WHEREAS by section 3 of the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886-1937, it is enacted that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include the City of Perth, and every place being within a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth and every other place outside the said circle of five miles to which the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation declare that the Act shall extend; and whereas it is also provided by that section that the Governor shall not make or issue any proclamation under that section to extend the limits of the Act to any place situate within the district of any municipal council or of any road board outside the said circle of five miles unless and until the municipal council or the road board concerned (as the case may be) has by resolution consented thereto; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Wanneroo has by resolution passed on the 22nd day of October, 1969, consented to the extension of the limits of the Act to the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Wanneroo described in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Wanneroo described in the Schedule hereunder and which is outside the said circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

The Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Beach Road (Road Number 246), a point on the present northern boundary of the Perth Gas Area, and extending generally northerly along the Low Water Mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southernmost southern boundary of Mullaloo Townsite; thence easterly to and easterly and northerly along boundaries of that townsite to the southern side of Road Number 1609; thence generally northeasterly along that

side to the northernmost northwestern corner of Swan Location 8278 (Reserve 28971); thence south-westerly and southerly along northwestern and western boundaries of that location and southerly along the western boundary of Location 700' (Reserve 25746) to the northwestern corner of Location 7550; thence easterly along the northerly boundary of that location, Locations 8001, E1 7265 (Reserve 26052) and again E1 to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Location 5199; thence southerly along that prolongation to southern boundary of Location H, a point on the present northern boundary of the Perth Gas Area aforesaid, and thence generally westerly along that boundary to the starting point.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Land Act, 1933, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 30137 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley in trust for the purpose of Pistol Club and Range: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley in trust for Pistol Club and Range with power to the said Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960-1969, that the Governor may, *inter alia*, make and publish in the *Government Gazette* uniform general by-laws for

all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a council under Part XV of that Act and, by order, declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the order together with any amendments thereof whether by way of addition, substitution or cancellation shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 691 of that Act that power given by that Act to make Orders in Council includes power from time to time to revoke or cancel those Orders wholly or in part for the purpose of substituting other Orders in Council for those revoked or cancelled; and whereas the Governor has made and published uniform general by-laws, namely the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965 and has from time to time made and published amendments thereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby revoke wholly every Order in Council heretofore made under section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, as amended from time to time, and doth hereby declare that of the Uniform Building By-laws, 1965 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th October, 1965 and all the amendments made to those by-laws after that day but before the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) the whole of each of them, with the exception of paragraph (a) of by-law 2805, applies to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Rockingham;
- (b) the whole of each of them applies to the municipal district of the Shire of Swan-Guildford with the exception of paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (1) of by-law 203 and sub-by-law (2) of by-law 2832 which apply only to those portions of the district which are not shown as for "Rural Development", on the Metropolitan Regional Plan;
- (c) the whole of each of them applies to the whole of each of the municipal districts set out in the first schedule hereto; and
- (d) the whole of each of them applies to those portions specified in each of the districts set out in the second schedule.


