Constitution Act, 1889.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1060/58.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889 provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department) should be vested in Roy Albert Hamilton and Frank Enos Watson: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Roy Albert Hamilton and Frank Enos Watson the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

Geraldton Country Water and Rating Zone.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 367/18.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of a Country Water Area: and whereas, by section 10 of the said Act, it is further provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend a Rating Zone in a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Geraldton Country Water Area and Geraldton Rating Zone to include the area defined in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

Extension to the Geraldton Country Water Area and Geraldton Rating Zone.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-eastern corner of Victoria Location 181, a point on the present boundary of the Geraldton Country Water Area, and extending southerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the northern boundary of location 664; thence easterly, southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the western side of Geraldton Highway; thence south-easterly along that side to the south-eastern corner of location 1298; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean; thence generally north-westerly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 6848, a point on the present boundary of the Geraldton Country Water Area aforesaid, and thence easterly along that present boundary to the starting point, as shown bordered red on plan P.W.D., W.A. 40256.
