ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 4278/48.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of to be specified in such order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27301 at Margaret River should vest in and be held by the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River in trust for the purpose of Stock Saleyards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River in trust for Stock Saleyards, with power to the said Shire for Stock Saleyards, with power to the said Shire of Augusta-Margaret River, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Buildings and Haystacks.—A firebreak six feet wide shall be cleared one chain from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and homesteads, by the 15th November, 1964, and the area between the firebreaks and the building or hay stack shall be cleared of all infiammable material by the 15th December, 1964.

Townsites.—On or before the 15th December, 1964, all town lots within the Shire are required to be cleared of all debris of infiammable nature and maintained free of such material. A spade break of not less than 2 feet is to be cleared round the boundaries of all occupied and unoccupied lots.
