THE Council of the Shire of Kwinana, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, 1959 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves;
- (b) controlling land development;
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Acts.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1.1 Scheme Title: This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Shire of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme, hereinafter called "the Scheme" and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1.2 Scheme Area: The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the Municipality of the Shire of Kwinana, which is approximately 45.6 square miles.

1.3 The Scheme: The Scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time, shall continue to have effect.

1.4 Responsible Authority: The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Kwinana (hereinafter referred to as the Council) except that where land is shown in the Scheme Map as "Regional Reservation" the responsible authority shall be deemed to be the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme shall apply to such reservations.

1.5 The Scheme Documents:

- (1) The Scheme Text:
 - Part I.—Preliminary.
 - Part II.—Reserved Land.
 - Part III.—Zones.
 - Part IV.—Non-conforming Uses.
 - Part V.—General Provisions.
 - Part VI.—Finance and Administration.
- (2) Land Use Map.
- (3) Scheme Map.

1.6 Planning Scheme Interpretations: In the Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix "D" of the Town Planning Regulations 1967, and where appropriate in the Scheme Text.

Unless the context requires otherwise:—

- "Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended);
- "District" means the Municipality of the Shire of Kwinana;
- "heliport" means land or building planned or designed with a landing pad with or without servicing facilities, intended for the use of helicopters.
- "veterinary hospital" means any part of a building or land, whether permanent or otherwise, in which animals or household

pets are received and lodged for medical treatment or care and the expression includes a kennel for boarding of animals;

"rural use" means the use of land or building for the growing, rearing or producing of primary products and the expression includes market gardens, poultry farms, aviaries, apiaries and nurseries;

"trade display" means the use of land or building for the display of goods for advertising purposes.

1.7 Revocation of Kwinana District By-laws: The Kwinana District By-laws, 1956 (as amended), adopted by the Kwinana Road Board for the District formerly known as the Kwinana Road District which now comprises the Municipality of the Shire of Kwinana, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of February, 1956, and subsequently amended from time to time, are hereby revoked with effect from the date the Scheme comes into operation.

1.8 Relationship of Scheme to Any By-laws: The provisions of the Scheme shall have effect notwithstanding any by-laws for the time being in force in the District, and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-laws, the provisions of the Scheme shall prevail.

1.9 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all provisions made thereunder and Part IV of the Scheme, no person shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration, or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.

1.10 Appeal Rights: Any persons aggrieved by a decision of the Council exercising the discretionary powers embodied in this Scheme Text, may appeal from such decision to the Minister for Town Planning who may uphold, reverse or vary the decision of the Council, and the order of the Minister shall be final and binding.

PART II.—RESERVED LAND.

2.1 Reservation of Land: Land set aside under the Scheme for the purpose of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the Scheme Map, and the reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme in order to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.

Any application for development on land reserved or abutting a reserve defined in the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme shall be referred to the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for determination in accordance with clauses 28 and 29 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

2.2 Development of Reserved Land: Except as otherwise provided in this Part a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under the Scheme, other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.

2.3 Approval of Development: In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserve and shall, in the case of land reserved for the purposes of a public authority, confer with that authority before giving its approval.

2.4 Existing Use Rights: No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance, for which the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.

2.5 Injurious Affection: Where a Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval

subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.

2.6 Claims for Compensation: Claims for such compensation shall be lodged at the office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

2.7 Council may Purchase: In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by such decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III.—ZONES.

3.1 Generally: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Scheme and without affecting the generality of clause 1.4 Part I, the Council may, with the consent of the Minister, or when required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the District, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of clause 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

3.2 Types of Zones: The Scheme area is divided into four (4) types of zones as follows:—

- (1) Residential Zone.
- (2) Commercial Zone.
- (3) Industrial Zone.
- (4) Rural Zone.

3.3 Zoning Table Explanation: Table I appended to this clause of this Part indicates the several uses permitted by the Scheme in the various Zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of the Table.

In respect of any use that is not specifically listed in the Table, the Council shall determine in which Zone or Zones the use may be permitted with or without conditions, as the Council deems fit.

The meanings of the symbols used in the Table are as follows:—

"P" —A use that is permitted under the Scheme;

"AA" —A use that is not permitted unless Council gives its approval in writing after giving consideration to the possible effect that such a use would have on the amenity, public health, convenience and economy of the existing or planned uses nearby.

"SP" —A use that is not permitted unless Council gives its approval in writing after giving consideration to the possible effect that such a use would have on the amenity, public health, convenience and economy of the existing or planned uses nearby; Council shall before considering each application—

- (1) Place in a conspicuous position on the site proposed for such a use and in the office of the Council, a notice in the Form SP No. 1 contained in Schedule I.
- (2) Advertise the proposed use in Form SP No. 1 contained in Schedule I, once a week for three consecutive weeks in a daily newspaper having a circulation in the District; the cost of the advertisements shall be borne by the applicant.
- (3) Give notice in Form SP No. 2 contained in Schedule I, of the proposed use to the owners and

occupiers of all land nearby that in the opinion of the Council may be affected by the proposed use. All costs resulting from this action shall be borne by the applicant.

This provision does not prevent any residents or rate-payers of the District from objecting to or supporting the proposed use and as far as practicable, Form SP No. 3 shall be used for such purpose.

(4) Consider any objection to and support for the proposed use, which are delivered to the Council in writing within 35 days of the date shown on the notice in Form SP No. 1 referred to in paragraph (1).

(5) This procedure shall not apply to broadacre areas being subdivided for urban purposes for the first time unless otherwise deemed by Council.

"IP" —A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council;

"X" —A use that is not permitted.

3.4 Change of Use Class: No person shall change the use of any land, however zoned, from one use class to another use class unless the prior approval in writing of the Council has been obtained.

3.5 District Civic and Shopping Complex: Land has been set aside as shown in the Scheme Map for the Development of a District Civic and Shopping complex.

Planning and development of this complex shall be carried out to the approval of the Council incorporating the following principles:—

- (1) The building group shall be designed to produce an integrated layout.
- (2) Building shall be of complimentary design with particular reference to height and slope of pavings and cantilever awnings; and also in terms of colour, tone and texture of facing materials so that components of form and finish will blend harmoniously.
- (3) The design shall make provision for general uniformity of future advertising outside any shops to be in keeping with the architectural character of the development.
- (4) Provision shall be made for planting and landscaping of development to enhance the environs and to secure a pleasant relationship between the centre and the existing and potential use of adjoining land.

3.6 Local Shopping Centres: In order to meet the future needs of local retail trading and services, land has been set aside at selected locations as shown in the Scheme Map, for future development of local shopping centres.

The planning, design and development of these centres shall be carried out to the approval of the Council incorporating the principles as set out in clause 3.5 of this Part.

3.7 Declaration of Location Control Areas: The Council may define and declare land in any zone as a Location Control Area and in addition to the provisions of the Scheme, Council may impose development restrictions within these areas in order to achieve a more effective operation of the Scheme. The declaration of a "Location Control Area" is not a change of zoning.

3.8 Scheme Amendments: All Scheme amendments shall be referred to the Town Planning Board for recommendation to the Hon. Minister for Town Planning.

PART IV.—NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

4.1 Existing Use Rights: No provision of the Scheme shall prevent—

- (1) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
- (2) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act,

1928 (as amended), and any other law authorising the development to be carried out have been duly obtained and was current.

4.2 Non-conforming Use of Reserved Land: Where in respect of land reserved under Part II of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections, alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.

4.3 Extension of Buildings: Where in respect of land zoned under Part III of the Scheme a non-conforming use exists or was authorised as mentioned in clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, and provided the prior consent in writing of the Council has been obtained, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under that Act for the purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried on immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

4.4 Change of Non-Conforming Use: The Council may permit the use of any land to be changed from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use, provided the proposed use is, in the opinion of the Council, less detrimental to the amenity of the neighbourhood than the existing use, or is in the opinion of the Council closer to the intended uses of the zone.

4.5 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:

- (1) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Part, except where a change of non-conforming use has been permitted by the Council under Clause 4.4, when a non-conforming use of any land or building has been discontinued, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
- (2) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and the occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner for that purpose.
- (3) When a building of non-conforming use is destroyed or damaged by fire or otherwise to the extent of fifty (50) per cent or more of its cubic content, excluding foundations, the non-conforming use right of that building and the land upon which it stands shall cease unless, before any rebuilding development takes place, the Council has given its approval in writing for the non-conforming use to continue.
- (4) Unless the Council has given its approval for the non-conforming use right to continue before it approves an application to commence development of land for the purpose for which it is zoned under the Scheme, any non-conforming use right of such land shall cease thereafter, within six months from the date of the Council giving its approval in writing or immediately after the approved development takes place, whichever date is earlier. Any existing buildings thereon shall be demolished, altered or extended and used in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.

PART V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

5.1 Development Control:

Development within any Zone shall be in accordance with the standards set out in this Part.

For the purpose of applying these standards and controls:

PLOT RATIO shall have the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purpose of the Uniform Building By-laws.

LOT COVERAGE shall have the same meaning as is given to it in and for the purpose of the Uniform Building By-laws.

5.2 Residential Development: For residential development, unless otherwise specified in the Scheme, site restriction provisions of General Residential Zone—Class 4 (GR-4) as specified in and for the purpose of the Uniform Building By-laws shall apply.

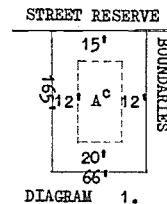
5.3 Maximum Permissible Plot Ratio: The maximum permissible plot ratio of any lot shall be determined by the Council according to the nature of the Use Class permitted but shall not exceed the maximum plot ratio given in Table II.

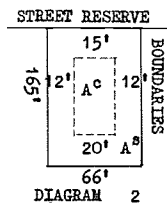

5.4 Maximum Permissible Lot Coverage: The maximum permissible lot coverage of any lot, except Occupancy Classes I, IA and II shall be the area of that lot minus the area contained between the boundaries and the minimum setbacks from all boundaries as specified in clause 5.5.

$$\text{MAXIMUM PERMISSIBLE LOT COVERAGE} = \frac{A^c \times 100}{A^L} = \%$$



Where, A^L is the area of the lot;
 A^s is the area contained between boundaries and setbacks;
 $A^c = (A^L - A^s)$ is the central area of the lot.

EXAMPLE: For a lot of 10,890 sq. ft. with dimensions as shown in Diagram 2.

5.5 Minimum Permissible Setbacks from Boundaries: The minimum setbacks from boundaries for a building of any Occupancy Class shall be determined by the Council but shall not be less than the minimum setbacks given in Table III.

5.6 Minimum Floor Areas of Flats: The minimum gross floor areas of flats, excluding external stairs and access-ways, and garages, shall not be less than the following standards:—

5.7 Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this Clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any lot or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision for vehicles used in conjunction with the lot (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees or other persons) to stand on or, in the opinion of the Council sufficiently close to the lot but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.

The number and sizes of parking and loading spaces to be provided in respect of any particular lot shall be determined by the Council generally in accordance with the standard requirement set down in Table IV and Council shall at all times have regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volumes of goods, materials or people moving to and from the lot and in relation to any existing or proposed public parking facilities nearby.

5.8 Land between Building Line and Street Alignment: The Land between the building line and the street alignment may be used as a means of access and for parking of vehicles, for loading and unloading, and for lawns and gardens. All other uses shall not be permitted unless Council gives its approval in writing.

5.9 Traffic Entrances: Where in the opinion of the Council, the siting and or design of any means of vehicular or pedestrian access to and from a street reserve seem likely to create a traffic hazard, the Council may require the owner to re-design and or re-position such means of access as it may direct. Where the Council considers that separate entrances to and exits from any lot for road vehicles are desirable for the avoidance of traffic hazards on public roads adjacent thereto it may require the owner to provide such entrances and exits as it may direct.

5.10 Fences: No fences exceeding three feet in height shall be permitted, between the street alignment of any lot and the set back line from the street alignment, provided that only link wire mesh fences with pipe upstands or other types of fences approved by Council, exceeding three feet in height in non-residential zones may be permitted where the Council is satisfied that such fences are unlikely to cause or create any traffic hazards and the Council may require such fences to be set back at not more than fifteen feet from any truncation.

The side fence of any corner lot in the Residential Zone, between the set back line from the street alignment and the rear boundary shall be not higher than six feet.

5.11 Obstruction in Corner Lots: Any structure, shrubs or plantings in any corner lot that in the opinion of the Council, may obstruct visually, shall not be permitted. The Council may order the removal, repositioning or pruning of such structure, shrubs or plantings that in its opinion, may create or cause a traffic hazard to motorists or pedestrians and the owner or occupier shall comply with such order.

5.12 Small Lots: The Council may permit a private dwelling of Occupancy Class I to be erected on a lot smaller in area and effective frontage than prescribed if the lot comprises the whole of any lot shown on a plan or diagram of subdivision approved in accordance with the provisions of the Act before the Scheme comes into operation.

5.13 Appearance of Buildings:

All buildings and land shall be maintained to preserve the amenity of the surrounding areas.

No building shall be so designed or constructed or finished or left unfinished that its external appearance would disfigure the locality or tend to depreciate the value of the surrounding properties.

In case of dispute, the applicant may within thirty days request the Council to seek the expert opinion of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects whose recommendation may be accepted by Council with or without modification. Any expenses incurred shall be borne by the applicant.

5.14 Dwellings Incidental to Industrial Uses: A dwelling on land forming part of or adjoining a factory occupied by a caretaker or of an employee of the factory and set aside for the exclusive use of the occupants may be allowed if the Council is satisfied that such a dwelling is necessary for the proper operation of the industry, but not more than one such dwelling for each establishment or industry or lot may be permitted subject to the following:—

- (1) For any lot less than 80 perches:—
 - (a) a two-person, single bedroom flat may be permitted;
 - (b) the flat and factory may be designed to form one building;
 - (c) the Council may impose any conditions it deems necessary.

- (2) For any lot greater than 80 perches:—
 - (a) a fiat or dwelling may be permitted;
 - (b) the fiat or dwelling shall be designed as an independent building from the factory building;
 - (c) the Council may impose any conditions it deems necessary.

5.15 Waste Disposal:

No land, however zoned, shall be used as a dumping area for any waste products or bi-products or industrial waste or residue of any form, nature or description unless prior approval in writing has been granted by the Council.

In considering an application for approval, the Council shall have regard to the possible effects of the development on the amenity of the surrounding areas and the possible result of such development on the soils and sub-soils.

PART VI.—FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit.

6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the coming into operation of the Scheme.

6.3 Annual Permit: Where any use class is permitted under the Scheme subject to an annual permit from the Council, an application shall be made annually by the owner or occupier as required by the Council.

6.4 Entry to Premises: The Council may, by its Shire Clerk or any officer authorised by him, enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.

6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and without prejudice to any other remedy given herein is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Act.

6.6 Development Approval: The Council shall not approve any application to commence development unless the proposed development complies with the provisions of the Scheme. Council shall determine the application within 28 days except where implementation under "SP" procedure is warranted.

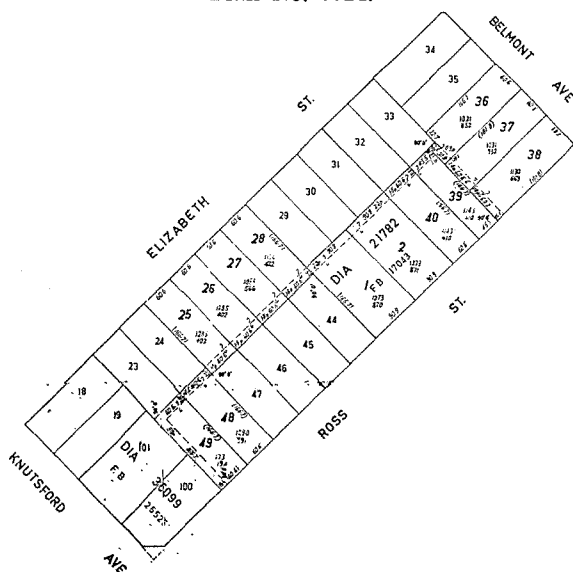

- Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Education Act Regulations, 1960, as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st February, 1968, and thereafter amended from time to time by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- Reg. 111 amended. (Amendment No. 20.) 2. Subregulation (1) of regulation 111 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting the following paragraph:—
(a) A teacher who is continuously employed for more than two weeks in temporarily filling a position the salary for which is higher than that prescribed for his permanent position shall, subject to paragraph (b) of this subregulation and subject to any special provision to the contrary relating to relieving salaries contained in a determination of the Minister made under subsection (2) of section 28 of the Act, be paid for the full period during which he holds the temporary position the salary to which he would be entitled if he held that position permanently.
- Reg. 249 amended. (Amendment No. 21.) 3. Subregulation (4) of regulation 249 of the principal regulations is amended by substituting for the passage "before 31st December, 1970" where it occurs—
(a) in line three of paragraph (a);
(b) in line three of paragraph (b); and

the passage "on or before 1st January, 1971", in each case.
