(q) At least five-subject Junior Certificate, including English. Shorthand, typing essential. Good appearance and manner. Self-reliant and confidential.

IT is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) that the Hon. Minister for Town Planning approved the

Town of Bunbury Town Planning Scheme on the 19th November, 1969—the Scheme Text of which is published hereunder.

**TOWN OF BUNBURY TOWN PLANNING**  
SCHEME No. 5.

THE Bunbury Town Council under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as Reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) Other matters authorised by the said Act.

**PART 1.—PRELIMINARY.**

1.1 This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Town of Bunbury Town Planning Scheme No. 5, hereinafter called "The Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land contained in the Scheme maps appended hereto.

1.3 The Town of Bunbury Planning Schemes numbers 3 and 4 from time to time amended are hereby revoked to the extent that they are inconsistent with the Scheme.

1.4 The Responsible Authority for carrying out the Scheme and enforcing the observance thereof is the Council of the Town of Bunbury, (hereinafter referred to as the Council.)

1.5 The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts.

- Part 1.—Preliminary.
- Part 2.—Reserved Land.
- Part 3.—Zones.
- Part 4.—Non-Conforming Uses.
- Part 5.—General Provisions.
- Part 6.—Finance and Administration.

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (1) Existing Uses Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.

1.6 In this Scheme, the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix 'D' of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, unless otherwise specified by the Scheme. Appendix 'D' of the Town Planning Regulations appears in the Scheme as Table 3.

Table 3.

Copy of Appendix 'D' of Town Planning Regulations 1967:—

**PLANNING SCHEME INTERPRETATIONS**

In any Scheme prepared in accordance with the Town Planning Regulations, 1967, unless the Scheme text provides otherwise—

"amenity building" means a building or part of a building that employees or persons engaged in an industry or business use for their personal comfort, convenience or enjoyment of leisure as distinct from the work of the industry or business;

"Board" means the Town Planning Board constituted under the Act;

"building" shall have the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"building line" means the line between which and any public place or public reserve a building may not be erected except by or under the authority of an Act;

"car park" means a site or building used primarily for parking private cars or taxis whether as a public or private car park, but does not include any part of a public road used for parking or for a taxi rank, or any land or buildings on or in which cars are displayed for sale;

"car sales premises" means land and buildings used for the display and sale of cars, whether new or second-hand, but does not include a workshop;

"caretaker's house" means a building used as a residence by the proprietor or manager of an industry carried on upon the same site or by a person having the care of the building or plant of the industry;

"caravan park" means an area set aside for the parking of caravans in conformity with the Caravan and Camp Regulations, 1961, made pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act, 1911 (as amended), and the Local Government Model By-law (Caravan Parks) No. 2. made pursuant to the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), and any amendments to those Regulations or to that Model By-law;

"civic building" means a building designed, used or intended to be used by Government Departments, statutory bodies representing the Crown, or councils as offices or for administrative or other like purposes;

"consulting rooms" means a building or part of a building (other than a hospital) used in the practice of his profession by a legally qualified medical practitioner or dentist, or by a physiotherapist, a masseur or a person ordinarily associated with a medical practitioner in the investigation or treatment of physical or mental injuries or ailments;

"drive-in theatre" means an open air cinema that makes provision for the audience or spectators to view the entertainment while seated in motor vehicles;

"Dry cleaning premises" means land and buildings used for the cleaning of garments and other fabrics by chemical processes;

"duplex house" shall have the same meaning as is given to it and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"dwelling house" means a building used primarily for living purposes as one separate family unit; the term also includes such out-buildings and recreational uses and gardens as are ordinarily used therewith, but does not include a "residential building" or part of such a building;

"educational establishment" means a school, college, university, technical institute, academy or other educational centre, or a lecture hall, but does not include a reformatory institution or institutional home;

"existing use" means use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately prior to the gazettal date of the Scheme, in accordance with the conditions set out in Part IV of Appendix "A";

"extractive industry" includes the extraction of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone minerals or similar substance from the land, and also the manufacture of products from those materials when the manufacture is carried out on the land from which any of those materials is extracted or on land adjacent thereto;

"fish shop" means a shop where the goods kept exposed or offered for sale include wet fish or fish fried on the premises for consumption off the premises.

"flats" shall have the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purpose of the Uniform Building By-laws and includes single unit flats as described in By-law 2808 of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"floor area" shall have the same meaning as is given to it and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"frontage" shall have the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"fuel depot" means a depot for storage or bulk sale of solid or liquid gaseous fuel, but does not include a service station;

"funeral parlour" means land and buildings occupied by undertakers where bodies are stored and prepared for burial or cremation;

"gazettal date" means the date on which notice of the approval of the Minister to a planning Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*;

"general industry" means an industry other than a hazardous, light, noxious, rural, extractive or service industry;

"hazardous industry" means an industry which by reason of the processes involved or the method of manufacture, or the nature of the materials used or produced requires isolation from other buildings;

"health centre" means a maternal or X-ray centre, a district clinic, a masseur's establishment, or a medical clinic;

"height" has the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

"hospital" means any building or part of a building, whether permanent or otherwise, in which persons are received and lodged for medical treatment or care;

"home occupation" means a business carried on with the permission of the responsible authority within a house or the curtilage of a house that—

- (a) does not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) injury or prejudicial affection due to the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, waste water, or waste products;
- (b) does not entail the employment of any person not a member of the occupier's family, except in the case of a professional person;
- (c) does not occupy an area greater than 200 square feet;
- (d) does not require the provision of any essential service main of a greater capacity than normally required in the zone in which it is located; and
- (e) is restricted in advertisement to a sign not exceeding two (2) square feet in area;

"hotel" means land and buildings the subject of a Publican's General Licence, an Hotel Licence or a Wayside-house Licence granted under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911 (as amended), or of any Act in substitution for that Act, but does not include a motel;

"industry" means the carrying out of any process for and incidental to—

- (a) the making, altering, repairing or ornamentation, painting, finishing, cleaning, packing or canning or adapting for sale, or breaking up or demolition of any article or part of any article;
- (b) the winning, processing or treatment of minerals;
- (c) the generation of electricity or the production of gas; and
- (d) the manufacture of edible goods for human or animal consumption, being a process carried on in the

course of trade or business for gain, other than operations connected with—

- (i) the carrying out of agriculture;
- (ii) site work on buildings, works or land; and
- (iii) in the case of the manufacture of goods referred to in subparagraph (d) above, the preparation on the premises of a shop of food for sale;

and includes, when carried out on land upon which the process is carried out and in connection with that process, the storage of goods, any work of administration or accounting, the sale of goods, resulting from the process and the use of land for the amenity of persons engaged in the process;

“institutional buildings” means a building used or designed for use wholly or principally for the purpose of—

- (a) a hospital or sanatorium for the treatment of infectious or contagious diseases;
- (b) a home or other institution for care of State wards, orphans, or persons who are physically or mentally handicapped;
- (c) a penal or reformatory institution;
- (d) a hospital for treatment or care of the mentally sick; or
- (e) any other similar use.

“institutional home” means a residential building for the care and maintenance of children, the aged, or the infirm, and includes a benevolent institution; but does not include a hospital or a mental institution;

“land” includes air stratum titles, messuages, tenements and hereditaments and any estate in the land, and houses, buildings, works and structures, in or upon the land;

- (a) in which the processes carried on, the machinery used, and the goods and commodities carried to and from the premises will not cause any injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of the emission of noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste water, waste products, grit, oil or otherwise; and
- (b) the establishment of which will not or the conduct of which does not impose an undue load on any existing or projected service for the supply or provision of water, gas, electricity, sewerage facilities, or any other like service;

“lot” has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Act, and “allotment” has the same meaning;

“marine filling station” means land and buildings used for the storage and supply of liquid fuels and lubricants for marine craft, but in which no industry is carried on; but does not include a service station;

“milk depot” means a depot to which milk is delivered for distribution to consumers but in which milk is not processed or pasteurised;

“motel” means a building, group of buildings or place used or intended to be used to accommodate patrons in a manner similar to an hotel or boarding house but in which special provision is made for the accommodation of patrons with motor vehicles;

“motor repair station” means land and buildings used for or in connection with mechanical repairs and overhauls, including tyre recapping, retreading, panel beating, spray painting and chassis reshaping;

“new street alignment” See “street alignment”;

“non-conforming use” means the use of land which, though lawful immediately prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme is not in conformity with the Scheme;

“noxious industry” means an industry in which the processes involved constitute an offensive trade within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911 (as amended), but does not include fish shops or dry cleaning establishments;

“office” means the conduct of administration the practice of a profession, the carrying on of agencies, banks, typist and secretarial services and services of a similar nature or, where not conducted on the site thereof, the administration of or the accounting in connection with an industry

“open air display” means the use of land as a site for the display and/or sale of goods and equipment;

“owner” in relation to any land includes the Crown and every person who, jointly or severally, whether at law or in equity—

- (a) is entitled to the land for any estate in fee simple in possession; or
- (b) is a person to whom the Crown has lawfully contracted to grant the fee simple of the land; or
- (c) is a lessee or licensee from the Crown; or
- (d) is entitled to receive or is in receipt of, or, if the lands were let to a tenant, would be entitled to receive, the rents and profits thereof whether as a beneficial owner, trustee, mortgagee in possession or otherwise;

“petrol filling station” means land and buildings used for the supply of petroleum products and automotive accessories;

“plot ratio” has the same meaning as is given to it and for the purposes of the Uniform Building By-laws;

“private hotel” means land and buildings used for residential purposes in respect of which may be granted an hotel licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911 (as amended), or any Act in substitution for that Act;

“private recreation” means the use of land for parks, gardens, playgrounds, sports arenas or other grounds for recreation which are not normally open to the public without charge;

“professional offices” means any building used for the purpose of his profession by an accountant, architect, artist, author, barrister, chiroprapist, consular official, dentist, doctor, engineer, masseur, nurse, physiotherapist, quantity surveyor, solicitor, surveyor, teacher (other than a dancing teacher or a music teacher), or town planner; and “professional person” has a corresponding interpretation;

“public amusement” means the use of land as a theatre, a cinema, a dance hall, a skating rink, swimming pool or gymnasium or for games;

“public assembly-place or” means any special place of assembly including grounds for athletics, all sports grounds, with spectator provision, race-courses, trotting tracks, stadia or show-grounds;

“public authority” means a Minister of the Crown acting in his official capacity, a State Government Department, State trading concern, State instrumentality, State public utility and any other person or body, whether corporate or not, who or which, under the authority of any Act,

administers or carries on for the benefit of the State, a social service or public utility;

“public recreation” means the use of land for a public park, public gardens, foreshore reserve, playground, or grounds for recreation which are normally open to the public without charge;

“public utility” means any works or undertaking constructed or maintained by a public authority or municipality as may be required to provide water, sewerage, electricity, gas, drainage, communications or other similar services;

“public worship—Place of” includes buildings used primarily for the religious activities of a church, but does not include an institution for primary, secondary or higher education, or a residential training institution;

“redevelopment” means revision of replacement of an existing land use according to a controlled plan;

“reformatory institution” includes a penal institution;

“reserved land for public purposes” means any land referred to in Part II of Appendix “A” of these regulations.

“residential building” means a building, other than a dwelling house, designed for use for human habitation together with such outbuildings as are ordinarily used therewith, and the expression includes a hostel, an hotel designed primarily for residential purposes and a residential club;

“rural industry” means an industry handling, treating, processing or packing primary products grown, reared or produced in the locality, and a workshop, servicing plant or equipment used for rural purposes in the locality;

“service industry” means a light industry carried on, on land and in buildings having a retail shop front and in which goods may be manufactured only for sale on the premises, or land and buildings having a retail shop front and used as a depot for receiving goods to be serviced;

“service station” means land and buildings used for the supply of petroleum products and automotive accessories and includes greasing, tyre repairs and minor mechanical repairs;

“shop” means any building wherein goods are kept exposed or offered for sale by retail, and includes a cafe and a restaurant and receiving depot, but does not include a bank, fuel depot, a market, service station, petrol filling station, milk depot, marine store, timber yard, or land and buildings used for the sale of motor and other vehicles, or for any purpose falling within the definition of industry;

“showrooms” means rooms in connection with warehousing or offices, and intended for display of goods of a bulky character;

“sports ground” means any land used for any sport; but does not include land within the curtilage of a dwelling, if not used commercially;

“street alignment” means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon, but where a new street alignment is prescribed, means the new street alignment so prescribed;

“transport depot” means land used for the garaging of road motor vehicles used or intended to be used for carrying goods for hire or reward or for any consideration, or for the transfer of goods from one such motor vehicle to another of such motor vehicles, and includes maintenance and repair of vehicles;

“Uniform Building By-laws” means the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th October, 1965, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices published in the *Government Gazette*;

“warehouse” means any building or enclosed land, or part of a building or enclosed land, used for storage of goods and the carrying out of commercial transactions involving the sale of such goods by wholesale;

“zone” means a portion of the Scheme area shown on the map by distinctive colouring, hatching, or edging for the purpose of indicating the restrictions imposed by the Planning Scheme on the erection and use of buildings or the use of land, but does not include land reserved.

## PART 2.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 The Scheme area is divided into 5 types of Reserves set out hereunder:—

Recreation.  
Government Reserves.  
Major Roads.  
Railways.  
Car Parks.

2.2 (a) Land set aside under this Scheme for the purpose of reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme other than the erection of a boundary fence without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

(c) In giving its approval, the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall, in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a Public Authority confer with that Authority before giving its approval.

(d) No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.3 (a) The Major Road Reserves shown under this Scheme may be varied in position or width at the time of detailed road design or subdivisional design up to a distance of one chain from that shown on the Scheme Map without the necessity of amending the Scheme.

(b) In the case of variations to Major Road Reserves in excess of one chain an amendment to the Scheme shall be necessary and the normal provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) relating to amendments to a Scheme shall apply.

2.4 The Council may close or stop up subject to the provisions of any other Act any road or right of way which is replaced by or which abuts onto any Major Road Reserve under the Scheme provided that where such road or right of way provides the only means of access to any land the Council shall, until either alternative means of access is available or access is no longer required, permit the use of such road or right of way for the purpose of access.

2.5 (a) Where the Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owners of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

(b) In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

3.4 (a) The Council may advertise its intention to grant approval for uses marked AA in Table 1 at least twice in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Town of Bunbury such advertisement to be published at least seven days apart.

(b) Where the Council has advertised its intention to grant approval the Council shall not earlier than 14 days after publication of the last advertisement referred to in sub clause (a) of this clause consider all written objections before granting approval to such uses.

3.5 Where a zone is restricted to one use only it has been excluded from the columns in Table No. 1 and its use may be determined from the Scheme Map.

3.6 Any use not listed in Table 1 may, in the Council's discretion, be permitted in a zone and on a lot which it considers appropriate.

## PART 4.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1. No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 Where in respect of land reserved under Part 2 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings, thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

4.3 Where in respect of land zoned under Part 3 of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform General Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended).

4.4 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.5 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this part except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.4, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued for a period of 3 months or more, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (b) The council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase or compulsory acquisition of the effected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or occupier of that property.

## PART 5.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

## Residential Development Zone.

5.1 Before granting approval for any of the uses permitted within the Residential Development Zone subject to Council approval under Table No. 1 the Council will require the submission of and agreement to an Outline Development Plan for such areas as are the subject of an application to develop or subdivide together with other areas determined by the Council having regard to—

- (a) the major road systems under the Scheme;
- (b) topographic conditions;
- (c) land holdings adjacent to or in the vicinity of the subject land;
- (d) the necessity of providing civic and public facilities.

5.2 Outline Development Plans shall be prepared for areas determined by the Council under clause 5.1 by either the owners of the land involved or by the Council and shall be submitted by the Council to the Town Planning Board for approval.

5.3 Outline Development Plans shall show the principles under which it is proposed to develop or subdivide the land and as a minimum requirement shall show—

- (a) the location and width of the distributor road system proposed;
- (b) the approximate location and quantity of shopping, civic and public facilities proposed together with an analysis of the factors used in determination of such facilities;
- (c) the distribution of the recreation and open space areas proposed;
- (d) the population and residential densities proposed.

5.4 (a) Upon preparation of an outline Development Plan the Council shall advertise that such plan has been prepared and will be available for public inspection and the lodgement of objections thereto.

(b) Advertisement of the preparation of an Outline Development Plan shall be by notice for each of three consecutive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the District of the Town of Bunbury and shall state a date on which objections to the Outline Development Plan may be made such date being not less than 21 days from the date of the last advertisement.

(c) Objections under sub-clause (b) of this clause shall be in writing addressed to the Clerk of the Council.

5.5 The Council shall consider the objections if any made under clause 5.4 and may amend the Outline Development Plan after such consideration of objections.

5.6 The Council shall submit the Outline Development Plan so prepared to the Town Planning Board together with the objections received under clause 5.4 and request the Board to adopt the plan submitted as the basis for approval of subdivision and development applications within the area covered by the plan.

5.7 Where the owners of land within the area covered by an Outline Development Plan are aggrieved by a decision of the Council pursuant to clause 5.5 or where the Council is aggrieved by a decision of the Board pursuant to clause 5.6 an appeal to the Minister for his determination may be made and the decision of the Minister shall be final.

#### Building Lines and Setbacks.

5.8 Within the Scheme area the building line shall be:—

- In the Commercial A Zone—25 feet from a road reserve.
- In the Commercial B Zone—30 feet from a road reserve.
- In the General Industry A Zone—100 feet from a road reserve.
- In the General Industry B Zone—25 feet from a road reserve.
- In the Light Industry Zone—30 feet from a road reserve.
- In the Noxious Industry Zone—100 feet from a road reserve.

In the Residential A (GR6) zone (except in the case of residences) 15 feet from a road reserve and the minimum setback shall be 25 ft. from the rear boundary and 5 ft. per storey from each side boundary.

5.9 Where a lot is situated at the intersection of two or more streets the Council may at its discretion reduce the distance of the building line from any road reserve other than that which in the opinion of the Council, the lot fronts.

5.10 Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 5.8 on the eastern side of Spencer Street between Forrest Avenue and Stirling Street the building line shall be 10 feet from the building line gazetted on the 8th February, 1957.

5.11 Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 5.8 if a subdivision within the Commercial B zone into lots for commercial use provides for a widening of the street immediately adjacent to the subdivision of at least 30 feet and if such widening has been laid out or set aside for car parking, no building line shall apply.

5.12 The owner of a lot, which is subject of a decision of the Council made under Clause 5.9 of this part, who is aggrieved by such decision may within 30 days appeal to the Minister against that decision.

#### CAR PARKING.

5.13 Within the Scheme area car or vehicle parking provisions as set out in the following subclause shall apply—

- (a) All zones where permitted—
  - (i) Residential Building—one car parking space for each bedroom.
  - (ii) Residential Building with public restaurant or other public area—Three car parking spaces for each two bedrooms.

(iii) Public assembly and Public Worship uses—One car parking space for each 100 square feet of Building floor area.

(b) Commercial A zone, between the building line and the street alignment, one car parking space for each 1,000 square feet of building floor area.

(c) Commercial B zone—

(i) Where development is proposed on a site exceeding one half acre in area, 2 square feet of car parking space for each square foot of retail shopping floor space.

(ii) Where development is proposed on a site not exceeding one half acre in area, the land between the building line and the street alignment shall be paved for car parking.

(d) Light Industry zone, between the building line and the street alignment, car parking spaces as determined by the Council.

(e) General Industry A zone, paved car parking spaces on an area of not less than 20 per cent. nor more than 50 per cent. of the Land between the building line and the street alignment.

(f) General Industry B Zone, between the building line and the street alignment, car parking spaces as determined by the Council.

(g) Residential A (GR6) zone, paved car parking space at a ratio of one space for each 500 sq. feet of building floor area, provided that no more than 25 per cent. of the area between the building line and street alignment shall be so used.

5.14 (a) In all zones where car parking provisions are required between the building line and the street alignment the balance of the land between the building line and the street alignment shall be laid out and maintained as lawns, gardens, or approved plantation strips, or with the approval of the Council, trade displays, provided that,

(b) No car parking or trade displays are constructed or permitted within a distance of 25 feet of a street corner and that,

(c) No trade display shall occupy more than 10 per cent. of the area defined in subclause (a).

#### Site Coverage and Plot Ratio.

5.15 Within the Scheme area site coverage restrictions as set out in the following subclauses shall apply:—

(a) Public assembly and Public Worship uses in all zones where permitted—Maximum site coverage 20 per cent.

(b) Commercial A zone—Maximum site coverage 70 per cent.

(c) Residential A (GR6) zone (except in the case of residence). Maximum site coverage 50 per cent., subject to a maximum Plot Ratio of 1.2.

#### Building Facade.

5.16 Within the following zones the facade of a building used for any of the uses permitted shall be constructed of material approved by the Council:—

- General Industry A zone.
- General Industry B zone.
- Light Industry zone.
- Commercial A.
- Commercial B.
- Residential A (GR6) zone.

#### Service Station Zone.

5.17 Where land zoned for Service Station is equal to or greater than half an acre in area a portion of the site not greater than one third of the total area may, with the approval of the Council be utilised for the sale of motor vehicles, caravans or tractors provided that—

- (a) such use is carried out in conjunction with or incidental to the business of a Service Station; and

- (b) the total number of motor vehicles, caravans and tractors displayed for sale at the time does not exceed twelve in number; and
- (c) no display of motor vehicles caravans or tractors shall take place closer to the street alignment than a distance of thirty feet.

5.18 Within land zoned as service station the Council may approve the sale of refreshments and other articles provided that such sale is carried out in conjunction with and incidental to the business of service station.

#### Rural Zone.

5.19 The Council shall not recommend the subdivision for residential purposes of any lot at present in the rural zone unless that lot has been appropriately rezoned by amendment to the Scheme.

#### PART 6.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Any application to develop required under any provision of the Scheme shall be in writing addressed to the Town Clerk of the Bunbury Town Council and may be approved by the Council or approved subject to conditions.

6.2 Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Council under the terms of Clause 6.1, may appeal to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning seeking a variation of the Council's decision.

6.3 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.4 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than the purpose of Part 2 shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the Scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*, except in the case of reserved land where the provisions of Part 2 shall apply.

6.5 Entry to Premises: The Council in the conduct and management of the Scheme may by an authorised officer enter and inspect with or without agents at all reasonable times any land or building within the area the subject of the Scheme.

#### 6.6 Enforcement of Provisions:

- (a) If any person contravenes or fails or neglects to comply with any of the provisions of this Scheme the Council may, by notice in the manner set out in Clause 6.7 hereof, order such person to discontinue forthwith any such contravention and within thirty (30) clear days after the service of such notice to remove, pull down, take up, alter or otherwise make good any work which contravenes the Scheme, or carry into effect any provisions of the Scheme which are not being complied with and at the same time it may pursuant to subsection 1 of section 10 of the Act advise such person that in the event of him failing to comply with the provisions thereof in the time limited for compliance then the Council by its agents will enter such person's property and cause to be done such works and things as shall be specified in such notice.
- (b) Any expense incurred by the Council in doing any works pursuant to any default under paragraph (a) hereof may be recovered from the person in default by action for a civil debt recoverable summarily in any court having jurisdiction in respect of the amount involved.

6.7 Notices: Any notice under Clause 6.6 hereof—

- (a) shall be addressed to the owner, occupier or lessee of the land in question;
- (b) shall describe in general terms the manner in which the Planning Scheme has been contravened; and

- (c) shall require the owner, occupier or lessee as the case may be, within 30 clear days after the service of such notice to discontinue such contravention of the Scheme and take such action as the Council may direct to cause a compliance with the provisions of the Scheme; and
- (d) shall where necessary advise the person to whom it is addressed that in default of his compliance with such notice the Council will enter such land and carry out the requirements of such notice itself at the expense of such person.
- (e) Any notice required to be made given hereunder may be served personally or by prepaid letter addressed to the person to be served at his address as shown in the rate book of the Council if he shall be a ratepayer or at his last known address (whether he is a ratepayer or not) and such notice shall be deemed to be served in due course of post.

6.8 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

2.2 Table No. 1 appended to Clause 2.3 of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in the various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the table and the list of "Zones" on the top of that Table excepting the Special Site Zone where the permitted use is limited to that specifically shown against the land on the Scheme Map.

2.3 The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 appended to this clause have the following meanings:—

- "P" = A use that is permitted under this scheme.
- "AA" = A use that is not permitted unless approval is granted by the Council.
- "IP" = A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.

**PART III.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.**

3.1 No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

3.2 (a) Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing;
