

Booragoon Primary School.—From the junction of North Lake Road and High Road, north along North Lake Road, then east along Canning Highway, south along Hickey Street, east along Shapcott Street, south along McCallum Crescent, then a line projected south along McCallum Crescent to High Road and west along High Road to North Lake Road.

Children living in North Lake Road (both sides), the south side of Canning Highway and the north side of High Road *shall* attend Booragoon School. Children living in Hickey and Shapcott Streets and in McCallum Crescent *shall not* attend Booragoon School.

Children living within the area and boundaries of Booragoon School and who were attending the Attadale, Applecross or Ardross Schools in 1966 shall have the option of continuing to attend these schools.

3. East Coolbellup Primary School.—The boundary between East Coolbellup and Coolbellup Schools shall be a line running through the centre of Coolbellup Avenue so that all children living on the east side of Coolbellup Avenue only shall attend the East Coolbellup School.

Children who were attending Bibra Lake School in 1966 shall be given the option of attending either East Coolbellup or East Hamilton Hill Schools.

4. Gatesby Street Junior Primary School.—From the junction of The Boulevard and West Coast Highway east along The Boulevard, then north along Pandora Drive and Dunstan Road, then east along Empire Avenue, then north along Ailsa Street, then west along Maisie Crescent, Glenelg, Brix, Quorn, Ken and Bent Streets, then north along Brompton Road, then west along Maloney Street to the West Coast Highway.

Children living on the north side only of The Boulevard and on both sides of all other boundary streets shall attend Gatesby Street School.

During the year 1967, only children attending the Wembley Downs School who are in Grades 2 and 3 (1967) and including Grade 1 (1967) and who live south of the boundary between the Gatesby Street and Wembley Downs Schools and have elder siblings in Grades 4 to 7 (1967) attending the Wembley Downs School, shall have the option of attending the Wembley Downs School. As from the beginning of 1968, this option shall not apply to new enrolments.

5. Kinlock Primary School.—The boundary between Kinlock and Cannington Schools shall be the Canning River.

6. McKay Street Junior Primary School.—From the junction of Holder Street and Hill View Terrace east along Holder Street, southeast along Dumont Street, then south along Walpole Street, then west along Manning Road.

Children living on the north side only of Manning Road and on both sides of Dumont and Walpole Streets shall attend McKay Street School. Children living in Holder Street shall not attend McKay Street School.

Children living in the area bounded by the south side of Manning Road (house numbers 176 inclusive and upwards), Bungaree Road (house numbers 1 to 4 inclusive) and both sides of Teague Street shall have the option of attending McKay Street or Wilson Schools.

7. Mount Pleasant Primary School.—From the junction of Ardross Street and Canning Highway, south along Ardross Street, west along Coogee Road, south along Bedford Road, east along Coomora Road, south along Reynolds Road, east along Crest Avenue and a line continued east from Crest Avenue to the Canning River.

Children living on the east side only of Ardross Street, south side only of Coogee Street, east side only of Bedford Road, both sides of Coomora Road and both sides of Crest Avenue shall attend Mount Pleasant School.

8. West Morley Primary School.—From the junction of Cooper and Wonga Roads, south along Cooper Road, east along Lincoln Road, south along Kelby Close and Jennifer Road and including Robann Way east of these streets, then south along Steven Street and southeast along Smith Street, south along Russell Street, west along Walter Road and northwest along The Strand.

Children living in The Strand shall not attend West Morley School. Children living on the north side only of Walter Road and on both sides of all other boundary streets shall attend West Morley School.

Children living in the area bounded by The Strand, Walter Road, Lennard Street and Conto Avenue shall have the option of attending West Morley or Dianella Schools.

9. Adam Road Junior Primary School.—From the junction of Bussell Highway and Goldsmith Street west along Goldsmith Street and West Road and a line continued west from West Road to the ocean.

Children living in Goldsmith Street and West Road shall not attend Adam Road School, but all children living south of the boundary streets shall attend Adam Road School.

EDUCATION ACT, 1928-1966.
