Specified Conditions.

Periods 1st October, 1970, to the 31st October, 1970, inclusive and the 1st April, 1971, to the 31st May, 1971, inclusive: Bush may be burnt subject to reasonable precautions being taken to prevent the escape of fire.

Periods 1st November, 1970, to the 14th December, 1970, inclusive and the 15th March, 1971, to the 31st March, 1971, inclusive:—

(1) Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place does not exceed one half of one acre—

(a) Stumps, fallen trees, limbs of trees, branches, logs, cleared scrub and other debris resulting from clearing operations may be burnt provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer appointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land, on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with. The permit must be obtained from the office of the Council or the nearest manned Fire Station to the land on which the bush is proposed to be burnt.

(b) Standing bush may be burnt without a permit provided that:—

(i) a firebreak at least three feet wide cleared of all inflammable material has first been provided inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land;

(ii) at least two able bodied persons fifteen years of age or over are in attendance during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning;

(iii) a hose long enough to reach all parts of the area to be burnt is provided and has water flowing through it continuously during the whole of the time in which the fire is burning; or

(iv) where reticulated water is not available, alternative firefighting equipment of the nature of shovels, rakes, beaters, water in buckets, or similar equipment, sufficient to control the escape of the fire is provided.

(2) Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds one half of one acre: Bush may only be burnt provided that a firebreak

at least ten feet wide (or of such greater width as specified in the permit) is first cleared, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land and a permit to burn is obtained from an officer appointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land, on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with. The permit must be obtained from the office of the Council or the nearest manned Fire Station to the land on which the bush is proposed to be burnt.

- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) and (2) herein, an officer appointed by the Council of the municipality in which the land, on which the bush it is proposed to burn, is situated or an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act may refuse to issue a permit to set fire to the bush on any land, if in his opinion, it would not be safe for the proposed burning to be carried out.

other date as is necessary to comply with paragraph 1 (d) herein) to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 31st day of March 1971, firebreaks of the following dimensions and in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you:—

1. Rural Lands:

- (a) North Ward: Along the whole of the external boundaries of the property and within one chain of the perimeter of any buildings, group of buildings or haystacks, a firebreak of not less than 10 feet in width.

- (c) All properties exceeding 5,000 acres: Where the total area of a property exceeds 5,000 acres additional firebreaks of not less than 10 feet in width must be provided in such positions as to divide the property into areas not exceeding 5,000 acres, each area being completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (d) Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) you shall forthwith clear a firebreak not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

2. Townsite Land: Clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks at least six feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land.

3. Bulk or Drum Fuel Storage Sites: All Bulk or Drum Fuel Storage sites to be totally cleared of inflammable materials for a minimum distance of 20 feet around the storage site.

2. Townsites—breaks to be completed by 30th November, 1970: On all land a firebreak 6 feet wide inside the external boundaries of such land having an area of 1 acre or more. Lots of less than 1 acre to be cleared of all inflammable material.



Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic Code, 1965, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th December, 1965, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published is referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 1611A added. 2. Part XVI of the principal regulations is amended by adding after regulation 1611, the following regulation—

Public meetings not to be held on roads without local authority's permission, etc.

1611A. (1) No person shall hold or address any public meeting upon any road, or address any public meeting assembled on any road, from any public or private place adjacent thereto, unless he has first obtained the written permission in that behalf of the Commissioner of Police in regard to the metropolitan area, or the town clerk or secretary of a Local Authority for any other district, and except on the date, and at the time and place specified in such written permission:

Provided that any refusal to grant such permission may be appealed against to the Minister whose decision shall be final.

(2) A person desirous of holding or addressing any public meeting upon any road shall, at least three days before the date upon which he desires to hold or address such meeting, apply to the proper authority specified in subregulation (1) of this regulation for permission to hold the same.

(3) Any person purporting to hold or address such a meeting pursuant to written permission granted under this regulation shall, upon demand, produce the same to any member of the Police Force or officer of the Local Authority which granted the permission.

(4) No person shall, by speaking, shouting, singing, playing upon, or sounding any musical or noisy instrument, or doing anything whatsoever, attract together a number of persons in any road, or public place to the inconvenience, annoyance or obstruction of the public.





IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality, hereby records having resolved on the Nineteenth day of February 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by His Excellency, the Governor, the following By-laws.

By-laws for the control of Reserve No. 23165 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th February, 1952 are hereby repealed.

1. In these By-laws, unless the contrary intention appears, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

“Council” means the Mundaring Shire Council.

“Reserve” shall mean and include the area designated Swan Location 5287, set apart as Reserve No. 23165 and popularly known as Lake Leschenaultia Reserve, and shall include also the waters of the Lake, lying within the boundaries of Swan Location 5287.

“Buildings” means and includes any building, erection, stall, jetty, fence, barrier, hoarding, pavilion, dressingroom, or other construction, and includes tent or caravan.

“Person” means any person or body corporate, or group of persons.

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk of the Mundaring Shire Council.

“Inspector” shall mean and include the Traffic Inspector and the Inspector appointed by the said Council to assist the Council in obtaining due observance of these By-laws.

“Omnibus” means any vehicle used as a passenger vehicle, but the expression does not include a motor car or motor wagon carrying less than ten passengers.

“Vehicle” shall have the same meaning as in the Traffic Act, 1919-69.

2. No person shall within the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of, the Inspector or any caretaker, ranger or other servant of the Council.

3. No person shall damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, fence, post, building, seat, watertank, waterpipe, hose or fitting, treeguard, electrical fitting, earth or other property within the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, treeguard, wall or fence, or upon the roof of any building within the Reserve.

5. No person shall light any fire within the Reserve, except at a fireplace built of brick, stone or fireproof material, as provided by the Council.

6. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix any placard, poster, handbill, notice, advertisement or any document whatever upon any tree, board, post, fence, gate, building, road, path or any place whatever on the Reserve.

7. No person shall use a microphone, loud-speaker, megaphone or other means of sound magnification for the purpose of advertising, nor shall he use such instrument or instruments for any other purpose so as to cause annoyance to other persons using the Reserve.

8. No person shall organise or participate in a political meeting or political rally in the Reserve.

9. No person shall distribute or exhibit any printed or written pamphlet or handbill in any manner whatsoever, within the Reserve without first obtaining the express consent of the Council in writing.

10. No person shall organise or participate in any religious service or rally in the Reserve.

11. No person shall fish in the Lake without first obtaining the written approval of the Clerk, or a person authorised in writing by the Clerk to give such approval.

12. The Council shall set aside an area in which fishing may be allowed by rod and line or by line only. Persons receiving approval to fish may do so in the designated area only.

13. No person shall use a speargun or net or any other instrument other than that allowed above for the purpose of catching fish.

14. No person shall carry any firearm within the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any bird or animal therein.

15. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, offal, paper, bottles, broken glass, china or litter of any kind whatsoever, upon the Reserve, except in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

16. No person shall commit a nuisance on the Reserve or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room or other building erected on the Reserve.

17. No person shall, without permission in writing from the Clerk, sell or expose or offer for sale any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits or other merchandise or things, and to obtain such permission the said person shall pay to the Council, in advance, a fee according to Schedule “A” hereof.

18. No person shall use any boat or canoe on the waters of Lake Leschenaultia other than a boat or canoe propelled by oars or paddles.

19. The Council may from time to time by resolution of Council, limit the number of boats on the Lake surface at any one time.
20. The Council may make charges for admission to the Reserve or to any specified portion thereof, or to any buildings thereon as per Schedule "B" and may charge camping fees as per Schedule "C" hereof.
21. No person shall camp, lodge or tarry overnight in the Reserve, or frequent the same for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying overnight therein, without the consent in writing of the Clerk or an officially appointed Caretaker for the Reserve, and the period of such consent shall not exceed six weeks.
22. No person shall erect, or permit, or authorise the erection of a building on the Reserve without the consent of the Council.
23. The Council may refuse to grant such consent or may grant its consent upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit.
24. Any person desirous of erecting a building on the Reserve shall make application to the Council in writing, stating the purpose of the building, and shall, if so required, provide a plan and specification of the proposed building and any other particulars required of him by the Council.
25. The consent of the Council to the erection of a building may specify—
- (a) the purpose for which such building may be used;
 - (b) the nature of the building which may be erected;
 - (c) the time during which such building may be permitted to remain on the reserve;
 - (d) the times when such building may be used;
 - (e) the position in which such building may be erected.
26. Any person who shall erect or use or permit or authorise the erection or use of any building on the Reserve without the written consent of the Council, shall be guilty of an offence.
27. The Council may, after having given to the person to whom a consent to erect a building on the Reserve had been granted, one calendar month's notice of its intention so to do, withdraw such consent.
28. The Council may, by notice in writing to the owner, or to the person whom it believes to be the owner of a building on the Reserve direct that a building erected or used on the Reserve without the consent of the Council or erected or used otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the consent of the Council, or any building in respect of which the consent to erect or use the same has been withdrawn, be removed within a period of 14 days after the date of the service of the said notice; any building not removed by the end of the 14 days may then be removed by Council who may recover the cost of said removal in a Court of competent jurisdiction. Any person who fails to comply with a notice given by the Council to remove a building on the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence.
29. No person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary on any road or prepared carriage-way within the Reserve, except on authorised stands.
30. No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on any portion of the Reserve, except on authorised stands.
31. No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to enter an authorised stand for vehicles unless he has paid a fee or fees as set out in the Schedule "B" hereto.
32. No person shall ride a motor cycle on any portion of the Reserve other than a prepared road or carriage-way.
33. The Council may prohibit any games or sports from being played or carried out in the Reserve.
34. No person shall, within the Reserve, indulge in or play at any game of chance or any unlawful game, and gambling or betting in any and all forms is completely prohibited.
35. No person shall consume or cause to be consumed any alcoholic beverage in the Reserve without first obtaining the written approval of the Clerk of the Council.
36. No dog shall be at large in any part of the Reserve and any person who shall cause or permit a dog to stray or be at large in the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence.
37. Any person who commits a breach of any of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Dollars (\$20.00).
38. The Council reserves the right to remove or cause to be removed any person who commits a breach of these By-laws and to refuse entry to the same person for an indefinite period.
39. The Council reserves the right to refuse entry to the Reserve to any person or vehicle after midnight and before 6.00 a.m. on any day.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960-1970.

The Municipality of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley.

By-laws relating to Aerodromes.

L.G. 1013/69.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 24th day of February, 1970, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

Application.

1. These By-laws shall apply to and be in force within the whole of the Area of the district of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley.

Interpretation.

2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Act"—The Air Navigation Acts, 1920-1966, of the Commonwealth of Australia or other Act or Acts of the Commonwealth relating to air navigation for the time being in force.

"Aerodrome"—Any area of land under the control of the Council as an aerodrome whilst and so long as licensed for the purpose of an aerodrome under the Regulation.

"Aerodrome Manager"—The officer appointed by or under the authority of the Council for the time being directing and controlling the traffic of aircraft on any aerodrome or of persons having business with aircraft on any aerodrome.

"Council"—The Council of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley.

"Groundsman"—Any person appointed by or under the authority of the Council to control and supervise the use generally of any Aerodrome, or for the time being acting in the discharge of such duties.

"Local Government Acts"—The Local Government Acts, 1960 to 1969 or any Act for the time being in force amending or in substitution thereof.

"Owner"—Includes lessee, charterer, and person for the time being in control of the aircraft.

"Pilot"—The person actually controlling an aircraft at the relevant time. If there is no such person, then the person entitled to such control.

"Regulations"—The Air Navigation Regulations made under the Act and for the time being in force by virtue of the Act.

Any term defined in the Act or Regulations shall have the same meanings in these by-laws.

Use by aircraft.

3. (i) The owner of every aircraft shall be entitled, upon and subject to compliance with these By-laws, to use any aerodrome for the landing, servicing and departure of his aircraft and the embarkment and disembarkment of aerial passengers and freights.

(ii) Unless and until so determined by the aerodrome manager, any aerodrome shall not be open to use for flying where the surface of the aerodrome may be or may reasonably be expected to be unsafe for landing or departure of aircraft.

Provided that, in the case of emergency, landings may be made, entirely at the owner's risk, upon such aerodrome.

Buildings, Notices, etc.

4. Subject to the Act and Regulations, the Council may—

(i) Erect, make, or place upon any aerodrome in such positions as it may see fit such buildings, structures, barriers, conveniences, amenities, signposts, notices, markings and other things as it may see fit for the more complete, effective, convenient, and safe use and enjoyment of any aerodrome as a public landing ground for aircraft.

(ii) Grant to any person, upon application, permission to erect buildings, refuelling sites, or any other structure or thing consistent with the use of the land as an aerodrome, subject, if the Council considers fit, to the payment of a rental for the use of the land upon which such buildings, refuelling sites, or other structure or thing are or is erected. Such permission may be granted by the Council subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem fit.

Right of entry to aerodrome.

5. (i) Save as herein provided, a person other than—

(a) Persons lawfully employed upon duties in or about the supervision and control of any aerodrome, or in or about the arrival, departure, or servicing of, or other attention upon aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome; or

(b) Passengers or intending passengers by aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome;
shall not enter or be upon any aerodrome or any part thereof.

(ii) The Council may, from time to time, set apart any specified part or parts of any aerodrome—

(a) To which persons other than those mentioned in subclause (a) of clause (i) of this By-law shall not be admitted;

(b) To which the general public, or any limited classes of the general public, may be admitted, either at all times or at specified times, or for limited periods and generally upon such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.

(c) To which no vehicle may be admitted, or to which vehicles may be admitted only on such terms and conditions as the Council may determine.

(iii) Suitable notices shall be placed by the Council indicating the limits of any part of any aerodrome set apart for any special or limited use under this By-law.

(iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of this By-law and By-law 11 the Council may on special occasions, such for instance, as an aerial pageant or other event of public interest, make such arrangements for the control of any aerodrome and charge such fees for participation and for admission as it may by resolution impose.

(v) No person shall bring, or permit to stray, on to any aerodrome, any horse, cattle, sheep or goats without authority from the Council. Any such animal so found trespassing without authority may be removed from the aerodrome by any officer or employee of the Council, or by any person authorised so to do. Any person bringing, or permitting any such animal to stray, on to any aerodrome without authority shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

6. It shall be an offence, punishable by a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100), for any person, without permission of the Council, to enter or be upon any part of any aerodrome to which he is not entitled under the provisions of By-law 5 to admission.

Conduct of Persons on Aerodrome.

7. Every person admitted to or being upon any aerodrome shall whilst thereon behave himself in a proper and becoming manner and so as not to cause any annoyance or inconvenience to any other person lawfully thereon; and shall obey any directions reasonably given to him by the groundsmen or any person acting under him, for the purpose of preserving order or promoting or facilitating, the lawful use and enjoyment of any aerodrome. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100).

8. All passengers and intending passengers by any aircraft shall, whilst upon any aerodrome, obey the directions of the groundsman or aerodrome manager as to their conduct and movements.

9. Any person, whether or not a passenger or intending passenger by an aircraft, who the groundsman or aerodrome manager may consider to be intoxicated or so under the influence of liquor as to make his presence on any aerodrome dangerous to himself or others, or offensive to others, or otherwise undesirable, may be refused admission to any aerodrome, or if upon any aerodrome may be removed by the groundsman or aerodrome manager or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome manager.

10. A person shall not use any building, structure, convenience, or amenity provided upon any aerodrome for any purpose other than that for which it is provided or intended, or destroy, remove, obliterate, deface, alter or otherwise interfere with any barrier, notice, sign, or marking designed or intended for the direction, guidance, warning or information of persons using any aerodrome.

Landing Fees, Charges, etc.

11. (i) The Council may require the owner of every private or commercial aircraft using any aerodrome to pay fees as per the attached schedule of charges and approved by the Department of Civil Aviation. Provided that, if at any time the scale of fees permitted by the Act and Regulations to be charged for the use of an aerodrome as a landing ground for aircraft be less in any particular than the scale set out by Council, then the fee in any such particular shall be that which is so permitted to be charged.

(ii) In the case of a regular air service, the Council may allow payment of an annual charge in respect of such service, of such amount as it may see fit, such charge not to exceed the total fees that would be payable in respect of the service for the year at daily rates.

(iii) If any aircraft remains on any aerodrome more than twenty-four (24) hours, a fee shall be payable as for one landing for each day after the first day during which it so remains. Provided that this provision shall not apply to aircraft parked within leased hangars or on leased sites.

(iv) If any arrangements have been made for the landing or departure of an aircraft, but such arrangements are cancelled after the aerodrome manager has attended for the purpose of such landing or departure, a charge equal to half a landing fee shall be payable, unless the aerodrome manager considers the cancellation warranted by adverse weather conditions, defects in the aircraft or the like.

(v) The owner of any aircraft not running to a regular schedule, which it is intended shall land upon or depart from any aerodrome, shall give the Council groundsman notice of sufficient length of time (where practicable, at least an hour) before the time of anticipated arrival or departure, to enable the necessary arrangements to be made. Where extra expense is incurred by the Council through failure to give adequate notice, the owner of the aircraft shall on demand pay the Council the extra expense so incurred.

12. (i) The fees payable under clause (i) of By-law 11 shall be payable at or before the time of landing of the aircraft or at such other time as may be specially fixed by the Council; other charges and expenses under that By-law shall be payable upon demand, for the purpose of which demand the pilot may be treated as the agent of the owner.

(ii) Any fee, charge, or expense payable in accordance with these By-laws shall constitute a debt due by the owner of the aircraft concerned, and may be recovered by the Council from him in any court of competent jurisdiction.

General.

13. A person who in any respect contravenes or fails to comply with any of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and where no other penalty is provided, liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and in addition such person may, if upon any aerodrome, be summarily removed therefrom by any police officer, groundsman, or aerodrome manager, or any person acting under the direction of the groundsman or aerodrome manager.

14. Provided further that the Council, in its absolute discretion, may, either generally or for specific use, waive all or any of the requirements of these by-laws.

Regulations.

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934 Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th September, 1938 and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Amendment to reg. 23. (Contributions to Workers' Compensation Board Fund). 2. Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is amended—
- (a) by adding after the regulation number "23." the subregulation designation "(1)";
- (b) by substituting for the figures "1964", in line three, the figures "1970";
- (c) by substituting for the passage "thirty-five thousand pounds", in the last line, the words "one hundred thousand dollars"; and
- (d) by adding a subregulation as follows—
- (2) The sum prescribed for the purposes of paragraph (e) of subsection (5) of section 27 of the Act is, with effect from the termination of the year ending the 30th June, 1970, twenty-five thousand dollars.
