WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1966, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the portion of the State hereinafter described be declared a totalisator agency region for those purposes: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 1st day of March, 1970, the portion of the State contained in the municipal district of the Shire of West Kimberley shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1966.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 14th day of January, 1970, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1969.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1969, it is provided *inter alia* that the Governor may, by Order in Council—

- (a) establish special courts to be called Children's Courts and determine the area in and for which each court shall exercise jurisdiction, by reference to magisterial districts;
- (b) appoint, as special magistrates, magistrates or persons who may from time to time, temporarily or otherwise, be assigned to or occupying the office or performing the duties of a magistrate assigned to one or more magisterial districts;
- (c) appoint such persons, male or female, as he thinks fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth—

- (a) establish a special court to be called a Children's Court at Newman to exercise jurisdiction within the area known as the Murchison Magisterial District; and
- (b) appoint—
 - (i) Harry Fitzgerald Harlock, Stipendiary Magistrate, Meekatharra, to be a special magistrate for; and
 - (ii) Peter John Alfred Collins and Bruce Leslie Grieves, both of Newman, to be members of

the Children's Court at Newman.

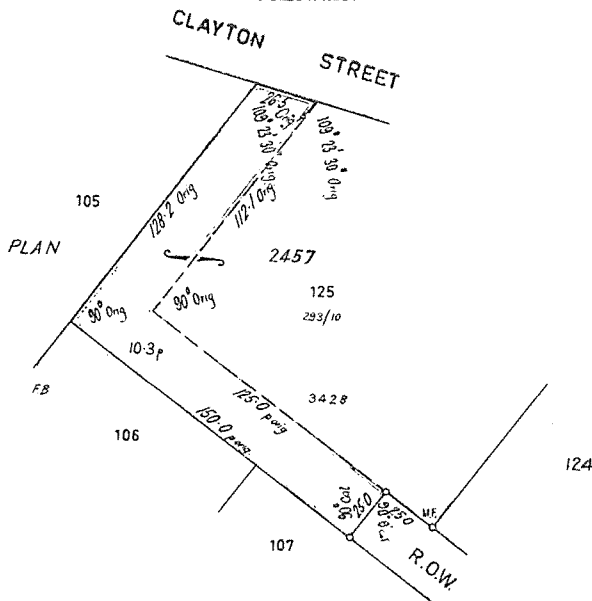

Schedule.

UNIFORM PRIVATE SWIMMING POOL BY-LAWS.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Uniform Private Swimming Pool By-laws.
2. In these by-laws—

“private swimming pool” means any place or premises provided for the purpose of swimming, wading or like activities which the public are not entitled to use.
3. These by-laws apply to and in relation to every private swimming pool other than a private swimming pool that—
 - (a) does not exceed fifty square feet in area;
 - (b) cannot be filled with water to a depth exceeding twelve inches; and
 - (c) is of a portable nature.
4. (1) Subject to by-law 5 of these by-laws, the owner or occupier of any premises on which there is a private swimming pool shall cause that private swimming pool to be enclosed by a fence, wall or building or any combination thereof, in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.

Penalty: One hundred dollars and in addition a daily penalty of ten dollars for each day on which the offence continues.

(2) Any portion of a fence, wall or building used to enclose a private swimming pool shall—

 - (a) be at least four feet in height; and
 - (b) be of such a construction as—
 - (i) to prevent a child from gaining access to the private swimming pool by passing beneath or through the fence, wall or building; or
 - (ii) not to afford foot or hand holds to any child attempting to enter the private swimming pool by scaling the fence, wall or building.
 - (3) Any gate or other device, that is incorporated with a fence, wall or building enclosing a private swimming pool for the purpose of enabling persons to enter the enclosed area of the private swimming pool, shall be fitted with—
 - (a) an efficient self-closing mechanism;
 - (b) a positive self-latching mechanism that is situated not more than six inches below the top of the gate or device; and
 - (c) a mechanism which enables the gate or device to be permanently locked.
5. The provisions of by-law 4 of these by-laws do not apply to a private swimming pool if the private swimming pool is situated in the rear portion of any premises, and the rear portion of those premises is itself completely enclosed by a fence, wall or building complying with all the requirements of that by-law.

1.—GENERAL TUITION FEES.

Fees to be charged to students in the Technical Education Division other than in self-supporting courses shall be as follows:—

(1) Apprentices—

Apprentices registered with the Western Australian Industrial Commission—

- (a) for normal day release or block release apprentice classes or related correspondence courses (per annum) \$15.00
- (b) For other instruction—fees as prescribed in items 2 and 3.

(2) Class Instruction—

(a) Fees calculated on the total hours of instruction as follows:—

- (i) Students aged 21 years or over—for each 3 hours of class instruction or part thereof 50 cents
Maximum fee payable per annum \$60.00
- (ii) Students aged 18 years or over but under 21 years of age—for each 4½ hours of class instruction or part thereof 50 cents
Maximum fee payable per annum \$40.00
- (iii) Students under 18 years of age—for each 9 hours of class instruction or part thereof 50 cents
Maximum fee payable per annum \$16.00

- (b) (i) In the case of a student admitted to a class after the commencement of a course, fees as set out in paragraph (a) above calculated on the total remaining hours of instruction.
- (ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (i) above, a student admitted to a class at any time during the first one-third part of a course shall pay the full fee prescribed for that course and for the purposes of this subparagraph a one-third part shall mean one-third of the total hours of instruction.
- (c) For the purposes of calculating the fees set out in this item, a full-year course shall be deemed to run for 36 weeks.
- (d) The minimum fee chargeable for class instruction shall be \$1 per annum.

(3) Correspondence Instruction—

- (a) For students aged 21 years of age or over, the fees for correspondence students shall be such as determined by the Minister to conform with the general level of fees for class instruction.
- (b) Students 18 years of age or over but under 21 years of age—per subject \$8.00
- (c) Students under 18 years of age—per subject \$4.00
