WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (4) of section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, that the Governor may at any time cancel a proclamation made under section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911; and whereas the Governor, by a Proclamation made the 19th October, 1966, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th October, 1966, did declare that on and after the 1st November, 1966, certain portions of the State specified in that Proclamation should be areas for the purposes of section 150 of the Licensing Act, 1911; and whereas it was enacted by paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 5 of the Liquor Act, 1970, that any proclamation made under the Licensing Act, 1911, that corresponds to a proclamation that might have been given under section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, should have the same force and effect as if it were made under that Act; and whereas it is now deemed desirable that on and after the 1st day of July, 1971, such proclamation be cancelled to the intent that the provisions of section 130 of the Liquor Act, 1970, shall no longer apply to any portion of the State: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare that on and after the 1st day of July, 1971,

the proclamation made on the 19th October, 1966, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th October, 1966, be cancelled.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1088/66.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, a Water Board may with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works to improve the water supply to the developed areas of Bunbury: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, of the Bunbury Water Board borrowing the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) from the Australian Mutual Provident Society, repayable with interest by sixty (60) half-yearly instalments over a period of thirty (30) years, with interest at a rate not exceeding seven dollars forty cents per cent. (\$7.40%) per annum for the purpose of financing the works referred to as Bunbury Water Board Plan Loan No. 45 (Part 1) Sheets 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 and approved by Order in Council on June 9, 1971 and published in the *Government Gazette* of June 18, 1971.

P.W.W.S. 1088/68.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, a Water Board may with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works

to improve the water supply to the developed areas of Bunbury: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964 of the Bunbury Water Board borrowing the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) from the Superannuation Board, repayable with interest by forty (40) half-yearly instalments over a period of twenty (20) years, with interest at a rate not exceeding seven dollars forty cents per cent. (\$7.40%) per annum for the purpose of financing the works referred to as Bunbury Water Board Plan Loan No. 45 (Part 1) Sheets 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 and approved by Order in Council on June 9, 1971 and published in the *Government Gazette* of June 18, 1971.

- (c) after considering the question so referred to it, the Commission reports to the Minister and in its report recommends that a power conferred upon the Governor by section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960 be exercised in a manner or to an extent different from that sought by the petition;

and whereas a petition praying for the severance from the District of Tableland of a portion of the district and the annexation of the portion to the District of Roebourne which the portion adjoins has been effectively presented to His Excellency the Governor and that question was referred to the Commission by the Minister and after considering

the question the Commission recommended in its report to the Minister that a power conferred upon the Governor by section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960 be exercised to an extent different from that sought by the petition, namely by recommending, *inter alia*—

- (d) the severance from the District of Tableland of a portion of the district described in the Schedule hereto, and the annexation of that portion to the District of Roebourne:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council on the aforesaid recommendation and in exercise of the aforesaid powers, doth hereby sever the portion of the district of the Shire of Tableland set out in the Schedule hereto and annex that portion to the Shire of Roebourne, and direct that this Order shall take effect on and after the first day of July, 1971.

- (d) the severance from the District of the Shire of Ashburton of the area described in Schedule A hereto, the severance from the District of the Shire of Meekatharra of the area described in Schedule B hereto, and the annexation of those areas to the District of the Shire of Tableland:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council on the aforesaid recommendations and in exercise of the aforesaid powers, doth hereby sever and annex the portions of districts of the Shires of Ashburton, Meekatharra and Tableland as set out in the Schedules hereto, and direct that this Order shall take effect on and after the first day of July, 1971.

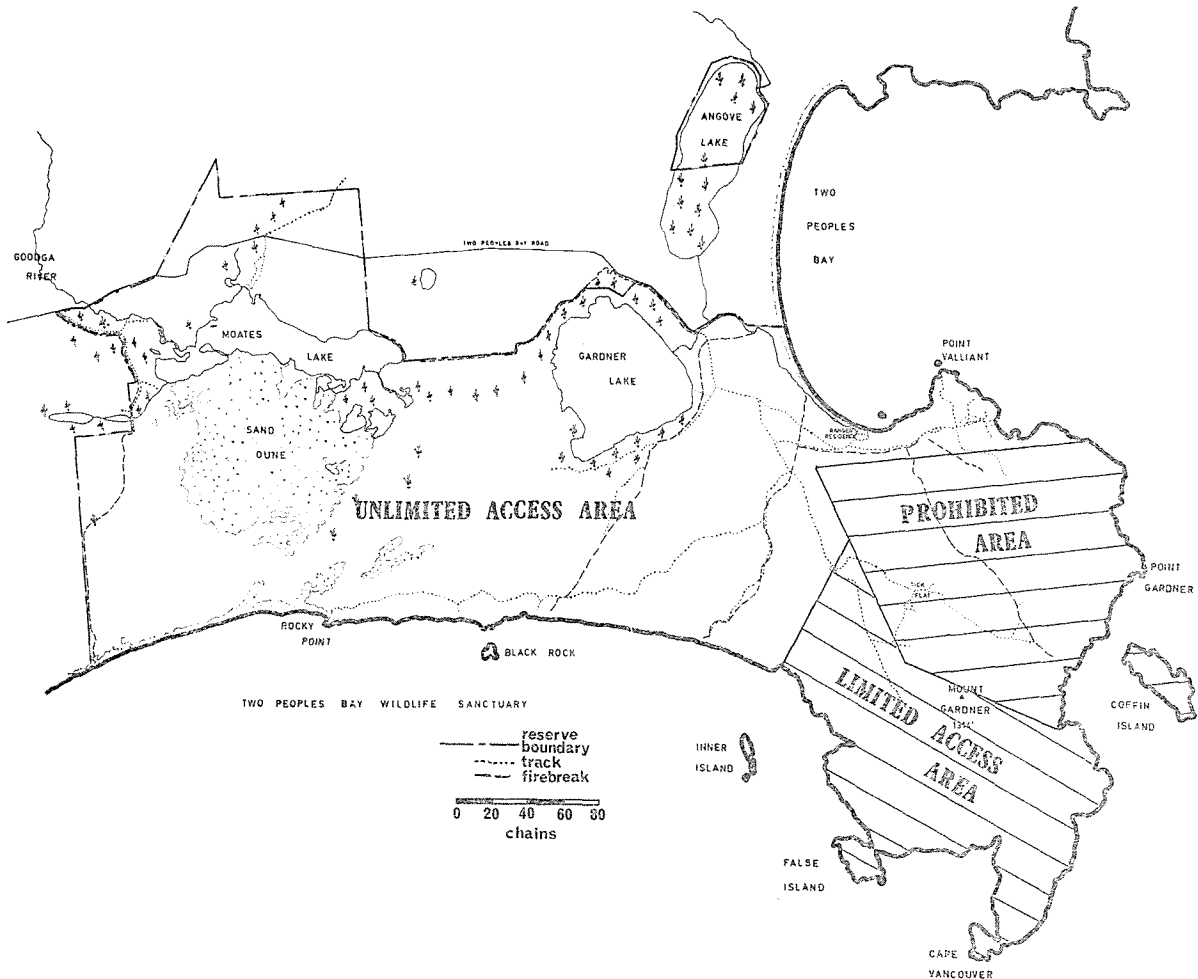
