Requirements in Respect of Fuel Storage on Rural and Urban Land.

IN accordance with the provisions of the above Act you are hereby required, on or before 15th October, 1971, to clear firebreaks not less than eight feet wide in the following positions and thereafter keep maintained such firebreaks of all inflammable material until 15th March, 1972:—

- (1) Around the boundaries of all cleared and part cleared land.
- (2) Along the boundaries of all cleared and part cleared land adjacent to roads.
- (3) Inside and along boundaries, and also adjacent to all railway lines through or adjacent to, or alongside your property.
- (4) Within one chain of all homesteads, buildings and haystacks. Landowners are also required to keep the area between the firebreaks and the homestead, building or haystack cleared of all inflammable materials.

- (5) All townsite lots and fuel depots must be free of all extraneous inflammable materials from 15th October, 1971 to 30th April, 1972 inclusive.

If for any reason it is considered impractical to provide firebreaks in the position, or by the date, an owner or occupier may make application to the Shire Council for approval of a variation of the order. No such application shall be considered unless it is made in handwriting on or before 8th October, 1971, adequately describes the land and is accompanied by the written approval of the bush fire control officer for the area in which the land is situated.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice will render the owner or occupier liable to a penalty of up to \$200.

Firebreak Requirements, 1971-72.

NOTICE to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Northam.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the dates referred to below to clear firebreaks on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of all inflammable material up to and including the 15th day of April, 1972:—

- (1) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1971, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land; and
- (2) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1971, clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least six feet in width in such positions as to divide properties of more than 500 acres into separate sections of no more than 500 acres completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least six feet in width; and

- (6) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1971, clear of all inflammable material (including standing and fallen trees, branches and undergrowth) firebreaks of at least ten feet in width along and as close as possible to all external boundaries of each separate area of undeveloped land and in such extra positions so as areas of undeveloped land of more than 500 acres are divided into areas of no more than 500 acres completely surrounded by a firebreak.

- (7) You shall on or before the 15th day of October, 1971, completely clear of all inflammable material all separate townsite lots where the lot is one acre or less in area.

Dividing Line:

An imaginary line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Avon Location 1779, thence running south and southeast along the western boundaries of Buckland Road (No. 25) and Irishtown Road (No. 109) to the northwestern boundary of the Town of Northam, thence northeast along the said boundary, along the northeastern and southeastern boundaries of the said town to its intersection of the Avon River, thence south along the said Avon River to the southeastern boundary of the Shire.

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Quairading Shire Council District.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the above Act, all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Quairading are hereby required, on or before the 25th October, 1971, to plough, cultivate, scarify or otherwise clear of all inflammable material firebreaks, at least eight feet wide, around all cleared and partly cleared land owned or occupied by them. A firebreak, eight feet wide, shall be cleared one chain from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks, and homesteads by the 25th October, 1971, and the area between the firebreak and the building or haystack shall be cleared of all inflammable materials by 31st October, 1971. If it is intended to clear the area around buildings by burning, a permit must be obtained from the Local Bush Fire Control Officer.

If it is impracticable for any reason to complete the clearing of firebreaks in the positions, or by the date required by this notice, application must be made not later than 25th October, 1971, to the Quairading Shire Council for permission to place breaks in an alternative situation or to complete clearing of breaks by a later date to be determined by the Council.

All firebreaks to be maintained clear of inflammable materials, up to the 1st April, 1972.

Townsites.

Notice to all Owners and Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale, including Owners of Town Lots.

If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

Failure or neglect to comply with this notice renders you liable to prosecution. Penalty—a fine of \$200 and the person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directly in this order if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

(2) where the area of cleared or partly cleared land is more than 300 acres, clear of all inflammable material additional firebreaks in such positions as to divide the land into areas not exceeding 300 acres, each separate area to be completely surrounded by firebreaks inside all external boundaries of the land and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 31st March, 1972.

B. On Townsite Land or Land Subdivided for Residential Purposes: Clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least ten feet wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land, and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st March, 1972.

C. Fuel Dumps and Depots: Remove all inflammable material from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and, where fuel drums whether containing fuel or not are stored, to a distance of at least twelve feet outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums, and thereafter maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 31st March, 1972.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to this Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 1st day of November, 1971, in respect of land outside the Metropolitan Fire District (as defined hereunder) and not later than the 1st day of December, 1971, in respect of land within the Metropolitan Fire District (as defined hereunder) for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Responsible Authority.

3. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of the Scheme is the Town of Albany (hereinafter called "the Council").

4. The Scheme shall apply to the whole of the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map.

General Objects.

6. The general objects of the Scheme are to zone the Scheme Area for the purposes in this Scheme described and to make provisions as to the nature

and location of buildings and the size of lots when used for certain purposes, the preservation of objects of natural beauty, of historical buildings and objects of historical or scientific interest and to make provision for other matters necessary or incidental to town planning or housing.

Interpretation.

7. In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires the following terms shall have the meaning set out hereunder respectively:—

"Absolute Majority" means a majority of the total number of the members for the time being of the Council whether present or not.

"Act" means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 as amended.

"Car Park" means a site or building used primarily for parking private cars or taxis whether open to the public or not but does not include any part of a public road or any land or building on or in which vehicles are displayed for sale.

"Caravan park" means an area set aside for the parking of caravans.

"Caretaker's house" means a building used as a residence by the proprietor or manager of an industry, business, office building or recreation area carried on or existing upon the same site, or by a person having the care of the building, plant, equipment or grounds thereof.

"Civic building" means a building designed, used or intended to be used by Government departments, statutory bodies representing the Crown, or councils as offices or for administrative or other like purposes.

"Consulting rooms" means a building or part of a building (other than a hospital) used in the practice of his profession by a legally qualified medical practitioner or dentist, or by a physiotherapist, a masseur or a person ordinarily associated with a medical practitioner in the investigation or treatment of physical or mental injuries or ailments.

"Duplex house" means a building comprising two dwelling units, each being complete and self-contained.

"Dwelling-house" means a building used primarily for living purposes as one separate family unit; the term also includes such out-buildings and recreational uses and gardens as are ordinarily used therewith, but does not include a "residential building" or part of such building.

"Eating house" means any house, building or structure or any part thereof in which meals are served to the public for gain or reward, but does not include—

(a) any premises in respect of which an hotel licence, a tavern licence or a limited hotel licence has been granted under the Liquor Act, 1970;

(b) any boarding house, lodging house or hostel; or

(c) any building or other structure used temporarily for serving meals to the public at any fair, show, military encampment, races or other public sports, games or amusements.

"Educational establishment" means a school, college, university, technical institute, academy or other educational centre, or a lecture hall, but does not include a reformative institution or institutional home.

"Extractive industry" includes the extraction of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone, minerals or similar substance from the land, the winning, processing or treatment of minerals, and also the manufacture of products from those materials when the manufacture is carried out on the land from which any of those materials is extracted or on land adjacent thereto.

"Flat" means a separate and self-contained dwelling within a building containing two or more dwellings.

"Gazettal date" means the date on which notice of the approval of the Minister to this scheme is published in the *Government Gazette*.

"Group housing" means a building comprising two or more dwelling units, each being complete and self-contained and having direct access to and the exclusive use of a garden or courtyard and having direct access to a road or footpath.

"Home occupation" means a business carried on within a dwelling or the curtilage of a dwelling—

- (a) that does not cause injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the neighbourhood, including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) injury or prejudicial affect due to the emission of noise, vibration, electrical interference, light, smell, fumes, smoke vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, liquid wastes or waste products;
- (b) that does not entail the employment on the premises of any person not a member of the occupier's family;
- (c) that does not occupy an area greater than 200 square feet;
- (d) that does not require the provision of any essential service main of a greater capacity than normally required in the zone in which it is located; and
- (e) for which there is not more than one advertisement sign and that not exceeding two square feet in area.

"Industry" means the carrying out of any process for and incidental to—

- (a) the making, altering, repairing or ornamentation, painting, finishing, cleaning, packing or canning or adapting for sale, or breaking up or demolition of any article or part of any article;
- (b) the generation of electricity or the production of gas; and
- (c) the manufacture of edible goods for human or animal consumption, being a process carried on in the course of trade or business for gain, other than operations connected with—
 - (i) the carrying out of agriculture;
 - (ii) site work on buildings, works or land; and
 - (iii) in the case of the manufacture of goods referred to in subparagraph (c) above, the preparation on the premises of a shop of food for sale;

and includes, when carried out on land upon which the process is carried out and in connection with that process, the storage of goods, any work of administration or accounting, the sale of goods resulting from the process and the use of land for the amenity of persons engaged in the process.

"Light Industry" means an industry in which the processes carried on, the machinery used and the goods and commodities carried to and from the premises do not cause any injury to or prejudicially affect the amenity of the locality by reason of the emission of light, noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, liquid wastes or waste products, and in which the only power driven machinery used is driven by electricity.

"Lot" has the meaning given to it by the Act.

"Motel" means a building, group of buildings or place used or intended to be used to accommodate patrons in a manner similar to an hotel or boarding house but in which special provision is made for the accommodation of patrons with motor vehicles.

"Motor Repair Station" means land and buildings used for or in connection with mechanical repairs and overhauls, including tyre recapping, retreading, panel beating, spray painting and chassis reshaping.

"Noxious Industry" means an industry in which the processes involved constitute an offensive trade within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911 (as amended) but does not include fish shops or dry cleaning establishments.

"Objects of Natural Beauty" means the natural beauties of the area including lakes and other inland waters, banks of rivers, foreshores of harbours and other parts of the sea, hill slopes and summits and valleys.

"Office" means the conduct of administration, the practice of a profession, the carrying on of agencies, banks, typist and secretarial services and services of a similar nature or, where not conducted on the site thereof, the administration of or the accounting in connection with an industry.

"Professional Offices" means any building used for the purpose of his profession by an accountant, architect, artist, author, barrister, chiroprapist, consular official, dentist, doctor, engineer, masseur, nurse, physiotherapist, quantity surveyor, solicitor, surveyor, teacher (other than a dancing teacher or a music teacher), or town planner; and "professional person" has a corresponding interpretation.

"Public Authority" means a Minister of the Crown acting in his official capacity, a State Government Department, State trading concern, State instrumentality, State public utility and any other person or body, whether corporate or not who or which, under the authority of any Act, administers or carries on for the benefit of the State, a social service or public utility.

"Rural Industry" means and includes an industry handling treating processing packing or carrying products grown reared or produced in the locality or a blacksmith's shop or a workshop servicing plant or equipment used in a rural pursuit in the locality.

"Rural Pursuit" means and includes agriculture, horticulture, forestry, pasture and poultry farming.

"Service Station" means land and buildings used for the supply of petroleum products and automotive accessories and includes greasing, tyre repairs and minor mechanical repairs.

"Shop" means any building wherein goods are kept exposed or offered for sale by retail, and includes a cafe and a restaurant and receiving depot; but does not include a bank, fuel depot, a market, service station, petrol filling station, milk depot, marine store, timber yard or land and buildings used for the sale of motor and other vehicles or for any purpose falling within the definition of industry.

"Showrooms" means rooms in connection with warehousing or offices, and intended for display of goods of a bulky character.

"Street Alignment" means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon, but where a new street alignment is prescribed under Section 364 of the Local Government Act 1960 it means the new street alignment so prescribed.

"Uniform Building By-laws" means the Uniform Building By-laws 1965 published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd October 1969 as amended.

"Vehicle" includes tractor.

"Warehouse" means any building or enclosed land, or part of a building or enclosed land, used for storage of goods and the

carrying out of commercial transactions involving the sale of such goods by wholesale.

8. The words and expressions used in this text shall unless the context otherwise requires or unless otherwise provided herein have the meanings assigned to them in Appendix D to the Town Planning Regulations 1967.

PART II.—ZONES.

Classification.

9. There are hereby created within the Scheme Area the several Zones set out hereunder:—

- (1) Single Residential and Group Housing.
- (2) Multi Residential.
- (3) Special Residential.
- (4) Licensed Hotel.
- (5) Business.
- (6) Office.
- (7) Showroom Warehouse.
- (8) Service Station.
- (9) Light Industry.
- (10) General Industry.
- (11) Special Industry.
- (12) Port Industry.
- (13) Public Building.
- (14) Public Open Space.
- (15) Rural.

10. The said zones are delineated and coloured on the Scheme Map according to the legend thereon.

Uses.

11. The Zoning Table contained in Appendix I indicates, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the uses permitted in the various zones shown in the Zoning Table. The uses are determined by cross reference between the list of Use Classes on the left hand side of the Zoning Table and the list of Zones at the top of the Zoning Table. The symbols used in the cross reference in the Zoning Table have the following meanings:—

“P”—A use that is permitted by this Scheme.

“PS”—A use that is permitted only if special approval is given by the Council.

“—”—A use that is not permitted.

12. Where in the Zoning Table a particular use is mentioned it is deemed to be excluded from any use class which by its more general terms would otherwise include such particular use.

13. If a particular use of purpose is not mentioned in the list of use classes or is not included in the general terms of any of the use classes such use of purpose shall unless it is permitted by the subsequent provisions of this Scheme be deemed to be prohibited.

Special Development Areas.

14. The Special Development Areas are shown on the Scheme Map within a continuous red line. The Council may permit lands within a Special Development Area to be used for purposes not permitted by the Zoning Table if—

- (a) Full details of the proposed use and proposed development are submitted to and approved by the Council and the Town Planning Board;
- (b) The proposed use and the proposed development do not in the opinion of the Council prejudicially affect the amenity of the area surrounding the proposed development; and
- (c) The developer and the owner of the land shall enter into an agreement with the Council to develop the land and to comply with such other terms and conditions as the Council shall consider desirable.

Special Zones.

15. In addition to the Zones mentioned in Clause 9 there are hereby created Special Zones.

16. Those portions of the Scheme Area which are specified in the Schedule hereto are classified as Special Zones.

17. Notwithstanding a parcel of land described in the Schedule as a Special Zone is within another Zone the land or any building or structure thereon may be used for the purpose set against that parcel of land in the Schedule in addition to the other uses permitted in the Zone in which the land is situated.

Application for Special Approval of Council.

18. Any person who desires to use land for a purpose which by the provisions of this Scheme is only permitted if special approval is given by the Council under Clause 11 shall make application for such approval to the Council in writing.

19. The application shall state the following particulars:—

- (a) The full name and address of the applicant.
- (b) A description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
- (c) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
- (d) The nature of the applicant's interest in the land.
- (e) The purpose for which the applicant desires to use the land.
- (f) The nature of the building and other improvements now on the land.
- (g) The nature of the buildings and other improvements the applicant desires to construct on or make to the land.

20. (1) The Council shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to recommend to a subsequent meeting of the Council that approval be granted. If the Council resolves to recommend that approval be granted it shall refer the matter to a subsequent meeting of the Council to be held not less than three weeks nor more than three months after the passing of the resolution recommending approval.

(2) The Council may resolve that notice be given to ratepayers likely to be affected by the granting of the approval and in that case it shall notify the applicant of the names and addresses of all persons who according to the Rate Book are the rateable owners of land within an area to be specified by the Council likely to be affected by the granting of the application.

(3) The Council shall require notice to be given to ratepayers likely to be affected if the proposed use is likely to be carried on at night or is likely to cause noise or to cause an assembly of persons or vehicles.

21. If so directed by the Council the applicant shall—

- (a) Cause to be sent by certified post to the owners whose names and addresses have been given to him by the Council and to all persons having an interest in the land the subject of the application a copy of his application to the Council; and
- (b) cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme Area notice of the application setting out in an abbreviated form the information contained in his application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice.

22. At a subsequent meeting of the Council held, if notices have been given, after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice and after the expiration of twenty-eight days from the posting of the said notices to the owners

whichever is the later, the Council shall again consider the application and decide whether to grant or withhold its approval upon conditions.

23. In making its decision on applications for its special approval the Council shall take into consideration the following matters:—

- (a) The provisions of any Town Planning Scheme including this Scheme affecting the land the subject of the application or affecting land in the vicinity.
- (b) The nature of the proposed development in relation to the development of any land within the vicinity of the said land.
- (c) The size, shape and character of the parcel of land to which the application relates and the nature and siting of the proposed building, the view from the building and the interruption of view likely to be caused by the proposed building.
- (d) Any representations which may be made by any statutory authority.
- (e) The existing and likely future amenity of the neighbourhood, including (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing) the question of whether the proposed development is likely to cause injury to such amenity including injury due to the emission of light, noise, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, grit, oil, liquid wastes or waste products.
- (f) The nature of the roads giving access to the said land.
- (g) What parking facilities are available or proposed and the likely requirements for parking.
- (h) Such other matters as the Council considers relevant.

24. The Council may enter into agreements with the Applicant whereby the Applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council in granting its approval as aforesaid.

PART III.—SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

25. Subject to the provisions of this text no person shall erect or use a building for a purpose specified in the Building Table contained in Appendix II otherwise than in accordance with the relevant provisions of that Table.

26. Subject to the provisions of this Text no person shall erect or use a building within a Multi-Residential Zone except in accordance with the Multi-Residential Table contained in Appendix III. In cases of difference between the Building Table and the Multi-Residential Table the latter shall apply within a Multi-Residential Zone.

Buildings Set Back from Street Alignment.

27. Subject to the provisions of this Text no person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any building or any portion of a building nearer to a street alignment than the distance mentioned hereunder (hereinafter called "the set back distances") for the particular zone or area in which the building is situated:—

Licensed Hotel	60
Showroom and Warehouse	60
Car Park	30
Service Station	40
Light Industry	50
General Industry	50
Special Industry	50
Port Industry	30
Public Building	30
Public Open Space	30
Rural	50

Provided that—

- (a) In the case of Industrial Lots having a depth of 150 feet or less the set back distance shall for lots fronting a major road be 30 feet and for lots fronting a minor road be 15 feet. The decision whether a road is a major or minor one shall be made by the Council. If the set back distance be reduced to 15 feet the set back area shall not be used for parking.
- (b) Nothing in Clause 25 or in the Building Table (Appendix II) shall be construed to permit the construction and use of a building nearer to the street alignment than the relevant set back distance.

28. Where a lot in a Single Residential and Group Housing Zone or a Special Residential Zone has a frontage to more than one street a building may be erected nearer to the street alignment of the less important of the streets than provided in the Multi-Residential Table (Appendix III) but not nearer than twenty-five (25) feet to such street alignment and the Council shall in each case determine which is or are the less important street or streets.

Area Adjacent to Street.

29. Unless otherwise approved by the Council pursuant to Clause 30 no person shall in any of the Zones following, that is to say—

- Light Industry Zone;
- General Industry Zone;
- Special Industry Zone;

- (a) Use the land within twenty feet of the street alignment except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (i) A means of access.
 - (ii) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
- (b) Use the land situated between twenty feet and fifty feet from the street alignment except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (i) A means of access.
 - (ii) The parking of vehicles used by employees or customers.
 - (iii) The loading and unloading of vehicles.
 - (iv) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
 - (v) If special permission of the Council shall be given thereto—trade display.

And in the case of a lot having a frontage to more than one street—

- (c) Use the land within ten feet of the street alignment of the less important of the streets except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (i) A means of access.
 - (ii) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
 - (iii) The parking of vehicles used by employees or customers.
- (d) Use the land situated between ten feet and thirty feet from the street alignment of the less important of the streets except for one or more of the following purposes:—
 - (i) A means of access.
 - (ii) The parking of vehicles used by employees and customers.
 - (iii) The loading and unloading of vehicles.

- (iv) Lawns, gardens or the planting of trees or shrubs.
- (v) If special permission of the Council shall be given thereto—trade display.

And the Council shall in each case determine which is or are the less important street or streets.

30. (1) If an owner of land shall submit to the Council a plan of development which does not comply with Clauses 27 and 29 the Council may in its discretion approve such plan and permit the uses proposed thereon and the provisions of Clauses 27 and 29 shall be deemed to have been modified according to the detail shown on the plan.

(2) The Council shall not approve a plan pursuant to this clause unless the following conditions apply:—

- (a) The setback distance shall not be less than 25 ft. unless the provisions of proviso (a) to Clause 27 apply.
- (b) Land shall be made available for the purposes mentioned in Clause 29 of an area not less than the area that would have been made available for those purposes if Clause 29 had been strictly complied with. Provided that in the case of a corner lot of less than one-third of an acre the owner shall not be obliged to provide land for the purposes mentioned in Clause 29 exceeding that which is required for a lot with a frontage to one street only.

31. No person shall between the street alignment and the set back distance—

- (a) place or display a vehicle or vehicles for sale;
- (b) place or permit to remain any vehicle which is being wrecked or repaired;
- (c) place or permit to remain any fuel or raw material or wastes of manufacture or except as hereinafter permitted any products or by-products of manufacture.

Access for Loading and Unloading of Vehicles.

32. (1) No person shall use a building for business or industry unless there is provided a paved access way for vehicles from a street to the rear of the building for the purpose of loading and unloading and of a nature mentioned in this clause.

(2) The access way shall be so constructed that vehicles using it may return to a street in forward gear.

(3) If there exists a right-of-way to the rear or side of the lot, an area shall be paved on the lot so that vehicles when loading or unloading shall not remain in the right-of-way and the area shall be of such a size that if no alternative route exists vehicles may turn so as to return to a street in forward gear.

(4) Except as hereinafter mentioned the access way shall be not less than fifteen feet in width; if the size of the lot makes the provision of a fifteen foot wide access way impracticable or unreasonable the Council may permit an access way of a narrower width but in no case less than ten feet in width.

Parking and Repair of Commercial Vehicles.

33. No person shall on privately owned land within a Single Residential and Group Housing Zone, a Multi-Residential Zone or a Special Residential Zone—

- (a) Park or allow to remain stationary for more than four hours consecutively—
 - (i) more than two commercial vehicles and if there are two such vehicles one at least must be housed in a

domestic garage or domestic out-building;

(ii) any vehicle which due to size or load is not capable of being completely housed within a domestic garage or domestic outbuilding having a maximum floor area of 500 square feet and in which no horizontal dimension is more than 50 feet;

(iii) a vehicle which together with the load thereon exceeds nine feet in height.

(b) Repair, service or clean a commercial vehicle unless such work is carried out whilst the vehicle is housed in a domestic garage or domestic outbuilding.

(c) Keep or allow to remain or repair, paint, service, clean, or renovate any boat, ship launch, yacht, dinghy, or other vessel in front of the building line on or on the road reserve adjacent to such land for more than four hours consecutively.

Lifts in Residential Buildings.

34. All residential buildings of more than two storeys shall be fitted with a passenger lift unless the topography is such that it is possible to reach the top floor without ascending stairways of a total height exceeding the height of one storey.

General Appearance of Buildings.

35. (1) No person shall construct—

- (a) A building which has an exterior design that is out of harmony with existing buildings.
- (b) An ugly building that may destroy local amenities.

(2) Any person who is aggrieved by the refusal of the Council to grant its approval to the construction of a building by reason of this clause may within sixty days after the refusal is communicated to him appeal to the Minister who may hear the appeal himself or appoint a person or persons to hear the appeal and report to him thereon and the Minister after considering the report if any shall make his decision thereon and communicate it to the Council and to the appellant. The decision of the Minister shall be final.

Corner Lots on Subdivision.

36. No subdivision of land shall be permitted which has the effect of creating a lot with a frontage to more than one street if that lot has a width of less than seventy-two feet at a distance of sixty-six feet back from the smaller frontage.

Relaxation of Restrictions.

37. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of the Uniform Building By-laws the Council may either generally or in any particular case, and on such conditions as it thinks fit, relax the provisions of this Part, if the resolution so to do is passed by an absolute majority of the Council and confirmed within three months by an absolute majority of the Council at a subsequent meeting.

PART IV.—DEVELOPMENT.

Council's Approval Necessary.

38. In addition to a Building License, Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development except a private dwelling house or duplex house.

39. Applications to the Council for its approval to commence development may be made on the following form:—

Council's Approval.

40. The Council may grant its approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its approval to the application to commence development.

41. If the Council shall have granted its approval to commence development subject to conditions and any of the conditions shall not be fulfilled or complied with the Council may revoke its approval.

42. The Council may limit the time for which its approval to commence development remains valid.

43. The Council shall within sixty days of the receipt by it of an application to commence development convey its decision to the applicant.

Appeal.

44. If a person shall have applied for approval to commence development and the Council shall have refused such approval or granted it subject to conditions unacceptable to the applicant he may appeal to the Minister for Town Planning.

45. The appellant shall in his notice of appeal set out in detail the grounds of his appeal. He shall serve a notice on the Minister and a copy on the Council within 30 days of the posting of the Council's decision to him.

46. The Minister shall deal with an appeal so made in accordance with the provision of the Act.

47. In making his decision the Minister shall be bound by all matters which were binding on the Council when it made the decision the subject of the appeal.

48. If the Minister shall allow the appeal subject to conditions or impose any conditions such conditions shall have effect and be binding in like manner as if they were imposed by the Council.

Prohibition.

49. In cases where the Council's approval is required to commence development no person shall commence development without the approval of the Council or carry out any development otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of the Council's approval.

PART V.—NON-CONFORMING USES OF LAND.

50. If at the gazettal date any land building or structure is being lawfully used for a purpose or in a manner not permitted by this Scheme (hereinafter called "a non-conforming use") the non-conforming use may continue subject to the following restrictions:—

- (a) The non-conforming use shall not be extended beyond the boundaries of the lot or lots upon which it was carried on at the gazettal date.
- (b) If the buildings in which the non-conforming use is carried on are wholly within one lot only then such buildings shall not be extended beyond the limits of that lot.
- (c) If the building or buildings in which the non-conforming use is carried on are constructed on more than one lot such non-conforming use shall be restricted to the land on which the building stands or the buildings stand and such land which is adjacent to the building or buildings and not being used for any other purpose authorised by the Scheme as is reasonably required for the purpose for which the building or buildings is or are being used.
- (d) No building which is subject to any of the special provisions in Part III shall be altered or extended unless it conforms to the relevant provisions of Part III or unless with the special approval of the Council.

51. If a non-conforming use shall after the gazettal date be discontinued, or changed, no person shall subject to the following clause thereafter use the land or any building or structure thereon on which the non-conforming use was carried on for any purpose not permitted by this Scheme.

52. The Council may upon such conditions as it thinks fit permit the change of a non-conforming use to another non-conforming use if in the opinion of the Council the latter use is less prejudicial to the amenity of the area.

53. The Council may for the purpose of discontinuing any particular non-conforming use acquire the land and buildings (if any) on or in which the use is or is permitted to be carried on or make

agreements relating to the payment of compensation or moneys to persons willing to discontinue a non-conforming use.

54. Any person carrying on a non-conforming use shall when required by the Council give to the Council in writing full information of the nature and extent of the non-conforming use.

PART VI.—PRESERVATION AND CONSERVATION OF OBJECTS OF NATURAL BEAUTY AND HISTORICAL BUILDINGS AND OBJECTS OF HISTORIC OR SCIENTIFIC INTEREST.

55. (1) The Council may resolve that it will consider whether an object of natural beauty specified in the resolution should be conserved.

(2) The Council may resolve that it will consider whether an historical building or an object of historical or scientific interest should be preserved.

56. If the Council shall pass one of the resolutions mentioned in the clause immediately preceding (hereinafter called "the preliminary resolution") it shall forthwith give written notice of the resolution to:—

- (a) The owner of the land on which the object of natural beauty or the historical building or the object of historical or scientific interest is situated.
- (b) The occupier of such land if he is not the owner.
- (c) All other persons whose names appear on the Certificate of Title to the said land as having an interest therein.
- (d) The National Trust of Australia (W.A.).
- (e) The Royal Western Australian Historical Society (Inc.).
- (f) The Albany Historical Society Inc.
- (g) The Western Australian Tourist Development Authority.
- (h) Such other persons who in the opinion of the Council could give to it information which would assist the Council in arriving at a decision on the proposal.

57. The said notice shall inform the person to whom it is directed that the matter will be reconsidered by the Council after the expiration of two calendar months from the date of the passing of the said resolution and that any recommendations or objection made in writing to the Council by such person before that time will be considered. The notice shall also contain a copy of this Part of the Scheme.

58. The Council shall cause a copy of the preliminary resolution to be published in a newspaper circulating throughout the State of Western Australia and in a newspaper published in the Scheme Area if such exists.

59. After the expiration of two calendar months but not later than four calendar months from the passing of the preliminary resolution the matter shall be reconsidered by the Council.

60. The Council shall consider all written recommendations and objections submitted to it and may resolve that the object of natural beauty or the historical building or object of historical or scientific interest should be conserved or preserved as the case may be. If the Council shall pass the said resolution (hereinafter called "the preservation resolution") it shall give written notice thereof to all persons mentioned in Clause 56 hereof.

61. If the Council shall not within a period of six months from the passing of the preliminary resolution pass the preservation resolution the Council shall be deemed to have abandoned the proposal contained in the preliminary resolution and shall not pass a preservation resolution unless and until the procedure mentioned in this Part of the Scheme shall have again been followed.

62. The Council may purchase or subject to the Act resume the parcel of land on which the object of natural beauty or the historical building or object of historical or scientific interest mentioned in the preservation resolution passed by the Council is situated or so much thereof as is in the opinion of the Council necessary for the preservation of the said object or building.

63. The Council may—

- (a) Enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of land on which an object of natural beauty or historic building or object of historical or scientific interest is situated, for the preservation or conservation of such building or object whether a preservation resolution has been passed or not.
- (b) Enter into agreements with any of the organisations named in paragraphs (d), (e) or (f) of Clause 56 hereof or with and other person for the preservation or conservation of any building or object mentioned in a preservation resolution passed by the Council; or if the owner thereof so agrees, notwithstanding that no preservation resolution has been passed.
- (c) Enter into agreements relating to the determination and settling of compensation.

64. Any person who is injuriously affected by the passing of a preservation resolution may within six months from the passing of the said resolution claim compensation from the Council.

65. If the parties cannot agree upon the amount of compensation payable it shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Act, 1895.

66. No person shall without the written consent of the Council—

- (a) within six months from the passing of a preliminary resolution, or
- (b) After the passing of a preservation resolution, make any alteration or addition to, damage, deface, demolish or remove any object of natural beauty, historic building or object of historical or scientific interest referred to in any such resolution.

PART VII.—ADMINISTRATION.

Prohibition.

67. (1) No person shall use any land or any building or structure thereon contrary to or otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.

(2) If pursuant to the provisions approval has been granted upon conditions no person shall commit a breach of any of those conditions.

Powers of Council.

68. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall in addition to all other powers vested in it have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect any land or building within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements and arrangements with any of the owners of land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To acquire land or buildings within the Scheme Area, and
- (d) To deal with or dispose of any land for the time being vested in it.

69. Twenty-eight (28) days written notice is hereby prescribed as the notice to be given pursuant to section 10 of the Act. Any expenses incurred by the Council under the said section may be recovered from the person in default as a simple contract debt in such Court of Civil Jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of the claim.

70. The Council may at any time exercise the powers conferred by section 13 of the Act.
