Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Beverley Municipality.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st October 1969, East of the Great Southern Railway or October 15th, 1969, West of the Great Southern Railway to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear, and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material, until the 15th day of April 1970, firebreaks not less than seven (7) feet wide in the following position on land owned or occupied by you.

1. Inside and within three (3) chain of the boundary of all property.

2. Where the above lands are divided by or abut trifficable public roads or railway reserve a fire-break shall be provided within three (3) chain of the boundary of the road or railway reserve.

3. Within three (3) chain of the perimeter of all buildings and hay stacks on the land, to completely surround the buildings or group of buildings or haystacks.

4. Land, the bush on which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing or burning shall be completely surrounded by a firebreak ten (10) feet wide. (Note:— Fire-break may be provided on adjoining land.)

5. Existing gullies, salt lakes, rivers or drains shall not form portion of a firebreak required by this order unless approved by the Shire Council.

6. Rivers: On all river banks a firebreak will be provided on the cleared land as close as is practicable but not further than three (3) chains from high water mark.

7. Beverley Townsite: On or before November 30th 1969, the whole of all Townsite and subdivision lots to be cleared of all inflammable debris. Additionally a firebreak seven (7) feet wide completely free of all inflammable material cleared inside and along all external boundaries.

8. Fuel Dumps: All grass or other inflammable materials must be cleared from areas where fuel drums, either empty or containing fuel, are stored or intended to be stored. The cleared area is to extend for a distance of ten (10) feet completely surrounding the fuel drums.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the positions required by this notice, the approval of the Council must be obtained to provide them in an alternative situation.

Firebreaks in the situation hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of the notice so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of any owner or occupier and the abutting lands referred to hereunder:—

- (a) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on the public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared the bush between the road formation and the common boundary.
- (b) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or a Reserve and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than seven (7) feet wide on the Crown Land or Reserve along the common boundary.

PART II.—DEVELOPMENT.

2.1 Any land or building or part of a building within the Scheme Area may continue to be used for the purpose for which it was used prior to the Scheme coming into operation but no such building shall be altered or added to after that date provided that the Council may permit any such building to be altered to enable it to be used temporarily.

2.2 (a) In this clause:

"Gross total floor area" means the floor area of a building calculated in the manner prescribed by the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme.

Planning Scheme, by-law, order or regulation applying from time to time to the Scheme Area for the purpose of ascertaining the permissible plot ratio.

"Permissible plot ratio" means the plot ratio fixed by any Town Planning Scheme, by-law, order or regulation applying from time to time to the Scheme Area.

(Jerramungup Townsite Area), hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.

1. 2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land set out in the maps in the Appendices hereto.

1. 3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Gnowangerup.

1.4 In the Scheme the planning area is divided into reserves and zones.

The basic types of reserves are:—

Public Open Space.
Public Purposes.
Communications.
Commonwealth.

The basic types of zones are:—

Commercial.
General Industry.
Light Industry.
Residential.
Special Uses.
Rural.

1. 5 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following parts and appendices:—

Part I.—Preliminary.
Part II.—Reserved Land.
Part III.—Zones.
Part IV.—Non-conforming Uses.
Part V.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are appended as follows:—

- (1) Land use Map marked "Map No. 2. (1 and 2)".
- (2) Planning Proposals Map Marked "Map No. 3".

The Scheme report is also appended.

1. 6. Interpretation: In the Scheme the terms used will have the respective set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, unless otherwise specified by the Scheme.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

Reservation of Land and Development thereof.

2. 1 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for any obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority confer with that authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.2 (a) Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the grounds that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) Any claim for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

(c) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to the conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 Table No. 1. appended to Clause 3.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of 'Use Classes' on the left hand side of the Table and the list of 'Zones' on the top of that Table.

3.2 The symbols used in the cross reference to Table No. 1. Appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

"P" = A use that is permitted as of right under the provisions of this Scheme.

"AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.

"IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

"X" = A use that is not permitted.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND

4.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

(a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or

(b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1929 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or uses thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

(b) Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under the Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.3 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one conforming use provided that proposed use is in the opinion of the Council less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended use of the Zone.

4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

(a) Notwithstanding the preceding provision of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.3 when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

(b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART V.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

5.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such arrangement with other owners as it deems fit.

5.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made no later than six months from the date of which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part II shall apply.

5.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by an authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed,

5.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.
