Taxi-cars (Co-ordination and Control) Act, 1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted (inter alia) by section 4 of the Taxi-cars (Co-ordination and Control) Act, 1963, that the Act applies only to the metropolitan and to such other portions of the State as the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, declare and is by that section authorised to declare; and whereas it appears to the Lieutenant-Governor expedient that the portion of the State described in the schedule hereto should (together with the metropolitan area) be declared a control area for the purposes of the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Execuacting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section and by section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1962, doth declare that all that portion of the State described in the schedule hereto shall, together with the metropolitan area (within the meaning of the Act), constitute a control area to be known as the "Metropolitan Control Area."

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the shore of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Swan Location 5392 and extending easterly to and along that boundary and northern boundaries of locations 3871, 5270, again 3871, the southern boundaries of locations 7007, 1879, 2035 and 1008 to the western side of road 1879, 2035 and 1008 to the western side of road number 3160; thence generally north-north-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the north-western side of Hocking Road; thence north-easterly to and along that side and onwards to the eastern side of Wanneroo Road; thence south-easterly along that side to the northern side of road number 4876; thence generally easterly along that side and onwards, generally easterly, along the northern sides of road numbers 7815, 1878 and 8705 and the northern side of Henry Street to the western side of road number 1116; thence genthe western side of road number 1116; thence generally northerly and generally north-easterly along that side and the western side of Great Northern Highway to a point situate in prolongation west-erly of the southern boundary of lot 5 of location 1 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 3985; thence south-easterly to the intersection of the southern side of Toodyay Road and the eastern side of Roland Road; thence generally southerly along that side to the southern boundary of location 12; thence westerly along that boundary of location 12; thence westerly along that boundary and onwards to the right bank of the Swan River; thence generally southerly downwards along that bank to the northern side of Middle Swan Road; thence generally westerly along that side and the southern boundary of location K1 to its intersection with the western boundary of the Shire of Swan Guildford; thence north north westerly section with the western boundary of the Same of Swan-Guildford; thence north-north-westerly along that boundary to its intersection with the southern boundary of location H; thence generally westerly along that boundary, the northern side of a one-chain road passing through portion of location 1215 and the northern side of Beach location 1315 and the northern side of Beach Road and onwards to the shore of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; and thence generally northwesterly along that shore to the starting point.

 - (v) where reticulated water is not where reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment, of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire is provided. the fire is provided.
 - (b) Standing bush over three feet height, fallen trees, branches, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may be burnt provided that a permit to burn be first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act, and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied
- (2) Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds one-third of an acre, bush may only be burnt provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with.
