Lands 7066/01, V2.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes to be specified in such Order and with Power of subleasing; and whereas by section 310 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969, it is provided, *inter alia*, that where a Reserve is vested in a Council, the Council may, except to

such extent as the Governor otherwise orders, exercise, in respect of the Reserve, such powers and functions as would be conferred upon the Council if it were a Board of Parks and Reserves to which the Reserve has been committed under the Parks and Reserves Act, 1895; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Class "A" Reserve No. 29911 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Boyup Brook in trust for the purpose of "Park" but that the Council of that Shire should not exercise, in respect of that Reserve, the powers referred to in paragraphs (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Parks and Reserves Act, 1895: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Boyup Brook in trust for a "Park" subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act, and doth hereby order that the Council of the Shire of Boyup Brook shall not, in respect of that Reserve, exercise the powers referred to in paragraphs (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Parks and Reserves Act, 1895.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969 that, where at least ten per centum of the number of the persons whose names appear on the municipal roll of a municipality of a district or fifty of them, whichever is the lesser number, have signed a petition praying for the exercise of the power of the abolition of the district and the dissolution of the municipality of the district and the petition has been prepared, verified and effectively presented in accordance with the appropriate provisions of Division 8 of Part III of the Act, the Governor may make an Order exercising the power and may, pursuant to section 20 of the Act, direct who, if any of the members of the council whose district is affected by the exercise of that power shall go out of office and when; and whereas at least fifty of the persons whose names appear on the municipal roll of the municipality of the Town of Boulder have signed such a petition and the petition has been prepared, verified and effectively presented in accordance with the provisions above-mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth, by this Order, with effect on and from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*, abolish the district of the Town of Boulder and dissolve the municipality of that district and direct that, on the date above-mentioned, the members of the council of the municipality of the Town of Boulder shall go out of office.
