AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth this 12th day of November, 1969, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960-1969.

Shire of Collie.

Valuation and Rating.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G.D. 1499/52.

WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (8) of section 533 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969, that a council of a municipality that is a shire shall for all rateable land within its district adopt valuations assessed on unimproved capital value unless at the request of the council the Governor, as he is hereby authorised to do, makes an order authorising the council to adopt valuations assessed on annual value of any rateable property in its district; and whereas by order published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th July, 1966 the Shire of Collie was authorised to adopt valuations assessed on the annual value of certain rateable land in its district, particulars whereof were set forth in the schedule to that order: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of Executive Council, and pursuant to the power conferred by section 533 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969, doth hereby revoke the abovementioned

order published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th July, 1966 and doth hereby order that the council of the Shire of Collie is authorised to adopt valuations assessed on annual value of rateable land contained within the North Town Ward and the South Town Ward, the boundaries of which Wards are set out in the schedule to an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st January, 1969.

- (4) On all land not less than six (6) feet in width and within a minimum of one chain and parallel to any boundary of a railway reserve and Timber Tramway reserve.

Firebreaks in the situations described hereunder will be accepted as complying with the requirements of this notice, so far as it applies to the common boundary between the land of an owner or occupier, and the abutting land referred to hereunder:—

- (a) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on a public road and the owner or occupier has burned or cleared to the satisfaction of the inspecting officer, the bush between the road formation and the common boundary.
- (b) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserve the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than six (6) feet wide, on the Crown Land or Reserve along the common boundary.

2. Townsite Lands:

- (a) Townsite lots having an area of not more than a half acre shall be completely cleared of all debris of an inflammable nature and maintained free of such material.
- (b) On Townsite lots having an area of more than a half acre, firebreaks not less than 6 feet width shall be provided and maintained inside and along the boundaries of the lots. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner and/or occupier the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group of lots.

If, for any reason, it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk before the Prohibited Burning Period commences in each separate area.

Any such application must bear the signature of the fire control officer of the area signifying his agreement to the variation. If permission for variation is not granted the terms of this notice must be complied with.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and may recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.
