ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 732/56, Ex. Co. No. 2000.

WHEREAS it is provided in section 161 (c) of the Health Act, 1911-1962, that the provisions of Division 3 of Part V of the said Act shall operate in certain districts which the Governor may declare, by Order in Council, to be districts within which the provisions of the said Division 3 of Part V shall apply: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of Executive Council, hereby declares that the provisions of Division 3 of Part V of the Health Act, 1911-1962, shall operate and have effect in the health district of the Esperance Shire Council.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 574/63.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1961, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Bunbury Fire District as set forth in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the Municipal District of Bunbury referred to in that Part IV of such

schedule that portion of the municipal district of the Town of Bunbury described and set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

That portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of Koombana Bay situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of Leschenault Location 24 and extending easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the low water mark of the north-western shore of Leschenault Inlet; thence generally south-westerly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of Wellington Location P403; thence south-easterly along that prolongation to the low water mark of the south-eastern shore of Leschenault Inlet aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly along that low water mark, excluding Gerrard Island (Reserve 13532), to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the north-eastern boundary of lot 28 of Leschenault Location 26, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3734; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of that lot and of lots 33 to 47 inclusive to the north-eastern side of Australind Road (road number 47); thence south-easterly to the southern corner of the truncation on the eastern side of the junction of Australind Road and Preston Street; thence south-easterly and southerly along north-eastern and eastern sides of Preston Street to the northern side of Rodsted Street (road number 1678); thence easterly along that side to the left bank of the Preston River; thence generally southerly and south-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of lot 1 of location 12, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 12060; thence southerly to and along that boundary to the intersection with the prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Wellington Location 140; thence westerly to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of location 167 to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned location and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 337; thence northerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to its north-western corner; thence west-south-westerly to the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the southern side of Brittain Road with the prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Reserve 10056; thence westerly to and along the southern side of Brittain Road aforesaid and onwards to the western side of Bussell Highway; thence north-westerly along that side to the south-eastern corner of location 4656 (Reserve 23839); thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location to its south-western corner; thence south-south-westerly along the north-western boundary of Reserve 4660 to the south-eastern corner of lot 297 of location 41, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3097; thence west-north-westerly along the south-western boundary of that lot to its south-western corner; thence north-north-westerly along a south-eastern boundary of Reserve 670 to the southern side of Hastie Street; thence westerly along the prolongation of that side to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and thence generally north-north-easterly and generally easterly along that low water mark and the low water mark of Koombana Bay aforesaid to the starting point. (Public Plans Bunbury Sheets 1, 2, 3, 4 and Bunbury Central.)

Land Act, 1933-1962.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole

Corres. 3111/61.—That Reserve No. 26971 (Swan Location 5560) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to The Home of Peace for the Chronic Sick to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hospital Site (Home of Peace).

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Corres. 9985/10, Vol. 3.—That Reserve No. 26975 (Bunbury Lot 436) should vest in and be held by the Town of Bunbury in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the provisions of the Public Education Endowment Act, 1909-1925.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 678/60.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 25637 (Busselton Lot 343) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton in trust for the purpose of a Tea Rooms Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton in trust for a Tea Rooms Site with power to the said Shire of Busselton, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 958/60, Lands 3467/59.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 12th day of October, 1960, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 4 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Retirement of Councillors.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G.D. 144/60.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 41 (7) (d) of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where a district is divided into wards which, or some of which, are not represented by the same number of councillors, retirement from office by the councillors shall be as set out in the section; and whereas it is further provided by subparagraph (iv) of the said paragraph (d) that where, in relation to a municipal council one ward is, or some wards are, represented by only one councillor and another ward is, or other wards are, represented by councillors of a number which is not three or a multiple of three, the order of retirement of each of the councillors is in inverse order to the percentage of primary votes cast for him at his election, but is such that as near as practicable to one-third of the total number retires on the Fourth Saturday in May of each year; and whereas it is further provided in section 41 (8) of the said Act that where in a district the order of retirements of any member will not be in accordance with the provisions of the section the Governor may, by order, declare the date on which that member shall retire; and whereas the Kalamunda Shire Council is represented by nine councillors, which is a multiple of three, but the respective wards are represented as to one ward by one councillor and as to the other four wards by two councillors respectively; and whereas the arrangement at present existing for retirement of members is such that there are not retiring in each year as near as practicable to one-third of the number of councillors in each ward; and whereas it is considered necessary that the retirements, should be brought into conformity with that Act and to that end that the term of office for each of the councillors shall be declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the dates upon which the respective councillors shall retire from office shall be as follows:—

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Hon. the Minister administering the Bush Fires Act has, under the authority contained in section 17 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1958, suspended the operation of all declarations prohibiting the setting fire to the bush so far as the declarations extend to Prohibited Burning Times Zone No. 6 (Metropolitan Fire District Zone) as defined in the *Government Gazette* of 13th September, 1963, subject to the conditions that all burning with the exception of fires for cooking purposes, carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall be carried out in accordance with the following specified conditions:—

Rules for Burning.

A. From 1st October, 1963, to 30th November, 1963 (inclusive):—

- (1) Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed one-third of an acre:—

(a) Standing Grass may be burnt provided that—

- (i) a firebreak at least three feet wide cleared of all flammable material has first been provided immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and

(ii) at least two adult persons are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; and

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided, and has water flowing continuously through it; or

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative fire fighting equipment, of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire, is provided.

(b) Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt in an incinerator of a type approved by the Bush Fires Board and maintained in the condition in which it was purchased or approved; or may be burnt on open ground provided the following conditions are complied with:—

(i) The refuse or rubbish is first heaped, and surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all flammable material, of a width at least equal to the greatest width of the heap; and

(ii) at least one adult person is in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; and

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided, and has water flowing continuously through it; or

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative fire fighting equipment of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire, is provided.

(c) Developmental Clearing.—Fallen trees, branches, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations for developmental purposes may be burnt in heaps on open ground provided that a permit to burn be first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act, and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with.

(2) Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds one-third of an acre:—

(a) Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt under the conditions prescribed in (1) (b) above.

(b) Burning of any other kind may only be carried out provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act, and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with.

B. From 1st December, 1963:

(1) Garden Refuse and Rubbish may be burnt—

(a) at any time of the day or night, provided that the burning is carried out in an incinerator of a type approved by the Bush Fires Board and maintained in the condition in which it was purchased or approved; or

(b) between 6 o'clock in the evening and midnight of the same day, provided that—

(i) the refuse or rubbish is first heaped, and surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all flammable material, of a width at least equal to the greatest width of the heap; and

(ii) at least one adult person is in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; and

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided, and has water flowing continuously through it; or

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative fire fighting equipment of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire, is provided.

(2) No other burning, with the exception of fires for cooking purposes, may be carried out.

- (b) Where a residence has not been erected on the land, but the land has been developed by general clearing of scrub and fallen timber, a firebreak not less than six feet wide, shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land, and any buildings erected on the land shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings.
- (c) Where a residence has been erected on the land, then all buildings shall be immediately surrounded by a firebreak cleared of all inflammable material to a width of three feet around the perimeter of the buildings and a firebreak not less than six feet wide shall be cleared inside and along the whole of the boundaries of the land.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, the approval of the Council or its duly authorised officer must be obtained to provide firebreaks in an alternative position or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.

(d) Irrespective of the originating point, long articles requiring the use of more than two four-wheeled wagons for carriage shall be subject to a minimum freight charge of two tons at First Class for the first four-wheeled wagon, and two tons at First Class for each additional wagon, whether such be used for carrying the load or as a safety wagon.

(e) The freight on all other goods, whether for the same Consignee or otherwise in the wagon or wagons is to be included in deciding whether the minimum requirements in paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this Clause are satisfied.

(f) No long article other than timber, which requires for its carriage the use of more than four wagons, shall be received and carried, except under special arrangements.

Delete the whole of Clause 9—Absence Through Sickness and insert in lieu thereof the following new clause:—

9.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) An Assistant Mistress shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for two (2) weeks on full pay and one (1) week on half pay in each calendar year at the rate of 5/24ths of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the Assistant Mistress leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the Assistant Mistress being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when an Assistant Mistress is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) An Assistant Mistress shall not be entitled to receive any wages from her employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of her employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of her own wilful default or for sickness arising out of her own wilful default.

(e) No Assistant Mistress shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless she produces proof satisfactory to her employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has not been allowed in any year to any Assistant Mistress by her employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the Assistant Mistress and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by her employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause and to any previous award shall be available to the Assistant Mistress for a period of five years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(g) Any time in respect of which an Assistant Mistress is absent from work except time for which she is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or school vacations as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining her right to payment under this Clause.

AGREEMENT

(Registered 9th August, 1963.)

THIS Agreement, to be known as the "Salaried Officers' (Department of Transport) Agreement", made pursuant to the provisions of Part 10 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-61, this 8th day of August, 1963, between The Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the "Association") of the one part and the Commissioner of Transport (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner") of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed by the Commissioner in an administrative, clerical or inspectorial capacity.

3.—Basic Rate Interpretation.

In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of—

- (a) male officers employed in the metropolitan area—the nearest pound (£) to the result obtained by multiplying the male basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th);
- (b) male officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared—the nearest pound (£) to the result obtained by multiplying the basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th);
- (c) female officers—seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest pound (£) of the male basic rate for the respective areas as determined in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subclause.

(b) Classes and grades beyond a margin of £477 per annum shall be those set out in clause 4 of this Agreement, provided that an officer shall not be eligible for promotion to a position classified above the automatic range or to claim or receive a salary higher than a margin of £477 per annum, until he has passed a promotional examination as determined by the Commissioner from time to time or has acquired equal or higher qualifications as approved by the Commissioner.

(c) An officer who is over the age of twenty-one (21) years on appointment to the automatic range may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of service and not on age.

(d) A male clerk classified in the automatic range who is a married man or is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner, shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale of the automatic range, with a maximum margin inclusive of such allowance, of £477 per annum.

(e) A male clerk classified in the automatic range who has passed the promotional examination or has acquired equal or higher qualifications approved by the Commissioner and who has been retained on the maximum margin of the automatic range for at least one year, shall be paid an allowance of £50 per annum which shall be increased to £100 per annum on completion of a further year's service on the automatic range. Thereafter the allowance shall be increased—

(i) to £150 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of £100 per annum for a period of twelve months ; and

(ii) to £200 per annum on the completion of a further twelve months' service ; provided that—

(a) an allowance under this subclause shall not be granted unless the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency, and ability of the officer to perform higher duties ;

(b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary margin up to the minimum margin of the position to which he is promoted, and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary margin as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments ; and

(c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(f) A male clerk who occupies a Class 1 position shall be paid an allowance of £50 per annum after completion of twelve months' service on the maximum margin of such Class 1 position, which allowance shall increase to £100 per annum after completion of a further twelve months' service ; provided that—

(a) in each case, the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties ;

(b) on the promotion of an officer to a higher position, any allowance received by him under this subclause shall be reduced by the amount which is required to bring his salary margin up to the minimum margin of the position to which he is promoted, and thereafter, any allowance still received by the officer shall be reduced and converted to salary margin as and when the officer becomes eligible for annual grade increments ;

(c) an allowance paid under this subclause shall cease, should the officer refuse to accept promotion ; and

(d) an officer shall not be eligible to receive an allowance under this subclause unless he has completed not less than nine years' service in the Clerical Division as an adult permanent officer.

6.—Inspectorial Staff.

(a) Hours of Duty :

The normal hours of duty to be observed by Inspectors will be 80 hours in each fortnight. Hours of duty will be in accordance with rosters which will provide each Inspector with 48 hours notice of the fact that he is required to report for duty, and also provide breaks of 12 hours duration between individual tours of duty. Provided that where an Inspector is called out for duty without the required notice he shall receive overtime, or time in lieu thereof at the rate of time and one half for the first four hours and double time thereafter. Provided further that payment shall be made or leave in lieu granted for a minimum period of 2½ hours.

(b) Meal Allowance :

Where a tour of duty extends over two normal meal periods, an Inspector shall be reimbursed the cost of one meal at the rate prescribed in clause 5 of the Public Service Allowances Agreement.

(c) Protective Clothing :

Each Inspector shall be provided with a dustcoat, waterproof top-coat and cap.

(d) An adult female General Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in this clause, may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same margin as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position, on the grounds that the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position; and if the Commissioner is satisfied that the duties and responsibilities of her position are identical with those of a male position, she shall be paid the same margin as that prescribed for the male officer occupying the identical position.

(e) An adult female Professional Division officer who is paid in accordance with the rates prescribed in this clause, may apply to the Commissioner to be paid the same margin as that prescribed for a male officer occupying an identical position, on the grounds that—

- (i) she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position; and
- (ii) the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position;

and if the Commissioner is satisfied that she possesses the same academic qualifications as those required by a male officer occupying an identical position, and that the duties and responsibilities of the position which she occupies are identical with those of a male position, she shall be paid the same margin as that prescribed for the male officer occupying the identical position.

8.—Female Officers—Clerk-Typists, Typists, Machinists, etc.

- (i) in the case of a Typist or Clerk-Typist she passes an efficiency examination in shorthand writing at a speed of 100 words per minute and typewriting at 50 words per minute;
- (ii) in the case of a machinist she passes an examination in typewriting at a speed of 35 words per minute and in the operating of accounting and listing machines; and
- (iii) such allowance shall cease on the promotion of the officer to the higher position or should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(d) An officer classified in the automatic range who has passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (c) and has completed at least two (2) years' continuous service on a margin of £344 per annum exclusive of allowance, shall be paid an allowance of £52 per annum, inclusive of the allowance under subclause (c). Thereafter the allowance shall be increased to—

- (i) £79 per annum when the officer has been in receipt of the allowance of £52 per annum for a period of twelve (12) months; and to
- (ii) £106 per annum on the completion of a further twelve (12) months' service.

(e) The payment of an allowance in accordance with subclause (d) shall be subject to a certificate from the Commissioner as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties and such allowance shall be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or shall cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(f) An officer classified in the automatic range who has not passed either of the examinations referred to in subclause (c) shall be paid—

- (i) an allowance of £25 per annum on completion of five (5) years' continuous service on a margin of £344 per annum provided the Commissioner certifies that the officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position or should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (ii) an allowance of £30 per annum on completion of not less than twenty (20) years of continuous permanent service, provided the Commissioner certifies as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer.

10.—Marginal Allowance.

All officers covered by this Agreement shall be paid marginal allowances similar to those applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904–1953.

The various salary rates expressed herein shall be automatically varied to conform to any variations which are made from time to time in the equivalent salary rates applying to officers under the Public Service Act, 1904–1953. Any such variations shall apply from the date that the variations have been effected in respect to officers employed under the Public Service Act, 1904–1953.

12.—Annual Increments.

Subject to good conduct, efficiency and diligence, officers shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of their respective classes by annual increments.

13.—Conditions of Service.

Except as otherwise provided herein, the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904–1953, and the regulations made thereunder, and the provisions of the Public Service Allowances Agreement and subsequent amendments thereto, shall apply to officers bound by this Agreement.

14.—Qualifications Allowance—Male Officers.

(a) Diplomates :

A male adult clerk who holds—

the diploma in Commerce of the University of Western Australia ; or
the diplomas in Public Administration, Transport Administration, Accountancy or Management Studies of the Technical Education Division of the Education Department ;

or passes the final examinations in all subjects in the syllabus of—

an Institute of Accountants, Secretaries or Cost Accountants approved by the Commissioner ; or
the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers ; or
the Australian Insurance Institute ;

or passes—

in five (5) units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science, Economics or Law at the University of Western Australia ; or
the examination in Law prescribed under Section 25 of the Public Service Act, 1904–1953 ;

or holds or passes—

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid ;

and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule "A" to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (b) of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

(b) Graduates :

A male adult clerk who holds—

a degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Law of the University of Western Australia ; or

who holds or passes—

a qualification or examination which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, is equivalent to any of the aforesaid,

and who is in receipt of a margin which is expressed in column (a) of Schedule "A" to this Agreement, shall be paid qualifications allowance at the rate expressed in column (c) of that schedule immediately adjacent to the officer's margin.

(c) Payment of an allowance under the provisions of this clause shall cease—

either

(i) as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a margin for which no qualifications allowance is provided,

or

(ii) by the effluxion of a period of ten (10) years from the date on which the officer first became entitled to payment of an allowance under this clause, whichever occurs first.

Provided that in the event of (ii) hereof, payment of the allowance shall not cease before the 30th day of June, 1965.

15.—Classification of Officers and Rights of Appeal.

(a) The classification of officers and the fixing of salaries of officers shall be vested in the Commissioner subject to the right of appeal as provided in subsections (c), (d) and (e) of this clause.

(b) The Commissioner shall re-classify officers covered by this Agreement as from the same date as the general reclassification of officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904–1953, is effected by the Public Service Commissioner.

(c) An Appeal Board consisting of a Magistrate as Chairman, and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties to this Agreement, shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by an officer employed by the Commissioner against a decision of the Commissioner in respect to—

- (i) the title, classification, reclassification or salary of such officer employed by the Commissioner ;
- (ii) disciplinary action resulting in the imposition of a fine, reduction to a lower class or grade, or dismissal from the Department ;
- (iii) the interpretation or application of the provisions of this Agreement.

(d) The times within which written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the Commissioner shall be as follows :—

(i) In the case of an appeal in respect of title, classification or reclassification, one (1) month after the publication of such title, classification or reclassification.

(ii) In the case of an appeal against any other matter, one (1) month after the occurrence of the matter aforesaid.

(e) The decision of the Appeal Board shall be final and binding on all parties.

16.—Fundamental Basis for Determination of Rates of Pay.

The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay expressed in this Agreement is the rate payable under the provisions of subclause (a) of clause 5 to a male clerical division officer at the age of 26 years or during the sixth year of adult service. This rate was determined on the 12th August, 1963 at a margin of £427 per annum over the basic rate.

17.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate as from the 12th day of August, 1963, and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years from that date, provided that either of the parties may, after the 11th day of August, 1964, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, or approach the Court for an amendment of this Agreement.
