WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, that the Governor may by proclamation declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any Reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, 1963, and published in the Government Gazette as shown in the checkula attached the Government gazette as shown in the sense. schedule attached, the Governor declared the areas described in the schedule to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Reserves: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by Section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby abolish the Reserves for Natives as declared and described in the attached schedule hereinbefore mentioned.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, on the 9th day of June, 1972, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:-

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1971.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1971, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which, after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1971, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby-

- (a) constitute that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River, more particularly described in the schedule hereunder, a fire district;
- (b) assign the name Augusta Fire District to that district; and
- include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, immediately below the words "Armadale Fire District", the words "Augusta Fire District" and in column two opposite that name, the name of the local authority, "Shire of Augusta-Margaret River."

Augusta Fire District.

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1971. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

(a) establish a special court to be called a Children's Court at Kambalda to exercise jurisdiction within the area known as the Hannans Magisterial District;

 - (i) Herbert Alfred Stawell Miller, Charles Maxwell McPherson and John Charles Warburton to be Members of

the Children's Court at Kambalda.

THE TOWN OF MOSMAN PARK TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

THE Council of the Town of Mosman Park under and by virtue of the power conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (as amended) and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959 (as amended) hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme for the purpose of—

- (a) setting aside land for future public use as reserves
- (b) controlling land development
- (c) other matters authorised by the enabling Act.

PART I—PRELIMINARY.

- 1.1 Scheme Title: The Town Planning Scheme may be cited as the Town of Mosman Park Town Planning Scheme and shall come into operation on the publication of notice of the Minister's final approval thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 1.2 Scheme Area: The scheme shall apply to the whole of the land within the Town of Mosman Park.
- 1.3 Operation of Scheme: The scheme is complementary to, and is not a substitute for, the Metropolitan Region Scheme, and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Scheme, as amended from time to time shall continue to have effect.
- 1.4 General Intent: The intent of this Scheme is to direct and control the development of the Scheme Area (hereinafter referred to as the District) in such a way as shall promote and safeguard the health, safety and convenience and economic and general welfare of its inhabitants and the amenities of every part of the district.
 - 1.5 Revocation of Zoning and Other By-laws:
 - (a) The Town Planning Zoning By-laws of the Mosman Park Road District which were published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1948, and subsequently from time to time amended are hereby revoked.
 - (b) The Town Planning Zoning By-law for a prescribed area of the Municipality of Mosman Park which was published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1963, is hereby revoked.
 - (c) The Building Line By-law (Riverside Drive) which was published in the Government Gazette on the 29th day of August, 1963, is hereby revoked.
 - (d) The Prohibition of Buildings By-law appertaining to Buildings (Saunders Street) which was published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of February, 1968, is hereby revoked.
- 1.6 Responsible Authority: The responsible authority for carrying out the Scheme is the Council of the Town of Mosman Park except that where land is shown on the Scheme Map marked "MRS" the responsible authority is deemed to be the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority and the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme shall apply to such reservations.

1.7 Arrangement of Scheme: The Scheme Text is divided into the following parts:—

Part I —Preliminary

Part II —Reserved Land

Part III—Zones

Part IV-Non Conforming Uses

Part V —General Provisions

Part VI—Finance and Administration

The remaining documents of the Scheme are as follows:-

- (1) Land Use Map.
- (2) Scheme Map.
- 1.8 General Obligations: Subject to the provisions of the Act and all regulations made thereunder and to Section 4 of this Scheme, no persons shall depart or permit or suffer any departure from the requirements and provisions of the Scheme, nor shall any person use or permit the use of any land or building or undertake or permit any new work if the use, new work, reconstruction, alteration or modification does not conform with the Scheme or would tend to delay the effective operation of the Scheme.
- 1.9 Relationship of Scheme to By-laws: The provisions of this Scheme shall have effect, notwithstanding any by-law for the time being in force in the District and where the provisions of the Scheme are inconsistent with the provisions of any by-law, the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.
- 1.10 Appeal Rights: The procedure for the lodgement and determination of appeals shall be as laid down in Part V of the Town Planning and Development Act, and Regulations made under that Act.
- 1.11 Interpretation: In this Scheme the terms used will have the respective interpretations set out in Appendix 'D' of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 and the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959 (as amended) unless otherwise specified by this Scheme.

Definitions:

Effective Frontage: Shall be calculated for lots having parallel side boundaries as the length of a line drawn perpendicular from one side boundary so as to bisect the opposite side boundary and, in the case of other lots, as the length of a line drawn parallel to the street frontage between the two side boundaries at 1/3rd of the mean depth of the lot measured from the main street frontage:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from deciding by other means, the effective frontage of lots of such irregular proportions that it considers the above formulae cannot be applied.

Plot Ratio: Shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

Site Coverage: Shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

Setbacks for Lots with Multiple Street Frontages: Shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Uniform General Building By-laws.

PART II—RESERVED LAND.

- 2.1 Land set aside under this Scheme for the purposes of a reservation is deemed to be reserved for the purposes indicated on the approved Planning Scheme Map, and the reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme are shown in the Scheme to comply with the provisions of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act.
- 2.2 Development on Reserved Land: Except as otherwise provided in this Part, a person shall not carry out any development on land reserved under this Scheme other than the erection of a boundary fence, without first applying for and obtaining the written approval of the Council.
- 2.3 Approval of Development on Reserved Land: In giving its approval the Council shall have regard to the ultimate purpose intended for the reserves, and shall in the case of land reserved for the purpose of a public authority, confer with that Authority before giving its approval.
- 2.4 Reservations Under the Metropolitan Region Scheme: Any application for development on land reserved or abutting a reserve defined in the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme shall be referred to the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for determination in accordance with Section 29 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

- 2.5 Existing Use Rights on Reserved Land: No provision of this Part shall prevent the continued use of land for the use for which it was being lawfully used immediately prior to the Scheme having the force of law, or the repair and maintenance of buildings or works lawfully existing on the land.
- 2.6 Compensation for Injurious Affection: Where the Council refuses approval for the development of land reserved under the Scheme on the ground that the land is reserved for public purposes, or grants approval subject to conditions, the owner of the land may, if the land is injuriously affected thereby, claim compensation for such injurious affection.
- 2.7 Compensation Claim Procedure: Claims for compensation shall be lodged at the Office of the Council not later than six months after the date of the decision of the Council refusing approval or granting it subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.
- 2.8 Council may Purchase: In lieu of paying compensation the Council may purchase the land affected by the decision of the Council at a price not exceeding the value of the land at the time of refusal of approval, or of the grant of approval subject to conditions that are unacceptable to the applicant.

PART III—ZONES.

- 3.1 Not-withstanding anything to the contrary in this Scheme and without affecting the generality of Clause 1.6 of Part I, the Council may with the consent of the Minister, or when required by the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority so to do, shall require that the development of any land within the District, however zoned, shall be subject to the provisions of Clauses 10, 24 and 30 of the Metropolitan Region Scheme.
- 3.2 Zones Specified in Scheme: The following use zonings are specified and described in this Scheme and more particularly in Table 1 Zoning Table :—

- 3.3 Residential Development Control Code: Development within Residential A, Residential B, Residential C, Residential D, and Residential Development Zones shall be in accordance with the controls and standards set out hereunder provided that no development of more than two units will be approved in any zone unless connection is made to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Minister's sewer main.
- 3.3.1 For the purposes of assessing the density of occupation the Council will apply the following schedule:—

- 3.3.2 A minimum of 50 per cent of the area of every lot developed for residential purposes shall be designed, developed and maintained as natural planting and pedestrian space (access driveways between street alignment and setback-line may be included in the 50 per cent of the area maintained as natural planting).

The following schedule details the bulk and location requirements which the Council will administer within the zone. The Council may, however, permit minor departure from these standards in cases where such departure would in no way detract from the amenities of the locality nor diminish the privacy, aspect or view enjoyed by adjoining properties.

Flats and Town Houses Generally in accordance with the provisions of the General Residential Zone Class 6 (GR 6) Controls of the Uniform General Building By-laws providing that a population density equivalent of 100 persons per acre is not exceeded on any one parcel of land, and providing further, that the minimum number of car parking spaces provided shall be determined on the basis of 2 spaces for each of the first five dwelling units and 1 5 spaces for every additional dwelling unit thereafter.

- 3.8 Residential Development Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The Council will only exercise its discretionary power to allow subdivision and/or development within this zone after its consideration of outline development plans. Any such plan shall show the proposed subdivision of land, the proposed land use pattern, the allocation of land for various public purposes including reserves for parks and recreation and the co-ordination of proposed subdivision and land usage with adjoining properties and with existing and proposed public utility systems. The bulk and location of residential buildings within this zone shall generally be in accordance with the General Residential Zone Class 4 (GR4) Controls of the Uniform Building By-laws providing that a population density equivalent of 50 persons per acre is not exceeded on any one parcel of land within the area covered by the outline development plan.
- 3.9 Aged Persons Housing Zone: The Council has zoned an area of 4.25 acres specifically for aged persons housing. The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The bulk and location of residential accommodation buildings will generally be controlled by Council in accordance with the General Residential Zone—Class 4 (GR4) Controls of the Uniform Building By-laws.
- 3.10 Business/Residential Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The bulk and location of residential buildings will generally be controlled by the Council in accordance with provisions of the Residential D Zone. Business accommodation will generally have to comply with appropriate bulk and location standards of the Building By-laws. Before approving any redevelopment of property within this zone the Council will require submissions to be made to show how the proposed redevelopment is to be integrated with the redevelopment of other property within the zone.
- 3.11 Business Centre Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The Council will only exercise its discretionary power to allow development within the zone after its consideration of submissions made by intending developers showing how it is proposed to integrate buildings, parking areas, access, services and pedestrian and planting areas throughout the whole of the zone to achieve high standards of safety, appearance, convenience and service.
- 3.12 Shops Zone: The uses permitted in this zone are described in Table No. 1—Zoning Table. The Council may as a condition of approval insist upon integration of building layout and design, parking layout and vehicular access and pedestrian circulation, with adjoining development.

- 3.13 Industrial Zone: With the exception of an area of approximately $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres, being Part Reserve B2020 and Part Reserve B2976 and lot 338 between the land occupied by the Esso Oil Company and the City of Fremantle boundary, land within the Industrial Zone may only be used for the purpose for which it is being used at the date of approval of the Scheme. The excepted area of approximately $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres may with approval of the Council be used for light industrial purposes.
- 3.14 Zones Not Specified on Table No. 1 Zoning Table: The following zones are specified in the Scheme but are not listed on Table No. 1 because of the specific nature of the use which is permitted and is established within them. Existing uses only are permitted within these zones

Service Station.

Private Clubs and Institutions.

Places of Public Assembly.

- 3.15 Table No. 1 Zoning Table indicates the several uses permitted by this Scheme in various zones, such uses being determined by cross reference between the list of "Use Classes" on the left hand side of the Table and the list of "Zones" on the top of the Table. The symbols used in the cross reference in Table No. 1 have the following meanings:
 - "P" —A use that is permitted under this Scheme.
 - "AA"—A use that is not permitted unless special approval is granted by the Council.
 - "IP" —A use that is not permitted unless such use is incidental to the predominant use as decided and approved by the Council.
 - "X" —A use that is not permitted.

Any use not specifically listed in Table No. 1 shall be included either in the appropriate use class or special use class at the discretion of the Council.

- 3.16 Any person who intends to use land for a purpose which is only permitted with the special approval of the Council shall make written application to the Council for such approval and the application shall state:—
 - (a) The legal description of the land and the particulars of the Certificate of Title.
 - (b) The names and addresses of the registered proprietors and of all other persons having an interest in the land and the nature of their interest.
 - (c) The full name and address of the applicant and the nature of his interest in the land.
 - (d) The purposes for which the applicant desires to use the land, together with plans and statements illustrating and explaining the nature and details of the proposed use.
 - (e) The reasons why the Council should exercise its authority to permit the proposed use.
- 3.16.1 The Council shall consider the application and may refuse its approval or may resolve to approve the application with or without conditions, or, the Council may resolve that notice of the proposed use should be given to those rate-payers and residents likely to be affected by the granting of the application.
- 3.16.2 If the Council so resolves the applicant shall give notice of the proposed use to those owners of land scheduled by the Council, and cause to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Scheme Area notice of the application setting out in abbreviated form the information contained in the application and stating that objections may be made to the Council within a specified period, being not less than twenty-eight days from the publication of the said notice.
- 3.16.3 Within twenty-eight days of the expiry of the objection period the Council shall again consider the application and any objection lodged opposing the proposed use and shall resolve to refuse or grant its approval subject to conditions.
- 3.16.4 The Council may enter into agreements with the applicant whereby the applicant covenants for himself and his transferees to carry out and observe the conditions imposed by the Council in granting its approval.
- 3.16.5 Any person grieved by a decision of Council given in terms of Clause 3.16 may appeal to the Minister for Town Planning or to a Town Planning Court in accordance with the provisions of Clause 1.10 of this Text.

PART IV-NON-CONFORMING USE OF LAND.

- 4.1 Existing Use Rights: No provisions of the Scheme shall prevent-
 - (a) the continued use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into force of the Scheme; or
 - (b) the carrying out of any development thereon for which, immediately prior to that time, a permit or permits required under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended) or any other law authorising the development to be carried out had been duly obtained and was current.
- 4.2 Non-conforming Use and Reserved Lands: Where in respect of land reserved under Section II of the Scheme a non-conforming use lawfully exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land all or any erections alterations or extensions of the buildings thereon or use thereof shall not be carried out unless the approval of the Council has been obtained in writing.
- 4.3 Extension of Buildings: Where in respect of land zoned under Section III of the Scheme a non-conforming use lawfully exists or was authorised as mentioned in Clause 4.1 of this Part on that land, buildings may be extended to the limits prescribed by the Uniform General Building By-laws made under the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended), or by any other by-laws made under the Act for the

purpose of limiting the size, location and distance from boundaries and any other matter required by law for that class of use within the boundary of the lot or lots on which the use was carried out immediately prior to the coming into force of the Scheme.

Provided that where the provisions of any by-law referred to in this section are inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme then the provisions of this Scheme shall prevail.

- 4.4 Discontinuance of Non-Conforming Use:
 - (a) Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Section when a nonconforming use of any land or building has been discontinued for a period exceeding 6 months, such land or building shall not thereafter be used other than in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
 - (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 4.1 of this Section, should any building or works comprised in such land be so damaged or destroyed that the cost of restoration or replacement is greater than 75 per cent of the value of such building or works immediately prior to the damage to or destruction thereof, such land shall be used only in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme.
 - (c) The Council may effect the discontinuance of a non-conforming use by the purchase or resumption of the affected property, or by the payment of compensation to the owner or the occupier or to both the owner and occupier of that property, and may enter into an agreement with the owner of that property.

PART V—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 5.1 Vehicle Parking and Loading: The purpose of this clause is to secure the provision of off-street parking and loading facilities in relation to the use of land so as to reduce or prevent the congestion of traffic on any road or public place. Every owner or occupier who constructs or who substantially reconstructs, alters or adds to a building on any site or changes the use of any land or building shall make provision in accordance with the requirements of Table II for vehicles used in conjunction with the site (whether by occupiers, their employees or invitees and other persons) to stand on or, in the opinion of the Council, sufficiently close to the site but not on a street while being loaded or unloaded or awaiting use.
- 5.2 Size and Location of Car Spaces and Locating Facilities: The minimum dimensions of every required car parking space shall be 18 ft. x 8 ft. excluding all access drives. When considering any development applications, the Council shall have regard to an impose conditions on the details of locating and designing the required car parking spaces and loading facilities. In particular, the Council shall take into account, and may impose conditions concerning—
 - (a) the proportion of spaces to be roofed or covered,
 - (b) the proportion of spaces to be below natural ground level,
 - (c) the means of access to each space and the adequacy of any manoeuvering area,
 - (d) the location of the spaces on the site and their affect on the amenity of adjoining development, including the potential effect if spaces should later be roofed or covered,
 - (e) the adequacy of proposed screening or planting,
 - (f) the extent to which spaces are located within required setback areas, and
 - (g) the location of proposed footpaths and the effect on traffic movement and safety.
- 5.3 Number of Parking and Loading Spaces to be Provided: The number of spaces to be provided in respect of any particular site shall be determined by Council, having regard to the nature of the use and the known or likely volume of goods, materials or people moving to and from the site and, where the use is stipulated, not less than the number of spaces set down in Table II hereunder:—

- 5.4 The Scheme Map shows a number of closed roads. It is not Council's intention that these roads should be closed physically or legally at the date of operation of this Scheme. Rather, the Scheme gives notice of Council's intention to close roads, the actual closure of which will occur when adequate and safe alternative vehicular access can be provided.
- 5.5 Appearance of Buildings: All buildings shall be maintained by the owner and occupier thereof so as to preserve the amenities of the locality and their harmony with the exterior designs of neighbouring buildings.
- 5.6 Prohibition of Unsightly Objects: No persons shall cause, allow or permit to be placed on any building or part of a building or on a building lot, any article, object or thing which shall be visible from any street, way or public place or from any other land or building or any part thereof, and which is, in the opinion of the Council, offensive, unsightly or otherwise considered to be detrimental to the amenities of the neighbourhood
- 5.7 Nuisance: No lot, building or appliance shall be used in such a manner as to permit the escape therefrom of smoke, dust, fumes, odour, noise vibration or waste products in such quantity or extent or in such a manner as to create or be a nuisance to any inhabitant of the neighbourhood of such land or to traffic or persons using roads in the vicinity.
- 5.8 Advertising Hoardings: No land within the district shall be used for the purpose of erecting thereon structures especially for the display of advertising media unless such media shall be either of an educational, community, directional or beneficial nature and which upon application receives the approval of the Council.
- 5.9 Stacked Material—Limit of Height: Within 30 ft. of any boundary fronting a reserve no material shall be stacked or stored to a height greater than the fence dividing the lot from the reserve.
- 5.10 Limitation of Height of Buildings: No part of the roof of any building hereafter erected and no part of any roof added to or altered on an existing building on any lot fronting Johnson Parade shall exceed in height a level of 31 feet above the level of the crown of the road opposite the centre of the frontage of the lot on which the building is to be or is erected.
- 5.11 Amenity Control: No building of more than two storeys shall be erected or built in any zone within the Scheme unless and until the Council has approved the design subject to the principles herein contained and the following conditions have been complied with:
 - (a) The Council is satisfied that such building will not clash in harmony with the exterior designs of neighbouring buildings.
 - (b) In considering the design of any building within any zone the Council shall take into consideration the relationship which the shape and siting of such building or buildings proposed within the area bears to the shape of the lot or lots on which such building or buildings is to be erected.

- (c) In considering the design of any such building within the Residential Zones the Council shall take into consideration the relationship which such building or buildings proposed within the area bear to the development of public utilities, amenities and other uses planned for the area considered as a whole.
- (d) In considering the design of any building within zones wherein business development may be permitted the Council shall take into consideration the provision in the zone for car parking space, vehicular access, pedestrian ways and general layout relative to the development uses proposed for the whole zone and within this zone the development of single lots shall be considered as part of a general design for the whole zone.
- (e) The Council may appoint an advisory committee consisting of the Mayor or his nominee and three architects selected by the Council and approved by the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, W.A. Division, to advise the Council on all questions of design and other matters falling within this clause.
- 5.12 Minimum Sizes of Dwelling Units: Minimum room sizes as prescribed by the Uniform Building by-laws as amended from time to time shall apply to all dwelling units constructed under the provisions of this scheme with the exception that the minimum floor area of a combined bathroom and toilet shall be 40 sq. ft. or as prescribed by the Uniform Building By-laws whichever is the greater provided that this condition shall only apply to the first bathroom in any dwelling unit

PART VI—ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE.

- 6.1 Disposal of Land: The Council may deal with or dispose of any land which it owns or which it has acquired pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme, in accordance with the Act and in conformity with the provisions of the Scheme, and for such purpose may make such agreements with other owners as it deems fit. In addition to all other powers vested in it the Council may acquire land and buildings within the Scheme Area and enter into agreements and arrangements with any of the other owners of land within the Scheme Area.
- 6.2 Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the Scheme other than for the purpose of Part II shall be made not later than six months from the date on which notice of approval of the scheme is published in the Government Gazette except in the case of land reserved under the Metropolitan Region Planning Scheme where the provisions of Division 2 of Part II of that Scheme shall apply.
- 6.3 Entry to Premises: The Council may by its Town Clerk, Health Inspector, Building Surveyor, Assistant Health Inspector, Assistant Building Surveyor, or such other officer authorised in writing by the Town Clerk, enter at all reasonable times any building or land for the purpose of ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed.
- 6.4 Relationship of Scheme Text to Other Documents: This Scheme Text is to be read in conjunction with all documents comprising Mosman Park Town Council Town Planning Scheme.
- 6.5 Penalties: Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Scheme is guilty of an offence and is liable to such penalties as are prescribed by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 and its amendments.
