon shift from 3.30 p.m. to not later than 11.30 p.m. and night shift from 11.30 p.m. to not later than 7.30 a.m.
- (ii) on "casual shift work" that is on one weekly shift only worked in any department, casual, day, afternoon and night shifts to start and finish at the times respectively referred to in the preceding paragraph.

(b) In the case of both regular and casual shift work the first shift of the week will begin on Sunday at 11.30 p.m. and the last shift of the week shall finish at 11.30 p.m. on Friday. Duty rosters shall be posted on Friday in each week and shall show the starting and finishing times of each worker during each week. Particulars relating to starting and finishing times shall be rigidly adhered to.

(c) The provisions contained in the previous subclauses of this clause may be varied by mutual agreement between any employer and the Union.

(d) All workers employed on regular afternoon and night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 10 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(e) All workers employed on casual night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 12½ per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(f) A crib time of thirty minutes shall be allowed to all workers on regular or casual shift. Crib time shall be included in the working time.

(g) The additional allowances mentioned in subclauses (d) and (e) hereof shall be taken into consideration in calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for the purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this Agreement.

5.—Overtime.

(a) The following overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half:—All time up to 4 hours worked.

- (i) Over 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.
- (ii) Outside the starting and finishing time mentioned in clause 3 (a) and before the starting time of 5.0 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. mentioned in clauses 3 (b) and (c) respectively.

(iii) In the case of shift workers outside rostered starting and finishing times.

(iv) On Saturday.

(b) All adult workers employed in or about a brewery bottling works, malt house or bottleyard and engaged in the process of manufacture, preparation for distribution, and distribution of the product, if called upon to work on a Saturday or Sunday shall be guaranteed a minimum of four (4) hours pay and any other workers not so engaged shall be guaranteed a minimum of two (2) hours pay.

(c) All overtime in excess of four hours worked during the periods referred to in subclause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(d) Subject to any alteration by mutual arrangement, all workers on day work engaged in or about a brewery or bottling works shall, if required to work more than one hour's overtime after the usual finishing time, be entitled to knock off for one hour after the usual finishing time for refreshments in which event, if notice of overtime has not been given at least 24 hours previously, tea money shall be paid at the rate of six shillings (6s.) but where food is provided by the employer, tea money shall be reduced by the cost of the food provided. If notice of overtime has been given at least 24 hours previously, tea money shall be paid at the rate of four shillings (4s.) and where food is provided by the employer, tea money shall be reduced by the cost of the food provided.

6.—Lunch Intervals.

The lunch intervals of 60 minutes shall be taken between 12 o'clock and 1.0 p.m. or between 1.0 p.m. and 2.0 p.m.

7.—Smoke-o.

Ten minutes shall be allowed at 10 o'clock a.m. and again at 3 o'clock p.m. This concession however does not apply to men working on shifts.

8.—Casual Hands.

Casual hands shall be paid by the hour at the rate of ordinary pay plus five shillings (5s.) per day.

9.—Record.

Each employer shall keep a record of the name of each worker (except stablemen), the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked and wages paid to each worker, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the Secretary or any other person appointed by the Union during working hours. Each worker shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

10.—Sundays.

All work performed by workers in any department on Sunday and Easter Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All workers required to work on Sundays shall be allowed one Sunday off per fortnight; provided that the employer may, in an emergency, require such workers to work on consecutive Sundays.

11.—Holidays.

All employees called upon to work in any department on the undermentioned holidays shall be paid one (1) day's pay for the holiday and in addition shall receive the following rates of pay on an hourly basis. All holiday shifts shall rotate.

(a) One and one-half (1½) times the ordinary rate of pay with a minimum of four (4) hours' pay.

(b) Twice (2) the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of four (4) hours.

The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Annual Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Show Day, and Sovereign's Birthday. In case any of the above holidays falls on a Saturday or a Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

12.—Annual Leave.

(a) An employer shall grant an employee who completes twelve (12) months' service, three (3) weeks' annual leave. Such leave shall be taken during the period commencing on the first day of April and terminating on the 31st day of October each year, provided that, where any employees engaged on maintenance are required to work during the winter months, such employees may, at the discretion of the employer, take their leave outside the period already referred to.

An employer shall pay to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than one (1) month but less than three (3) months an amount equivalent to one and one-quarter ($1\frac{1}{4}$) days' pay in respect of each completed month of service; and to an employee who has been continuously employed for more than three (3) months an amount equivalent to two and one-twelfth ($2\frac{1}{12}$) days' pay in respect of each completed month of service. The said payments shall be made to an employee entitled thereto—

- (a) on the termination of his service if such termination occurs before he takes his leave; or
- (b) on the taking of his annual leave if he remains in the service of his employer.

An employer shall set aside and/or credit to an employee's account from time to time sufficient money to cover the said payments so that, unless the employee's services are terminated earlier there will be available for him at the time he takes his annual leave a sum equivalent to two (2) weeks' double pay and one (1) week's single pay and apart from paying the money so set aside an employer shall not be obliged to make any payments to an employee in respect of his annual leave or in respect of the period during which such leave is actually taken.

(b) It shall be a condition of every worker taking annual leave that he—

- (i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
- (ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of leave; and
- (iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with annual leave.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar payments or benefits.

A breach of condition (ii) (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a medical officer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

13.—Bonus.

The employer shall pay to an employee receiving wages under this Agreement a bonus equal to one fiftysecond part of each week's pay. The employer's liability shall become absolute at the end of each week of an employee's service. The said bonus shall be accumulated by the employer and held on behalf of and paid to the employee entitled thereto in the last week of December in each year or on the earlier termination of his service.

14.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last twenty completed years of continuous service. Provided, however, that where a worker has received long service leave under previous agreements on the basis of 13 weeks' leave after 25

years' service, he shall be entitled to further six and one half ($6\frac{1}{2}$) weeks' leave on the completion of each 10 years continuous service after the date he first qualified for long service leave.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmitter") to another employer (herein called "the transferee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmitter in that business becomes an employee of the transferee—the period the continuous service with the worker has had with the transmitter (including any such service with any prior transmitter) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transferee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(4) Such service shall include—

- (a) any period of absence from duty or any annual leave or long service leave;
- (b) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
- (c) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in Section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (e) any termination of the employment of the worker on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
- (f) any termination of the employment of the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;

- (g) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate Union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (h) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post. Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Subject to subclause b (2) where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be:—

- (i) If such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under Placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.
- (ii) If such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under Placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or, in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of a Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination.

the amount of leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply, the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall, subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be at the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this agreement.

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker, the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay—

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payments shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies:—

(a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrued due or at such time as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time as may be determined by a Board of Reference having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by a Board of Reference, the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(c) Where a worker is beyond sixty years of age at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave he shall have the option of taking actual leave under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for long service leave.

(d) The employer shall have the right in cases of emergency to recall any worker from long service leave, in which case the unexpired leave shall be made up on some mutually convenient date.

(e) Any leave shall be exclusive of any public holidays or Annual Leave specified in this Agreement occurring during the period when the leave is taken.

(f) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

(i) In full before the worker goes on leave;

(ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or

(iii) in any other way agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

(g) It shall be a condition of every worker's taking long service leave that he (or she)—

(i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;

(ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of the leave; and

(iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with long service leave pay.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance, or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) above (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a Medical Officer appointed by the employer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

(h) In order to avoid confusion and embarrassment workers whilst on long service leave shall not, without the prior permission of the officer in charge of the particular establishment, visit any of the premises of the employer except for the purpose of collecting pay or transacting genuine business with the employer's officers. Social visits shall not be indulged in. "Establishment" means any brewery, cooperage, or workshop, but does not include hotels or annual picnics or sports or usual weekly competitive sporting activities.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Subject to subclause (b) (2) any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve months thereafter or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement

to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Agreement with respect to the Time and Wages Record.

(h) Board of Reference.

In the event of any disputes arising on any matters herein the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference appointed by the parties to this Agreement and the Board shall determine all such disputes.

15.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

16.—Engagement.

The engagement between employer and worker, except casual hands, shall be weekly and may be terminated by a week's notice from either party, except in the case of the worker absenting himself without leave, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of other misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempest, when such engagement may be terminated immediately.

17.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker who is unable through sickness or accident to attend his duties shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty.

(b) A worker shall be entitled to sick pay in respect of any period of absence on account of sickness after the 1st day of January, 1948, on the basis of one-half day's pay for each completed month served with the employer between the said 1st day of January, 1948, and the date of the commencement of such absence, provided that, in calculating the amount due to a worker in respect of any particular period of absence through sickness, there shall be deducted therefrom any sum or sums previously paid to him hereunder.

(c) The term "sickness" shall not include any case where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof of his sickness satisfactory to the employer. This proof shall be in the form of a medical certificate if the absence is for three days or more. The employer shall have the right at any time to have the worker examined by a doctor on behalf of the employer.

(e) Except as aforesaid, a worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost through sickness or accident.

18.—Contractors.

All work of any employee in the capacity as mentioned in this Agreement in or about a brewery or bottling works or in connection with the business of brewing or bottling beer shall be carried out departmentally by *bona fide* brewery employees engaged and paid direct by the brewery proprietors and not by agents or contractors. This clause shall not apply to contractors erecting, repairing or making alterations to buildings or machinery or to carriers being engaged for the delivery of goods other than beer as has been the practice or custom prior to this date. But when contractors are employed delivering beer, the brewery company shall undertake to see that, whilst employed on such work, the contractors pay to both the drivers and offiders the same wages and work under the same conditions as is provided in this Agreement.

19.—Area.

This agreement shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

20.—Term.

This agreement shall be for a term commencing on the 1st day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two and expiring on the 30th day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-three.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 29 of 1962.

(Registered 18th December, 1962.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1961, this 18th day of December, 1962, between the Commissioners of the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia on the one part and the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia Salaried Officers' Association (Union of Workers), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties as follows: Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to an Industrial Agreement made on the 13th day of July, 1962, and numbered 9 of 1962, do mutually agree that the said Industrial Agreement shall be and the same is hereby varied in the following manner, that is to say:—

Clause 7—Professional Engineers.—Group 11A. Delete the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

Clause 7—Professional Engineers.

(a) For the purpose of this clause—

- (i) "Professional Engineer" shall mean an adult male person qualified to carry out professional engineering duties. The term "Professional Engineer" shall embrace and include "Qualified Engineer" and "Experienced Engineer" as hereunder defined;
- (ii) "Qualified Engineer" shall mean a professional engineer other than an experienced engineer as hereafter defined, that is, it shall mean a person who is or is qualified to become a graduate member of the Institution of Engineers, Australia;
- (iii) "Graduate" shall mean a qualified engineer who is the holder of a university degree (4 or 5 year course) recognised by the Institution of Engineers, Australia;

(iv) "Experienced Engineer" shall mean a professional engineer with the undermentioned qualifications in any particular employment the adequate discharge of any portion of the duties of which employment requires qualifications of the employee as (or at least equal to those of) an Associate member of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.

(b) The aforesaid qualifications are as follows:—

- (i) That he has attained the age of 25 years, and
- (ii) (1) that he is an Associate member of the said Institution, or
- (2) that he, having graduated in a four-year or a five-year course at a university recognised by the said Institution, has had four years' experience on professional engineering duties since becoming a qualified engineer; or
- (3) that he, not having graduated, has had five years of such experience.

(c) (i) The rates of pay of professional engineers (other than those classified under subclause (d) of this clause) shall be as follows:—

(ii) The commencing margin for a graduate shall be £792.

(d) (i) The classification of professional engineers beyond the range fixed by subclause (c) (1) of this clause and the fixing of their salaries shall be vested in the Commission, subject to the right of appeal as provided in clause 38 of Industrial Agreement No. 9 of 1962.

(ii) The Commission shall issue a general reclassification of professional engineering offices and officers at least once in each five (5) yearly period, commencing on the date of registration of this Industrial Agreement.

(iii) The classes and rates of pay for professional engineers (other than those classified under subclause (c) (i) of this clause) shall be as follows:—
