PART I—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Waroona Town Planning Scheme No. One (Coastal Highway area), hereafter called the Scheme and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land bordered in red set out in Map 1 in the Appendices hereto.

1.3 The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Waroona.

1.4 Arrangement of the Scheme: The Scheme is divided into the following Parts:—

Part I—Preliminary.

Part II—Zones.

Part III—Non-conforming Use of Land.

Part IV—Public Signs and Overhead Wires.

Part V—The Exercise of Discretionary Powers.

Part VI—Finance and Administration.

The Scheme documents also include the "Scheme Proposals" and the "Existing Use" Maps.

1.5 Interpretation:

- (1) Subject to the provision of subclause (2) of this clause, in this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix D of the Town Planning Regulations, 1963, unless otherwise specified in this Scheme.
- (2) In this Scheme, unless the context requires otherwise, "highway" means the road designated as such in map 3; "petrol filling station" means business premises for the supply of petroleum products—and automotive accessories, with or without a cafe therein or attached thereto.

PART II—ZONES.

2.1 Table No. 1 appended to clause 2.2 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the table and the list of "Zones" on the top of the table.

2.2 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

- P = A use that is permitted under the provisions of this Scheme.
- AA A use that is not permitted unless
- AS & = approval is granted by the responsible authority.
- AM = A use that is not permitted.

2.3 Any use class which is not included in Table 1 is not permitted in A Rural Zone, and is not permitted in an Urban Zone unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.

PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 Where in respect of land zoned under Part II of the Scheme a nonconforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 3.1 of this part on that Land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building

By-laws made under the Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

3.3 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The Responsible Authority may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.

PART IV.—SIGNS ADVERTISEMENTS POLES AND OVERHEAD WIRES.

4.1 No public sign, advertisement, hoarding, or notice shall be erected other than by a Department of the Government of Western Australia save with the approval of the Responsible Authority.

4.2 The Responsible Authority may remove any public sign, advertisement, hoarding or notice which has been erected contrary to clause 4.1.

4.3 No poles or overhead wires shall be erected within 2 chains of the centre line of the highway unless approval is granted by the Responsible Authority.

PART V.—DISCRETIONARY POWERS.

5.1 In exercising its discretion under Part IV the responsible authority will be guided by the considerations set out in subclauses (a) and (b) of this clause.

- (a) In the case of those classes of use marked AA in Table 1 the Responsible Authority will consider the need to preserve the amenity of the area, to permit a safe and unimpeded flow of traffic on the highway and to provide for the amenity of the public.
- (b) In the case of those classes of use against which AS or AM are written in Table 1, in addition to the considerations set out in subclause (a) of this clause, the Responsible Authority will not permit a lot to be put to such use within 10 miles of a lot similarly used on the same side of the highway. The words similarly used in this subclause shall be deemed to mean uses against which the same letters are shown in the same column of Table 1.

5.2 In exercising its discretion under Part IV the Responsible Authority will be guided by the need to preserve the scenic attractions of the area. It will not approve the erection of any sign on land zoned for rural purposes which advertises any commodity or service which is not sold or prepared by the owner or occupier of the land. It will not approve the erection of any sign which exceeds 3 feet in height or 3 feet in width.

PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Responsible Authority may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purposes may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

6.3 Entry to Premises: The Responsible Authority may by its engineer or other authorised officer enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.4 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.




