

 - (c) Student 16 years and over Concession Tickets (single or return).—The difference between half adult first class single fare and half adult second class single fare applicable for the journey to be made

in the higher class. When excess fare is collected to cover change of class over any section where compulsory charges are applied (i.e. meals, berths, etc.) any excess due for compulsory charges must also be collected at the time.

(c) The "De Luxe" compartment is identified as Berths 5 and 6.

(d) In addition to each occupant of the "De Luxe" compartment holding the appropriate first class inclusive rail ticket for the journey being undertaken, fees as under are to be charged for the use of the "De Luxe" compartment, according to the degree of occupancy:—
