By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Com-monwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Juries Act, 1957-1961, inter alia, that when it appears to the Governor that the duties of any office, or class of offices, in the paid and active service of the Crown in right of the State, or of any agency or instrumentality of the Crown in right of the State, are such that interruption of the discharge of those duties would result in serious inconvenience to the public or any section of the public, the Governor may by proclamation exempt any person while occupying that office, or while occupying any class of those offices, from liability to serve as jurors; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, that the interruption of the discharge of the duties of the interruption of the discharge of the duties of the class of office specified hereunder would result in serious inconvenience to the public or some section of the public: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in me vested, do hereby exempt the persons for the time being occupying the following class of office in the instrumentality of the Crown in right of the State, namely the Academic Staff and the Assistant Director (Administration and Finance) of The Western Australian Institute of Technology, from liability to serve as jurgers from liability to serve as jurors.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (3) of section 36 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that where the Governor is of opinion that on account of economic or seasonal conditions it is desirable that the operations of subsections (1) and (2) of section 36 should be suspended, he may, from time to time, by proclamation, suspend their operation in such districts and for such periods as are specified in the proclamation and may by subsequent proclamation revoke or vary the proclama-tion; and whereas the Governor is of the opinion that it is desirable on account of seasonal and economic conditions to further suspend the opera-tion of subsections (1) and (2) of section 36 which were suspended for the period ending on the 31st March, 1972, by proclamation dated the 1st day of September, 1971, in the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Yalgoo: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby vary the said Proclamation and further suspend the operation of subsections (1) and (2) of section 26 of the Act in the district of the Municipality 36 of the Act, in the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Yalgoo for a period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1972 and ending on the 31st December, 1972.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth this 24th day of April, 1972, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued—

> Land Act, 1933-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1515/95.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Body Corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the Order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 24857 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley in trust for the purpose of Racecourse: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley in trust for Racecourse with power to the said Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 849/71.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1971, it is inter alia made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 31291 (Port Hedland Lot 2458) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia to be held in trust for "Sub-Station Site": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Constitution Act, 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Shires of Ashburton, Broome, Carnarvon, Marble Bar, Nullagine, Port Hedland, Roebourne, Tableland, Upper Gascoyne and Wiluna.

Alteration and Adjustment of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LG.: 390/70B.

WHEREAS it is provided in subsection (2) of Section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that the Governor may, upon effective presentation of a Petition, under the Common Seal of each Muncipality which will be affected by an Order, alter and adjust the boundaries of adjoining disarter and adjust the boundaries of adjoining districts; and whereas it is provided in paragraph (e) of subsection (4) of Section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that the Governor may, unite two or more municipalities whose districts are adjoining, and their districts so as to form one municipality and one district if union of those municipalities has been recommended by the Local Government Boundaries Commission appointed under subsection 6 of Section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971: and whereas the Municipalities of the Shires of Ashburton and Upper Gascoyne, Wiluna and Nullagine, Ashburton and Carnarvon, Ashburton and Roebourne, Marble Bar and Broome, Tableland and Nullagine, Port Hedland and Marble Bar, Tableland and Roebourne and Roebourne and Port Hedland have submitted joint petitions praying for the boundaries between the said adjoining districts should be altered and adjusted; and whereas the Local Government Boundaries Commission has recommended that the municipalities of the Shires of Marble Bar and Nullagine, and their districts should be united to form one municipality to be named the Shire of East Pilbara, and that the municipalities of the Shires of Tableland and Ashburton and their districts should be united to form one municipality to be named the Shire of West Pilbara; now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby:

 sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Roebourne and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Ashburton, the land specified in Schedule A hereto;

- (2) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Tableland and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Roebourne the land specified in Schedule B hereto;
- (3) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Roebourne and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Tableland, the land specified in Schedule C hereto:
- (4) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Roebourne and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Port Hedland, the land specified in Schedule D hereto;
- (5) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Port Hedland and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Marble Bar, the land specified in Schedule E hereto;
- (6) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Marble Bar and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Broome, the land specified in Schedule F hereto;
- (7) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Tableland and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Nullagine, the land specified in Schedule G hereto;
- (8) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Wiluna and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Nullagine, the land specified in Schedule H hereto;
- (9) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Ashburton and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon, the land specified in Schedule J hereto;
- (10) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Ashburton, the land specified in Schedule K hereto;
- (11) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Ashburton and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Upper Gascoyne, land specified in Schedule L hereto;
- (12) unite the municipalities of the Shires of Tableland and Ashburton and their districts, as amended by the severances and annexations aforesaid, to form one municipality, named the Shire of West Pilbara, as set forth in Schedule M hereto;
- (12) unite the municipalities of the Shires of Nullagine and Marble Bar and their districts, as amended by the severances and annexations aforesaid, to form one municipality, named the Shire of East Pilbara, as set forth in Schedule P hereto;
- (14) describe the boundaries of the district of the Shire of Roebourne, as amended by the severances and annexations aforesaid, as set forth in Schedule N hereto;
- (15) describe the boundaries of the district of the Shire of Port Hedland, as amended by the severances and annexations aforesaid, as set forth in Schedule O hereto;
- (16) direct that this Order shall take effect as and from the 27th day of May, 1972.

Schedule A.

TRANSFER OF TERRITORY FROM SHIRE OF ROEBOURNE TO THE SHIRE OF ASHBURTON.

(1) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation north-northwesterly of a line joining the 50 mile

peg on the Carnarvon to Roebourne Telegraph Line and Trigonometrical Station KAP 7 (Peedamullah) with the prolongation west of the westernmost south boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/1027, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne and extending to and along that Pastoral Lease boundary to the northernmost northwest corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/1011, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne aforesaid and thence generally southwesterly and generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point. Area: about 66,360 acres.

- (2) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southernmost southeast corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/1027, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne and extending north, east, again north, and again east along boundaries of that Pastoral Lease to the northernmost west boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/1013, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne aforesaid and thence generally easterly, generally southwesterly and generally northwesterly along that boundary to the starting point. Area: about 211,433 acres.
- (3) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on a northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/1013 situate about 170 chains west of the easternmost northeastern corner of that Lease, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne and extending north to the southernmost south boundary of Pastoral Lease 394/438; thence east and north along boundaries of that Pastoral Lease to the northernmost northwest corner of De Witt Location 50 (Class "A" Reserve 30071); thence east, south, west, again south, again east, north, again east and again south along boundaries of that Location to an east-west line passing through a cairn at Grant Spring (Latitude about 21 degrees 14 minutes 14 seconds south), a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne aforesaid and thence generally southerly, generally westerly and generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point. Area: 1,136,938 acres.

Schedule B.

TRANSFER OF TERRITORY FROM THE SHIRE OF TABLELAND TO THE SHIRE OF ROEBOURNE.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the southernmost east boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/492 situate east of a cairn at Grant Spring (Latitude about 21 degrees 14 minutes 14 seconds south), a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Tableland and extending south and west along boundaries of that Pastoral Lease to its southernmost southwestern corner, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Tableland aforesaid and thence north, east, again north and again east along that boundary to the starting point. Area: about 63,400 acres.

TRANSFER OF TERRITORY FROM THE SHIRE OF ROEBOURNE TO THE SHIRE OF TABLELAND.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the southernmost east boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/492 situate east of a cairn at Grant Spring (Latitude about 21 degrees 14 minutes 14 seconds south), a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne and extending north, east, again north, again east, again north, again east, again north and west along boundaries of that pastoral lease to the northernmost southwest corner of late Pastoral Lease 3114/936; thence north, east, south, again east, again south, again east, again south and again east along boundaries of that late Pastoral Lease to the southernmost southeast corner of late Pastoral Lease 3114/533; thence north 49 chains and 18 links and east 974 chains and 5 links to a southeast corner of that late Lease; thence southeasterly to the southernmost southwest corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/517,

a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne aforesaid; and thence generally southerly, generally westerly and generally northerly along that boundary to the starting point. Area: about 718,196 acres.

- (2) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southernmost southwest corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/517, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne and extending about 306 degrees to a southeast corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/1029; thence north and east along boundaries of that Pastoral Lease to its easternmost southeast corner, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Roebourne aforesaid and thence east, south, again east, and again south along that boundary to the starting point. Area about 76,522 acres.

TRANSFER OF LAND FROM SHIRE OF PORT HEDLAND TO SHIRE OF MARBLE BAR.

Area: about 2,990,058 acres.
- (ii) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the southwest corner of pastoral lease 3114/446, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Port Hedland and extending north along the west boundary of that pastoral lease and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Port Hedland aforesaid and thence generally easterly, generally southerly and generally westerly along that boundary to the starting point. Area: about 470,583 acres.

Area: about 69,920 acres.
- (3) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the easternmost east boundary of Pastoral Lease 3114/870 situate 320 chains and 12 links north of the southeast corner of that lease, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Marble Bar and extending south. east and north along boundaries of that Pastoral Lease to the southeast corner of late Pastoral Lease 536/97, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Marble Bar aforesaid; and thence north and east along that boundary to the starting point. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 286/62.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraphs (h), (i) and (j) of subsection (2) of the section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1971, that upon the presentation to him of a petition under the Common Seal of the Municipality the Governor may by Order create new wards in a district, describe the boundaries of the wards of a district and determine the number of offices of councillor assigned to a Municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 12 of the Act that the Governor may give such directions as he thinks necessary to give effect to an alteration in the number of members; or to an alteration in the number of wards; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 20 of that Act, that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12, he may by Order direct who, if any, of the members whose district is effected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office and when, and may direct the holding on a day appointed by the Order of an election of such members so affected, as the case requires; and whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Coorow has presented a petition under its Common Seal praying that the wards shall be described, with boundaries as described in the schedule hereto and that the number of offices of councillor be increased from five to seven; now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

(a) Abolish the existing West Ward and create three new wards namely Eganu Ward, Warradarge Ward and Coastal Ward in the district of the Shire of Coorow.

- (b) describe the boundaries of the wards of the Shire of Coorow as set forth in the Schedule hereto.
- (c) Declare that the number of offices of member be increased from five to seven to be allocated to the respective wards as follows: Town Ward 1, Central Ward 1, South Ward 1, Waddi Ward 1, Eganu Ward 1, Warradarge Ward 1, Coastal Ward 1.
- (d) Direct that the member for the West Ward shall go out of office on the 15th July, 1972.
- (e) Direct that an election be held on the 15th July, 1972, to return one member to each of the Eganu, Warradarge and Coastal Wards.

Milk Act, 1946-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1971 that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Minister by Order in Council subdivide any district into two or more districts; AND WHEREAS by an Order in Council made the 26th August, 1970 and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th August, 1970 the Governor did, inter alia, divide the Metropolitan Dairy Area into districts as set out in the Schedule

to that order and included in those districts the districts of the Shire of Gosnells and the Shire of Wanneroo; and whereas it is now expedient to subdivide each of those districts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister for Agriculture, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1971, subdivide the district of—

- (a) the Shire of Gosnells into the districts as defined in the First Schedule hereto; and
- (b) the Shire of Wanneroo into the districts as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.
