FIREARMS REGULATIONS, 1931.

Published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th November, 1931, and incorporating the amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th January, 1932; the 24th March, 1932; the 20th May, 1932; the 15th July, 1932; the 23rd September, 1932; the 23rd June, 1939; the 8th September, 1939; the 16th July, 1954; the 9th April, 1957; the 7th January, 1958; the 16th December, 1963; the 17th September, 1964; the 19th August, 1965; the 23rd January, 1968 and the 2nd July, 1969, and the amendments that, pursuant to the provisions of section 8 of the Decimal Currency Act, 1965, are deemed for the purposes of this reprint to be amendments to the regulations; and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954.

FIREARMS AND GUNS ACT, 1931.

FIREARMS REGULATIONS, 1931.

These regulations may be cited as the Firearms Regulations, 1931.

1. An application to possess a firearm shall be as in Form 1 of the Schedule hereto.

2. An application for a license to manufacture and repair firearms shall be as in Form 2 of the Schedule.

3. An application to deal in firearms shall be as in Form 3 of the Schedule.

4. An application for a license to conduct a shooting gallery shall be as in Form 4 of the Schedule.

5. Forms of applications under Regulations 1, 2, 3, and 4 may be obtained free of charge from the officer in charge of any Police Station.

6. A license to possess a firearm or firearms shall be in the form of Form 5 in the Schedule to these regulations.

6B. The license to possess a firearm under Regulation 29B shall be as in Form 5B of the Schedule.

7. The license to manufacture and repair firearms shall be as in Form 6 of the Schedule.

8. The license to deal in firearms shall be as in Form 7 of the Schedule.

9. The license to conduct a shooting gallery shall be as in Form 8 of the Schedule.

10. Every application shall be made to the officer in charge of the Police Station nearest to the place where the applicant usually resides. When the firearm in respect of which a license is required is in the possession of the applicant at the time the application is made it must be produced to such officer, who may insert on the application the required particulars of the firearm. When such particulars are inserted by a member of the Police Force, he shall initial such particulars as being correct.

11. When the firearm in respect of which the license is required is not in the possession of the applicant at the time when the application is made, the officer in charge of the Police Station shall issue a permit to obtain possession of the firearm pending the issue of a license. Such permit shall be in Form 9 of the Schedule. The applicant shall, within the time stipulated in such permit, produce the firearm in respect of which the license is required, in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 10. Before the applicant obtains a license he shall deliver the permit to the said officer.

11A. (1) The Commissioner, or a member of the Police Force acting with his authority, may issue one license to a person for several firearms and may, upon payment of a noting fee, note a further firearm on a current license.

(2) Where a further firearm is noted on a current license, the license applies during the remainder of its currency to the further firearm.

12. (1) An application for a license or for renewal made by a person who has previously held a license must be accompanied by the expired license, or satisfactory proof that the same has been lost or destroyed.

(2) A person applying for the renewal of his license to possess a firearm shall first certify in writing to the Commissioner that the firearm or firearms listed on the license are the only firearms in his possession.

13. All expired licenses must, within one month from the date of expiry, be returned to the officer in charge of the Police Station from which they were issued, or satisfactory proof furnished that they have been lost or destroyed.

14. When the age of a person applying for a firearm license appears to be under sixteen years, the issuing officer may require such proof of age as he may deem necessary.

15. When the age of a person applying for a pistol license appears to be under twenty-one years, the issuing officer may require such proof of age as he may deem necessary.

16. Any person wilfully misrepresenting his age or any other material particulars with a view of obtaining a license, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

17. The record of firearm licenses issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 10 of the Schedule.

18. The record of licenses to manufacture and repair firearms issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 11 of the Schedule.

19. The record of licenses to deal in firearms issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 12 of the Schedule.

20. The record of licenses to conduct a shooting gallery issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 13 of the Schedule.

21. (a) The particulars of firearms sold or let on hire, or pledged with any dealer, or redeemed by persons from dealers, shall be kept by the dealer, in accordance with Form 14 of the Schedule.

(b) All entries of firearms sold or let on hire by licensees or redeemed from pawnbrokers shall be made forthwith on each and every individual transaction.

21A. A person licensed to manufacture and repair firearms shall, before selling or disposing of any item of reloaded ammunition, durably imprint in a prominent place on its cartridge case the words, "re-loaded ammunition".

22. A licensed dealer may dispose of ammunition to any person who represents himself as being the holder of a license to possess a firearm, or who represents himself as lawfully possessing a firearm in respect of which he is not obliged to obtain a license and who the dealer believes on reasonable grounds to be entitled to possess such firearm, provided:—

- (i) that the dealer shall forthwith note in a book to be kept by him for that purpose the particulars of the firearm in respect of which such person alleges he holds a license;
- (ii) that the dealer shall not dispose of any ammunition other than that suitable for discharge from such firearm or dispose of any item of re-loaded ammunition that has not durably imprinted in a prominent place on its cartridge case, the words "re-loaded ammunition";
- (iii) that the dealer shall make a note in such book of the name and address of the person to whom such ammunition is supplied, the date on which the ammunition is supplied and particulars as to the quantity of the ammunition supplied;
- (iv) that the person to whom such ammunition is supplied shall sign a statement in such book acknowledging the truth of all such details.

Any dealer who fails or neglects to comply with the conditions of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40; and any person who falsely represents himself as being entitled to obtain any ammunition under the preceding regulation shall be liable to a like penalty.

The book referred to in this regulation shall be kept in accordance with Form 22 of the Schedule hereto.

22A. For the purposes of regulations 21A and 22 of these regulations,

"re-loaded ammunition" means ammunition placed in a cartridge case that has been used previously.

23. A licensed dealer may dispose of ammunition to any person apparently over the age of 21 years who represents himself as, and who the dealer believes to be the agent of any person who holds a license to possess a firearm, or who is lawfully in the possession of a firearm in respect of which he is not obliged to obtain a license.

A licensed dealer shall, *mutatis mutandis*, comply with the provisions of the paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii), and (iv) of the foregoing regulation,¹ and shall also note down in his book the name, address, and occupation of the person for whom the agent states he is obtaining such ammunition.

Any dealer who fails or neglects to comply with the conditions of the foregoing regulation¹ shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40, and any person who falsely represents himself as being the agent of any person mentioned in this regulation shall be liable to the like penalty.

24. The record of particulars of firearms sold, let on hire, pledged or redeemed in accordance with Form 14 and the book referred to in the preceding regulations, shall be produced for inspection by any member of the Police Force at his request.

25. A member of the Police Force shall, if he so requests, be permitted to check the stock of firearms on the premises of any person licensed to deal in firearms, or to manufacture or repair firearms, and to compare same with the record book of firearms shown in stock.

26. A record of the firearms in stock at the passing of these regulations, and all purchases since the coming into operation of the regulations, shall be kept by all persons licensed to deal in firearms. Such record shall show the date of purchase, name and address of the person from whom obtained, the number of firearms obtained, the maker's name, the number on, and any other marks identifying each individual firearm.

Every licensed dealer shall lodge at the nearest Police Station to his licensed premises not later than the seventh day of each month a copy of such record, for and made up to and including the last day of the month next preceding.

27. All firearms in the possession of any person licensed to deal therein, or to manufacture or repair same, shall be kept by such person in a strongroom or similar receptacle, securely fastened by lock and key during the period such person's premises are not open for trade.

28. Any person in the possession of a firearm curio or trophy shall register same at the nearest Police Station to his usual place of residence, if called upon to do so in writing by the Commissioner of Police.

29. The following fees are prescribed as the fees payable and to be taken under the Firearms and Guns Act, 1931-1956¹:—

29C. The fee payable by the owner of a firearm who requests the Commissioner of Police in writing under Section 11A of the Act, to retain the firearm in his custody, shall be two dollars per annum.

30. (1) A bank or financial institution may apply in its corporate or trading name for a license to possess any number of specified firearms, and, where the license is issued, it shall be issued in the corporate or trading name of the bank or financial institution.

(2) On payment of the prescribed noting fee, any further firearm that was not included when the license was originally issued under this regulation, may be specified on the license, and thereupon the license shall apply during the remainder of its currency to the additional firearm.

(3) Where a bank or financial institution is licensed to possess specified firearms under the provisions of this regulation, it may permit any of those firearms to be kept and used by an employee—

- (a) being of the full age of eighteen years, on its premises; and
- (b) being of the full age of twenty-one years, in the course of his employment, generally.

31. The records prescribed by Forms 10, 11, 12 and 13 shall be kept by the Commissioner of Police at his office at Perth, and shall be available for inspection on payment of a fee of 10 cents for each inspection.

32. The Commissioner shall publish in the *Government Gazette* before the 31st March in each year, a list of licenses issued to persons to deal in, manufacture, or repair firearms.

33. The Commissioner of Police may, where he is satisfied that the holder of any license issued in accordance with these regulations is not entitled to hold such license, or that such license was obtained by fraud, or that such person is no longer a fit and proper person to hold such license, or that the particular weapon for which such license was obtained is dangerous or unfit for use, revoke the license either wholly or in respect to any particular firearm described therein.

34. Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the Commissioner or a member of the Police Force acting with his authority to grant a license under Section 10 of the Act, or by the revocation by the Commissioner of a license under the provisions of the preceding regulation, may appeal to a Stipendiary Magistrate. Every such person desirous of appealing shall lodge notice of appeal in the form set out in Form 15 or 16 respectively with Stipendiary Magistrate in the district in which the license was applied for and refused, or, in the case of revocation, to the Magistrate in the district in which the license was issued.

35. A copy of such notice shall be served on the Commissioner of Police in all cases, and where the license was refused by a member of the Police Force a copy shall also be served on such member.

36. On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the said notice or notices have been duly served, the Magistrate shall cause to be sent written notice to the parties of a date and time for the hearing of such appeal, which date shall not be less than fourteen clear days from the service of the last of such notices.

37. If either party neglect to appear personally or by counsel or solicitor on the date and at the time fixed for hearing, the Magistrate may:—

- (a) where the appellant fails to appear, dismiss the appeal;
- (b) where the Commissioner of Police or member of the Police Force concerned, as the case may be, fails to appear, hear the appeal or adjourn it to some other date.

38. On the hearing and determination of the appeal, the Magistrate may make such order as to costs to be paid by either party to the appeal to the other party, as he may think fit.

39. On hearing of the appeal the appellant shall open his case, and the appeal shall proceed as nearly as may be according to the procedure and rules of evidence relating to the trial of an action in a Local Court.

40. The Local Court Rules, 1961, shall insofar as applicable and not inconsistent with these regulations, apply to appeals hereunder.

41. A license that has been revoked shall be delivered to the officer in charge of the Police Station nearest to the usual place of residence of the person in whose name such license was issued, within seven days of the notice of revocation issued by the Commissioner of Police.

42. Every holder of a license for a pistol shall notify the Commissioner of Police in writing of each and every change of abode.

43. The proprietor or any person conducting a shooting gallery shall:—

- (a) Cause the several parts of such shooting gallery to be properly put together and securely fixed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner;
- (b) Cause every part of such shooting gallery within, along, or toward which it may be intended that any firearm shall be discharged, to be constructed of iron of such strength and thickness as is sufficient to resist any missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearm;
- (c) Cause such shooting gallery to be so constructed that no missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearms used therein can escape from such shooting gallery, if such firearm at the moment of discharge is pointed towards any target or mark that may be within such shooting gallery;
- (d) Cause every part of such shooting gallery within, along, or toward which it may be intended that any firearm shall be discharged, to be maintained at all times in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner;
- (e) Cause such shooting gallery at all times when open for public use to be under the management and control of a sufficient number of competent persons;
- (f) Cause the letting to hire and use by any person of any firearm in such shooting gallery to be under the management and control of a competent person directly responsible therefor;
- (g) The proprietor or other person for the time being having the management or control of a shooting gallery shall, in the exercise of such management or control, take all reasonable and proper care so as to prevent danger from the use of firearms in such shooting gallery;
- (h) Every person having the management and control of the letting to hire or use by any person of any firearm in a shooting gallery shall not at any time cause or suffer to be used in such firearm any greater charge than is consistent with safety, and shall cause every such firearm, when loaded or being loaded, to be pointed towards the target in such shooting gallery, and shall not suffer any loaded firearm to be taken out of such shooting gallery;
- (i) No person hiring or using any firearm in a shooting gallery shall, while such firearm is loaded or being loaded, allow such firearm to be pointed otherwise than towards the target in such shooting gallery, and shall not take any loaded firearm out of such shooting gallery;
- (j) No person shall wilfully and improperly or carelessly or negligently interfere with any person or any firearm let to any person in a shooting gallery or with any shield, fastening, or fitting which secures or contributes to the safe use of firearms therein;
- (k) The maximum calibre of any firearm used at any shooting gallery shall not exceed .22.

44. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations, either by act or omission, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40.
