AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 9th day of December 1969, the following Orders of Council were authorised to be issued:—

Clean Air Act, 1964-1967.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 597/66; Ex. Co. 3212.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 6 of the Clean Air Act, 1964-1967, that the Governor may by Order in Council from time to time amend the schedule to the Act by adding thereto or removing therefrom any premises, a class of premises and the Schedule as so amended shall be the Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council and exercise of the powers conferred by the Act do hereby amend the Schedule to the Act by adding to paragraph (a) the following premises or class of premises:—

- (a) bitumen works, being premises in which bitumen is mixed or prepared for use in places or premises other than at the works;
- (b) concrete works, being premises in which concrete is mixed or prepared for use in places or premises other than at the works;

- (c) sandblasting works, being premises on which metal or other material is cleaned or abraded by blasting with silica sand. i.e. sand containing more than 10 per cent. free silica.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3125/95.

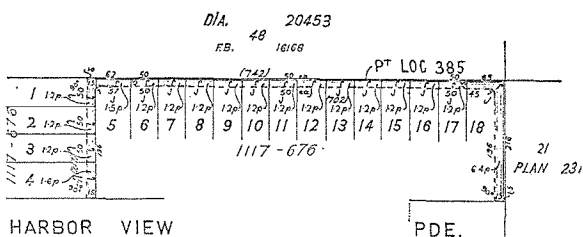

Emberson Road at the junction with Deschamps Road, south along Emberson Road, south east and then south along Bath Road to Walter Road, west along Walter Road to Charnwood Street, north along Charnwood Street to Halvorson Road, east along Halvorson Road to Sandhurst Place, north along Sandhurst Place to Rodda Street, east along Rodda Street to Crimea Street, thence north along Crimea Street to Deschamps Road.

Children living in the boundary streets (both sides) of Emberson Road, Bath Road, Charnwood Street, Sandhurst Place and the boundary part (both sides) of Rodda Street and Halvorson Road shall attend the Weld Square Junior Primary School. Children living on the west side of the boundary part of Crimea Street shall attend the Morley School and children living on the east side of the boundary part of Crimea Street shall attend the Weld Square Junior Primary School. Children living on the north side only of the boundary part of Walter Road shall attend the Weld Square Junior Primary School.

Children attending Government schools, in Grades 1 to 3 inclusive in 1970 and living within the boundaries of the Weld Square Junior Primary School, as provided above shall attend the Weld Square Junior Primary School.

9. West Armadale Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

Seventh Road, from the Railway line to Forrest Road, north east along Forrest Road to Dale Road, north and north west along Dale Road to the old Railway line, west along the old Railway line to Seventh Road.

Children living in the boundary street of Dale Road (both sides) shall attend the West Armadale School. Children living in the boundary part of Forrest Road (both sides) shall attend the Armadale School. Children living on the north side of the boundary part of Seventh Road shall attend the Armadale School and children living on the south side thereof shall attend the West Armadale School.

Children at present travelling to the Armadale School on the Westfield bus may continue to attend the Armadale School if they so desire, but such children living within the compulsory radius of the West Armadale School may be directed to this school at any time.

Children attending Government schools, in Grades 1 to 3 inclusive in 1970 and living within the area described above, shall attend the West Armadale School.

10. West Gosnells Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

Southern River Road from the junction with Southern River and north east to its junction with Crandon Street, north west along Crandon Street to King Street, north east along King Street to Fremantle Road, east along Fremantle Road to Hicks Street, north west along Hicks Street to the junction with Homestead Road, thence a line drawn east to the Railway line, north west along the railway line to where it crosses the Canning River, thence in a westerly direction along the Canning River to its junction with the Southern River, south west along the Southern River to its junction

with Fremantle Road, north west along Fremantle Road to Warton Road, and thence south west along Warton Road.

Children living in the boundary streets (both sides) of Southern River Road, Crandon Street, King Street, Warton Road and Fremantle Road (western end) shall attend the West Gosnells School. Children living in the boundary parts (both sides) of Hicks Street and Fremantle Road (eastern part) shall attend the Gosnells School.

Children attending Government schools in Grades 1 to 5 inclusive in 1970 and living within the boundaries of the West Gosnells School, as provided above, shall attend the West Gosnells School.

11. West Sorrento Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

From West Coast Highway east along Clontarf Street to Ford Street, north along Ford Street to Warwick Road, thence east along Warwick Road.

Children living in the boundary Streets (both sides) and north thereof shall attend the West Sorrento School.

Children attending Government schools in Grades 1 to 4 inclusive in 1970 and living within the boundaries of the West Sorrento School, as provided above, shall attend the West Sorrento School.

12. Willetton Primary School:

The boundaries for the above school are as follows:—

Mansard Road, at the junction with Riley Road, west along Mansard Road to Vahland Avenue, north along Vahland Avenue to High Road, west along High Road to a line due south from Bull Creek, and thence south along this line.

Children living in the boundary streets (both sides) of Mansard Road and Vahland Avenue shall attend the Riverton School. Children living on the south side only of the boundary part of High Road shall attend the Willetton School. Children living on the north side of the boundary part of High Road shall attend either the Rossmoyne or Riverton Schools in accordance with the boundary between these schools.

Children attending Government schools, in Grades 1 to 6 inclusive in 1970 and living within the boundaries of the Willetton School, as provided above, shall attend the Willetton School.

13. Albany Schools:

- (1) Yakamia Primary School—will open at the beginning of 1970 and will accommodate children in Grades 1 to 6 (1970) inclusive.

The boundaries for the Yakamia School shall be as follows:—

- (a) Chester Pass Road and south along Chester Pass Road, and Hanrahan Road to Muir Street. East along Muir Street, north along Spearwood Road to Lion Street, east along Lion Street to Serpentine Road, south along Serpentine Road to Wellington Street, east then northeast along Wellington Street to North Road, east along North Road to Range Road thence north along Range Road.

- (b) Children living on both sides of the boundary part of Hanrahan Road shall attend the Mt. Lockyer School.

Children living on both sides of all other boundary streets shall attend the Yakamia School.

- (c) An optional area is created bounded by Albany Highway on the west and Chester Pass Road on the east. Both these boundary streets are excluded from the optional area.

Children living in this optional area may attend either the Mt. Lockyer or Yakamia Schools.

- (d) Children, living within the Yakamia School boundaries and—

- (1) attending the Albany Junior Primary School as Grade 3 (1969); and
- (2) Grade 1 (1970) new admissions;
- (3) new families moving into the Yakamia School area from 1970 onwards, shall attend the Yakamia School.

The Grade 1 and 2 (1969) children at present attending the Albany Junior Primary School and who live within the Yakamia School boundaries, shall transfer to the Yakamia School when they pass out of the Junior Primary School at the end of their Grade 3 year.

- (e) Children (Grade 1 to 6 (1970) inclusive), travelling on the Little Grove and Cuthbert or Elleker school buses shall attend the Yakamia School as from the beginning of 1970. The Grade 7 (1970) will complete Grade 7 at the Spencer Park School.
- (2) Mt. Lockyer Primary School.
- (a) Boundaries: Gledhow Road and east along Glendhow Road and Cuming Road to Hanrahan Road thence northeast along Hanrahan and Chester Pass Roads.
 - (b) Children living on both sides of the boundary parts of Gledhow, Cuming and Hanrahan Roads shall attend the Mt. Lockyer School.
Children living on both sides of Chester Pass Road shall attend the Yakamia School.
 - (c) Children living in the area specified under 1(c) above are allowed the option of attending either the Yakamia or Mt. Lockyer Schools.
- (3) Spencer Park Primary School:
- (a) Boundaries: Range Road and south along Range Road to North Road, east along North Road to Lockyer Avenue, south along Lockyer Avenue to Cockburn Road, east along Cockburn Road, to Bluff Street, south along Bluff Street to Beauchamp Street, thence east along Beauchamp and Hanson Streets.
 - (b) Children living on both sides of Range Road shall attend the Yakamia School. Children living on both sides of the boundary parts of North Road, Lockyer Avenue, Cockburn Road, Bluff, Beauchamp and Hanson Streets, shall attend the Spencer Park School.
 - (c) Children living at Emu Point are allowed the option of attending either the Spencer Park or Albany Primary or Albany Junior Primary Schools.
 - (d) See 2(e) above.
- (4) Albany Junior Primary and Albany Primary Schools:
- (a) Boundaries: Gledhow Road and east along Gledhow Road, Cuming Road and Muir Street to Spearwood Road, north along Spearwood Road to Lion Street, east along Lion Street to Serpentine Road, south-east along Serpentine Road to Wellington Street, east and northeast along Wellington Street to North Road, east along North Road to Lockyer Avenue, south along Lockyer Avenue to Cockburn Road, east along Cockburn Road to Bluff Street, south along Bluff Street to Beauchamp Street, east along Beauchamp and Hanson Streets.
 - (b) Children living on both sides of those parts of all boundary streets are excluded from attendance at the Albany Primary and Junior Primary Schools.
 - (c) Children living within the Yakamia School boundaries and at present attending the Albany Junior Primary School shall transfer to the Yakamia School as provided in 1(d) above.

- (d) Children living at Emu Point are allowed the option of attending either the Spencer Park or Albany Primary or Albany Junior Primary Schools.

14. Allendale and Bluff Point Primary School
The boundaries between the above two schools are as follows:—

The Railway line from the crossing over North West Coastal Highway, east along Railway line and Ord Street, then south-east along Flores Street, and thence east along I Street to the east side of Anderson Street.

Children living in the boundary streets (both sides) shall attend the Bluff Point School.

This instruction governs future admissions only.

15. Gosnells and Maddington Primary Schools
The boundaries between the above two schools are as follows:—

Gosnells Road from the junction with Alcock Street, southwest along Gosnells Road to Albany Highway, and thence a line continued west to the junction of Hicks and Horstead Roads.

Children living in the boundary part Gosnells Road (both sides) shall attend Maddington School.

Children, at present attending the Gosnells and Maddington Schools, who live outside respective school boundaries may remain their present schools and Grade 1 siblings of these children may also be admitted to school the elder siblings are attending. This concession shall apply till the end of 1971. From the beginning of 1972, Grade 1 siblings shall not be admitted to the Gosnells and Maddington Schools from outside the respective school boundaries.

16. Ardross, Brentwood and Mount Pleasant Primary Schools:

- (1) The area previously allowed as an optional area, namely, the area bounded by Riseley Street, Karoonda Road, Rogerson Road, Coomoora Road, is hereby cancelled. Children living in this area were given the option of attending either the Brentwood or Ardross School but were prohibited from attending the Mount Pleasant School.

The following has been approved as a new optional area:—

The area bounded by Canning Avenue, Karoonda Road, Riseley Street, Coomoora Road, Crest Avenue and east to The Esplanade, and The Esplanade south to Canning Avenue. With the exception of Coomoora Road and Crest Avenue, all other boundary streets (both sides) are included in the optional area.

Children living in the new optional area may attend either the Brentwood or the Mount Pleasant School, but not the Ardross School. However, a Grade 1 child who lives in the new optional area may attend the Ardross School if elder siblings are already attending at that school. Children enrolled at the Ardross, the Brentwood or the Mount Pleasant School must remain at their present school.

- (2) A further optional area has been approved in respect of children enrolling at the Mount Pleasant and Ardross Schools, viz.:—

Ardross Street at the Junction with Canning Highway, south along Ardross Street, Coogee Road, west along Coogee Road, Sweetman Street, north and northwest along Sweetman and Tain Streets to Canning Highway, and thence northeast along Canning Highway to Ardross Street. Children living the south side only of the boundary part Canning Highway, and in the boundary part (both sides) of Coogee Road, Ardross Street, Sweetman Street and Tain Street, shall be included in the optional area.

This option applies to new admissions only, including Grade 1 in 1970. Children now enrolled at either the Ardross or the Mount Pleasant School shall remain at their present school.

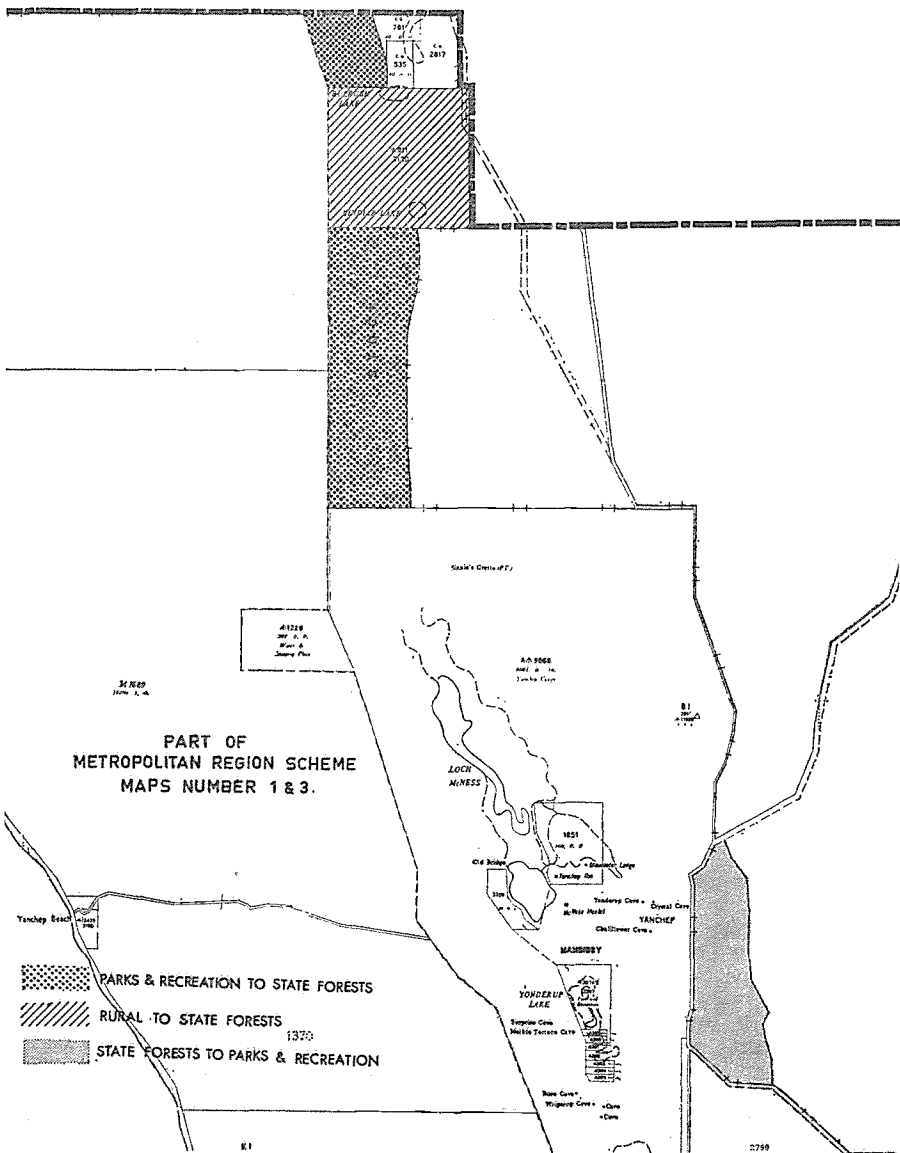

Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is amended by adding after the word "Trust" being the last word in subregulation (6) the passage "or operated by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission pursuant to section 21 of the Government Railways Act, 1904".
