WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 186 of the Health Act, 1911-1968, that the Governor may by proclamation declare that any process within any trade that is an offensive trade for the purposes of Division 2 of Part VII of that Act is a process to which the provisions of that Division, other than section 194, do not apply; and whereas any of the trades, businesses, or occupations usually carried on, in, or

connected with cleaning establishments, dye works is an offensive trade for the purposes of that Division; and whereas it is now expedient that the process whereby dry cleaning is carried out in machines that use only perchlorethylene as the cleaning fluid and operate on a full cycle, fully enclosed process should be a process within a trade to which the provisions of Division 2 of Part VII of the Health Act, 1911-1968, other than section 194 of that Act, do not apply: Now, therefore, I the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby declare the process whereby dry cleaning is carried out in machines that use only perchlorethylene as the cleaning fluid and operate on a full cycle, fully enclosed process, to be a process within a trade, namely, cleaning establishments, dye works, to which the provisions of Division 2 of Part VII of the Health Act, 1911-1968, other than section 194 of that Act, do not apply.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth on the 26th day of November, 1969, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of

a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Manjimup, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Walpole Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Walpole Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Municipal District of the Shire of Manjimup".

Walpole Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the northwestern corner of Nelson Location 11687 and extending southerly along boundaries of that location to its southwestern corner; thence south to the right bank of the Collier River; thence generally northwesterly downwards along that bank to the low-water mark of Walpole Inlet; thence generally northwesterly and generally northerly along that low-water mark to a point west of a point situate south 2 chains from survey post

marked F; thence west crossing an arm of that

inlet to the low-water mark of Walpole Inlet aforesaid; thence generally southwesterly along that low-water mark to the left bank of the Walpole River; thence generally westerly and generally northerly upwards along that bank to the prolongation northeasterly of the southeastern side of a road as shown coloured blue on Original Plan 9007; thence 72 degrees 30 minutes about 3 chains and 30 links along that prolongation; thence 1 degree 16 minutes, 6 chains 2 and five-tenths links to the southern side of the South Western Highway as shown coloured brown on Original Plan 9007 aforesaid; thence 59 degrees 20 minutes, 25 chains 5 and two-tenths links; thence 65 degrees 58 minutes, 4 chains 17 and two-tenths links; thence 83 degrees 37 minutes, 4 chains 71 and three-tenths links; thence 91 degrees 44 minutes, 16 chains 59 and nine-tenths links; thence 97 degrees 37 minutes, 5 chains 45 and two-tenths links; thence 108 degrees 15 minutes, 3 chains 3 and five-tenths links; thence 116 degrees about 9 chains and 70 links along that side and onwards to the northern side of Nornalup Road; thence generally easterly along that side to the northwestern side of Chugg Street; thence northeasterly along that side to the easternmost southeastern corner of Location 12726; thence easterly to and along southern boundaries of Reserve 18723 aforesaid and Location 12965 to the southernmost southeastern corner of that location; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of Reserve 18723 aforesaid to the starting point. (Public Plan Walpole Townsite.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 926/10.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 12692 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Cockburn in trust for the purpose of Hall Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor,

by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Cockburn in trust for Hall Site with power to the said Shire of Cockburn, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1490/08.—That Reserve No. 11501 (Dowerin Lots 52 and 53) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Perth Diocesan Trustees to be held in trust for "Church Purposes".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the West Pilbara Water Supply Millstream Supply Main and Appurtenances on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 44932-1-1 to be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1964 (being an Act mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950), and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

18-inch and 12-inch Feeder Main in Headingly Road and Railway Road Kalamunda and Gooseberry Hill.

The construction of—

- (a) An eighteen inch diameter water main about one thousand four hundred and ninety feet in length.
- (b) A twelve inch diameter water main, about four thousand, four hundred and eighty feet in length. The above works are to

be complete with valves and all other necessary apparatus, and shown on plan M.W.B. 10339.

Scheme Text.

1. Citation: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Perth Town Planning Scheme No. 29—Hertha Road Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

2. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for the administration and enforcement of the Scheme is the Shire of Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

3. Maps: The following maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

4. Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

5. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are as follows:—

- (a) To plan the subdivision of the land within the Scheme Area;

- (b) To plan within the Scheme Area suitable roads;
- (c) To ensure the proper drainage of the roads and those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage or other such works;
- (d) To facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Scheme Area;
- (e) To make provision for land to be used for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes.

6. Method of Carrying Out Objects: It is intended that as and when an owner of land within the Scheme Area desires to develop and subdivide his land, such development and subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development of the Scheme Area in which the land is situated.

7. The plan of subdivision shown on the Scheme Map forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Scheme Area but the Council may permit alterations or variations to the said map where in its opinion circumstances justify such action, provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it would impede the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area as a whole.

8. Subdivision: An owner of land within the Scheme Area who desires to subdivide his land, either alone or in conjunction with other owners, shall submit a plan of the proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act.

9. New Roads and Footways: All new roads and footways within the Scheme Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners therein and each owner shall pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.

10. In cases where the situation of a new road or footway is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road or footway, and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them, then the amount payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

11. If the Council shall construct or drain a new road or footway within the Scheme Area prior to the subdivision of the land adjoining such road or footway, the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road or footway, and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land paid by the Council, shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land as and when their land is subdivided and the provisions of Clauses 9, 10 and 14 hereof shall apply in respect of such payments.

12. If an owner shall claim compensation for the resumption from him of land to be used for a road or footway there shall be set off against the amount of compensation payable to him the amount by which the value of the remainder of his land has been increased by the construction of the roads and footways within the Scheme Area and by the operation of the Scheme.

13. If an owner shall subdivide his land, and if he or his predecessors in title shall have claimed or shall have been paid compensation by reason of resumption by the Council for a new road or footway within the Scheme Area, he shall before the approval of his plan of subdivision release the Council from the payment of compensation or repay to the Council the compensation paid by it to him or his predecessors in title as the case may be.

14. Drainage: Each owner shall when subdividing his land pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion to the estimated costs (as revised from time to time) of drainage of the Scheme Area, as the area of his land bears to the total acreage of the privately owned land within the Scheme Area at the date of coming into operation of the Scheme. The Council shall at

the appropriate time or times carry out the drainage scheme of the Scheme Area in accordance with the drainage plan approved by the Council with such modifications as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

15. Public Open Space: It is intended that the lands coloured green on the Scheme Map amounting to approximately one-tenth of the total areas of land within the Scheme Area shall be reserved for Public Open Space and Local Authority purposes.

16. Each owner of land within the Scheme Area shall when subdividing his land, and subject as hereinafter provided, transfer to the Council an area of land being subdivided or developed by him or such other areas as the Town Planning Board shall upon approval of the Plan of Subdivision require.

17. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development it is not practicable to transfer an area of land exactly equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided, the owner shall transfer to the Council a greater area of land, or with the consent of the Council, a lesser area than the said one-tenth of the total area being subdivided and the Council shall make or receive a cash adjustment so that the value of the land (if any) to be transferred with or subject to the cash adjustment equals one-tenth of the value of land the subject of the subdivision.

18. If within a portion of the Scheme Area the subject of subdivision and development more than one-tenth is required by the Council for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes, the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council and the owner so agree, the Council may transfer to the owner other land in or near the Scheme Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council in which case the amount of compensation payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

19. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to or acquired by it for the purpose of Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and all moneys received by the Council under Clause 17 hereof shall after making all necessary payments to owners and paying the costs of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under Clause 18 hereof be expended by the Council in the acquisition or improvement of land for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes in or near the Scheme Area.

20. Land Owned or Acquired by the Council: All or any of the land now owned or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Scheme Area may be used by the Council for any purpose appropriate to the Scheme and if such purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council hereunder the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used by the Council.

21. If the Council shall have resumed land for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes, it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs paid by it from the moneys received by it from the sale of land or under Clause 17 hereof, and upon the owner from whom the land was resumed subdividing his land, the area and value of one-tenth of his land to be made available for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes hereunder shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

22. If the Council shall resume or otherwise acquire any land so that it may be used for a specific purpose other than for Public Open Space, it may sell or otherwise dispose of such land upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit to any person who shall agree to use the land for that purpose.

23. Powers and Authorities of the Council: In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:

- (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To make agreements with the owners or occupiers of land within the Scheme Area in respect of any matters affecting the Scheme.
- (c) To make agreements with the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board, the State Electricity Commission, or other Government instrumentality concerning any matter relating to the Scheme.
- (d) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Scheme Area.
- (e) If any owner of land within a Scheme Area does not proceed with the subdivision and development of his land in accordance with the terms of the Scheme, and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay or impede the completion of the Scheme or the subdivision and development of the Scheme Area, the Council may resume the land of such owner and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (f) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under paragraph (e) hereof, it shall have all the powers of the owner in the subdivision, development and disposal of the said land. If the owner has not been paid compensation for the resumption of his land the Council shall before selling the land so subdivided and developed, offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption, subdivision and development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs consequent upon such subdivision and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance (if any) of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council make good any deficit.
- (g) If the offer mentioned in paragraph (f) hereof be not accepted, the Council may retain all or any part of the said land, but if it does so, it shall be responsible to pay all costs of the subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (h) The Council may resume any land within the Scheme Area for Public Open Space or Local Authority purposes or in order to make it available for a particular use shown in the said plans in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (i) To dispose of any lot or lots to which it becomes entitled whether under paragraphs (e) or (h) hereof or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, may sell the lots singly or in groups and subject to or with the benefit of easements.
- (j) Extend the time within which payments are to be made to the Council and agree to the securing of such payments.

24. Twenty-eight days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to Section 10 of the Town Planning and Development Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said Section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

25. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by Section 13 of the said Act.

26. Valuations: Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land or portion thereof for the purpose of the Scheme, the value shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or such other disinterested and competent valuer as shall be appointed by the Council. If an owner objects to the value so determined, he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value or the revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value to a figure acceptable to the owner the value shall be determined by arbitration.

27. If a valuation made by the valuer shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on other lands and make such revaluations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected by such revaluation shall forthwith be notified of any change in value.

28. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners or between an owner and the Council as to their respective rights under the Scheme, or as to the value of any land, or in respect of any matter which pursuant to the Scheme may be determined by arbitration, may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895 or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator, he may be nominated by the Council.

29. Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of the Scheme may be made within six months of the Scheme coming into operation.

A person shall not sell, except for the purpose of export from the State, any stone fruit of which the sale is, pursuant to the provisions of section 3D of the Act prohibited, and any person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.
