ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1962, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby appoint Edward Colin Cadd and James Francis Sanderson to be members of the Children's Court at Northam and doth hereby revoke the appointments of Alfred Horace Rush-ton and George Campbell Curlewis as members of the Children's Court at Northam.
